NOTES FOR BCU RACING CALENDAR 1999/2000

- Ass Indicates an assessment race for GB Team.
- * Indicates that this is not a standard divisional race. Usually classes are some combination of senior/junior, mens/ladies/mixed, and singles/doubles.
- SCA Indicates this is a race run by the SCA. Most races have a long course(10-25 miles), a short course(6-9 miles), and usually a novice course(3-4 miles). BCU ranked paddlers should enter these races as follows:-
- Div 1-3 Long Course Divisions 6-7 Short Course
- Div 4-5 Short Course Divisions 8-9 Novice Course
- Except Ladies, Juniors, and Veterans who are never promoted to the long course, but may opt to paddle it if they wish.
- K1 Indicates there will be a Div 1 K1 class but no Div 1/2 K2 class.
- K2 Indicates there will be a Div 1/2 K2 class but no Div 1 K1 class.
- H Indicates a Hasler qualifying race for 1998/9 for the region shown.
- H2000 Indicates a Hasler qualifying race for 1999/2000 for the region shown.
- 1 13 miles and 3 portages. Shepperton to Richmond K2s only.
 - 2 24 miles and 8 portages. Windsor to Teddington. K1s compete for the Eve Watkin Cup. Juniors in K2s only. The Bernard Watkin Cup is awarded to the the winning team. Open to K1, K2, C1, and C2.
 - 3 13.5 miles and 21 portages time trial. Great Bedwyn to Newbury.
 - 4 14 miles and 14 portages time trial. Aldermaston to Reading.
 - 5 18.5 miles and 23 portages time trial. Newbury Circuit.
 - 6 18 miles and 8 portages. Reading to Marlow Rugby Club.
 - 7 13 miles and 6 portages on canal for K2s only. U18, U16, U14, U12 - boys, girls, & mixed + senior open for men, women, and veterans.
 - 8 22.5 miles and 30 portages time trial. Pewsey to Newbury.
 - 9 17 miles and 9 portages on canal/river. K1 and K2 straight through, or relay.
 - 10 34.5 miles and 30 portages time trial. Devizes to Newbury.
 - 11 54 miles Canal, 54 miles Thames, and 17 miles Tideway with 76 portages. Non-stop for senior doubles. Junior doubles and singles race in 4 stages over 4 days.
 - 12 K1 Div 1/2/3 and open K2 Div 2/3/4, and open plus junior K1 and K2
 - 15 10 miles of tidal estuary on flood tide which can be rough. Divs 1-7 only plus tourist trial.
 - 18 95 mile circular canal race through the night. K1 & K2, non-stop & relay + 10 paddler double tourer relay.
 - 19 18 miles and 9 portages. Allington to Tonbridge. K1/K2, C1/C2. Classes for Div. 1-3, 4-6, and 7-9 singles and doubles plus touring.
 - 22 10 Km K1 race for the Paddling Challenge Cup. Shorter races for novices. Masters race over 6 Km.
 - 23 14.5 miles Bridgenorth to Bewdley for all classes of open canoes.
 - 24 60 Km canal circuit with 49 locks, 325m tunnel, and lift bridge. Non-stop K1/K2/C1/C2. 2 Boat relays K1/K2/C1/C2. 6 paddler relays for junior racers and for youth groups.
 - 28 19 miles and 9 weirs. Tiverton to Exeter. For over 16 years only. Buoyancy aids compulsory
 - 29 18.5 miles and 3 portages. Castle Donnington to Nottingham for K2.
 - 30 15 mile river descent for all boats.

- 31 26 miles and 10 portages time trial. Longridge to Elmbridge. Select own start time at half hour intervals from 9.00 a.m. to finish between 2.00 and 3.00 p.m.
- 35 Veterans event only. 35+ men, 30+ ladies. 10 mile race run in age groups.
- 36 66 miles on Thames, Lechlade to Reading. Individual, relay, and team classes.
- 37 9.5 miles and 6 weir shoots or portages. Classes for K1/K2 Divs 1-3 & 4-9, WWRs, C2 racing, & touring, slalom, and touring.
- 40 12 miles + 5 portages for Divs 1-3, 8 miles + 3 portages for Divs 4-9.
- 44 15 miles + 4 portages. K1/K2 Senior Men(Div 1-3), K1/K2 Open, K1/K2 Juniors, Open singles/canoes
- 48 20 miles & 3 portages. K2, K1, C2, C1 for U19s in full time education. Schools trophy for K2 team of 3-4 boats.
- 49 17 miles - 10 weirs all portageable or shootable on River Soar, Leicester. 17 classes plus 8 mile fun run for U14s and U12s.

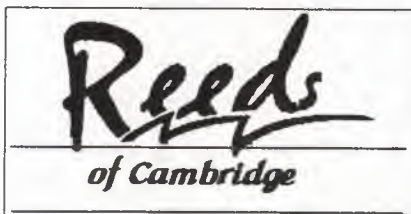

THE RACING REGISTRATION SCHEME

Introduction

The Racing Registration Scheme was introduced in 1977 by the Racing Committee who were concerned over the lack of an efficient communication system between the Committee, competitors, officials and Regatta Organisers, and its inability to ensure that only B.C.U. members competed at regattas.

The Scheme also enables the committee to establish how many active racing canoeists there are in the country at any one time, and provides a means of communicating with them.

The Registration Number is the unique numerical identification for each paddler, and is used in computer programmes when programming a regatta. Only Registered Paddlers will be allowed to compete in B.C.U. Events at N.W.S.C., Entries submitted without a Registration Number will not be accepted.

Initial Registration

This may be done in one of three ways:-

1. At the Canoe Exhibition (Racing Stand).
2. At any N.W.S.C. Regatta, at the Secretary's desk.
3. By post with the Registration Officer (Send S.A.E. please).

In all cases the following are required:

1. Full Name and Address.
2. Date of Birth.
3. Club.
4. Your ranking (if known).
5. A Coaching Scheme Certificate of Standard for 500m which states the actual time taken for your trial.
6. Proof of current B.C.U. Membership (a photocopy of your card is acceptable).

Renewal of Registration

Competitors will remain on the register and retain their racing number until such times as they have not competed for two years, or their B.C.U. membership has lapsed. On production of a current B.C.U. card, anyone deleted from the register may re-register if they so wish.

