On Friday October 6th. the Wharfe was running at an ideal level for the Slalom and both the Course and the Practice Course were in position. Throughout Friday night it rained continuously and the river rose 5 feet. On Saturday morning the Wild Water Race was held as planned. The Organising Committee decided in conjunction with the Protest Committee that it was possible to run the Novices' Event down the bottom half of the Course. This was tried, found impracticable, and the event cancelled. The full course was then adjusted to accommodate the extra volume of water and a successful Open Event and Canadian Doubles Event were held. During Saturday afternoon the river was dropping rapidly and it was the Organisers' view that the remainder of the Slalom could be run to schedule on the Sunday.

During Saturday night it rained very heavily once more, and by Sunday morning the river was 8 feet above summer level. The Organising Committee and the Protest Committee were in agreement that the water
