LTPD Progress Report - Sept 1st 2005

Work on the LTPD project is going really well. We have a number of projects on the go that will make a real difference to paddlesport delivery across the UK.

LTPD Pathway Document:

The pathway document has been produced in glossy form and is available to BCU members for £5. This outlines the BCU vision for LTPD and was produced as a result of extensive consultation across our sport, but also under the guidance of Dr. Istvan Balyi himself! It outlines the kind of technical, tactical, physiological and psychological preparation paddlers should be doing at all stages of development and caters for all levels of ability. If you are involved in coaching or paddlesport delivery in any way – you should have a copy and be starting to implement the ideas into your everyday delivery. Coaching Young Paddlers Workshop:

The BCU workshop entitled "Coaching Young Paddlers" has been updated to include LTPD education material, especially relevant when working with young people. The resource book that accompanies the course also has a lot of information to help coaches and deliverers working with this age group. These workshops are run around the UK, contact your PDO, CDO or RCO to find out when these 2^o hour workshops are being run, or to organise one for a group of coaches, parents etc in your area. Attendance at these workshops counts towards the coaching element of update requirements.

Short Introduction to LTPD presentation:

These presentations are going to be run through the autumn coach update forums and include a brief summary of the model, with the opportunity to discuss how you could begin to implement these ideas into your coaching. Again contact your CDO, PDO, or RCO for details. If any groups of individuals would like a presentation to introduce the concepts of LTPD i.e. clubs or centres etc. Please contact LTPD project officer to make the necessary arrangements. Sports Coach UK 'Introduction to LTAD' Workshop:

Sports Coach UK run three LTAD specific workshops:

1. Introduction to LTAD – A 3 hour workshop based around Istvan Balyi's work, and the concepts that support LTAD. Aimed at those who have an interest in coaching or with little or no practical experience.
2. FUNDamental movement skills – A practical 3 hour workshop that introduces the concepts behind development of balance, coordination and agility as fundamental movement skills.
3. Managing Coaching within LTAD – A 3 hour workshop for coach managers and coaching development professionals responsible for the development of coaches.

Fundamental Paddlesport Skills Workshop:

An exciting new workshop that is looking into the development of basic movement and paddlesport skills is due out early in 2006. This will focus on the skills necessary for paddlers to create a union between themselves, the boat, paddle and the water around them, to such a degree that to an onlooker these components look as if they are working together as one. In order to achieve this the paddler must have an extensive repertoire of skills, many of which are established before the person sets foot in a boat! Topics such as balance, agility, co-ordination, active posture, being able to create powerful effective strokes and being able to react / feel the movement of the boat underneath the paddler will be addressed. Development work is currently being undertaken to ensure this is a cutting edge workshop and should help all coaches further understand the fundamental paddlesport skills required in all disciplines and at all levels.

eLearning LTPD test of knowledge:

Another exciting project that we are working on! This web based test of knowledge is being developed to include an eLearning site, followed with a test of basic LTPD knowledge. The test will result in a certificate if completed successfully and it is our intention to use it as a pre-requisite for other courses, and as an update option for coaches and providers.

New Book's out:

We have been working closely with Slim and Loel Collins on the new Canoe Games book, this should be out in the Winter, and



with an updated format is geared towards using games to promote quality skill development along the lines of LTPD amongst other things!

Also out, in spring 2006, is the new BCU Coaching Handbook. This has chapters on developing the key skills required in paddling and will help any paddlesport coach provide a better service and integrate LTPD into their work.

Discipline Specific Development:

Another key project being worked on at the moment is to encourage discipline development to support LTPD. This is in its early days at the moment but is likely to include reviews of competition structures, integrated calendar planning, multi-skills events, performance criteria and selection policy linked to LTPD in the competitive disciplines and development plans to facilitate the integration of LTPD.

'Preparing for a life in Paddlesport' Leaflet:

Sports Coach UK are producing a flyer for us to provide information about LTPD at an entry level. This is targeted at parents, coaches, clubs, administrators etc who are new to the concept of LTPD and follows on from a generic leaflet they have produced already 'Preparing for a life in Sport'. This should be available in the New Year.

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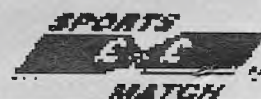

Update and New Courses from the BCU Lifeguards

'The following comes with an apology to the Lifeguards who had requested that this info be posted in the previous Code' - sorry guys I know you worked hard on this and wanted coaches to be aware of these developments'

BCU Primary First Aid

This is a 4-hour First Aid award aimed at providing BCU L1 and L2 coaches with an appropriate basic qualification.

We also recommend that this award's training course be used to revalidate coaches who have a current Aquatic First Aid Award. This would be in line with the way other First Aid awards are administered, eg the First Aid at Work (FAW) award. The initial training for FAW is a 4-day course and revalidation of a current award is achieved by attending a 2-day refresher course.

BCU Paediatric Resuscitation Award

This is a 2-hour course aimed at providing coaches, and other interested persons, with the skills and knowledge necessary to resuscitate children and babies.

NB - the international definition of a child in the context of resuscitation protocols is a person aged from 1 to 7 years old. From 8 years old onwards, adult resuscitation protocols apply.

BCU Aquatic First Aid

This award remains an 8-hour award. However, the syllabus has been amended to make it more relevant to the current needs and requirements of coaches 'working within reasonable distance of medical assistance'. There has not been a major 'dumbing down' of the award. The amendments merely reflect changes in protocol across the spectrum of NGB First Aid awards.

These awards have been evaluated and approved for use by the BCU Lifeguards Training Panel and BCU Lifeguards National Committee. They are adopted by the BCU and will be administered through the BCU.

Improving Access – A concern for us all

Without access to water our sport and our interest in assisting other people to develop their canoeing skills would be null and void. For us access to rivers and waterways are our lifeblood. Research has shown that canoes do not harm the wildlife or the water environment. We paddle over water quietly leaving no sign that we have passed.

Fact– Over 98% of rivers have NO access rights for the public - That means we do not have access to over 41,000 miles (65,000km) of rivers in England and Wales. Nearly all of the most beautiful inland rivers are not accessible to canoeists. It is in England and Wales where the problem exists.

So what are the BCU doing about it? - For years the BCU have tried to negotiate access rights to many rivers and they have been successful in getting 500 miles (812 km) of agreed access. It has been a long slow process. This is why the BCU feels that the long term aim for access has to be a new law.

DEFRA commissioned a major research project in 2003 concerning access to rivers and we are currently awaiting the publication of this latest research from the University of Brighton. (The Countryside Agency Access Demonstration Projects.) If we have received a response and (or) have been able to respond then you can find out all the information on our website www.riversaccess.org and in the next edition of Canoe Focus.

Even with the work being undertaken, raising awareness of the access issue is important for the BCU. This is in order to capture the most public interest when we respond to the Governments position on the findings. It is also essential to help keep the access issue alive and heading towards our aim. The Action on Access campaign has been renamed and relaunched with a new website to raise the profile of the campaign.