Current Lists of Registered Paddlers are intended as 'working' lists and only include paddlers who have raced during the last two years and those who are fairly certain to race in the current season. Anyone who does not appear on the lists will have been transferred to the storage file and can be brought back to the 'live' file at any time they return to racing. If we can keep these lists as up to date as possible, it speeds up the process of compiling the programmes.

Youth paddlers who initially registered as Cadet members will remain on the register but should join the B.C.U. as full Youth members at the end of the first year. They should inform the Registration Officer of any change of number.

Summary of Responsibilities

1. At the Club

- a) Ensure that club members achieve the relevant standard to qualify for competing at National Regattas.
- b) Advise the Colours Registration Officer of their appointment, and include details of any changes in the Club Racing Colours.
- c) *Check that all boats have adequate buoyancy.*

2. Entries

- a) Advertise the Regatta to all club members, collate entries, and return Entry Form by closing date accompanied by the correct entry fees.
- b) Check Timetable for clashes & problems. The inclusion of an S.A.E. with the entries will bring a timetable from the organiser.
- c) Ensure that paddlers are conversant with the Rules of Racing for Competition & Conduct as shown in the Handbook, and hold current membership of the British Canoe Union. Ensure that all paddlers have been registered.
- d) Encourage paddlers to purchase their own Year Books.

3. Before the start of Racing

- a) Collect and check the detailed regatta programme ensuring that every entry made is shown correctly.
- b) Arrive on time for the Team Leaders Meeting. All scratches, crew changes, and late entries should be made during the meeting.
- c) Advise paddlers of any changes and/or alterations to the programme.
- d) Ensure that paddlers and their boats are adequately dressed and equipped for the conditions.
- e) Ensure that all paddlers are fully aware of safety measures.

4. During Competition

- a) Ensure that paddlers arrive in time for their races, wearing club colours, and with the correct lane number.
- b) Ensure that K4s, if required, are booked in advance. Boat hire is included in the Race Entry Fee.
- c) Be available to receive notification of disqualifications, and deal with any problem involving paddlers from their club.
- d) Collect from, and promptly return to, the Raft Marshall all Long Distance Numbers. A deposit of £10.00 is required.
- e) Hand in S.A.E. to the Regatta Secretary for a copy of the results.

5. After the Regatta

- a) Return Long Distance numbers promptly to the Raft Marshall.
- b) Display results on club noticeboard.
- c) Note promotions of Club paddlers.

1. Appointment

Club Secretaries must inform the Colours Registration Officer, who is the Team Leader for their club (and if you wish a nominated reserve), before January 1st each year. If a club is to be represented by another person at the N.W.S.C. the regatta organisers should be informed by the registered Team Leader, preferably when the entries are submitted.

2. Communication

At all regattas the organisers will only communicate with the Club Team Leader or his/her nominated reserve, in respect of:-

- a) Making entries
- b) Making late entries.
- c) Communication from the organisers to his/her club paddlers - including disqualifications.
- d) Making protests.
- e) Receiving results.

3. Safety

The Team Leader is primarily responsible for the safety of his club members. Team Leaders should ensure that paddlers are:-

- a) suitably dressed for the weather, water and race conditions.
- b) able to perform basic capsized drills and are briefed on what to do when approached by a safety boat.
- c) able to swim at least 50 metres in wet clothing without a lifejacket.
- d) **that all canoes are fitted with buoyancy, bow and stern**, sufficient to ensure that the canoe will remain afloat *and* support the crew in the event of a capsize.
- e) that all competitors in Junior or Youth classes are in possession of a lifejacket or buoyancy aid which conforms to the standard of the I.C.F or S.B.B.N.F.

In the event of cold and/or windy conditions the organisers may at their discretion cancel or postpone a race, or insist on the wearing of buoyancy aids.

4. Entries

Please note all the information given on the completion of the Official Entry Form which appears on the following page.

All entries must be made on the Official Form. Please do not break up the form. Send the complete form, even if you are making only one entry. Please ensure that you use the correct form.

Fees for this season have not been increased and the charge bands are still as follows:-

- a) All entries for a N.W.S.C. Regatta must be made on the Official Entry Form, or a photocopy. A blank form is included on the entry form for this purpose.
- b) **One Page for Each Class** must be used.

- c) At the top of each page, enter the names of all the paddlers who are to be entered in that class. Indicate the paddler's Initial, Name, and Club as shown below. If, in a crew boat, you include a paddler who is registered in the name of another club, make sure that his name & club are shown.
- d) Use the first four figures of the box for the paddler's Registration Number. A full list of these is shown in the Racing Year Book.
- e) If a paddler has a 3 figure Registration Number, e.g. 027, prefix it with another zero e.g. 0027. **No entry will be accepted without a Registration Number**
- f) Enter A.N.Other by four zeros.
- g) Do not use one page for more than 12 names. Photocopy or use the spare page at the back of the entry booklet.
- h) Telephone Entries are not accepted.
- i) The closing date for entries is normally the Friday fifteen days before the event. Any entries arriving after the closing date must be made by the Team Leader at the Team Leaders Meeting.
- j) Entries made without the correct fee(s) will be charged as Late Entries.

