Last year was one of great success and sadness.

The success has been with the paddlers, the sadness and readjustment with the organisation of our sport and perhaps only seen by those closely involved.

First of all our success in paddling. The results were outstanding throughout the year. In all classes at senior level, men and ladies kayaks, mens canoe we had world class performances from world class athletes. I was privileged to be at the World Championships in Belgrade to see the best ever overall performance of a British Team.

The readjustment was in the committee slowly changing away from a system where a virtually full time Chairman did most of the work of the section. The sadness of a steadily diminishing committee for personal, job or health reasons. In particular the death of Bruce Lucas was a severe blow to the Racing and Regatta Committee.

To look to the future. Here things look very promising, our paddlers at senior level must have every chance of medals in the World Championships and for the 1984 Olympics we will without any doubt be sending the strongest team ever. With the high level now being achieved at senior level the juniors performances are sometimes overlooked but there is a wealth of talent now emerging.

From the organisational side a number of people have offered their services for the various committees and with a shared load we can look forward with confidence.

Our major tasks ahead are in fund raising for our International paddlers to back their commitment and to develop a proper coaching scheme for flat water canoeing.

I hope during my term of office we are able to move forward on these two fronts. Good paddling to all.

The capital project for May 2nd this year is the Slalom Course at Holme Pierrepont, please give it your support, next year it might be a Marathon Scheme. This support and all your ideas and help will be most welcome.

I look forward with you to a continued expansion of enjoyment and activity this year in Marathon canoeing.

COMPETITION COACHES SCHEME

(RACING)

If YOU are keen to help competitors to succeed, this is for you.

Courses are open to all BCU members who are 18 years of age or over, be they competitors, non-competitors, parents or established instructors.

If you are hesitant about joining a 'formal structure' do not be alarmed - there is no compulsion to sit an examination or accept a 'qualification'. You are quite welcome merely to attend the courses.

Entry to the scheme is by direct application to the organiser concerned.

RACING TRAINER

This is aimed at those introducing paddlers to the lower levels of competition. It is designed to attract competitors and non-competitors, and also non-canoists such as parents of paddlers.

CONDITONS OF ENTRY

1. Be an individual BCU member (includes family membership)
2. Be 18 years of age or older
3. Pay the appropriate registration fee.

THE COURSE WILL COVER THE FOLLOWING -

- Paddler and/or handling skills and analysis
- Rules and tactics.
- Water reading and/or use of water.
- Equipment.
- Simple training programmes.
- Relevance of gym and weight training sessions.
- Trainer/paddler relationships.
- Canoe safety for trainers.

There is no formal assessment at this level.

On the successful completion of a trainers course the director will endorse the candidates coaching log book.

RACING COACH

This is aimed at those regularly involved in competition coaching within clubs

TRAINING COURSE

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY ARE THE SAME AS FOR THE RACING TRAINER.

THE COURSES WILL COVER THE FOLLOWING -

- The analysis of skills and techniques.
- Techniques, tactics and technical knowledge.
- Training programmes and peaking.
- Physiology of exercise.
- Cardiovascular training.
- Action of muscle and muscular development.
- Diet.
- Tests and measurements.
- Basic Psychology and motivation.
- Coach/paddler relationships and personality.
- Control and safety in the coaching situation.
- Outline of experience required and level of assessment.

ASSESMENT

Candidates who have satisfied all conditons of entry and training and have

gained experience to the level indicated to them on the training course are eligible to attend an assessment of one day duration. Candidates for Assessment must be B.C.U. Senior Instructors or exempted by the Director of Coaching*

They will be expected to have kept a log book, and the assessment will be based on:

An oral examination.

Practical coaching tests on specific aspects of the syllabus.

- * For direct entry at coach level, a candidate should be recommended initially by his club, or an established coach of the type concerned, to the Director of Coaching, who is empowered to issue a "certificate of exemption".

Successful candidates will be issued with a certificate. It will then be valid for five years from the 31st October following the assessment or appointment date, but always subject to the holder remaining a member of the BCU. It can be re-validated for further five year periods provided that the award holder submits a log of his/her competition coaching activity to the Director of Coaching to show that he/she has kept up with developments and that he/she still actively coaches.

THE 10,000 METRE AWARD

10,000 metres is a standard racing distance, competed over annually in the World Championships and is the longest distance raced under Racing conditions.

To be able to paddle 10,000 metres in a racing kayak or canoe without stopping is an indication of a fair degree of competence and paddling fitness. A paddler who can do so would feel that he or she could enter a regatta or race without being likely to disgrace himself or herself.

Any member of the B.C.U. coaching scheme may assess this test of competence in a K1 and may obtain badges and certificates (which he may fill in himself) at 40p including postage, the set from the Director of Coaching B.C.U. HQ.

It is suggested that the test should be made something of an occasion, the culmination of a Winter's training perhaps with spectators and an interesting course exactly the right length with notices every 1000 metres and so on.

The assessor must use his experience to ensure safe practice and the proper sort of safety regulations for the 10,000 metre course he is laying out.

SPORTS AID FOUNDATION

The Sports Aid Foundation is an entirely independent organisation, managed by a Board of Governors, who volunteer their services. In consideration of grants, the Governors are assisted by a committee of advisers who also volunteer their services. The committee includes members nominated by the Sports Council, and the Sports Council for Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland, under the Chairmanship and Vice Chairmanship of two independent members nominated by the Board of Governors.

The Sports Aid Foundation's ability to raise funds through voluntary donations, is entirely dependent upon their maintaining public goodwill. It is vital therefore that recognition is given at every opportunity, to their valued assistance. Any particular enquiries concerning the system and location of grant aid, should always be directed through your Liaison Officer to B.C.U. Head Office.

NATIONAL SPORTS AID FOUNDATION

International Grants are paid to paddlers who are likely to compete with distinction in major international competitions.

Those who are eligible will have their name put forward automatically by their Sports Aid Foundation liaison officer, and will be informed of the outcome of the application. Once an application has been made to National Sports Aid Foundation, no request to a Regional Sports Aid Foundation company should be made by or on behalf of that person.

REGIONAL SPORTS AID FOUNDATION

Regional grants are available to competitors resident within the area of the Sports Aid Foundation regional company. Paddlers must have already attained regional/county standard, and be expected to compete with distinction in:

- A. United Kingdom Championships.
- B. National Championships at senior and junior levels.

and who do not qualify for Sports Aid Foundation elite or international grants.

Applications in the first instance should be made to your regional BCU Secretary (name and address from BCU Headquarters).

PURPOSE OF GRANT

In both instances (international and national) help is given, in accordance with personal need, for the following items. Grants are always intended to help with preparation and training costs only. They are not to compensate for loss of earnings, or to act as an inducement to give up full-time employment.

1. ADDITIONAL costs incurred by the individual in lodging for training.
2. ADDITIONAL costs incurred by the individual for special food.
3. ADDITIONAL costs incurred by the individual for essential preparatory competition not otherwise grant aided.
4. Transport or travel for training.
5. Equipment - but only small items of personal equipment including confirmation that the items have been or will be purchased by the individual.
6. Coaching fees necessarily incurred by the individual.

To be in receipt of money from other sources does not disqualify from SAF grant. Amounts must be declared however, and may be taken into account when the amount of the grant is calculated by SAF. Please note also that all such money should be declared and administered through your Specialist Committee.

RACING ENCOURAGEMENT TESTS

1. These tests are designed to encourage paddlers to master the balance and paddling techniques required to race an international K1.
2. The tests should not be confused with Star or Proficiency Tests. They are not in any way related. Their sole intent is to encourage racing and marathon skills in single-seat international racing kayaks. They are for the use specifically of Racing Trainers and other members of the Coaching Scheme who wish to promote K1 paddling.
3. The existing Espada Award Scheme is not affected. These Racing Encouragement Tests are designed to help a paddler to the point where he or she is capable of entering a ranking race or regatta and thus undertake the 10,000 metre award or continue through the "Espada Awards". Full details of these are contained in the Racing Year Book.
4. Certificates are available in blocks of 10 at a cost of £1.00 to all qualified Senior Instructors or Racing Trainers, or above.
5. Examiners are asked to keep as nearly as possible to the draft syllabus.
6. Any amendments to these tests that may prove necessary in the light of practical experience will not be retrospective, and will not in any way affect candidates who obtain certificates.

TEST REQUIREMENTS

The fee for a Certificate is 20p. There is NO FEE payable for a FAIL.

The Test should be taken on still water, but may NOT be taken in a swimming pool. It is intended that seats should be used, but spray decks are not necessary for Grades I and II, and should NOT be used for Grade I.

For all tests candidates must be able to swim 25m in light clothing. Lifejackets to BSI 3595/69 or Buoyancy Aids to SBBNF and ICF requirements must be worn by all paddlers up to Grade III, and at all times for the purpose of the test by paddlers under the age of 18 years.

No part of the tests may be taken in a swimming pool.

More than one test can be taken at a time but grades should not be skipped. The candidate need only purchase the highest grade certificate.

Examiners should note that the tests are designed to determine skills required in marathon or paddle racing. The demonstrations should reflect this requirement, and not be judged against manœuvres employed in other forms of canoeing.

The tests may be taken in an Espada or any Class I International Racing K1.

SYLLABUS

GRADE 1

PRACTICAL

1. Paddle an Espada or any Class I International Racing Kayak a distance of 1000m (Seat may be dispensed with if absolutely necessary.)
2. Demonstrate 'flattening out' (using the blade as an outrigger).
3. Capsize and swim kayak ashore a minimum distance of 25m.
4. Empty the kayak properly, with assistance.

THEORY - Show a simple knowledge of basic safety.

GRADE 2

PRACTICAL

1. Enter and disembark from a reasonable bank (i.e. not more than 2' above the water).
2. Turn a complete circle in both directions by use of the rudder only.
3. Demonstrate an ability to move the boat sideways.
4. Paddle a measured distance of 100m using seat, in a time of 1 minute or less (still water).

THEORY - Show a simple knowledge of basic paddling stroke; racing classes for Marathon and Paddle Racing.

GRADE 3

PRACTICAL

1. Enter the kayak unaided (except for paddle) from knee-deep water.
2. Demonstrate an ability to slap for support.
3. Propel kayak with hands only for a distance of 20m.
4. Turn kayak 360° with alternate forward and backward sweeps. (Both clockwise and anti-clockwise).
5. Paddle backwards in a straight line a distance of 20m.
6. Paddle a measured distance of 3,000m in 30 minutes or less.
7. Empty waterlogged kayak unaided (unless precluded by physical inability).

THEORY - Show a simple knowledge of racing rules for regattas and marathons.

GRADE 4

PRACTICAL - To be conducted in a simple 2-knot current.

- A.1. Hold kayak steady against a 2-knot current.
2. Demonstrate a ferry glide (forwards only, both directions).
 3. Demonstrate turns using the current)break-in/break-out).

To be conducted in relatively still water

- B.4. Demonstrate an ability to paddle on one side only.
5. Carry out, with assistance, a deep water rescue of another capsized racing kayak.
 6. Tow a capsized canoeist a distance of 50m (both paddler and kayak.)

THEORY - Show a simple knowledge of race tactics; the organisation of regattas and marathons.

RACING SECTION CONSTITUTION

As submitted by the British Canoe Union Sprint Racing Committee for approval by the Annual General Meeting of the Sprint Racing Section held on Saturday, 29th January, 1977 and ratified.

1. Title The Section shall be called the British Canoe Union Racing Section.
2. Objectives To the extent to which it is authorised by the British Canoe Union (BCU) the Section shall control competitions in canoes and kayaks, over distances up to and including 10,000 metres, on racing courses which are designed to be as flat and still as possible, and in relation thereto shall -
 - 2.1 Organise and conduct National Championships and other competitions on behalf of the British Canoe Union.
 - 2.2 Draft Rules and Regulations.
 - 2.3 Select, train, and administer teams representing the United Kingdom and Channel Islands for international events.
 - 2.4 In co-operation with the National Coaching and Development Committee, train coaches and encourage and develop good coaching within regions and clubs.
 - 2.5 Train competition officials.
 - 2.6 Foster technical research and development.
 - 2.7 Act as a final authority in settling disputes.
3. Membership Shall be open to any individual member or affiliated member of the British Canoe Union.
4. Officers and Committees In order to carry out its objectives, the following officers and other committee members shall be elected:-
Members of:
 - 4.1.1 Chairman
 - 4.1.2 Secretary
 - 4.1.3 Treasurer
 - 4.1.4 A committee known as the Racing Committee (RC) consisting of the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer of the section, and not more than eight other Committee members.

Nominated Representative from BCU Regions, the WCA, CANI, SCA and other groups, with an interest in Racing, will be entitled to attend and speak at meetings of the Racing Committee at the expense of the nominating organisation.
 - 4.1.5 A member who is not a full member, or is a full time employee of the Union, or has a commercial interest in canoeing, shall not be eligible for election as an officer, or as a member of the Committee, other than as a non-voting co-opted member.

