

SEASONAL POSTSCRIPT

This was thus the Silver Jubilee year of the Union. The sober result lists on the following pages of the various events held during the latter part of the season reflect the manifold activities in all branches of our sport which marked the year.

Our sailing fraternity in particular did us proud. At the sailing meet Great Britain—USA, our team retained the New York Canoe Club Challenge Trophy which we gained two years ago in the States. We had the honour of organising the first post-war Canoe Sailing World Championships, and our sailors excelling themselves not just by numbers and better boats but by the artistry of their watermanship, gained all the first seven out of 24 places.

Our LD people put British canoeing on the map by their fine performance in the Sella River Race in Spain. Out of 104 entries our pair P. Lawler and R. Still gained a fourth place preceded only by a Danish, Spanish and Swedish crew and followed by the teams from Switzerland, Germany, Luxembourg, France, Portugal, Mexico, Norway, Belgium and Italy, to name a few. The Worcester pair, E. Gagg and B. Cubberley who broke a paddle and capsized near the start, still came in 41st. In the singles event E. Owen came fifth, J. M. Woolley sixth and J. Richards, after a capsize, 14th out of 27 entries. In the international regatta at Aviles, preceding the Sella River Race, P. Lawler and R. Still gained a third place over the 1,000 metres distance and a second place over 500 metres against teams from Spain, Sweden, Belgium and Germany.

As far as sprint racing is concerned, it will take some time and a tremendous effort by all concerned before we will be able to live down the blow which British kayak racing suffered by not being represented in the European Championships in Poznan. On the home front we have not done so badly: the National Championships at Walton received a greater number of entries than for many years, and the Serpentine Regatta was the biggest ever. Entries for the canoeing events were up by over 100%. True: the larger number of entries was partly. but only partly, due to an invasion from abroad, and the Italian team ran away with the first prizes in all the events for which they could enter, but the greater number of home entries from all over the country, including for the first time an entry from Scotland, was heartening.

The European Championships in Poznan showed again the Soviet Union to be the leading racing nation in the world, followed by Hungary. However, to the surprise of competitors and spectators alike, Rumania who on previous occasions had proved herself to be particularly strong in the canadian events, this time also did very well in the kayak events. She gained a third place in the overall ranking list replacing the Federal German Republic who had to be satisfied with a fourth place. Good progress was shown by the Dutch team, and the performances of the Swedish team confirmed Sweden's leading position in Northern Europeeven in the absence of Gerd Frederiksson who this time came to Poznan as a Team Leader.

We have not been able to obtain a report on how our team did in the Cance Slalom and Wild Water World Championships and we must therefore let the results speak for themselves.

The Union will wind up the season with a Buffet Dance at the Star and Garter Hotel in Richmond on October 21. Have you ordered your ticket? If not, do so now by sending a remittance for 10/6d per person to Headquarters-there may be just a few tickets left.

CANOE INSURANCE

Is your canoe insured? If not, avail yourself of the comprehensive canoe insurance policy which the Union has effected with Lloyds. All types of canoes and gear are covered, and if required, camping gear and clothing normally carried can be included. All loss or damage, but not normal wear and tear and valuables, are covered, also third party liabilities up to £1,000 in the UK and Europe. The premiums range from 25/- to 45/per annum. Proposal forms are obtainable from Headquarters or club secretaries. During October both periods will be devoted to instruction in the Eskimo Roll. The charge for this will be 4/- per person per period.

During the remaining months the Tuesday period will be devoted to serious training in Slalom. The charge for this will be 2/6 per person per period. The Friday periods will be open to all comers, when practice can be continued in Eskimo Rolling. Swimming will also be allowed. Charges will be 1/- for bathers, or 2/6 for the use of canoes.