5. Notes on Classes

- a) Kayak competitors are divided into three age groups, Youth, Senior and Veteran. These three kayak classes are then divided into Men and Women. These three subdivisions then being further divided into ability groups. Canadian paddlers are divided into three ability groups regardless of age.
- b) Youth Paddlers will paddle in the four youth divisions according to their individual ability. Promotions within these classes will be done on the basis of improvement in standard of performance. When applying for registration the time certificate submitted should show the time recorded on the 500m test in order that new paddlers can be classified correctly. Beginners do NOT automatically start in the "D" group.
- c) The chart "Standards for Sprint Racing", demonstrates the way in which the subdivisions are made according to speed.
- d) The status of a paddler in a kayak class has no bearing on their status in a Canoe.
- e) Mixed Events, in which male and female competitors race together in the mens classes, are permitted, provided the races are of parallel standard to that of their designated classes.
- f) Open Events - In order to facilitate programming we reserve the right to combine classes in any distance at any regatta, with the exception of National Championship events, which will all start separately provided there are sufficient entries.
- g) Paddlers must race ONLY in their designated class for singles events (K1 and C1) at N.W.S.C. Regattas. Competitors may race above their designated class in crew boats only. Exceptions may be made when O.R.S. coaches wish to enter squad paddlers in higher classes.
- h) A Youth paddler may race in crew boats in a senior class equivalent or above the standard of his own youth standard, eg. BAK= MBK (see chart).
- i) All paddlers will be graded into classes according to the standards set out on the facing page. Coaches should use the Coaching Scheme 500m Racing Tests as preparation for paddlers entry into racing. See chart opposite.
- j) Youth National Championships
Youth Paddlers will race in the following Age Groups
 - UNDER 18(BORN 1981)
 - UNDER 17(BORN 1982)
 - UNDER 16(BORN 1983 or 1984)
 - UNDER 14(BORN 1985 or later)A youth paddler, who has been promoted to Senior Status on ability, may for National Championship Events only race in his/her youth age group.
- k) Promotions/Demotions
 - a) Will be made throughout the year on the basis of standards laid down, and using the race results.
 - b) Are not automatic, and need to be ratified by the S.R.C nominee before taking effect.
 - c) Will be notified on the regatta results and should take effect at the next regatta.
- l) Veterans
Paddlers born before 1964 may compete in the Veteran class unless Mens A or B

6. Check your Programme

Prior to the Team Leaders Meeting it is essential for each Team Leader to make a careful check of all his entries. It is best to keep a copy of your entry for this purpose. If there are any omissions or if you wish to make substitutions, mark your programme: the Team Leaders Meeting goes very quickly, and leaves no time for hesitation.

It is not uncommon for the regatta organisers to make a few mistakes with the entries, but it is your responsibility to check the programme. Once a race has been passed during a meeting it is not normal to go back.

The event organisers will do their best to arrange the programme so that all races in each class are well spaced out, giving a minimum rest period of 40 minutes between races. Any competitor racing outside his designated class in crew boats cannot depend on the programme accommodating this situation satisfactorily.

7. Team Leaders Meeting

It is intended to hold only one meeting per regatta, at 0800 hrs on the Saturday morning (unless otherwise stated) in the Lecture Room. If the meeting cannot be completed in a reasonable time it will be adjourned and the time of the reconvened meeting announced. Each club must nominate one representative to deal with alterations and late entries at the meeting. This nominated representative will be responsible for all the money owed for the entries he submits. This money must be paid by 12.00 Noon on Saturday. Failure to pay on time will incur a £5.00 surcharge which must be paid by the end of racing on Saturday. Failure to meet this deadline will result in all paddlers from that club being disqualified from Sunday's racing.

Procedure

- a) Team Leader signs in on arrival.
- b) Meeting commences promptly at 8.00 a.m.
- c) Technical announcements.
- d) If there are any objections to the programmed order of events they must be raised at this stage.
- e) Late entry provision:-
 - i. Events will be dealt with in order.
 - ii. The Competition Organiser will call out in order each set of heats (or finals, if there are no heats). Team Leaders should scratch any competitors who do not intend to race, or make suitable substitutions. They should call out the lane number first then the competitors name(s).
 - iii. If there are any vacant lanes the Competition Organiser will then ask Team Leaders to raise one hand for each late entry they wish to make. If there are more late entries required than there are vacant lanes available, a draw will take place.
 - iv. It is not permitted to return to an event which has been concluded.

8. Entries after the Team Leaders Meeting

Entries after the meeting for laned races will only be accepted in exceptional circumstances, and at the discretion of the Competition Organiser.

Late entries will be accepted for long distance events (3 km, 6 km, 10 km.), up to one hour before the race, on payment of the appropriate late entry fee. Entries can be made on the form available from the regatta secretary's desk.

9. Club Colours

Must be worn by all competitors in all events at the N.W.S.C. regattas.

- a) In K4 crews where more than one club is represented, paddlers must wear the colours for the club in whose name they are registered.
- b) Clubs racing for the first time at a N.W.S.C. regatta may request exemption from this rule by application to the Regatta Organiser; but the competitors should wear a plain white shirt with no markings. The club must then register its colours before taking part in subsequent events.

10. Numbers

- a) It is a requirement that clubs should provide their own lane numbers as prescribed in the Racing Rules for races up to 1000m in length.
- b) Sets of numbers 1-9, and suitable mounting brackets for kayaks and canoes, are available for sale from the regatta secretary's desk.
- c) For races over 1000m in length, the competition organisers will issue numbers. These will be of a type that fix into a slot on the deck of the boat, all competitors must ensure that their boats are fitted with these slots.
- d) Numbers for long distance racing can be obtained from the regatta secretary's desk, and may be collected by Team Leaders ONLY. A deposit of £10.00 must be left by every club collecting numbers, regardless of how many numbers are required. This money can be reclaimed at the end of the day when all numbers are returned; alternatively it can be left at the desk to cover for numbers which will be required for Sundays racing, and would then be returned Sunday evening when all numbers were collected in.
- e) Lost Numbers, will be charged at £3.00 per number, and the amount deducted from the deposit before it is returned.
- f) A form will be available at the meeting on which the Team Leaders should order the numbers required for the day's long distance races in advance. This form should be handed in to the regatta secretary's desk. He will then make up your requirements for collection later in the morning, (after 11.00).

ALL CANOES AND KAYAKS MUST BE FITTED WITH NUMBER SLOTS

11 K2/K4 Crew Names

Notification of crew names must be made at the Regatta Office at least 30 minutes before the race. Any crew which has not notified the full set of names will be allowed to start the race but will not appear in the results, nor will they go forward to the next round of the competition. Paddlers who take the place of other paddlers without the proper substitution will be allocated 2 penalty points and disqualified from the event. Team Leaders may ask for multiple copies of the form below:-

12 K4s

- a) They will be stored on racks outside the boathouse.
- b) Crews must not sit in the K4s *except when they are on the water*.
- c) Young paddlers must be supervised by a responsible adult when handling the K4s onto and off the water. The K4 Official reserves the right to refuse the boat to any youth crew which is not accompanied by an adult.