Period of Office:

- 4.2.1 The Chairman shall hold office for one year.
- 4.2.2 The Secretary and Treasurer shall hold office for two years and retire on alternate years, the secretary one year, the treasurer the next.
- 4.2.3 The members of the Committee shall retire after two years, half of them shall retire at the Annual General Meeting at which the Secretary retires, and the other half the following year.
- 4.2.4 All officers and members of the Committee shall be eligible for re-election.

Nominations:

- 4.3 Nominations of candidates for election shall be put forward in the form of a motion under the terms of paragraph. 6.6

Co-Options

- 4.4 The Committee may co-opt not more than three full members to its number (who shall have no voting rights).

Vice-Chairman:

- 4.5 At the first meeting of the Committee following the second part of the Annual General Meeting, the Committee shall elect a Vice-Chairman from amongst its members, to serve until the next Annual General Meeting.

Casual Vacancies:

- 4.6 In the event of a casual vacancy among the officers or members of the Committee, the Committee shall appoint another eligible person to act for an appropriate period, but not beyond the next Annual General Meeting.

5. Duties of Officers and Committees

The Racing Committee shall be responsible for the finances, and for carrying out the objectives of the Section as defined in paragraph 2. It shall, additionally, be responsible for appointing Team Management and Team Coaching personnel, and other specialist officers as from time to time may be required, and for defining their terms of reference. It shall have the power to set-up Sub-Committees, without prejudice to its over-riding control of the Section.

- 5.1 The Secretary shall keep minutes of the proceedings of General and Racing Committee meetings, report to the Annual General Meeting on the attendance of each officer and member at Racing Committee meetings held during the previous year, and carry out such other duties as the Racing Committee may from time to time direct.
- 5.2 The Treasurer shall keep such books of account as the MCB Council and the Racing Committee may from time to time direct.
- Expenses for attending Racing Committee and sub-committee meetings may only be paid to Elected, Appointed and Co-opted members.
- 5.3 Six members shall form a quorum at a meeting of the Committee.

6. General Meetings Annual General Meeting:

6.1 The Annual General Meeting (AGM) shall be held in two parts. The first part shall be at the time of the last competition held at the National Water Sports Centre, Holme Pierrepont, during September each year. The second part shall be held within one calendar month prior to the British Canoe Union Annual General Meeting.

6.2 Special General Meeting:

A Special General Meeting may be called at the discretion of not less than 10 affiliated members of the Section entitled to vote under paragraph 7. Such a direction must state in the form of a motion the business to be discussed and bear the signature of the members concerned and the name of their Club.

6.3 Right to Speak:

Only Full members of the British Canoe Union are entitled to speak at General Meetings.

6.4.1 Notice of General Meeting:

At least 14 clear days notice must be given of the date and place of a General Meeting.

6.4.2 In addition, every BCU affiliated member who has taken part in a National competition, as designated by the Committee, during the year, shall be sent a written notice of a General Meeting by first class post, addressed to the Secretary of the affiliated member organisation as recorded at the BCU Headquarters.

6.5.1 Business of General Meeting:

Only the business notified in the agenda accompanying the notice shall be transacted at General Meetings. Amendments must be kept within the terms of motions for consideration and the Chairman has power to refuse any amendment which subsequently alters the intention of the motion.

6.5.2 The business of the Annual General Meeting shall be, for the first part, to consider any motions on the Agenda in relation to paragraphs 2.3 and 2.4 of these rules, to receive any proposals from the Racing Committee concerning amendments to the Section Constitution, and to receive reports from Team Management and Coaching personnel and other specialist officers. For the second part, it shall be -

- (a) To receive the report of the Chairman
- (b) To receive the report of the Secretary
- (c) To receive the report of the Treasurer and to adopt the accounts.
- (d) To elect the Chairman
- (e) To elect the Secretary
- (f) To elect the Treasurer
- (g) To elect the members of the Committee
- (h) To consider any motions on the Agenda for the alteration of the Section Rules or which are in relation to paragraph 2.

6.6

Motions:

Any motion for discussion at the Annual General Meeting, not originating from the Racing Committee, must be signed by two full members of the BCU who are members of an affiliated member entitled to vote under paragraph 7, and shall be lodged with the secretary at least 21 days prior to the first part, and on or before the 1st December prior to the second part, in relation to each part of the Annual General Meeting respectively.

6.7

Quorum:

No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless a quorum of members is present at the time the meeting proceeds to business. 10 full voting members as defined in paragraph 7 shall form a quorum.

7. Voting at
General Meetings

Each affiliated member of the British Canoe Union whose membership consists of 12 individual members or more, represented at a General Meeting, and whose members have taken part in a national competition as designated by the Committee, shall have one vote.

7.1

Each affiliated member must be represented by a full member of the British Canoe Union who shall cast their vote.

7.2

No member shall be entitled to speak or vote at a General Meeting unless all monies due to the BCU by him, at that time, have been paid.

8. Amendments and
Decisions

A decision to alter the Racing Rules and Regulations can only be taken at a General Meeting, with a simple majority of the total number of votes cast.

8.1

A decision to alter any part of the Section Rules can only be taken at a General Meeting with a majority of two-thirds of the total number of votes cast.

8.2

Other decisions taken at General Meetings will be by simple majority of the total number of votes cast, unless otherwise specified in the Section Rules.

8.3

The Chairman shall have a casting vote only.

9. Financial Year

The Financial Year of the Section shall end on the 31st October. Prior to the second part of the Annual General Meeting, and at such other times as the Committee may think fit, the books and accounts shall be audited.

10. Advisory
Committee

Without prejudice to its over-riding control of the Section, the Committee shall establish -

10.1

Competition Committee:

A sub-committee responsible for selecting, training and administering the Olympic Training Squad and teams representing the United Kingdom and the Channel Islands for international events. This Competition Committee shall be composed of a Chairman and Members appointed by the Racing Committee, the Director of the OTS, the National Coach and Team Management personnel. Decisions of the Competition Committee shall be subject to ratification by the Racing Committee.

10.2

Regatta Committee:

A Sub-Committee responsible for organising and conducting

THE RACING RULES

Definition: Racing is competition in canoes and kayaks over a course as flat and still as can be obtained of distances up to and including 10,000 metres.

Although competitions may be organised for any craft the normal classes of boat will be the K1, K2, K2, and C1, C2, and C4.

Valid from 1st January 1978

1 GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. All competitions announced as National or Open competitions shall be held in accordance with the Racing Rules of the British Canoe Union. (This rule does not apply to closed or invitation competitions subject to Rule 4).
2. National competitions are organised by, or on behalf of, the B.C.U.
3. Open Competitions for which entrance fees are charged, over distances up to 10,000 metres, organised by a member of the B.C.U., a Club or Clubs affiliated to the B.C.U. or by an organisation outside the Union.
 - a. A STATUS COMPETITION is an open competition approved by the Racing Committee, for which a Regatta Permit has been issued (see Rule 6) and in which all or some of the events advertised, are for classes of kayaks and canoes as defined in Section II of these rules. Details of such competitions will be published by the Racing Committee in the B.C.U. Calendar, the Canoe Racing Year Book and other such publications as the Committee sees fit.
 - b. A NON-STATUS COMPETITION is an open competition in which none of the events advertised are for Classes of kayaks and canoes as defined in Section II of these rules.
 - c. Entry to an open status competition is restricted to members of the B.C.U. No non-members of the B.C.U. may compete in an open status competition unless exempted under Rule 7 and/or unless specifically permitted by the decision of the Racing Committee of the B.C.U.
4. Competitions are considered closed or Invitation Competitions if entry is restricted to named individuals; bona-fide members of an independent organisation or recognised clubs. The number of such clubs must not exceed three and for affiliated clubs Rule 5 applies.
5. Every Club affiliated to the B.C.U. shall state its affiliation in its competition advertisement and programme and declare that the competition is being held under B.C.U. Rules.
6. Application for a Regatta Permit shall be directed to the Hon. Secretary of the Racing Committee. Such a permit shall require:
 - a. Observance of the B.C.U. Racing Rules.
 - b. Inclusion of the words "Under B.C.U. Rules" upon all printed matter issued in connection with the competition.
 - c. Compliance with Section III rule 19.b regarding Regatta Officials.

If an organisation is not in possession of a Regatta Permit, then the competition is not considered an amateur competition under the B.C.U. Rules and anyone competing shall disqualify himself from competing under B.C.U. Rules until he or she has been reinstated by the B.C.U. Racing Committee.

7. Only members of the B.C.U. may participate in Open Status competitions held under B.C.U. Rules, with the following exception:

" An amateur is a sportsman who, having a basic occupation designed to ensure his present and future livelihood, devotes himself to sport as an avocation for his own pleasure and for his own moral and physical well-being without deriving therefrom, directly or indirectly, any material gain"

DEFINITIONS:- A competitor may not -

- a. be or have been a professional athlete in any sport.
- b. Have allowed his person, name, picture or sport performance to be used for advertising, except when his or her International Federation, National Olympic Committee or National Federation enters into a contract for sponsorship or equipment. All payments must be made to the International Federation, National Olympic Committee or National Federation concerned, and not to the individual.
- c. Have acted as a professional coach or trainer in any sport.

A competitor may:

- a. be a physical education or sports teacher who give elementary instruction.
- b. Accept, during the period of preparation and actual competition which shall be limited by the rules of the I.C.F.:
 - i) Assistance administered through his or her National Olympic Committee or National Federation for: food and lodging; cost of transport; pocket money to cover incidental expenses; insurance cover in respect of accidents, illness and disability; personal property, sports equipment and clothing; cost of medical treatment, physiotherapy and authorised coaches.
 - ii) Compensation, authorised by his or her National Olympic Committee or National Federation, in case of necessity, to cover financial loss resulting from his or her absence from work or basic occupation in the Olympic Games and International sports competitions. In no circumstances shall payment made under this provision exceed the sum which the competitor would have earned in the same periods. The compensation may be paid with the approval of the national federations or the National Olympic Committees at their discretion.
- c. Accept prizes won in competition within the limits of the rules established by the I.C.F.
- d. Accept academic and technical scholarships.

In all cases which are not covered by the above regulations, the corresponding rules of the International Olympic Committee shall apply.

9. When a competitor is a member of two or more clubs he shall, by March 1st, have declared the name of the club in whose colours he will race that year in individual events. In crew events that club shall have first claim on his service. A person joining a second club after March 1st must continue to race for his first club. A competitor who has changed his club is not permitted to compete for his new club unless prior consent of his old club has been obtained. The consent shall not be withheld in the case of a change of residence from one area to another.

10. No club or member of a club or individual member of the B.C.U. may compete outside the United Kingdom without permission from the B.C.U. Racing Committee.

11. No member of a foreign club may compete or be invited to compete in an open or national competition within the United Kingdom without permission from the B.C.U. Racing Committee. A foreign competitor shall normally be expected to have the sanction of his own National Federation unless he has been domiciled in the United Kingdom for two years or more. This rule does not apply to women competitors who leave their country of origin and acquire by marriage British nationality. In this case, they can compete without the delay of two years.

12. Within 14 days of the close of a competition a completed regatta programme with results and signed by the Competition Secretary shall be sent to the Records Officer of the B.C.U. Racing Committee for the records.

13. CLASSIFICATION OF PADDLERS

a. Youth - A Youth is a competitor under the age of 18 years on the 1st January, who has not been promoted to a Senior status class. On reaching the age of requirement for Senior status a Youth, not previously promoted, will be re-classified to an adult status class.

b. Novice - A Novice is a competitor over the age of 18 years on the 1st January who has not been promoted to a Senior Status class. (Only occurs in the canoe class).

c. Senior - A Senior is a competitor who has been promoted from Youth and is over 18 years on 1st January. Senior status competitors will be nominated to compete in one of the Senior classes as laid down from time to time by the B.C.U. Racing Committee. Entry to and promotion between Senior classes will be determined by results gained in competition at regatta venues nominated by the Racing Committee. A Senior status competitor may, at the discretion of the Racing Committee, be permitted to revert to a lower Senior class at the end of a regatta season.

d. Veteran - A Veteran is a competitor over the age of 35 years on the 1st January who is not already nominated to compete in the premier Senior Class.

d. Mixed Events - Mixed events in which male and female competitors take part, either in the same boat or in a competition with each other, are permitted.

f. Status - Status in Kayaks has no bearing on status in Canadian canoes and the converse, i.e. a premier Senior class competitor in Canadian canoes may be a lower Senior class in Kayak.

g. Special Rules for Kayak Fours - Senior status competitors may not compete in foursevents of a lower Senior class than that for which they are nominated as individuals. Senior status competitors may be members of four crews competing in higher Senior classes than their own without losing their individual Senior class status. A win in a fours event does not affect the status of the members of the crew.

h. Promotions - All promotions shall be at the discretion of the B.C.U. Racing Committee. Promotions shall normally be decided at the end of each season, although the B.C.U. Racing Committee shall be empowered to promote competitors during a competition season, should it so wish.

14. National Championship Entries - Entries for these events shall be restricted to British Nationals who are members of the B.C.U. Aliens resident in Great Britain for at least two years may be permitted to enter for a National Championship event except in the case of women competitors who conform to the reference to British nationality contained in Rule 11. At National Championship Regattas competitors may only enter one class or age group.

