

Thanks - if we can do slalom a favor (like ease the burden of all those medals)

CALBUDAR CHANGE

Well there was to have been the Tryweryn at the start of September This first event was cancelled at the 25th hour by the Damn Authorities on account of TOO MUCH WATER in Lake Bala and beyond. Those of us who were there on the Saturday had no cause for complaint however, as the middle section was to be enjoyed in excellent high conditions.

So the season so far has been almost exclusively a Yorkshire event (which is the way things should be). October has seen the first Aire Race & the Yorkshire Championships (Wharfe), with a double Washburn and Aire 2 to come.

The SAXON INNS AIRE RACE (Oct 2) took place in miserably low conditions but high competitive spirits. Somehow everyone seemed to enjoy themselves. The Beardsmores at last won a justified promotion to A/B in C2. In Mens Kl Div C promotees were led by three outstanding performances: Dodd (RAF), John "John Boy" Graveling, and Waudby (the 1983-4 national FLUSH premier).

The Open event score sheet was somewhat of a surprise. The REAL Dave Taylor took a fine first place in a very strong field, with RAF's John Anderson in second place proving himself to be one of our best small-water paddlers. Dave Kay found enough flat water to come third equal ... with none other than Jerry Hibble. Smith, Morley and Lowe were also unhappy about this disturbing turn of events.

Geordie power was not allowed to threaten Yorshire supremacy a second time in the (totally closed) Yorshire Champs (15/16 Oct). The Hibble / Smith / Morley axis dealt with the Kay threat by organising more than the fair share of torrential rain between the practice day and the race. The proper order of things was restored with the river racers taking the first four places (Hibble, sporting a very fashionable kevlar Frog, was 14 seconds clear of Smith, Morley and Kay) in their event in epic conditions. The Grand Prix Slalom results did however mean that slalomists Close and Godfrey beat Mike Smith very narrowly into third place - not bad considering Mike has not done a slalom for a year and has never done a Grand Prix.

We now look to the Washburn weekend (22/23 Oct) with interest to see if either Taylor wishes to further undermine Yorkshire Kl pride before the Fosters - at which time Swallow (never stopped training since the war - which war?) further complicates the equation.


The Fosters does fall out of season for top GB paddlers, and anyone with eyes on the 1984 international season should be quietly ignoring the temptation to train up for the event. Nevertheless it is a public occasion at which no one will be happily humiliated. It will be interesting to see who is really contending for the early season limelight