TEAM LEADERS HANDBOOK

- d) Check your K4 before you use it. If it is not in order please report the fact to the Official. The crew that previously used the boat will be held responsible.
- e) K4s can be booked for any race during the course of the day as soon as the boathouse is open. and the K4 Official is present.
- f) Crews must supply their own wing-nuts and toggles when they report to collect the boat they have booked.
- g) Crews must use the boat allocated.

13 Protests & Disqualifications

- a) Notification of disqualification will always be made to the Team Leader or his nominated reserve. Except in National Championship Events, there will be no appeal against disqualification.
- b) In a National Championship event, a protest must be made by a paddlers Team Leader.
- c) Team Leaders should realise that it is impossible to adequately umpire all races in every regatta. Where infringements are observed by an umpire, these will be reported to The Chief Official, who if necessary will inform the offending paddlers Team Leader.
- d) Often however, infringements will not be observed by the umpires, and Team Leaders should realise that they have a responsibility to explain the situation to young paddlers who may easily become frustrated by what might seem to be an arbitrary system of justice.

14 Results

If a copy of the results is required, please send a S.A.E. marked RESULTS with your entry, or leave an addressed envelope and the appropriate postage at the Regatta Office.

15 Car Parking

Team Leaders MUST take an active part to see that club members observe the car parking lines. Parked cars must not obstruct the launching access for K4s to the concrete pontoons in front of the boathouses. Particular attention should be paid to the access road in the vicinity of the Centre Buildings. Access for emergency vehicles must NOT be impeded.

The pontoon on the seating side of the tower on the waterfront is a No Parking Area, and must not be used by competitors. This area is solely for the use of safety boats.

★ **Particular attention is drawn to safety requirements, especially the need for adequate buoyancy in all boats.**

★ **Sufficient fixed buoyancy must be securely fitted to all boats before they are allowed on the water.** Severe penalty points (and disqualification) will be incurred by all those ignoring this requirement. This is intended to ensure the safety of all those on the water.

Disciplinary Procedures

The Chief Official

The Chief Official will be solely responsible for all disciplinary matters of a minor nature, under the operation of a penalty points system. At his/her own discretion, he/she may issue up to three penalty points for a single offence.

Racing in incorrect or wrong colours	1 point
Racing with incorrect or without number	1 point
Failure to observe water zoning procedures	1-2 points
Unauthorised substitution for another paddler	2 points + Disqualification
Failure to report for Semi-Finals and/or Finals having qualified in the heats	2 points
Conduct during racing likely to cause injury or damage to equipment	3 points
Use of bad or offensive language	1-3 points
Underweight Boat	1-3 points+Disqualification
Underweight Boat(2nd offence at same regatta)	Disqualification from regatta ★
Failure to report for boat weighing immediately	1-3 points+Disqualification
Insufficient Buoyancy	2 points ♦
Insufficient Buoyancy(2nd offence at same regatta)	Disqualification from regatta ♦

★ Disqualification from the rest of the regatta if the offence is committed on Saturday. Should the offence occur on a Sunday, the offender will be banned from racing on the first day of the next regatta. Weights must be properly fixed to the boat or seat. Stones in bags or any other removable temporary system will not be accepted. A policy of random Boat Weighing will be continued through the year. Boats required for weighing will be notified at either Start or Finish.

♦ Random inspections will be made at launching points, and if buoyancy appears inadequate, 2 points will be awarded immediately, and the boat turned back. If the boat goes on to race, without fitting in the correct buoyancy the offender(s) will, if the offence is committed on the Saturday, be disqualified from the rest of the regatta. If the offence is committed on the Sunday, the paddler(s) will be banned from racing on the first day of the next regatta. Persistent offence by paddlers from any one club may eventually result in **ALL** paddlers from that club being banned from a regatta.

'A' Classes will be subject to maximum penalty, and more stringent inspections. An official will be checking both buoyancy and boat weights, and keeping records of his findings. Inspections may be carried out both prior to, and after, craft go afloat.

Totting Up

- When a paddler achieves a total of 4 points he/she will be automatically disqualified from the next full days racing. In two day regattas, if the incident occurs on the Saturday the disqualification becomes effective on the Sunday. If the incident occurs on the Sunday the disqualification will be for the Saturday of the next regatta. Penalty points awarded will be notified on the result sheet at the end of each regatta.
- A paddler who collects a further 3 points during any one season making a total of 7 in all, will be disqualified for the next two days racing.
- A paddler who achieves a total of 4 or 7 points during the last regatta of the season, will serve his suspension at the first regatta of the next season.
- All other paddlers will start the new season with a clean sheet.

Team Leaders will be informed when a warning or disqualification is effected. The notification will also appear on the result sheet.

Disciplinary Procedures

Disciplinary Matters of a More Serious Nature.

In respect to all other disciplinary matters the Chief Official, Competition Committee and the Competition Jury must act as described in the Racing Rules which include penalties in accordance with B.C.U. Rules or the Racing Section Disciplinary Regulations.

N.B. A reported incidence of dissent/abuse towards a Regatta Official, another competitor or their equipment, or a spectator must be treated as conduct prejudicial to the interests of the sport and dealt with under the Section Disciplinary Regulations.

1999 sees a new system for the membership for Juniors of a B.C.U. Affiliated Club.

A junior club member need not be a full member of the B.C.U. in order to race in Junior D Classes. He or She must be a member of his or her club, and the number used for his or her identification will be club's affiliation number followed by his or her own individual club number.

Should he or she be promoted, however, to 'C' or above, he or she must then become a full member of the B.C.U. in his or her own right.

It is the responsibility of the Team Leader to advise the Registration Officer of the full B.C.U. Number.

1999 sees a new system for the membership for Juniors of a B.C.U. Affiliated Club.

A junior club member need not be a full member of the B.C.U. in order to race in Junior D Classes. He or She must be a member of his or her club, and the number used for his or her identification will be club's affiliation number followed by his or her own individual club number.

Should he or she be promoted, however, to 'C' or above, he or she must then become a full member of the B.C.U. in his or her own right.

It is the responsibility of the Team Leader to advise the Registration Officer of the full B.C.U. Number.

THE MCGREGOR PADDLE COMPETITION

A simplified scoring system was introduced in 1997.