In International training and competitions it is forbidden to indulge in commercial publicity. Boats, accessories or clothing shall carry only the same trade mark symbols as corresponding articles on current sale. In all cases these symbols should not exceed 20 x 5 cm on boats and 10 x 3 cm on paddles and, in the latter case, only once on each face. Any boat or accessory which does not comply with the above mentioned conditions will not be acceptable.

In domestic training and competitions, commercial publicity is allowed, subject to the approval of the Racing Committee.

16. Construction.

a. Kayaks - All kind of building materials are permitted. Sections and longitudinal lines of the hull of the Kayak shall be convex and not interrupted. Steering rudders are allowed. The maximum thickness of the rudder blade must not exceed 10mm in the case of K-2 and K-1 or 12mm in the case of K-4, in cases where the rudder forms an extension to the length of the kayak.

b. Canoes - All kinds of building materials are permitted. Sections and longitudinal lines of the hull of the canoe shall be convex and not interrupted.

The canoe must be built symmetrically upon the axis of its length. Steering rudders or any guiding apparatus directing the course of the canoe are not allowed. A Keel, if any, must be straight, shall extend over the whole length of the canoe and not project more than 5cm above the hull. The C-1 canoe may be entirely open and shall not be covered more than 150cm from the stem and 75cm from the stern, reckoned from the outer edge of the stem or stern to the furthest point of the edge of the deck for the fore or aft decks respectively. The C-2 canoe may be entirely open, the minimum length of the opening shall be 295cm. The C-4 may be entirely open, but the minimum length of the opening shall be half of the boat length.

17. Measuring - The length of a kayak or canoe shall be measured between the extremes of the stem and the stern. Stem-bands or other protection of the stem or stern, if any are to be included. Any rudder forming a continuation of the length of a kayak not to be included in the measurement. The beam of a kayak or canoe shall be measured at the widest part. Rubbing strake, if any, is not to be included in the measurement.

18. Weighing - No alterations in canoes or kayaks are permitted after the measuring and weighing and before the competition has taken place. All loose outfits shall be removed. Permanent knee rests attached to the floorboard and buoyancy attachments consisting of water absorbing material must be absolutely dry at the first weighing prior to the race. Where possible in National Championships the first four boats in the final as well as all the boats which have qualified for a higher round shall immediately after the race be measured and weighed again.

III ORGANISATION OF THE COMPETITIONS

19. a. Officials - If its nature and extent so demand, each competition shall be held under the supervision of the following officials:-

Chief Official	Competition Organiser
Competition Secretary	Starter/s
Aligner	Course Umpire/s
15m Umpire	Finishing Line Judge/s
Turning Boat Umpire/s	Measurer/s
Timekeeper/s	Press Official
Announcer	

If circumstances permit, one person may function in two of the above offices. The Chief Official, Competition Organiser, Starter, Umpires and Chief Judge should if possible, be registered British Canoe Union Officials.

b. For status competitions two of the competition committee must be registered regatta officials of the B.C.U. Racing Committee.

c. Competition Committee - The top management of the competition shall be in the hands of a Competition Committee which shall consist of:-

Chief Official
Competition Organiser
One additional person who may be one of the other officials provided that his function allows him to be near the finishing line at all times. This person is appointed by the Chief Official.

The Competition Committee must:

- i) organiser the competition and supervise its arrangement.
 - ii) in the event of inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances which make it impossible to carry out the competition, postpone the competition and decide on another time when it may be held.
 - iii) hear any protests that may be made and settle any disputes that may arise.
 - iv) decide matters concerning disqualifications in cases where the regulations are broken during the competition. Should a competitor be injured during a heat, the Committee may allow him to participate in another heat or in the final.
 - v) The decision of the Committee shall be based on the racing rules. Penalties in accordance with the B.C.U. Rules may also be imposed i.e. disqualification for a longer period than the duration of the competition in question.
 - vi) before any decision is made regarding an alleged infraction of the rules, hear the opinion of the Umpire who controlled the race in which the infraction was said to have occurred. The Committee shall also seek the opinions of other officials in the race, if it is felt to be of importance in clearing up the alleged infraction.
- d. The Competition Jury - Final authority for National Championship competitions shall rest with a Jury composed of a Chairman and four members.

- i) The members of the Jury shall be appointed by a quorum of the Racing Committee prior to the commencement of the competition. (In the event of a quorum not being present, the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, or another official of the Racing Committee and two Committee members may appoint the Jury).
- ii) The Chairman of the Jury will be the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Racing Committee or an elected Racing Committee Member.
- iii) Subordinate to this Jury are the Chief Official and other officials shown in Rule 19.a.
- iv) Protests shall be referred to the Chief Official for decision by the Competition Committee in accordance with Rule 29.
- v) An appeal against a decision of the Competition Committee must be addressed to the Chairman of the Jury and be handed in not later than 20 minutes after the team leader has been informed, in writing by the Chief Official, of the decision against the competitor or crew and has signed the receipt.
- vi) The decision of the Jury is final.

e. Duties of the Officials

The Chief Official - who is also Chairman of the Competition Committee, shall observe and supervise the races and decide on all matters arising during the actual contest which are not dealt with in these rules. The Chief Official may disqualify any competitor who behaves improperly or who by his conduct or speech shows contempt towards the competition officials, other competitors or onlookers.

The Competition Organiser - is responsible for organising the competition and producing the competition programme. He should chair the Team Leader's Meeting, and is responsible for the smooth running of the competition and the general co-ordination of officials and competitors during the competition. When required to do so by the Competition Committee (or Jury in the case of National Championship competitions) he shall, with the assistance of the Measurer ensure that regulations concerning measurements are complied with. He shall make certain that the Announcer gives the onlookers all the necessary information about the races such as the order of starting, the name of competitors failing to start and the result.

The Competition Secretary - shall be responsible for recording the results of the races, arranging the draws for intermediate rounds and finals and distributing the results and draws to those officials who require them.

The Starter - decides all questions concerning the start of the races, and is alone responsible for decisions as to false starts. His decision is final. He shall see that the starting gun or pistol is in good working order. By means of a signal, he shall communicate with the officials at the finishing line, and after having received a signal from there that all is ready, he shall order the competitors to their places and carry out the start according to the racing rules.

Aligner - the duty of the Aligner is to bring the boats to the starting line with the least possible delay, to check the competitor's attire and the competition number on the back. When all boats are level he shall notify the starter by raising a white flag.

The 15m Umpire - will signal the Starter with red flag if one of the competitors has broken his paddle within area.

The Course Umpire - shall see to it that during a race the rules are complied with. If the rules are broken, the Umpire shall report the infraction to the Chief Official, who in turn shall refer it to the Competition Committee. The Competition Committee shall decide whether any of the competitors concerned shall be disqualified or not. If the Umpire has a report of an infraction of the rules he shall show a red flag after the race and shall make a report before the next race takes place. In such a case, the Competition Committee shall make known its decision immediately and before the result of the race is announced. If there is no infraction to report, the Umpire shall show a white flag. In races of 500 and 1,000 metres, the Umpire shall follow the race in a boat. He shall be completely unhampered during the race. No-one except the Umpire and his Secretary shall be admitted to the boat reserved for him. When a launch is not used, one or more Umpires shall be placed in such a position from which they can ensure that the rules are being complied with. In long distance races with many competitors, more than one Umpire may be nominated. One of the Umpires shall, if possible, follow the leading group in the race, but without disturbing the other competitors.

Turning Point Umpires - when a race is run along a course with one or more turning points, one or more Umpires and one Secretary must be stationed at every turning point, where they gain the best view of the turn. The Turning Point Umpire shall see that the competitors turn according to the rules. The Secretary shall make a list of all who pass the turning point. Immediately after the race, the Turning Point Umpire shall report to the Chief Official as to who has turned and if any infraction of the rules has taken place. The author. and duties of the Turning Point Umpire correspond with those of the Course Umpire.

Finishing Line Judges - decides the order in which the competitors have passed the finishing line. The Judges shall be placed at the finishing post. If the Judges differ regarding the placing of two or more competitors the dispute in the absence of photo finish, shall be decided by a simple majority. In the case of equal voting, the Chief Judge has the casting vote. When the photo finish is used the final decision should be co-ordinated with the results of the photo-finish. The Chief Judge shall inform the officials concerned in good time before a fresh race is started. The decision of the Judges is final.

The Timekeepers - are responsible for recording the times. This shall be done by means of stop watches. Before each individual race, the Chief Timekeeper shall see that the watches have been wound and tested and shall divide the work among the timekeepers. At the end of each race, he shall compare the official times with the other timekeepers and immediately inform the Competition Secretary of them. Each race shall be timed by at least two watches. When the watches have not recorded the same time, the longest (worst) time shall be taken as correct. The stop watches are to be started when the starting flag is lowered or when the smoke from the starting pistol or gun is visible, not when the sound of the shot is heard.

The Announcer - shall, on the instructions of the Competition Organiser, announce the start of each race, the order of the starting and the position of the competitors during the race. After the race is finished, he will announce the results.

The Press Official - must supply all the necessary information to the representatives of the press, radio and television about the race and its progress. He is authorised therefore to ask information from the different officials who must also procure for him as soon as possible the copies from the officials results.

20. Invitations - an invitation to an Open Regatta shall contain the following information:-

- a. Time and place of the regatta.
- b. Situation and plan of the course(s)
- c. Classes and distance of the races.
- d. Whether the races are to be held on still or running water, up or down stream.
- e. Amount of entry fee.
- f. Address to which entries must be sent and the final date for receiving entries. This date shall not be earlier than 14 days prior to the first day of the competition.

21. Entries - Entries for Open Regattas can only be made in accordance with the regulations given in the invitation. An entry shall, however, always contain the following information:-

- a. Name and address of competitor or crew.
- b. Name of club to which the competitor or crew belong.
- c. Classes and distances in which the competitor/crew propose to compete.
- d. Similar details of reserves, if any.
- e. The Racing Registration number of each competitor or members of the crew and reserves.

An entry may be telegraphed if it is despatched before midnight on the last day for receiving entries. Entry by telegraph must be confirmed immediately by letter and in the eventuality of conflicting information, the information by letter would take precedence. Late entries shall not normally be accepted. The acceptance of late entries shall be at the discretion of the Competition Committee who may charge up to double the entry fee.

22. Acceptance of Entries- Confirmation that the entry has been accepted, together with notification of the result of the draw and time of events, shall be sent to the entrant on written request by him and on production by the entrant to the Competition Organiser of a "stamped addressed" envelope. The final programme shall be available at the regatta course giving the names of the competitors, the sequence and approximate starting times of events.

23. Alterations to Entries and Withdrawals - Only those substitutes named at a Team Leader's Meeting or on the entry are allowed to replace the nominated competitors. Notifications of such substitutes must be made to the organiser at least one hour before the first race of the day. The withdrawal of an entry is considered final and no renewed entry of the same crew is allowed. Every competitor whose entry has been confirmed by his own club, at the time of the meeting of the Team Leaders called to confirm the entries is obliged to take part in the due event. If the competitor does not start, and has no valid reason approved by the Competition Committee, he shall be disqualified for the whole competition. A competitor who arrives too late at the start, shall be considered to have voluntarily withdrawn and shall be disqualified from taking any further part in the event, under this rule. The refunding of entry fees for entries withdrawn not less than 24 hours before the competition is at the discretion of the Competition Committee.

24. Alterations in the Sequence of Events - The sequence of races given in the programme and the intervals between the races as given in the racing programme are binding on the organisers. Alterations cannot be made unless the respective team managers at the competition give their consent.

25. Marking signs - For National Championships and where possible for other competitions the turning points shall be marked by at least six flags (or buoys) which shall be readily distinguishable and shall, if possible, be diagonally divided with one half in red and the other half in yellow. Both the start and finishing lines shall be marked with red flags (or buoys) at the points where these lines intersect the outer limits of the course. The 15 metres distance from the starting line from where the competitors can be called back according to Rule 33 (broken paddle) should be marked by flags.

26. Courses - Before the start of the races the racing course shall be measured and marked by means of clearly visible flags mounted on buoys. The course at the start shall permit a clear width, where possible, of at least 5 metres for each boat. For National Championships the starting and finishing lines shall be at right angles to the course. The finishing line shall be at least 45 metres long and be marked by two flags. The finishing line judges must be placed as near the finishing line as possible. For National Championships races up to 1,000 metres, the course shall be straight and in one direction.

For races exceeding 1,000 metres turning points are permitted. In this case the following conditions shall be fulfilled, (unless a special dispensation has been obtained from the Racing Committee):

- a. The distance between the starting line and the first flag of the first turning point shall be straight and at least 1,000 metres.
- b. The distance between the last flag at the last turning point and the finishing line shall be straight and at least 1,000 metres.
- c. The distance between the centres of the turns, shall be at least 1,000 metres. The radius of each turn should, if possible, be at least 40 metres.

For competitions other than National Championships these conditions should be complied with, where possible and Racing Committee approval for the course sought, through the Secretary.

27. Canoe Numbers - All kayaks and canoes shall carry a vertical number plate marked with black numbers on a yellow ground indicating the lane. The plates shall be placed on the centre line of the after deck (Canadian Canoe foredeck). The approximate size of the number plate shall be 18 x 20cm.

