THE BRITISH CANOE UNION

The BCU is the governing body of the sport of canoeing in Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

The BCU is affiliated to the International Canoe Federation and represents the interests of British canoeists in International Canoeing affairs.

The BCU represents the needs of canoeists to the Sports Council, Government Departments and Local Authorities.

The BCU is actively campaigning for improved facilities for recreational use of water by canoeists and for extended access to inland water.

The BCU works to further the interests of the cruising canoeist and negotiates with river authorities, local authorities and landowners regarding the use of water and scales of charges where applicable.

The BCU maintains an advisory service for the benefit of its members who wish for information regarding canoe touring at home and abroad. It has published a comprehensive Guide to Waterways of the British Isles and maintains stocks of British and European maps and guides for the benefit of its members.

The BCU has a Coaching Scheme which is available to anyone who wants to learn to canoe properly and safely. Help can be obtained from area coaching panels which have been established throughout the country. The BCU publishes a series of pamphlets on canoeing techniques.

The BCU has a scheme of Proficiency Tests at all grades from novice to fully qualified coach.

The BCU Committees organise the four types of competitive canoeing: Sprint Racing, Long Distance Racing, Slalom and Wild Water Racing and Sailing Racing.

The BCU teams selected by these Committees represent Britain in International competitions and the BCU represents canoeing on the British Olympic Committee.

The BCU has founded a Corps of Canoe Lifeguards to give canoeists an opportunity to use their skills to the community. These services may include beach patrol and rescue work, flood reconnaissance, expedition leadership and any other form which offers itself.

The BCU has built up a library of canoeing films which is managed by the British Film Institute and has a stock of film strips illustrating various paddling techniques.

THE COMPETITION RULES

The competition is being run in accordance with BCU Slalom Rules.

Individual competitor's scores are made up from the time taken to complete the course (in seconds) plus any penalty points (expressed in seconds).

Competitors should go through all the gates in proper sequence taking each gate in the right direction, i.e. always having red/white pole on their left and green/white pole on their right; taking each gate from the proper side, i.e. that side from which the gate number is seen not to be disguised by a diagonal red bar; and without touching poles.

If gates are not done correctly penalties are awarded as follows:-

10 points – Going through the gate but touching one pole in the process.

20 points – Going through the gate but touching both poles in the process.

Outside touch on the gate provided it is followed by a successful negotiation (with 0, 10 or 20 penalties).

Wrong colour presentation and wrong entry, provided before an inside touch occurs and before the body cuts the gate line, a disengagement occurs and is followed by a negotiation of 10, 20 or 50.

50 points – Outside touch not followed by passage of boat.

Wrong presentation and wrong entry not followed by passage.

Deliberate displacement of poles.

Eskimo rolling in gateline.

Boat does not cross gateline.

Body does not pass between poles.

The above is only a summary of the rules condensing six printed pages relating to penalties from the slalom rules.

SAFETY

Life jackets conforming to ICF specifications must be worn at all times when on the water. Boats must be rendered unsinkable and must have regulation loops at each end.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH SAFETY REGULATIONS WILL MEAN DISQUALIFICATIONS.

PRACTICE

Practice will be allowed only after the course has been fully erected but will be restricted to only one run per competitor.

NUMBERS

Must be on regulation 9" circles. Team numbers must be preceded by the letter "T" on 9" squares, or teams may wear uniformly coloured bibs with the name of the team conspicuously displayed, e.g. CHALFONT A etc. squares and discs must be displayed on the right foredeck and left sterndeck. Competitors not clearly showing their own competition number will not be allowed to start.