Under the following system most clubs should have an equal opportunity to achieve a winning score:

1. Each Club will automatically score 1 point for every paddler competing in the Inter Club Regatta.
2. Each Club will score 1 point for each promotion accredited to their paddlers during the four previous Regattas i.e. April, May, June, & July of the same year.
3. The scoring at the Inter Club Regatta will be on the following basis:
Each Club will score its best 12 K1/C1 results in all finals
6 K2/C2 results in all finals
3 K4 results in all finals

Scores will be awarded, provided there at least three crews participating, on the following basis:

- 1st 20 points
- 2nd 19 points
- 3rd 18 points....etc

4. Notes:
 - a) Composite crews, with members from more then one Club,do not score.
 - b) At least 50% of the crew must be registered in the class in which they are racing.
i.e. 2 paddlers K4, and 1 paddler K2. Crews may be made up with paddlers from a lower ability group with the following exceptions:
 - i) Men may not paddle in Womens races.
 - ii) Boys may not paddle in Girls races.
 - iii) Seniors may not paddle in Junior races.
 - c) No one may enter any singles class other than their designated class as shown on the Registration File.

THE BCU YOUTH PROGRAMME AND PADDLESPORT DEVELOPMENT OFFICERS

The aim of the youth programme is to get more young people paddling more regularly and taking part in more events. To this end the BCU has adopted a new membership category - 'Youth Section' which gives young people the opportunity to access events (up to 'C' class in sprint regattas and Division 6 in marathon) without paying a taster fee.

Another aspect of the programme is the appointment of Paddlesport Development Officers. It is their role to help develop more events suitable for young people of different abilities. Please contact them if you need support with your event or to discuss any issues related to young people.

PLACID WATER RACING AWARDS

The Placid Water Scheme was set up as a coaching scheme to develop marathon and sprint racing, and fast touring. The various *skill*, *racing*, and *coaching awards* are designed to offer a progressive coaching and paddling structure to support clubs based on placid water. Outlined below are the RACING awards currently available in the Placid Water Scheme(PWS).

PLACID WATER MARATHON & SPRINT RACING AWARDS

The Racing Tests are designed to encourage paddlers to improve performance and recognises their progress in racing kayak and canoe. They are also useful to indicate the class or division to which paddlers should enter in sprint and marathon racing. There are three types of award:

- 1) The 500m Awards
- 2) The Marathon and Half Marathon Awards
- 3) The Time Trial Awards

The awards can be examined by Placid Water Teacher, Instructor, Senior Instructor, Competition Race Trainer, Competition Coach, Club Official. They can be taken in any kayak or canoe.

1.2 Sprint Entry Guidelines

The Sprint Entry Guidelines are for clubs wishing to enter paddlers in Sprint Regattas held at the National Water Sports Centre, Holme Pierrepont. A Coaching Scheme Certificate, or photocopy, must be sent to the Race Registration Officer when a paddler registers for Sprint Racing. The certificate should state the actual time taken to make sure that paddlers are entered into the correct class.

3 TIME TRIAL AWARDS

The Time Trial Award can be tested over any distance from 2000 to 10,000 metres, and is awarded on the basis of speed(minutes per 1000 metres), and can be attempted in any type of canoe or kayak. The award is designed to be flexible, to suit whatever placid water is available. Testing can be organised as part of a fun race, a club handicap race, or a specially organised time trial.

REGISTRATION OF THE AWARDS

In 1995 there was an important change in the administration of the RACING AWARDS. The **Placid Water Coaching Development Committee** is responsible for the administration and promotion of the PW Racing Awards on behalf of the BCU Coaching Service.

All monies raised by these awards will be retained by The Placid Water Competition Coaching Development Committee. It is, therefore, in the interest of racing clubs to make sure that the scheme is a success.

PLACID WATER COACHING AWARDS

Coaching is a most important factor in improving participation, performance, and excellence levels of the paddlers involved in Marathon and Sprint racing. The BCU Placid Water Scheme was designed specifically to support and develop the levels of coaching in racing clubs. The Placid Water Coaching Award Courses offer an opportunity to develop and recognise technical knowledge, safe practice, and coaching skills for both canoe and kayak racing.

The awards fall into two broad groups:

1 The Competition Coaching Awards

The Competition Awards are intended to support those people who are coaching individuals and groups of paddlers to greater success in competition on an ongoing basis. There are two award courses available. The *Competition Trainer* provides a good introduction to sports coaching for Marathon and Sprint racing, but does not involve or require any paddling ability. The *Competition Coach* builds on experience gained in practical coaching following Competition Trainer, and covers the coaching of clubs and individual paddlers within clubs in more detail. The *Senior Competition Coach* is an honorary award for National Level Coaches, and is awarded by the Director of Coaching after consultation with the Sprint and Marathon Committees.

2 The Instructional Coaching Awards

The Instructional Awards are intended for those introducing beginners, instructing and organising activities within a placid water club. There are three awards in the progression. The *Placid Water Teacher* is the introductory level coaching award, and it is recommended to all entering either competition or instructional Placid Water Coaching. The *Placid Water Instructor* covers the instruction of groups, and the *Placid Water Senior Instructor* includes introduction, instruction, and club leadership.

Anyone requiring further information on the Placid Water Coaching Awards should contact BCU headquarters for a leaflet giving a full explanation of the awards.

Regional Development of Placid Water Coaching

To support the renewed development of the Placid Water Scheme around the country, there is a series of Regional Representatives that make up the Placid Water Coaching Panel. They hold up to date information on Competition and Instructional Coaching Courses in their region. Leptospirosis and the Canoeist

Leptospirosis

This is an animal infection, but after recovery the animal continues to excrete the organisms in the urine. These survive for days or even weeks in moist conditions, but for only a few hours in salt water. Humans catch the infection by direct contact with the urine, or the urine polluted environment. Bacteria enter through skin abrasions or via the eyes, nose, or mouth.

The Illness

The usual incubation is 7 to 12 days. Normally a 'flu-like illness occurs which resolves in 2-3 weeks. There may be fever, severe headache, pains in the back and calf and prostration. A few cases develop jaundice, when the condition is known as Weil's disease.