28. Instructions for Competitors - Written instructions shall be available for competitors 2 hours before the beginning of the competition, containing the following information:-

- a. Detailed information of the courses and their markings.
- b. Starting time.
- c. Starting line.
- d. Finishing line.
- e. Competitor's racing number.

29. Protests - A protest against the right of a crew to take part in a race shall be referred to the Chief Official not later than one hour before the start of the race.

- a. A protest made later - within 31 days from the date when the race in question was held - is only permitted if the officials of the club of the competitor making the protest can prove that the facts on which the protest is based, came to their knowledge later than one hour before the start of the race.
- b. A late protest shall be referred to the B.C.U. Racing Committee accompanied by the prescribed fee (see below).
- c. A protest made during a competition must be addressed to the Competition Committee and be handed to the Chief Official not later than 20 minutes after the Team Leader has been informed by the Chief Official of the protest against his competitor or team. All protests must be made in writing and be accompanied by a fee of \$1.00 which shall be returnable if the protest is upheld. If the protest is not upheld the fee may not be returned at the discretion of the Competition Committee.

IV. RACING REGULATIONS.

30. Disqualifications - Any competitor who attempts to win a race by any other than honourable means, or who breaks the racing regulations, or who disregards the honourable nature of the racing regulations shall be disqualified for the duration of the race concerned. Should a competitor have completed a race in a kayak or canoe which is shown upon inspection not to fulfil the classifications (see Rules 15 to 18), he shall be disqualified from the race in question. It is forbidden to receive during a race, outside help, or to be accompanied by other boats along the course - even outside the lanes - or by throwing objects into the course. All such acts shall entail the disqualification of the competitor/s concerned. For National Championships and where possible for other competitions all disqualifications by the Competition Committee have to be confirmed in writing immediately with the reasons. The team leader has to acknowledge the receipt on a copy with exact time, which is the start of the protest time.

31. Means of Propulsion - Kayaks shall be propelled solely by means of double-bladed paddles. Canadian canoe shall be propelled solely by means of single-bladed paddles. The paddles may not be fixed on the boats in any way. If a paddle is broken (except at the start; see Rule 33) a competitor may not be provided with a new one by a supporter.

32. Heats and Finals - At least three kayaks or canoes must be entered before a race can be held. If the number of entries in races up to and including 1,000 metres is so great that heats are necessary, the number of kayaks or canoes in each heat and in the final must not exceed nine. The division of competitors into heats shall be determined by drawing lots.

- a. (i) Where the width of the course permits, eight or nine kayaks or canoes shall participate in the final, (if more than this number have been entered in the entire race the recommended procedure is:-

3 to 9 entries,	direct final.
10 to 11 entries,	two heats and four from each to final.
12 to 27 entries,	three heats and three from each to final.
over 27 entries,	required number of heats and three intermediate heats. Three from each of the intermediate heats to the final.

- a (ii) The division into heats must be made in such a way that at least three competitors proceed to the final (or intermediate heats) from each preceding heat.

- b. When making the draw, the difference between the number of competitors in the heats of the race shall not exceed one.
 - c. If the number of competitors in the heats varies, the earlier heats shall have the largest numbers. Any crew which has not taken part in a heat as instructed shall not be allowed to compete in the final. The composition of a crew which has qualified for intermediate heats or for the final must not be changed.
 - d. Heats and the final shall be run on the same stretch of water. Participation in the final must not depend upon times attained in the heats. For races of more than 1,000 metres, heats shall not be held, and all canoes taking part shall start simultaneously.
 - e. Should the width of the water not permit a simultaneous start, starts at regular intervals shall be permitted.
33. Start - Lots shall be drawn to determine the stations of boats at the start. Number one shall be placed on the left, then number two and so on. In competitions where heats are required, lots must be drawn for each heat separately (Opening, intermediate and final).
- a. Competitors shall be at the start at the time specified in the racing programme. The start shall be given without reference to any absentees.
 - b. The position of the boats at the start shall be such that the bows of the competing boats are on the starting line. Boats must be satisfactory.
 - c. The Starter shall give the starting signal by the word "Ready" to be followed by a shot. The shot can be replaced by the word "Go".
 - d. When races start from a pontoon or dock an assistant holds the stern of the boat and releases it on the word "Go" (shot).
 - e. If the competitor starts paddling after the word "Ready" and before the shot has been fired, he has made a false start. The Starter must immediately warn the offending competitor/s and if two false starts are made by the same competitor/s the Starter must exclude him (her) from the race. All crews making a false start and not only the competitor(s) who caused the false start shall be subject to the same penalties. Any competitor who disregards the second warning of the Starter to take up the correct position at the start, and who keeps ahead of the other competitors, shall be excluded from the race in question.
 - f. Should any competitor break his paddle within 15 metres from the start, the Starter shall immediately call back all competitors, and a new start shall be made after the broken paddle has been replaced. The team managers of the competing teams are responsible for having reserve paddles available at the start for their respective teams. The recall shall be made by means of a second shot.
34. Interruptions- The Umpire has the right to interrupt a correctly started short distance race if unforeseen hindrances arise. Such an interruption may be effected in the same way as is prescribed for recall in 33 above. The competitors must immediately stop paddling and await further instructions.
- If a race is declared null and void, no change of the composition of a crew is permitted at the new start. In the event of a capsized competitor or crew is eliminated from the race if he or they are not able to get in again without outside help.

35. Taking Pace and Hanging - Taking pace or receiving assistance from boats not in the race or by any other means is not permitted. When a race is in progress crews not taking part in the race are strictly forbidden to proceed over whole or part of the course, even outside the marking buoys.

a. Races up to 1,000 metres - In races up to 1,000 metres competitors must keep their lane from the start to the finish of the course. It is forbidden to hang, and no competitor must come nearer than five metres in any direction to another competitor and derive benefit from his wake.

b. Races of more than 1,000 metres distance - In races over distances of more than 1,000 metres competitors may deviate from their lane, providing they do not impede other competitors. Over the last 1,000 metres the rules as for races up to 1,000 metres, in particular the 5 metre rule, apply. In long distance races every competitor shall be warned by a sound signal (e.g. a bell) when he passes a point 1,000 metres from the finishing line.

36. Turns - When a race is run on a course with turning points, these shall be passed to port (i.e. in an anti-clockwise direction). When going around a turning point, the competitor on the outer course must leave room for the competitor on the inner course if that competitor has the bow of his boat at least level with the front edge of the cockpit of the boat on the outer course. With respect to K-2 and K-4, this refers to the fore-cockpit. With respect to C-1, it refers to the level of the competitor's body, and for C-2 it refers to the level of the body of the foremost member of the crew. A competitor will not be disqualified for touching a turning point buoy, unless, in the opinion of the Turning Point Umpires, an advantage has been gained therefrom. In making a turn, the boat shall follow as closely as possible the course as marked by the buoys at the turning points.

37. Overtaking - When a canoe or kayak is overtaking another canoe or kayak in a race, it is the duty of the overtaking craft to keep clear at all times of the boat being overtaken. On the other hand, the craft being overtaken is not allowed to alter its course to make difficulties for the overtaking craft.

38. Collision or Damage - Any competitor who collides with another, or who damages the canoe or kayak or paddle of another can be disqualified.

39. Finish - The finishing line is reached when the bow of the canoe or kayak with the competitor/s on it has passed the line between the red flags. If two or more boats reach the finishing line at the same time they get the same classification.

40. Racing Colours - A competitor or crew must not change their racing colours during a competition.

V. SPECIAL RULES FOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS.

41. Only members of the B.C.U. who qualify under Rule 14, may participate on National Championship Events. The only exceptions to this rule are those exempted by the B.C.U. Racing Committee under Rule 11.

42. All canoes and kayaks must comply with the classes and building rules as laid down in Section II of these rules.

43. Officials - Fully in accordance with Rule 19a 19b and 19c.

44. Competition Committee - Fully in accordance with Rule 19c.

45. Competition Jury - Fully in accordance with Rule 19d.

46. Marking Signs - In accordance with Rule 25.

47. Courses:- In accordance with Rule 26.
48. Disqualifications:- In accordance with Rule 30.
49. Heats and Finals:-

In the event of their being less than six kayaks or canoes in a National Championship Final then a National Championship Medal will only be awarded to the winner.

National Championships and other competitions on behalf of the British Canoe Union, and training competition officials. This Regatta Committee shall be composed of members as may from time to time be determined by the Racing Committee. Decisions of the Regatta Committee shall be subject to ratification by the Racing Committee.

10.3

Finance Committee:

A sub-committee responsible for approving the expenditure programmes of all other sub-committees; monitoring such expenditure and advising the Racing Committee on matters of general financial policy. The Finance Committee shall be responsible for the production of the Section Year Book and other Racing Publications that may from time to time be required.

The Finance Committee shall be composed of the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer of the Section: The Chairman of the Competition Committee and the Chairman of the Regatta Committee. Decisions of the Finance Committee shall be subject to ratification by the Racing Committee.

11. Appointment of Committee Officials

The appointment of officials by the Racing Committee within the terms of paragraph 5, shall be subject to the approval of the Annual General Meeting of the Section (1st Part).

RACING REGISTRATION SCHEME

INTRODUCTION

The Racing Registration Scheme was introduced in 1977 by the Racing Committee who were concerned over the lack of an efficient communication system between the Committee, Competitors, Officials and Regatta Organisers and its inability to ensure that only B.C.U. members competed at Regattas. The Committee now feels that these shortcomings are being partly over-come by the operation of the Racing Registration Scheme. The Scheme also enables the Committee to establish exactly how many active Racing Canoeists there are in the country, at any one time, and more importantly, be able to contact them, individually whenever the need arises.

Additionally with the installation of the computerised race timing system at the Holme Pierrepont Water Sports Centre the registration number will be the unique numerical identifier for each paddler for programming of the computer to take place.

Only registered competitors will be allowed to compete in regatta committee events at Holme Pierrepont and/or B.C.U. National Championship events.

INITIAL REGISTRATION

All Racing Canoeists competing at the National Watersports Centre Regattas or in National Championship events are required to register with the Racing Committee. This may be done at the Canoe Exhibition held in February each year, or at the first N.W.S.C. regatta attended during the season, where the registration desk will be open for one hour on each day. Youth paddlers who are not members of the B.C.U. will be required to become Cadet members of the Union at a cost of £2.50.

For other competitors, registration will only be carried out on production of a current B.C.U. membership card. Each competitors details will be entered on the register (name, address, club, racing status, B.C.U. No. etc.)

For those competitors who are not B.C.U. members, they can become 'instant' members on payment of the appropriate B.C.U. subscription and completing the application form which can be obtained at the registration desk.

RENEWAL OF REGISTRATION

Registered competitors will remain on the register and retain their racing number until such time as they have not actively competed for two years or their B.C.U. Membership lapses.

Youth paddlers who initially register as Cadet members will remain on the register but should of course join the B.C.U. as full Youth members at the end of their first year. The Registration Officer should be informed of their new B.C.U. Membership number.

TEAM LEADERS HANDBOOK

This section deals mainly with the responsibilities of the Club Team Leader, but will provide a guide on regatta procedures that could be usefully studied by ALL competitors.

SUMMARY OF OF A TEAM LEADER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

ADVERTISE THE REGATTA TO YOUR MEMBERS.

SEND ENTRIES IN ON TIME ON THE OFFICIAL FORM (KEEP A CARBON COPY OR PHOTOSTAT COPY OF YOUR ENTRIES)

CORRECT ENTRY FEES INCLUDED.

S.A.E. ENCLOSED FOR A TIME TABLE; S.A.E. ENCLOSED FOR RESULTS.

CHECK TIME TABLES FOR CLASHES/PROBLEMS.

COLLECT PROGRAMME ON FRIDAY, IF POSSIBLE **AND CHECK THAT EVERY ENTRY HAS BEEN MADE.**

BE AT THE TEAM LEADER'S MEETING ON TIME.

MAKE SCRATCHES/SUBSTITUTIONS/LATE ENTRIES.

INFORM YOUR PADDLERS OF ANY CHANGE IN EVENTS OR PROGRAMMES.

ENSURE THAT YOUR PADDLERS STUDY THE PROGRAMME INFORMATION PAGE, AND ENSURE THAT YOUR PADDLERS ARE FAMILIAR WITH THE RACING RULES GOVERNING BOTH COMPETITION AND CONDUCT AS PUBLISHED IN THE CANOE RACING YEAR BOOK.

BE AVAILABLE DURING THE REGATTA TO RECEIVE NOTIFICATION OF DISQUALIFICATIONS.

PUT RESULTS UP ON YOUR CLUB NOTICE BOARD.

ENSURE THAT ALL PADDLERS JOIN THE B.C.U. AND REGISTER AS RACING PADDLERS.

ENCOURAGE PARENT/SUPPORTERS TO CONSIDER BECOMING REGATTA OFFICIALS.

ENSURE YOUR YOUTH PADDLERS (IN PARTICULAR) ARE FULLY AWARE OF THE SAFETY MEASURES AT REGATTAS.

ENSURE YOUR CLUB MEMBERS OBSERVE CAR PARKING REGULATIONS.

