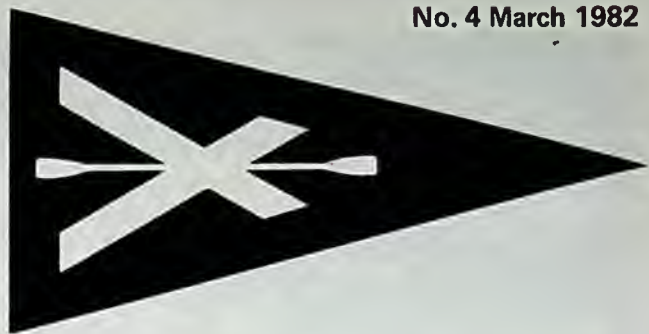

Canoe Polo - Championships

The Scottish Canoe Polo Championships were held on 30th January in the Hector McNeill Baths, Greenock, a change from the regularly used Infirmary Street Baths in Edinburgh.

The event was well attended with eight youth and eight senior teams entered. Several teams tried to get late entries which had to be refused as the draw had already been made. A useful lesson for next year, if you want an entry, enter on time!

And so to the competition. In the Youth Championships, Forth Youths once again triumphed with Port Glasgow High School A coming second. This result was perhaps predictable, but every credit must go to them for their preparation and practice which showed through in the end. The youth finalists were decided in the morning and we then moved on to the Senior Championship which took up most of the afternoon. For the first year the competition was not a straight knock-out competition, but was played as two qualifying groups with the top two groups in each section going through into semi-finals and then on to finals. This eliminated the possibility of people travelling up to 200 miles each way for a ten minute game of polo after being put out in the first round. As the qualifying rounds were drawing to a close, the tension could be felt amongst players and spectators alike. This was particularly evident in the deciding match for the first two places in Group 2 which ended in a 1-1 draw, the group being decided on the

number of goals scored by both the teams concerned. In the semi-finals the standard of play and competitiveness of play visibly improved as the teams

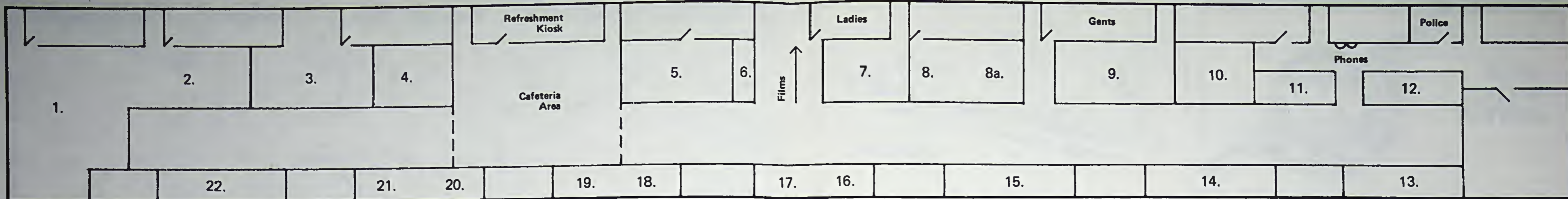

1982 Leukaemia Event

On Sunday, 6th June 1982 we are running a sponsored canoe event to raise funds for Leukaemia Research at Edinburgh Royal Hospital for Sick Children. The event will be run on the River Tay from Stanley to Perth, a distance of ten miles on grade 2/3 water.

The groups will be divided as follows:

1. Sponsored paddlers paddling purely for pleasure with the incentive of a new canoe as a prize for the paddler who raises and deposits the largest sum raised through their sponsorship.

2. Sponsored groups from Schools or Clubs paddling for pleasure with a new canoe as a prize and the Lennie Muirhead Memorial Trophy (to be held for one year) for the group raising and depositing the largest sum raised through their sponsorship. A group shall consist of not less than four and not more than eight paddlers.

3. The Donald Marshall Memorial Trophy — a race for the competitive paddler with the Trophy as first prize (to be held for one year). Entrants for this race must be sponsored or pay a £2 entry fee. Starting at Kinclaven Bridge this will be a ranking event.

Groups one and two will start between 10 am and noon and rescue boats will be in position at Stanley Weir and Thistle Brig.

Group three will start at 12 noon.

All paddlers must have a lifejacket/harishock, spray deck, helmet and paddle in groups of not less than three.

Graham Tiso will have a marquee at the finish where all

competitors and officials will receive a snack, free of charge.

To be considered for a prize all money raised must be deposited by the 4th July 1982 and bank receipt forwarded to above address.

I hope you will enter for this event and assist in raising funds for a worthwhile cause as well as promoting a greater interest in this sport. We are hoping for better weather this year so bring the family and make a day of it.

LOCH EIL KAYAK COURSES FOR 1982

 - Please print neatly.
 - Where on the entry card it asks "Slalom Promoted at . . ." you **must** quote either the slalom at which you were promoted to your present division (if during the current season) or your position on the ranking list in your present division. (see yearbook).
- Ensure your competition number is displayed correctly.
- Please co-operate if you are asked to assist with judging.
- Camp Sites** — Please keep them tidy and remember that after 11.00pm others may be trying to sleep.
- Local Community** — At many events small rural communities must feel they are being invaded, so please drive carefully on narrow roads and try not to "rub the locals up the wrong way".