Although death may occur in about 15% of the jaundiced patients, death without jaundice is virtually unknown. Antibiotics during the first few days may help in limiting infection. Many cases recover without specific treatment.

What to do

If you think you may have the infection, go to your doctor and tell him/her that there may be a small risk of leptospirosis. The diagnosis is by clinical suspicion. Blood tests can rarely confirm the illness in time to affect treatment. They may subsequently confirm it.

The microbiologist at your local hospital is the best source of advice.

Prevention

1. Cover all cuts and abrasions with waterproof plasters.
2. Always wear footwear to avoid cutting the feet.
3. Avoid capsize drill or rolling practice in inland waters.
4. Shower as soon as possible after canoeing.
5. If in doubt, contact your doctor early.

Remember, simple precautions can reduce your risk.

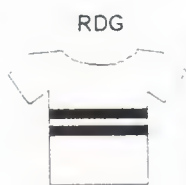

OLYMPIC RACING SQUAD

Policy

1. In formulating its Olympic preparation policy, the Racing Committee has reaffirmed its confidence in the concept of the Olympic Racing Squad, which it believes provides outstanding opportunities for training and competition that would not be available in any other training situation. Scarce and meagre resources may be maximised, for minimal financial expenditure, and the best available conditions are established for the creation of National Crews, the improvement of individual skills and fitness, the supervision and monitoring of performance, and the development of a national perspective.

Olympic Racing Squad

2. The Committee has agreed that a National Olympic Racing Squad be selected this year to provide for the coaching and training needs of potential competitors at both senior & junior World Championships.
The Squad will be composed of a maximum of 73 athletes, 12 coaches, one of whom shall be the Chief Coach.
3. Membership of the Squad is by invitation to those athletes who are of a sufficiently high standard, and who are prepared to undertake the sustained training and crewboat preparation that is required.
4. The Squad will function from 1st November to 30th September each year. Members will be selected by the O.R.S. coaches by reference to past conduct and performance during the previous season, and ratified by the B.C.U. Racing Committee.

Composition

5. The numbers of the various competition categories (i.e. Kayaks, Canoes, Men, Women, Boys, and Girls) will be subject to the circumstances at the time, and within the overall approved limitations :

Seniors - 41	Juniors - 32	Total - 73

6. To ensure that the concept of a unified national preparation and training programme is maintained, the Olympic Racing Squad will be administered as one unit, with management and coaching personnel available to perform their duties, as from time to time required, for and on behalf of the Racing Squad.

Objectives

7. The primary objectives of the Olympic Racing Squad will be to develop and improve national standards of performance to a level sufficient to ensure that our competitors perform with distinction.

Activity

8. The emphasis of all Olympic Racing Squad activity will continue to be placed on crew and team training. Firm direction will be provided regarding the formation of National Crews. Improved arrangements for the provision of personal coaching in the local training environment will be provided by all O.R.S. coaches. Costs of their expenses are to be born by the club or individual requiring their services. (Sports Aid Grants do include the costs of coaching). Help will be given to those members of the Olympic Racing Squad who receive no coaching support by the O.R.S. Chief Coach.

OLYMPIC RACING SQUAD

9. The Racing Committee will, where possible, undertake to meet a proportion of the reasonable travelling expenses of the O.R.S. members from the funds to which it has access. Priority will be given to the O.R.S. training camps and crewboat training. Subject to the funds being available, the following will apply:

One person in a car	25% of the costs
Two people in a car	50% of the costs
Three people in a car	75% of the costs
Four people in a car	100% of the costs

Payments for training camps will be at the discretion of the Chief Coach or Team Manager.
Payments for crew boat training will be at the discretion of the Chief Coach.

Conditions of Membership

- 9a. All paddlers accepting the benefits of membership of the O.R.S. must undertake during their membership to:

1. Be a fully paid up member of the British Canoe Union.
2. Attend all officially designated national Olympic Racing Squad training sessions, other than in unusual and permissible circumstances. Notification of non attendance must be given at the earliest opportunity, so that valuable resources are not wasted. Athletes failing to do this will be asked to pay the full costs of all services that have been booked on their behalf.
3. Members of all ORS squads must be prepared to commit themselves to a sustained programme of preparation and training that will ensure the maximisation of their potential performance.
4. Accept direction regarding crew composition in order to form their own, and to assist in forming other crews.

Junior Development Squads

In addition to the Junior ORS, the Junior Development Squad, which was established in 1993/4, will continue to operate on a regional basis.

Aims

1. To encourage the development of junior racing.
2. To provide a formal link with the Junior ORS.
3. To provide early experience of international competition at an appropriate level.
4. To monitor the training of promising Junior paddlers through liaison with their club coaches.
5. To encourage the development of crew boats through inter club co-ordination.

Objectives

There will be regular training days throughout the winter on a national and regional basis at various venues. These will be open to all members of the JDS (i.e. all Junior Boys A, B, & C and Junior Girls A, B, & C and all Junior Canoe paddlers who are not in the Junior ORS.

Selected JDS crews which have been developed during the winter training will be sponsored for entries in 500m and 1000m events at the April, May, and June regattas at Holme Pierrepont. Selected members of the JDS will also have the opportunity to compete at up to two international regattas. Although all age groups will be represented on these international trips, the priority for selection will be given to Under 16, then Under 14, and finally Under 18 paddlers.

OLYMPIC RACING SQUAD

Selection Policy 1999

10. General Notes on Selection

As an outdoor sport that can be affected by weather conditions and lane draws, it will be necessary to operate a policy of continuous assessment. Athletes achieving satisfactory results at National events can be consider for selection to GBR and English teams.

10.1 Competition Committee(to be confirmed at next General Meeting)

Without prejudice to its over riding control of the section, the Racing Committee may establish a Competition Committee. This committee will be comprise the following, the BCU Performance Director, the technical Director of the ORS, the National Performance Coach, relevant National Squad Coaches and a nominated member of the BCU Racing Committee. They will have responsibility for selecting, training and administering the senior and junior Olympic Racing squads

10.2 International Teams

The Technical Director of the ORS will prepare a training and competition programme for approval by the BCU Performance Director and the Sprint Racing Committee. This Programme will be published in the yearbook. A selection committee comprising of the ORS Technical Director, the BCU Performance Director, The National Performance Coach, the relevant National Squad Coach and a nominated member of the Sprint Racing Committee will be called on to select teams for major internationals. Teams for minor internationals can be selected by the Technical Director in consultation with the relevant National Squad coaches.