NOTES FOR TEAM LEADERS

1 APPOINTMENT

Club Secretaries must inform the Race Records Officer who is the Team Leader (and if you wish a nominated reserve) before 1st April each year. If a club is to be represented by another person at a N.W.S.C. regatta organisers should be informed by the approved Team Leader, preferably when the entries are submitted.

2 COMMUNICATION

At ALL regattas organisers will only communicate with the Club Leader or his nominated reserve.

This means in respect of

- (i) Making entries.
- (ii) Making late entries.
- (iii) Communication from the Organisers to his club paddlers - including disqualification.
- (iv) Making Protests.
- (v) Receiving Results (if envelopes provided).

3 SAFETY

The Team Leader is primarily responsible for the Safety of his club members. You should ensure that your paddlers are:-

- a. Suitably dressed for the weather, water and race conditions.
 - b. Are able to perform basic capsize drills and are briefed on what to do when approached by a safety boat.
 - c. Able to swim at least 50 metres, in wet clothing, without a life jacket.
 - d. That all canoes are fitted with buoyancy bow and stern sufficient to ensure the canoe will remain afloat and support the crew in the event of a capsize.
 - e. That all competitors in Junior or Youth classes are in possession of a life jacket or buoyancy aid which conform to the standards of the I.C.F. or S.B.B.N.F.
- IN THE EVENT OF COLD AND/OR WINDY CONDITIONS THE ORGANISERS MAY AT THEIR DISCRETION CANCEL OR POSTPONE A RACE, OR INSIST ON THE WEARING OF LIFEJACKETS OR BUOYANCY AIDS.

4 ENTRIES

Please note all the information on Page **58** of the Year Book.

PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU USE THE OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM (or a photocopy).

5 NOTES ON CLASSES

Please study the racing rules carefully for notes on racing classes.

The following notes explain procedures currently adopted by the regatta committee within the framework of the racing rules.

- (a) A Youth may race in Sen A or Sen B or Sen C Class but NOT in the SEN D Class.
- (b) A Junior/Novice class is one in which the Junior and Novice paddlers are combined (Only occurs in the Canoe).
- (c) PROMOTIONS from one class to the next, e.g. Senior B Men to Senior A Men or ~~Womens~~ B to Senior A Women is normally done at the end of a season on the basis of a competitors results.
The only exception to this is -

SEN D. MENS KAYAKS

During the season the winner of the SEN D Men K1 500m and K1 1000m at any N.W.S.C. regatta will be promoted to Senior C men for subsequent regattas.

- (d) STATUS of a paddler in a Kayak Class has no bearing on his status in a Canadian Class.
- (e) MIXED EVENTS in which Male and Female competitors race together in the Mens Classes are permitted.
- (f) OPEN EVENTS. In most distance events (i.e. 10,000, 6,000 and 3,000m) except for National Championship events it will be necessary to combine classes if these events are to be fitted into the programme at all.
i.e. Youth Men 6,000 may race with Girls and Senior A women 6,000 as well as Canoes with Kayaks.
Except for National Championship events the organisers reserve the right to combine any long distance events of the same length.
- (g) AGE GROUPING - change on the 1st January of each year.

FOR EXAMPLE:-

CLASS	AGE on 1.1.83	BORN
VETERAN	OVER 35	1948 OR EARLIER
SEN.D.	OVER 18	1965 OR EARLIER
YOUTH U18	UNDER 18	1966 OR LATER
YOUTH U17	UNDER 17	1967 OR LATER
YOUTH U15	UNDER 15	1969 OR LATER
YOUTH U13	UNDER 13	1970 OR LATER

If you are in any doubt about a paddlers class please consult the Records Officer.

6 ADVICE ON ENTRIES

With the exception of Youths in SEN. D. class Paddlers may race in a more senior class by Status, or age group IF THEY WISH, but they may find there are clashes of races if they enter for more than one class.

For National Championship events paddlers are only allowed to race in one class.

Event organisers will arrange the programme so that all the events in each class (e.g. Senior B Men, Boys C etc) are well spaced out, usually a minimum of 40 minutes between successive races.

There is no reason why a paddler should not enter all of the races in their particular class. IN FACT WE WOULD ADVISE THAT IT IS BETTER TO KEEP YOUNG PADDLERS OCCUPIED BY ENTERING THEM FOR ALL THE EVENTS IN THEIR CLASS RATHER THAN HAVE THEM BORED OR FED UP BECAUSE THEY DO NOT HAVE ENOUGH EVENTS IN WHICH TO COMPETE.

7 CHECK YOUR PROGRAMME

- Prior to the Team Leaders meeting it is essential for each team leader to make a careful check of all his entries. It is best to keep a carbon or photocopy of your entry for this purpose.

- If there are any omissions or if you wish to make substitutions mark your programme, since the Team Leaders meeting goes VERY QUICKLY.

It is not uncommon for the regatta organisers to make a few mistakes with the entries BUT IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO CHECK THE PROGRAMME.

Once a race has been passed during the Team Leaders meeting it is not normal to go back.

8 TEAM LEADERS MEETING

Introduction - It is the intention to hold only one Team Leaders' Meeting per Regatta, at 8.00 am. on the Saturday in the Lecture Room. If the meeting cannot be completed in a reasonable time it will be adjourned and the time of the adjournment announced (usually 7.30 am Sunday morning).

Each club must nominate ONE representative to deal with alterations and late entries at the Team Leaders Meeting. The nominated representative will be responsible for all money owed for the entries he submits; THIS MONEY MUST BE PAID BY 12.00 ON THE SATURDAY-

Failure to pay by 12.00 Saturday will incur a £5.00 surcharge which must be paid by the end of Racing Saturday.

Failure to pay completely by the end of Racing Saturday will result in ALL paddlers from the clubs concerned disqualified from Sunday's racing.

PROCEDURE

- a). Team Leader signs in on arriving.
- b). The Meeting will commence promptly at 8.00 am.
- c). Technical announcements.
- d). If there are any objections to the order of events - they must be raised at this stage of the meeting.
- e). Late entry provision:-
 - i) Events will be dealt with in order.
 - ii) The Competition Director will call out in order each set of Heats (or Finals if there are no heats). Team Leaders should scratch any competitors who do not intend to race or make a suitable substitution (see Rule 23 shown at 12a). They should call out the lane number first and then the competitors name/s.
 - iii) If there are vacant lanes the Competition Director will ask Team Leaders to raise one hand for each late entry. If there are more late entries required than there are vacant lanes a draw will take place.
 - iv) It is not permitted to return to an event which has been concluded.

9 ENTRIES AFTER THE T.L.M.

- Entries after the Team Leaders meeting for lined races will only be accepted in exceptional circumstances, at the Competition Directors discretion.

LATE ENTRIES FOR LONG DISTANCE RACES

- Late entries will be accepted for Long Distance Races up to one hour before the race ON PAYMENT OF THE APPROPRIATE LATE ENTRY FEE.

Entries can be made on the form as shown below.

10 PROTESTS/DISQUALIFICATIONS

Notification of disqualification will always be made to a Club Team Leader, or his nominated reserve.

Except in National Championships events there will be no appeal against disqualification.

In a National Championship event a protest must be made by the paddlers' Team Leader.

Team Leaders should realise that it is impossible to adequately umpire all races in every regatta. Where infringements are observed by an umpire this will be reported to the Chief Official, who if necessary, will inform the paddlers' Team Leader.

Often however, infringements will not be observed by the umpires and Team Leaders should realise that they have a responsibility to explain the situation to young paddlers who may easily become frustrated by what appears to be an arbitrary system of justice.

11 K2/K4 NAMES

The names of crew boats entered at the T.L.M. or substitutions and last minute changes of crewnames may be made up to 20 minutes before the event in question.

Any crew which has not notified the full list of names, will be allowed to start, but they will not appear in the result, nor will they go into the next round of the draw.

Paddlers who take the place of another paddler, without the proper substitution, will be disqualified for the remainder of the regatta.

Notification of crew names must be to the REGATTA OFFICE **20 MINUTES** before the event.

12 RESULTS

If a copy of the results is required, please send a stamped S.A.E. marked results with your entry, or leave an addressed envelope and appropriate postage at the regatta office.

13 LOAN OF K4,S

Eight K4's will be available from the Raft Marshall. They will be available for RACES ONLY, not for practice.

- a). They will be stored on trestles in front of the Raft Marshall's office.
- b). Crews must not sit in the K4's EXCEPT WHEN THEY ARE ON THE WATER.
- c). Young paddlers must be supervised by a responsible adult when handling the fours onto and off the water.
- d). Check your K4 before you use it. If it is not in order please report the fact to the Raft Marshall and the crew that previously used the boat will be held responsible.
- e). K4's can be booked for any race during the course of the day as soon as the raftmarshall's office is open.
- f). Crews must leave £1 deposit, in return for a set of wingnuts and toggles when they report to collect the boat they have booked.
- g). Crews MUST use the boat allocated.

14 CAR PARKING

Team Leaders MUST take an active part to see that club members observe the car parking lines, and no vehicles on the course road ruling.

Failure of competitors to observe these rules will result in centre charges for barrier marshalls which will mean higher entry fees.

PROMOTION OF REGATTAS AT REGIONAL AND CLUB LEVEL

At the Regatta Officials Symposium in November 1981 it was agreed that the National-scale events held at the National Watersports Centre in Nottingham, were becoming increasingly difficult to organise as the number of competitors continued to grow. Problems will arise in the 1983 season fitting extra classes into the programme, and eventually there will come a point when it will be necessary to limit the entry in some way.

When we arrive at that stage, there will be some competitors who find that they have no sprint events to go to, unless we prepare NOW for this situation. It was therefore considered how we could best encourage clubs and regions to organise more low-key regattas in their own area.

Although the Regatta Committee have always been willing to help any prospective organiser, it was felt that something more positive needed to be done, especially in regions where sprint racing is already thriving. Representatives were nominated from among experienced officials to be the advisor/promotor for each separate region. It was hoped that these representatives would initially give active help and encouragement to clubs within their region and aim to instigate at least one new sprint competition in their area each season.

By way of practical help a small booklet has been produced which gives some basic instruction and advice on how to organise a simple regatta: this should shortly be available from any of the regional representatives listed below.

Much controversy arose during the 1981 season over 'Regatta Levies' and the Racing Committee agreed with the Regatta Committee that it was inappropriate to collect levies from club/regional events, and that the money would be better spent promoting local competition.

Initially equipment such as boat numbers, loudhailers etc. may present problems to a prospective organiser. Again, the Regatta Committee would in many cases be able to loan such equipment, and would do so through the nominated representative.

During last season, some club organisers felt that the BCU racing rules were, in their current form, too flexible to allow low-key regattas to be organised in accordance with the rules 1-7. Consequently proposals for revisions are in hand. However, the Racing Committee expressed the opinion that it was too early to rewrite the constitutional changes needed, and agreed for the 1983 season that the rules in question should be relaxed to whatever extent was necessary to promote local competition.

1 DIRECTIONS

Holme Pierrepont National Water Sports Centre is sign-posted on all main roads leading into NOTTINGHAM. It is situated off the main A52 road on the Grantham side of the city.

2 ENTRIES

- a)- Entries must be made THROUGH YOUR CLUB LEADER and submitted on the new official entry form (or a photocopy).
The new race entry form will require paddlers registration numbers and it is essential that the correct form (or a photocopy) is used, because it is intended to use the registration numbers for the compiling of the regatta programme during the 1983 season, using the N.W.S.C. Computer/ Timing System.
Entries for Individual Club Members sent in on their own behalf are NOT ACCEPTABLE.
- b)- Entries received without the correct fee will be charged as LATE ENTRIES.
- c)- All paddlers must be Registered.
- d)- **NO TELEPHONE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED**
- e)- The Closing Date for Entries is normally on the FRIDAY eight days preceding the event. Any entries arriving after the closing date must be made by the club leader at the Team Leaders meeting.
- f)- Timetables, against which you can check clashes of entries, will be posted to all Team Leaders who enclose a S.A.E. with their entries.
- g)- Programmes will be on sale at the Centre Reception Desk on Friday evenings of the regatta week-end.

5 CANOE STORAGE

There is no overnight canoe storage available in the boathouse. We advise that all canoes are removed to the campsite on Saturday night. All canoes on the outside racks at the Centre are left entirely at the owner's risk.

6 CLUB COLOURS must be worn by all competitors in ALL events at the N.W.S.C.

- a) In K4 crews where more than one club is represented, paddlers must wear the colours for the club in whose name they are registered.
- b) Paddlers not registered with a club must wear a plain white vest or shirt with NO MARKINGS OR LOGO.
- c) Clubs racing for the first time at the N.W.S.C. may request exemption from this rule by application to the Competition Director - but must register their colours before taking part in subsequent events at the N.W.S.C.

7 HOURS OF RACING are normally -

SATURDAY	10.00am - 7.00pm
SUNDAY	9.00am - 5.00pm.

8 NUMBERS

It is a requirement that clubs must provide their own numbers as prescribed in the racing rules for races up to 1000m in length.

Both sets of numbers from 1 to 9 and suitable mountings that can be fixed to Canoes or Kayaks are available from the Competition Office.

