For many this is the time of the year for planning expeditions for the coming summer. To keep you in touch with a few expeditions I have heard about.....

1/ North Wales Kayak Expedition to North West Greenland.
Mike Jaques, John Bull, Celia Crowley and Ian Fawcett will attempt to canoe from Dundas to Kap Alexander, the most westerly point of Greenland and often called the 'Cape Horn of the North'.

2/ British Sea Kayak Expedition to explore North West Spitsbergen.

John Anderson, Sam Cook, Gwyn Edwards and Keith McDowell will venture to Sualbard, Artic Norway, the object being to explore part of one of the islands called Spitsbergen.

3/ The Kyak Konnexion.

Neil Shave, Alan Topping, Nick Moore and Dave Welham are planning to travel an average of 21 miles per day to cover 651 miles from Mainz in West Germany to Watford, England; the idea being to help celebrate the official 'twinning' of the two towns in 1956.

The Long River Canoeist Club...from John O'Groats to Lands End.

Paul Grigg, Simon Chivers, David Evans and David Thimbeby will paddle this 1,000 miles trip to raise at least £500 for the R.N.L.I.

5/ Round the Horn.

Over the Christmas period this year Barry Smith, Nigel Mathews, Frank Woodman and Jim Hargreaves will paddle south from Tierra Del Fuego to round Cape Horn to return northwards to the Beagle Channel. The purpose of this expedition is to demonstrate that canoes can tackle the most difficult waters and coast line in the world and survive.

6/ Aleutian Islands expedition. A trip being organised by Berek Hutchinson. 7/ An attempt to cross the Bass Strait between South Australia and Tasmania in January, 1978 to mark the occasion of the International Slalom and

Wild Water Championship being held in Tasmania.