10.3 Teams for Major Internationals

Teams for all major international events such as World and European Championships must comply with the rules of the International Canoe Federation and the European Canoe Association. Entry to these events is restricted to affiliated National Governing bodies. Further restrictions apply to the number of entries each country may place. Selections for these competitions will be made by the Selection Committee as shown in 10.2 and must be ratified by the Racing Committee.

10.4 Olympic Games

Entry to the Olympic Games is subject to the qualification rules as agreed between the International Canoe federation and the IOC. National teams may qualify boats at the World Championships in the year prior to the Olympic Games. The selection committee as defined at 10.2 will select Great Britains Olympic team approximately 4 months prior to the Games. The team will be ratified by the BCU Racing Committee, and must then be endorsed by the British Olympic Association.

10.5 Funding

All International teams will be subject to available funding. Levels of funding may influence the size and number of international teams. All athletes will be asked to contribute to the overall costs of the international programme. For athletes on the World Class Programmes this cost will be limited to the cost of food in lodging. For other national teams the amount payable will be determined by the Technical Director and approved by the SRC. All funds will be used to support the Competition Programme.

SPORTS AID FOUNDATION GRANTS

Towards the end of the 1998 season, all competition disciplines were asked to submit athletes for consideration for Sports Aid awards. The rules regarding these application have recently changed and grants are primarily aimed at younger athletes particularly those under 18 years of age who are competing at National level.

Sports Aid Foundation – Priority Criteria

- ◆ World Championships level - A member of Junior GB team and has been selected for and raced at a Junior World Championships or Junior World Cups event.
- ◆ International level - A member of a Junior National Squad and has been selected for and represented Great Britain at an international event. These athletes will show clear potential for GB teams in the next 2 years.
- ◆ National Level - A member of a Junior Development Squad Competing regularly at National events with potential to reach international standard.

Special Cases

Athletes aged 19-21 may be submitted by the BCU Performance Director in consultation with the discipline coaches. This will only happen when the athlete has strong international results.

The Chief Coach has consulted with all national coaches, and with the Marathon team manager to produce a long list of flat-water athletes. This list has already been submitted to the SAF and we expect a decision to be made early in 1999.

Regional Grants

Each region is autonomous, and the available funds vary from area to area. The main criterion is that the individual concerned should be showing good potential to achieve national honours at either junior or senior level. Each Region in England, and each National Association, has a liaison officer, who can requested to put a paddler's name forward for consideration. Alternatively, the S.A.F. in the region can be contacted direct, and they will refer back to the regional/national officer for confirmation. A standard form is available from the regional S.A.F., regional/national S.A.F. liaison officer, or the B.C.U. office.

Purpose of Grant

In both instances(international and regional) help is given, in accordance with personal needs, for the following items.

- a. *Additional costs incurred by the individual in lodgings for training.*
- b. *Additional costs incurred by the individual for special food.*
- c. *Additional costs incurred by the individual for essential preparatory competition not grant aided.*
- d. *Transport or travel for training.*
- e. *Equipment - but only small items of personal equipment including confirmation that the items have been or will be purchased by the individual.*
- f. *Coaching fees necessarily incurred by the individual.*

Paddlers who are fortunate enough to have a National Sports Aid Foundation Grant should be aware that part of their grant is awarded for coaching. In the past coaches used to get their own Sports Aid. This helped towards their own costs, which are often as high as the paddler's own. It would seem that none of the paddlers receiving Sports Aid contribute anything towards the cost of the coaching that they receive. This is clearly wrong, and the situation is under review by the Racing Committee.

REGATTA OFFICIALS TRAINING

The training of officials is a highly important area of our activities from both a National and Regional point of view. Anyone interested in assisting at National regattas at Nottingham is encouraged to come and sit alongside more experienced officials to learn what is involved. Each year in November, a course is held at the N.W.S.C. to introduce anyone who wishes to help with either National or Regional events.

Candidates can progress from this course, through officiating at our own National and International Regattas to a standard where they become eligible to take the International Canoe Federation examination, so then becoming qualified to officiate at World Championships.

THE BASIC COURSE: The basic course is aimed at complete beginners and no previous knowledge or experience is assumed. All aspects of the organisation are covered in a basic and practical way. Particular attention is given to the organisation of low key, local events of all kinds. This course would be followed by practical experience at regattas, working alongside a more practised official to gain knowledge and experience.

THE SYMPOSIUM: This consists of discussion groups of more experienced officials who meet to discuss any problems which have arisen during the season, and methods of solving them. Additional training can be given in specialised fields for those aiming to take the I.C.F. examination.

RACING SECTION CONSTITUTION

As submitted by the British Canoe Union Sprint Racing Committee for approval by the Annual General Meeting of the Sprint Racing Section held on Saturday, 29th January, 1977 and ratified, and subsequently updated (14 Nov 98). The Constitution is bound to the Articles and the Association of the British Canoe Union.

1. Title

The section shall be called the British Canoe Union Racing Section.

2. Objectives

To the extent to which it is authorised by the British Canoe Union (B.C.U.) the Section shall control competitions in canoes and kayaks, over distances up to and including metres, on racing courses which are designed to be as flat and as still as possible, and in relation thereto shall:

- 2.1 Organise and conduct National Championships and other competitions on behalf of the B.C.U..
- 2.2 Draft Rules and Regulations.
- 2.3 Select, train, and administer teams representing the United Kingdom and Channel Islands for international events.
- 2.4 In cooperation with the National Coaching Scheme, develop good coaching within regions and clubs.
- 2.5 Train competition officials.
- 2.6 Foster technical research and development.
- 2.7 Act as a final authority in settling disputes.

3. Membership

Membership shall be open to any individual member or affiliated member of the B.C.U.