As from the April Regatta 1982 numbers issued for all long distance events will be of the type that fix into a slot (which all competitors are now expected to have fixed to their boats).

These numbers will be available from the Raft Marshal and will be issued to TEAM LEADERS ONLY. A £5 deposit must be left by every club collecting numbers, regardless of the quantity collected. This money can be reclaimed on Saturday evening when all numbers are returned, or left with the Raft Marshal to cover for numbers which will be required for Sundays racing. It would then be returned to club officials when Sundays numbers are returned.

LOST NUMBERS These will be charged at 75p per number.

A form will be available at the Team Leaders Meeting for Team Leaders to complete to order their long distance race numbers in advance. This form should be taken to the Raft Marshals office. He will then make up your requirements for the day, which you then may collect later in the morning (after 11.30).

PLEASE ENSURE THAT ALL KAYAKS/CANOES ARE FITTED WITH NUMBER SLOTS.

CAMPING

An excellent Camping Site is now available at the centre, containing toilets, showers, washing facilities, and ample water and waste disposal points.

The site is open to all competitors, officials and supporters and no pre-booking is required.

RATES for the 1983 season are likely subject to approval by the Centre management committee to be:-

For a Caravan or Motor Caravan..... £2.30 Per night.
For a Tent Pitch..... £1.50 Per night.

NOTE: A tent pitch is intended for a Frame tent and thus therefore represents a very cheap rate for 4 or more people.

If small (i.e. hiking) tents are used two tents may share one pitch. They will only be charged £1.50 each for 2 nights.

N.W.S.C. DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES

To try to clarify regatta disciplinary procedures the following guidelines will be followed for all National Water Sports Centre Regattas during the 1983 Season.

If they prove successful, proposals to alter the Racing Rules will be put to next year's Annual General Meeting in the light of this year's experience.

It is hoped that these procedures will be helpful to Team Leaders, paddlers and officials. By operating a single and double penalty offence system, it should produce a fairer system of "justice".

CHIEF OFFICIAL

The Chief Official will be responsible for all disciplinary matters and the enforcement of the racing rules. Umpires will report to the Chief Official and any matters that Team Leaders wish to raise, with respect of discipline should be directed to the Chief Official not the Competition Director.

IN ALL EVENTS OTHER THAN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS THE CHIEF OFFICIAL WILL HAVE THE POWER TO DISQUALIFY A COMPETITOR WITHOUT THE RIGHT OF APPEAL.

In National Championship events disqualifications will be dealt with by Competition Jury as defined below.

PROCEDURES

The Chief Official will keep a record of warnings or disqualifications issued to paddlers' Team Leaders.

He will operate according to the following guidelines:-

(1) DISQUALIFICATION WITHOUT FURTHER PENALTY

- (i) Infringement of lane, washhanging or long distance racing rules- Following an Umpires Report.
- (ii) Failure to provide full set of names for a crew boat.
- (iii) If boats are weighed - for racing in an underweight craft.

(2) DOUBLE PENALTY OFFENCE - This will mean AUTOMATIC DISQUALIFICATION for the remainder of the regatta in question - and score two points in the "totting up" procedure.

- (i) Reported incident of dissent or abuse towards a regatta official.
- (ii) For entering a race without an entry or substituting for another paddler, in a single or in a crew boat, without proper notification.
- (iii) Demonstrably unsporting conduct (e.g. pushing the start) or deliberate damage during a race of another members equipment.

(3) SINGLE PENALTY OFFENCE- Team Leaders will be informed when a single penalty warning is used. This will score one point in the "totting up" procedure. SINGLE PENALTIES will be awarded for -

- (i) Starting or finishing a race without the correct number properly displayed.
- (ii) Racing without the correct club vest.
- (iii) Not appearing at the start IN A NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP EVENT.
- (iv) Failure to observe water zoning procedures (e.g. paddling across the course).

TOTTING UP Club leaders only will be informed when a warning or disqualification is effected.

- (i) When a paddler achieves a total of four points they will then be automatically disqualified from the next full days racing (i.e. In two day regattas if the incident occurs on Saturday the disqualification becomes effective for the Sunday. If the incident occurs on the Sunday the disqualification will be for the Saturday of the Next Regatta.)
- (ii) A paddler who collects a further three points during any one season, making a total of seven in all will be disqualified from the next two days racing at N.W.S.C. events.
- (iii) A paddler who achieves a total of four or seven points during the last regatta of a season will serve his suspension during the first regatta of the next season.
- (iv) All paddlers will start with a clean sheet at the start of a season.

ANTI DOPING CONTROL

Anti-doping controls will be continued during the 1982 season.

Since our racing rules at present, make no clear definitive statement on drug abuse the I.C.F. rules will be followed.

Any paddler who contravenes these rules, or refuses, to provide a sample when directed, will be disqualified from all racing committee events for the duration of 1983, and the Regatta Committee will recommend to B.C.U. Council that the competitor concerned be banned for life.

WEIGHING AND MEASURING OF BOATS

Weight checks will be made on canoes and kayaks competing in regattas at NWSC. Any paddler found to have raced an underweight boat will be disqualified from the event in question.

During the 1983 season length and width and concavity of canoes and kayaks competing at NWSC in all SENIOR A classes will be checked for their conformity to international standards and disqualifications made accordingly. In subsequent seasons the checks will be made down the scale of classes.

We would advise paddlers ordering new boats to request that the manufacturers guarantee that the boat is to international specification.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS

At National Championship events the Chief Official will have the power to give penalty points, or to disqualify from the event in question.

A protest against his decision, or against another paddler, may be made by a team leader as prescribed in the racing rules.

The protest will be heard by the Jury who will consist of -

- The Chief Official (Chairman).
- The Regatta Organiser.
- The Competition Director.
- The Regatta Administrator.

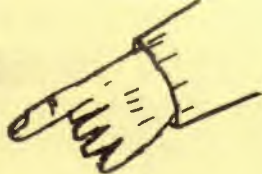
Who will be appointed by the Regatta Committee.

If any of these four is not available a substitute will be appointed by either the Chief Official, from the list of officials who have passed the I.C.F. exam.

An appeal against the decision of the Jury must be made to the Chairman of the Regatta Committee.

THE REGATTA OFFICIALS SCHEME

NEEDS YOU



Regattas don't run on their own.

- At an increasing number of venues up and down the country we need many regatta officials to make our sport possible.

Competitors train hard to achieve their standards but they need your support to organise and control their events. The regatta committee provides a programme of training for officials, from the very beginning up to International level.

So if you are a retired paddler, mother, father, boyfriend, girlfriend, or whatever why not get involved, there are jobs suitable for everyone and you won't be forced to do a job you don't think you can manage.

HOW TO START

Don't wait until the end of the season. Find Di Lawler (Chairman of the Regatta Committee) at any N.W.S.C. Regatta or any Regatta Organiser elsewhere and offer your help. You will find initially that you are training with a more experienced official who will show you the ropes.

There are many jobs to be done and typing up the results is as important as being an umpire or a starter.

COURSES

Every year in either November or December an officials course is held at the N.W.S.C. Holme Pierrepont.

For those who have not been before there is a **BASIC COURSE**

This sets out to deal with all aspects of regatta organisation, and covers them mostly by means of practical example and simulated exercises rather than lectures.

Over 200 trainee officials have already completed this course that gives an excellent **OVERVIEW** and the overwhelming opinion is that it provides a worthwhile and enjoyable weekend.

For experienced officials there is usually a **SYMPOSIUM** when the years problems are discussed and plans laid for the future.

By attendance at the courses and by officiating in major regattas (such as NICK) it is possible to take the International Canoeing Federations Officials exam, the passing of which is a pre-requisite to being chosen to officiate in a World or European Championship.

POWERS OF THE REGATTA COMMITTEE

For serious matters concerning paddlers conduct, on or off the water during a N.W.S.C. event, the Chief Official will refer the matter to the Regatta Committee, which will be convened, with a quorum of four, as soon as possible. (Usually during the event).

This committee has the powers to dispense more severe penalties than those outlined above, but, of course, in accordance with the B.C.U.'s rules on disciplinary procedures.

An appeal against the decision of the Regatta Committee must be to the Racing Committee.

POINTS SYSTEM FOR REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS AND INTER-CLUB COMPETITION FOR MCGREGOR PADDLE

- Composite crews (with members from more than one club) - Do not score.
- There must be three crews entered in a race before points are awarded.
- Every crew entered in a heat is awarded one point.
- No points are awarded for Semi-Finals.
- Points for Finals awarded as follows -

1st - 10	2nd - 8	3rd - 7	4th - 6	5th - 5
6th - 4	7th - 3	8th - 2	9th - 1	
- For 3K, 6K & 10K events the points will be awarded exactly as above but one point will be given to EVERY finishing crew after 8th position.

OLYMPIC TRAINING SQUAD

POLICY

1. In formulating their Olympic Preparation Policy the Committee has re-affirmed its confidence in the concepts implicit in the National Olympic Training Squad system, which they believe provides outstanding opportunities for training and competition that would not be available in any other training situation. Scarce and expensive resources may be maximally exploited, and for minimal financial expenditure and effort, ideal conditions are established for the creation of National crews, the improvement of individual skills and fitness, the supervision and monitoring of performance and the development of a national perspective.

OLYMPIC TRAINING SQUAD

2. The Committee has agreed therefore that a National Olympic Training Squad be selected this year to provide for the coaching and training needs of potential Olympic performers at senior and junior levels. The Squad to be composed of a maximum of 73 athletes, 11 coaches, 1 director, 1 administrator.
3. Members of the Squad will be available, on invitation to those performers who are of a sufficiently high standard, and who are prepared to undertake the sustained training and preparation required.

COMPOSITION

4. The Squad will function from the 1st November to the 30th September each year. Members will be selected annually, by the British Canoe Union Racing Selection Committee, by reference to performances during the previous season and the recommendation of Training Squad Coaches. Junior membership of the Training Squad will be restricted to those in the following age categories-

For 1982/1983 - those born in 1965/66/67/68

5. The number of members of the Training Squad falling within the various competition categories, i.e. kayaks, canoes, men, women, boys, girls, will be subject to the circumstances prevailing at the time of training squad selection within the overall approved limitations -

Seniors	- 41)	73 Total
Youths	- 32)	

6. To ensure that the concept of a unified, national preparation training programme is maintained, the National Olympic Training Squad will be administered as one unit, with management and coaching personnel available to perform their duties as from time to time required, for and on behalf of the various categories within the Training Squad.

OBJECTIVES

7. The primary objectives of the British Canoe Union Olympic preparation training programme for the period 1980/1985 will be to develop national standards of performance to a level sufficient to ensure - That our competitors perform with distinction in Olympic Games and World Championships in Kayaks and Canoes at both Senior and Junior Level.

ACTIVITY

8. The emphasis of all training Squad Activity will continue to be placed upon crew and team training. Firm direction will be provided regarding the formation of national crews. Improved arrangements for the provision of personal coaching in the local training environment will be continued and help will be given to all those members of the Training Squad who receive no coaching support, by the use of Training Squad Coaching Personnel.

9. The Committee will undertake to meet a proportion of the reasonable travelling expenses and accommodation charged of members of the National Olympic Training Squad from the funds to which they have access. Additionally they will seek means of obtaining financial support for the sustenance of those members of the Squad who wish to engage in full time training for that period of time approved by the International and National Olympic Committees, i.e. 60 days in a calendar year.

CONDITIONS OF MEMBERSHIP

All applicants for Membership of the British Canoe Union National Olympic Training Squad, must undertake during membership of the Squad to:-

1. Commit themselves to a sustained programme of preparation training that will ensure the maximisation of their potential performance.
2. Attend all officially designated National Olympic Training Squad training sessions, other than in unusual and permissible circumstances.
3. Accept direction regarding crew composition and preparation training for crew events.

MARATHON RACING

PART A CONSTITUTION AND ADMINISTRATION

1. The Marathon Racing Section of the B.C.U. interests itself in all matters arising out of marathon racing in Great Britain.

Its aims are as follows:

- a). To encourage club, regional, national and international marathon events.
 - b). To draft rules and make recommendations for the conduct of B.C.U. National and Regional marathon races.
 - c). To give advice, guidance and encouragement to sponsors of marathon racing in Great Britain.
 - d). To select, train and administer teams representing Great Britain in international events.
 - e). To select, train and administer teams representing England in International events.
 - f). To confirm and record cross channel canoe and kayak record attempts.
 - g). To foster the development of suitable craft and equipment for marathon racing.
 - h). To act as final authority in disputes and protests.
2. Annual Meetings shall consist of a Chairman, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Race Records Officer, a National Racing Coach, and other such officials as the Annual Meeting consider it necessary to elect, together with the representatives appointed by clubs or organisations. Each Canoe Club affiliated to the B.C.U. and having 5 full members of the B.C.U. may appoint two representatives to attend Marathon Racing Annual Meetings.
 3. Each club or organisation affiliated to the B.C.U. and represented at an Annual Meeting will be entitled to one vote. The Chairman will not be entitled to vote, except in the case when a casting vote is required by the Chairman. A quorum shall consist of six clubs represented.
 4. The Annual Meeting or Executive may co-opt additional members as they think fit in the interests of the sport, but co-opted members will not be entitled to vote. The A.G.M. or Executive may co-opt members or persons who are full time employees of the Union or who have a commercial interest in canoeing only with the permission of Council.
 5. At least one meeting will be held during the year in addition to the A.G.M.
 6. Where clubs wish to raise matters of policy or alteration of existing rules at the A.G.M. the proposal must be forwarded to the Secretary in writing and correctly proposed and seconded by the 20th November. Proposals and matters for discussion shall be promulgated to clubs at least two weeks prior to a meeting.
 7. The Annual Meeting shall elect an Executive, consisting of officers and other members up to a total of 12, for the purpose of day to day administration. The quorum of the Executive shall be four voting members. The Executive shall be responsible to the Annual Meetings.
 8. The officers and members of the Executive Committee shall serve for two years and shall be eligible for re-election, half retiring one year and the other half the following year. Nominations for election shall be in writing, supported by the signatures of two full B.C.U. members and must reach the Secretary before the 20th November before the meeting at which the annual election takes place. If more than one nomination is received for a post, the Annual Meeting will elect by ballot.

If no nomination is received for a post, the previous officer will be automatically re-elected providing he is willing to stand.

9. Marathon Racing funds shall be administered by the Executive.
10. The Executive shall approve the list of trophies which are the property of the Committee and are awarded each year. The Executive will also determine and publish the basis of competition for these trophies.
11. Each year the Executive shall organise or nominate a Championship Marathon Event.
 - a). The course must be typical of present courses.
 - b). The winners of the classes shall be considered the National Marathon Racing Champions in the respective classes.
12. The Treasurer shall keep such books of account as the full Committee shall instruct and produce annual accounts for approval.

PART B RULES FOR COMPETITION - COMMENCING 1-9-82

1. A Marathon Race is a race over distances set out in Part B 7(f) of these rules.
2. Competitors shall race in a fair manner.
3. **CLUB MEMBERSHIP** - When a competitor is a member of more than one club he shall declare before 1st September to the Secretary and the Race Records Officer of the Marathon Committee the name of the club in whose name he shall race that year.

When a competitor changes his club in mid-season, he is permitted to compete for his new club instead of his old provided that the prior consent of the old club is obtained. This consent shall not be withheld unreasonably in the case of change of residence from one area to another. The agreed change shall be advised to the Race Records Officers in writing before points can be allocated to the new club.

4. **BOAT DESIGNS** - Any type of canoe or kayak may be used but only within the I.C.F. regulations for length, breadth and weight, as detailed below.

Boats over 460 cm in length must not have concave sections.

Propulsion shall be by paddle only, the paddle being supported solely by the hands.

5. THE RACING STRUCTURE

The Marathon Racing system has been designed to encourage all levels of competitor from raw beginner to top class international competitors. There are four categories of race:

a). DIVISIONAL RACES

Group (A). Those races approved by the executive.

Promotions between all divisions will take place as shown in 7(d).

For these races a minimum of divisions 1-8 must be held.

Group (B). Those races in the regions and clubs not appearing in the calendar. These will include Introductory or Fun Marathon Divisions

9-12. Promotions will take place in divisions 9-12 as shown in 7(d).

- b). THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS - see Rule 12.
- c). Races approved by the Marathon Committee not in the divisional system such as the Waterside Series, the Stage Marathon, the Royal K1 and the Richmond K2 at which certificates must be issued as they are the race levy.
- d). Races approved by the B.C.U. but organised by outside bodies such as the D.W. Committee.

6. SPONSORSHIP AND THE CERTIFICATE SCHEME

During the last four years Cape Industries have sponsored Marathon Racing through the Certificate Scheme.

It is simple to operate. Numbered Certificates are purchased from the Open Racing Secretary at 25p each. Results showing the Certificate Number issued to each competitor are returned to the Secretary. Every three months a draw is made. The winning competitor receives a new racing canoe or kayak and the issuing organising club receives a cash prize of £100.

Certificates must be used for all races published in the year book. Organisers may use the certificates for any race in a club.

These certificates will in effect be a race levy.

7. THE DIVISIONAL SYSTEM

- a). There are twelve single divisions and a promotion scheme providing a challenge for everyone.

b). DIVISION 1-8

- i) Will be official B.C.U. races and paddlers will be ranked nationally.
- ii) Will require B.C.U. membership.
- iii) Must be held at all races counting towards the National Team League Championship - The Hasler Trophy.
- iv) Double events will be held for:

Division 1	Division 6/7
Division 2/3	Division 8
Division 4/5	

c). DIVISIONS 9-12

- i) These are Regional or Fun Marathon Divisions.
- ii) The divisions are STARTING DIVISIONS depending on craft and age.
- iii) The age split is now at 14 as at the 1st January each year.
- iv) The boat split is broadly "general purpose/slalom type" up to and including 14ft. and racing type boats over 14ft. This is to encourage those with the general purpose/slalom type craft to try racing.
- v) STARTING DIVISION

Division 9	Over 14 years old.	Over 14ft long boats.
Division 10	Under 14 years old.	Over 14ft. long boats.
Division 11	Over 14 years old.	14ft. and under boats.
Division 12	Under 14 years old.	14ft. and under boats.
- vi) Once promoted paddlers must race in their correct divisions.
- vii) Organisers may include open double races for these divisions in canoe or kayak.

d). PROMOTIONS

- i) Promotions will normally take place on single performances. The committee may decide to promote those who only race doubles.

- ii) Status in canoe will not affect status in kayak or vice versa.
- iii) Each year a divisional ranking list will be made out for divisions 1-8.
- iv) No lady or C paddler will be promoted higher than Division 3. They may race in a higher division if they wish to.
- v) Promotion within the season will vary according to Division as follows:
Divisions 2,3,4. The winner provided there are 8 or more starters in a race.
Divisions 5-12. The winner + 20% as shown in the table below.

and so on.

- vi) Once promoted competitors must race in their correct division. Any competitor found racing in a lower division may be disqualified from the event and be banned from Marathon Competition for 12 months from the date of the event when the last misdemeanour took place.
- vii) DEMOTIONS
Each year the ranking lists are checked. Any paddler not having competed in the season will be demoted one division. After two years their name will be removed from the ranking lists. Any competitor who feels he has been wrongly placed in the ranking list may apply for demotion to the compiler of the ranking list.

e). HANDICAP SYSTEM FOR LOW ENTRIES

If there are less than three entries in a division then the organiser may transfer those entries to a lower division. A handicap of two minutes per division will be used to calculate the results which will count for Hasler points.

Paddlers racing in a lower division will not count for prizes or in calculating promotions.

f). TYPES OF COURSE

Course will be adjusted to suit the levels of ability. Whilst there will be variations due to local type of course available, the normal standard will be:

- Div 1/2 - Full senior course of more than 12 miles with any degree of severity.
- Div 3 - Course of about 10 miles.
- Div 4/5 - Course of about 8 miles.
- Div 6/7/8 - Course of about 6 miles.
- Div 9/10/11/12- To cater for the wide number of races this is open to the organiser. Please make sure that the distances are clearly shown on all information to potential competitors.

- g). Race organisers are encouraged to give prizes for special groups of paddlers e.g. first under 16, first C1, first open Canadian. In particular they are strongly recommended to give a prize for the first lady in each Division. This kind of encouragement is particularly important in the Divisional system.

8. The organiser of a race must apply for that race to be registered. This must be done in the Summer of the year preceding the event. The event must be organised and run under the Marathon Racing Rules. Races may advertise through the Union and may appeal through the Executive Committee in cases of dispute or difficulty.

Registration shall be the minimum requirement for a race to be recognised. Registration fee will be by the Certificate Levy which will apply to category a) b) c) races. See Rule 5 a), b) and c).

9. The organisers of a Marathon Race may apply for it to be classified as a Group (A) Race. These races shall be run with a higher degree of organisation. They shall be properly advertised. Adequate pre-race instruction shall be made available in adequate time. Properly documented results shall be sent to the Committee, and competitors who provide a stamped addressed envelope.

The status of a race will be decided by the Executive Committee on the basis that a race has been run satisfactorily by the same organisation over essentially the same course.

10. Selection races will be picked by the Executive Committee from the most suitable races for the events to which the British Team will be going and advised to the organiser by February 1st each year.

11. RULES RELATING TO RACES

A. GROUP A RACES.

- a). Organisers must be affiliated to the Union.
- b). Organisers must provide at least Divisions 1-8 inclusive for Group (A) races.
- c). Organisers shall issue adequate instructions on request up to one month before the event to prospective competitors or interested group leaders. After the race the organisers shall issue complete results sheets to all competitors who provide stamped addressed envelopes.
- d). Organisers may charge an entry fee for each competitor. This fee may be reduced for juniors or augmented for late entries.
- e). Within 14 days of a race, the organisers shall send four copies of the results to the Open Racing Scheme Secretary: -
Mrs Shirley Wickens, 4 Beech Avenue, Drakes Broughton, Nr. Pershore, Worcs.
- f). Changes of division and late entries shall be permitted if the organiser so wishes. Information regarding late entries and division changes should be available to all competitors at least 30 minutes before the start time of the division concerned.
- g). Group A races shall be open to amateur canoeists who are members of an ICF affiliated federation.
- h). A competitor shall number his boat for a race. The number shall be clearly displayed on white discs of not less than 9" diameter. One such disc shall be affixed to the fore and aft decks or as indicated by the organiser.
- i). Competitors may not hang on the washes of powered craft.
- j). A competitor must not change boats during a race, but he may change paddles in the event of a breakage.
- k). A competitor may receive food and drink during a race, but no other assistance unless permitted by the organiser. This particularly applies to help at portages.

- 1). The organisers of a race shall provide a Protest Committee consisting of four officers or members of the organising body to hear and settle all protests by any competitor in that event. The following rules will be observed:

- i). The protests must be presented immediately on completion of the racing and before the announcement of the confirmed results. Failure to observe this will invalidate the protest.
- ii). The protest must be handed in writing to an officer of the organising body and must give full details of the alleged infringement of the rules.
- iii). The protest committee must meet immediately, to hear all the evidence and consider the protest's validity in accordance with B.C.U. and marathon racing committee rules.
- m). A protest against an organising body may only be dealt with by the Marathon Committee or Executive. Any such protest must be made immediately and in writing to the Secretary of the Marathon Committee and give full details of the alleged infringement of the rules. The person making the protest must also inform the Secretary of the Club or body concerned. Failure to comply with these conditions will invalidate the protest.
- n). Appeals against the decision of a protest committee are permitted and these will be heard by the Marathon Executive Committee.

B GROUP (B) RACES

Rules apply as above in 11A) (a,c,d,e,f,g,h,i,j,k,l,m,n.)

12. NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

There are two National events.

- A). THE HASLER TROPHY. This is competed for throughout the season on a regional basis. The top scoring three clubs from each region plus a team from the Army, the Navy and the RAF competing in a national final at the end of the season.

The Hasler Trophy Rules are:

- a). Each region should run its own league championships throughout the year. The regions will be defined as the Sports Council regions for England plus Scotland East, Scotland West, and Wales.
- b). The best three clubs from each region may compete in the final, together with a team from:
 - 1) The Army 2) The Navy 3) The R.A.F.
- c). Each region will decide which races to count. It is hoped eventually there will be enough races in each region to have the best nine results. These will have the following status REG. A.
- d). Each club will be allowed as many competitors as it wishes.
- e). The points system throughout the year and in the final will be as follows:-
 - i) Division 1-8 will count for points.
 - ii) Points will be awarded for paddlers both in singles and doubles - 10 for first, 9 for second and so on down to 1 from all finishers.Pro-rata if less than 10 starters.

- iii). Each club will count its best seven scorers in any division for singles.
- iv). Each club will count its best two scorers in any division for doubles.
- v). For each race the winning club will get ten points, nine for second and so on Pro-rata if less than ten clubs in race.

f). The final will normally be in late September.

NOTE.

- 1). In the regional races leading to the final only those clubs within the region will score for points i.e. paddlers from other regions will not be taken into account when calculating points.
- 2). Competitors must be B.C.U. members (Full, Family, Youth or Cadet) if racing in Divisions 1-8. B.C.U. numbers must be quoted on entries and results.

Competitors failing to provide their B.C.U. numbers will not be eligible for points or prizes.

B). THE NATIONAL AGE GROUP AND TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

These Championships will identify the various age group national Champions and a trophy will be awarded to the club scoring the most points at these championships.

The championships will be run in the following age groups:

Senior Men	- Over 18	Senior Ladies	- Over 18
Junior Men	- Under 18	Junior Ladies	- Under 18
Youth Men	- Under 16	Junior Ladies	- Under 16
Cadet Men	- Under 14	Junior Ladies	- Under 14

All ages as at 1st January of the year of competition.

There will be classes for Mens Singles and Doubles Kayak.
Mens Singles and Doubles Canoes.
Ladies Singles and Doubles Kayaks.

All competitors must be B.C.U. Members (Full, Family, Youth or Cadet Members).

A Club Cup will be presented to the club gaining the most points at the Championships.

N.B. See Rule 13(g) and 13(i) - Safety.

The points will be scored as follows:

Senior and Junior Men Kayak and Canoe: 20,19,18 and so on down to 1 for each finisher. Pro-rata if less than 20 starters.

All other classes: 10,9,8,7,6 and so on down to one for each finisher. Pro-rata if less than ten starters.

13. SAFETY

- a). Competitors must render their boats sufficiently buoyant to remain afloat and to support the crew in rough water when capsized.
- b). Race organisers may require life jackets or buoyancy aids to be worn. Such equipment must be provided by the competitors.
- c). On open water, adequate spray decks must be worn.
- d). Competitors must be able to swim adequately in the waters on which the race is held.

- e). The wearing of life jackets or buoyancy aids is compulsory for Divisions 8-12.
 - f). Team leaders should normally decide if paddlers under 16 in higher divisions should wear life jackets (or buoyancy aids).
 - g). Race organisers would have the final say as to who should wear life jackets (or buoyancy aids) except where this is covered by Rule 13 (e) and 13 (i) depending on weather and water conditions.
 - h). The life jackets (or buoyancy aids) referred to in b) e) f) g) and i) will conform to the standards of the I.C.F. or S.B.B.N.F. e.g. must have 6 kg of inherent buoyancy.
 - i). At the National Championships all paddlers in the Under 16 and Under 14 classes will wear life jackets or buoyancy aids as in h).
14. In the event of circumstances which render it impossible or unsafe to run the race as planned, the organiser shall take all reasonable steps to inform the competitors and supporters at the earliest possible moment.
15. To aid the description of races, the courses shall be classified as follows:-
- 'A' shall denote sea, tidal estuary, lake or other open water.
 - 'B' shall denote fresh water rivers and canals.
 - 'P' shall denote portages.
- A number following the symbol shall denote the length in miles or the number of portages. Thus for example 'A5B6P7' would denote a race of 5 miles on open water, 6 of closed water and 7 portages.
16. In the event of a tie for any B.C.U. trophy an extra race shall be taken into account and this repeated as often as is required to settle the matter where this is appropriate. If the matter is still unresolved, the trophy shall be held jointly, the order of inscription being alphabetical and each party holding it for an equal fraction of the year.

PART C - RECOMMENDATIONS

These recommendations are intended to guide organisers and others in the interpretation of the Rules for Racing, and in the provision of acceptable races.

A. ADVANCE INFORMATION

1. Do not attempt to run a race without visiting a few to find out how things work.
2. Advance information sent to competitors and Clubs should at least set out the following details.
 - a). Name, date and status of race.
 - b). Name of organising body.
 - c). Closing date for entries and whether or not late entries will be accepted.
 - d). Address to which entries and enquiries should be sent, and if possible a corresponding telephone number.
 - e). Entry fees, and the name of an account to which they are payable.
 - f). Locations of start and finish and directions for getting to these places.
 - g). Times of start and closure of checking in.
 - h). Brief description of the course, sufficient to give a newcomer a general picture of the type of course and a warning of any details of the course that he should inspect in advance.
 - i). Any special regulations that the competitor should be aware of before he arrives.

j). Any major changes since the previous year.

k). An entry form asking for full details of competitors (A specimen race details and entry form follow these recommendations).

B. PRE-RACE INFORMATION

Every boat should be inspected at the check-in to ensure that it is numbered clearly, correctly and durably. Check that the water soluble ink has not been used. Although it is the competitors responsibility to number his boat, it is your responsibility to ensure that he has done it. One way of doing this is to demand that the boat be presented with clean number discs and to number them yourself, not revealing the number in advance. It is human nature that some competitors will fail in this responsibility. Have with you the wherewithall to number boats and use it when the occasion demands.

It is customary to deliver a briefing shortly before a race. This is the time to explain the starting procedure and order, to describe any special features of the course and to emphasise any special regulations.

There may be a wide range of ambitions present at a race. Some people go for a pleasant paddle, some with Olympic hopes. Try not to let them stumble over each other. Both parties are cross when a fast crew is confronted by a slow crew blocking critical portages. Let the fast classes start first.

Local conditions, variations of course for different classes, should be considered when arranging the starting order.

Ensure that the course is clearly marked at all points where there could be doubt. Marshalls should be positioned at turning points and should tick off numbers on a check list. It is desirable to post marshalls at portages and shoots. The marshall should keep the passage clear for competitors, keep spectators and competitors off forbidden land, and report any misdemeanours to the central control. A marshall's directions should override any prior instructions. A marshall must be clearly identifiable.

C. STARTING

A clean start is important and difficult to achieve. Most people can start the juniors in good order, but a strong personality is needed to keep the seniors in order. The starter must never lose control of the start, either through physical inability to make himself heard or through weakness of will. Preferably get an experienced racer to start your race. Supply him with an adequate megaphone.

Massed starts are good value for bull fighting addicts, but can be bad for competitors. Do not start classes together if it means overcrowding the start line.

Do not let yourself be bullied by the competitors. They often try out the strength of the starter while waiting on the line. In the very last resort you can disqualify on the spot. On the other hand, do not keep competitors hanging around unnecessarily. They are often nervous before a race, they may be getting cold or just plain bored. In fast water or wind it is often difficult for them to hold their positions. If you have got them into a fair line, then start them without further delay. Say 'READY GO'.

Record the time of the start at each Division.

Do not use a system which relies on a set start time. You cannot guarantee starting exactly on the required second.

D. FINISHING AND RESULTS

Signify a crossing of the finishing line aurally by Bell, Whistle or some such device. Mark the finish clearly. It is not always obvious to the paddler exactly where the finishing line is, particularly since he may be exhausted.

Have a reliable clock which is easily readable and have a backup in case of malfunctions. Make a record of the finishing order of every boat as it passes the finishing line. Have one person making an independent list of boat numbers, another person should make a list of boat numbers and finishing time. This person should have a pad of paper with each sheet numbered in advance so that you will know later if any sheet has been lost. On each sheet mark ten lines say. When a boat finishes record its number and its finishing time alongside. Never mind computation at this stage, you will have your handsfull enough just recording the finishes correctly. When a page is full, pass it on to someone else to analyse. It is also useful to have a reliable portable cassette recorder running constantly at the finish line. You can record every thing that happens at the finish and the tape can be used to double check your finishing order and timing if for any reason your finishing team is overwhelmed by mass finishes. Give the recorder to one of the number spotters and tell him to 'Talk' every boat over the line giving boat number and finishing time. One C60 cassette tape should last for most marathon races.

Have somewhere out of the wind and rain and away from possible distractions from paddlers to analyse the finishing results. Arrange a system for displaying results as soon as you know them. If there are any errors the paddlers will usually spot them and they can be queried before the prize-giving. Have a results display system that is not dependant on good weather to work. The thing the competitors want to see quickly is a list in finishing order, giving name, and overall times. Other details, such as start and finishing time are essentially irrelevant and only clutter up the display.

Have the prize-giving as soon as possible. Announce any divisional promotions at this stage.

E. SAFETY

Safety measures are largely at the discretion of the organiser, since adequate measures vary considerably with course and conditions. Unnecessary precautions are wasteful and irksome, but inadequate precautions can lead to disaster. A senior paddler on inland water seldom needs a life jacket but for a Division 8-12 paddler or one under 16 it is a stipulation. On open sea it is probably wise to insist on buoyancy aids for all. On open water rescue boats are very important. It does not take long to paddle half a mile out to sea, but it takes a long time to swim back, especially in cold water. A weir may be trivial to a fresh paddler, but a different story to one who has just raced fifteen miles. It is sometimes a good idea to place frogmen below a weir to pull people and equipment out as they drift past, but make sure that the rescuers are competent. An incompetent rescuer can be more of a hinderance than a help.

An important precaution is ensuring that no-one is stranded or lost halfway round the course. On open sea races, it is important to account for everyone; on calm rivers it is usually sufficient to have a back marker paddle over the course at the tail of the race.

F. RESULTS

After the event is over, buckle to and get the final results sheet sorted out. If you put it off your memory will dim, pieces of paper will get lost, your enthusiasm will wane, and the competitors will get very cross.

Results sheets should be arranged by Divisions in finishing order. They should include position, name, club, BCU number where applicable, certificate number and points for each entry and promotions to a higher division. Total of points scored by clubs should also be included. (A specimen results sheet follows these recommendations).

G. CERTIFICATES

To save time on the day it is suggested that the organisers should post the certificates to clubs and individuals after the event. The system would work in the following way:-

- a). The organisers would provide A4 envelopes at the race.
- b). The team manager would fill in his address on the envelope and pay 15p for postage.
- c). The organisers would fill in the certificates after the event and post them on together with the results.

THE STARTING OF SELECTION RACES FOR 1983

There is a necessity to maintain the standard of starting for selection races. The following will apply to all selection races in 1983.

REQUIREMENTS.

- (1) The Start line must be clearly defined on both banks.
- (2) A clearly defined Marshalling line must be established about 50 metres behind the start line.
- (3) The race must be started by a person drawn from the approved starters list below, who will have an experienced assistant.
- (4) The Marshalling line should be controlled by at least two experienced officials.
- (5) The above should all be equipped with P.A. equipment or loud hailers etc.
- (6) Where river conditions require it, Division 1 starts will be seeded into 2 or more lines.
The starter will liaise with the race organiser prior to the briefing to establish the starting ranks.

THE FOLLOWING RULES WILL APPLY TO ALL DIVISIONS AT THE 'SELECTION EVENT'

- (1) An audible warning will be given 5 minutes before the first start. From that time on, no paddler is to pass in front of the marshalling line. All paddlers who are already in front of the marshalling line, have 3 minutes to get behind it.
- (2) A second audible warning will be given 2 minutes before the 1st start. Any paddler in front of the marshalling line, will be penalised. No paddler shall go in front of the marshalling line until so instructed by the Marshall.
- (3) Once released by the Marshall, the paddlers will be under the starters control. Any paddler going in front of the start line before the 'GO' will be penalised.
- (4) For each contravention of the above rules, a 2 minute penalty will be imposed.

NOTE The Marathon Team selectors, have been instructed by the Executive Committee, that they will use the results, INCLUDING any penalty, as the basis for selection.

INTERNATIONAL MARATHONS 1983

The British Team continued with its run of success in the 1982 season, and made it 5 in a row when it won the Grand Prix series.

The newly introduced International Cup Event, run in Luxemborg was very successful. The British Team swept the board and came away with all the amateur trophies. Robin Belcher - K1 and Paul Dimmock/Robin Ayres - K2 won the Premier classes and can consider themselves as unofficial World Champions.

The new format of events will be continued in 1983 and the B.C.U. Marathon Executive see the International Cups event, and the Grand Prix series as its priority for Sports Council Grant.

The I.C.F. Marathon Sub-Committee have selected the following events for 1983:-

G.P.1	Round London Marathon.	Great Britain	88 KM	River and Canal.
G.P.2	Valladolid Marathon.	Spain	25 KM	River.
G.P.3	Copenhagen Marathon (International Cups)	Denmark	42 KM	Sea.

There will be 3 separate cups to compete for in Copenhagen; They are Mens Kayak, Mens Canoe, Ladies Kayak.

The Team for each will be 2 singles and 2 doubles, with the first finisher for each nation in each class to count.

The rules for the Grand Prix remain the same. A National Team comprises a maximum of three K2's and three K1's in the Senior Mens class. The first two finishers, in both K1 and K2 of each team count towards the team trophy for each event. The points each nation gains from its best two events, decide the winner of the Grand Prix Trophy.

It is also hoped to support additional events in Belgium, Spain, Denmark and Holland if further monies come available from grants or sponsorship. Some contributions will be required from paddlers towards travel costs to these events.

The make-up of the team for each event, will depend entirely on paddlers being of a sufficiently high standard. Both Senior and Junior paddlers should race in Division 1 and Ladies in Division 3 for the selection races unless otherwise directed.

Paddlers wishing to be considered for the events must comply with the following conditions:-

1. They should apply to the International Team Liaison Officer, J. Rossiter by completing the application form.
2. They should be prepared to travel and be accommodated in the best interests of the team, under the Team Manager's direction.
3. They should be prepared to meet all the costs of the trip, including £15 per person per event as a small contribution towards travel.
4. They should be prepared to accept the Team Coach's direction with regard to training and racing whilst abroad.
5. They should be prepared to dress and conduct themselves in a manner befitting a British Team Representative, and promote the good name of British Canoeing at home and abroad.

6. They should be prepared to give support to the Sports Council in promotional aspects, in return for the grant provided.
7. They should wear the G.B. track suit provided on all suitable occasions.
8. They should paddle in all of the selection races for each event, or in the K1 or K2 race where applicable.

1983 TRAINING CAMPS SCOTLAND AND IRELAND

We will once again be holding a Training Camp on Loch Tay, in September, providing grant aid is forthcoming. We will, however, be taking a smaller party, of twenty. Paddlers will travel to Scotland on Monday 29th August and will take part in the Tay Marathon as part of the week.

Applications to attend the camp should be submitted to J. Rossiter by 6th August (Royal K1) on the form in the Year Book. Places at the Tay will be granted to those who will give a good return to Marathon Canoeing.

We will also send a small party to a long weekend in Dublin, to take part in the Liffey Descent. There will be a selection event for this camp, as indicated below.