4. Officers

- 4.1 In order to carry out its objectives, the following officers and other committee members shall be elected.
 - 4.1.1 Chairman
 - 4.1.2 Secretary
 - 4.1.3 Treasurer
 - 4.1.4 A committee known as the Racing Committee (R.C.) consisting of the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer of the Section, and not more than eight other Committee members. Nominated representatives from B.C.U. regions, the W.C.A., C.A.N.I., S.C.A., and other groups, with an interest in racing will be entitled to attend and speak at meetings of the Racing Committee at the expense of the nominating organisation.
 - 4.1.5 A member who is not a full member, or who is a full time employee of the B.C.U., or who has a commercial interest in canoeing, shall not be eligible for election as an officer, or as a member of the Committee, other than as a non-voting co-opted member.

4.2 Period of Office

- 4.2.1 The Chairman shall hold office for one year.
- 4.2.2 The Secretary and Treasurer shall hold office for two years and retire on alternate years, the Secretary one year, the Treasurer next.
- 4.2.3 The members of the Committee shall retire after two years, half of them shall retire at the Annual General Meeting at which the Secretary retires, and the other half the following year.
- 4.2.4 All officers and members of the Committee shall be eligible for re-election.

RACING SECTION CONSTITUTION(cont)

4.3 Nominations

Nominations of candidates for election shall be put forward in the form of a motion under the terms of paragraph 6.6.

4.4 Co-Options

The Committee may co-opt not more than three full members to its number (who shall have no voting rights).

4.5 Vice Chairman

At the first meeting of the Committee following the second part of the Annual General Meeting, the Committee shall elect a Vice-Chairman from amongst its members, to serve until the next Annual General Meeting.

4.6 Casual Vacancies

In the event of a casual vacancy among the officers or members of the Committee, the Committee shall appoint another eligible person to act for an appropriate period, but not beyond the next Annual General Meeting.

5. Duties of Officers & Committees

The Racing Committee shall be responsible for the finances and for carrying out the objectives of and the Section as defined in paragraph 2. It shall, additionally, be responsible for appointing Team Management and Team Coaching personnel, and other specialist officers as from time to time may be required, and for defining their terms of reference. It shall have the power to set up Sub-Committees without prejudice to the over-riding control of the Section.

5.1 The Secretary shall keep minutes of the proceedings of the General and Racing Committee meetings, report to the Annual General Meeting on the attendance of each officer and member at Racing Committee Meetings held during the previous year, and carry out other duties as the Racing Committee may from time to time direct.

5.2 The Treasurer shall keep such books of account as the B.C.U. Council and the Racing Committee may from time to time direct. Expenses for attending Racing Committee and Sub-Committee meetings may only be paid to Elected, Appointed, and Co-opted members.

5.3 Six members shall form a quorum at a meeting of the Committee.

6. General Meetings

6.1 The Annual General Meeting (AGM)

The Annual General Meeting shall be held in two parts. The first part shall be held at the time of the last competition held at the National Water Sports Centre, Holme Pierrepont, during September each year. The second part shall be held during the period 1st November to 31st January.

6.2 Special General Meeting

a Special General Meeting may be called at the discretion of the Racing Committee or by not less than 10 affiliated members of the Section entitled to vote as defined under paragraph 7. Such notice must state in the form of a motion the business to be discussed and bear the signatures of the members concerned and the name of their club.

6.3 Right to Speak

Only full members of The British Canoe Union are entitled to speak at General Meetings.

RACING SECTION CONSTITUTION(cont)

6.4 Notice of General Meetings

- 6.4.1 At least 14 clear days must be given of the date and place of any General Meeting.
- 6.4.2 In addition, every B.C.U. affiliated member who has taken part in a National Competition, as designated by the Committee, during the year, shall be sent a written notice of a General Meeting by first class post, addressed to the Secretary of the affiliated member organisation as recorded at the B.C.U. Headquarters.

6.5 Business of General Meeting

- 6.5.1 Only the business notified in the agenda accompanying the notice shall be transacted at General Meetings. Amendments must be kept within the terms of motions for consideration and the Chairman has the power to refuse any amendment which subsequently alters the intention of the motion.
- 6.5.2 The business of the Annual General Meeting shall, for the first part, be to consider any motions on the Agenda in relation to paragraphs 2.3 and 2.4 of these rules, to receive any proposals from the Racing Committee concerning amendments to the Section Constitution, and to receive reports from Team Management and Coaching Personnel and other specialist officers.
For the second part it shall be:
 - (a) To receive the report of the Chairman.
 - (b) To receive the report of the Secretary.
 - (c) To receive the report of the Treasurer and to adopt the accounts.
 - (d) To elect the Chairman.
 - (e) To elect the Secretary or Treasurer.
 - (f) To elect the members of the Committee.
 - (g) To consider any motions on the agenda for the alteration of the Section Rules or Constitution or which are in relation to paragraph 2.

6.6 Motions

Any motion for discussion at the Annual General Meeting Part 2, or nomination for officer or committee member, not originating from the Racing Committee, must be signed by two full members of the B.C.U., who are members of an affiliated member club entitled to vote under paragraph 7, and shall be lodged with the Secretary within 14 days after the Annual General Meeting Part 1 of that year.

6.7 Quorum

No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless a quorum of members is present at the time the meeting proceeds to do business. Ten full voting members, as defined in paragraph 7, shall form a quorum.

7 Voting

Each affiliated member club of the British Canoe Union whose membership consists of 12 individual members or more, represented at a General Meeting, and whose members have taken part in a National Competition as designated by the Committee, shall have one vote.

- 7.1 Each affiliated member club must be represented by a full member of the British Canoe Union who shall cast their vote.
- 7.2 No member shall be entitled to speak or vote at a General Meeting unless all monies due to the B.C.U. by him, at that time, have been paid.

8 Amendments

a decision to alter the Racing Rules and Regulations can only be taken at a General Meeting, with a simple majority of the votes cast.

- 8.1 a decision to alter any part of the Section Rules can only be taken at a General Meeting with a majority of two-thirds of the total number of votes cast.

RACING SECTION CONSTITUTION(cont)

8.2 Other decisions taken at General Meetings will be by simple majority of the total number of votes cast, unless otherwise specified in the Section Rules.

8.3 The Chairman shall have a casting vote only.

9 Financial Year

The financial year of the Section shall end on the 31st October. Prior to the second part of the Annual General Meeting, and at such other times as the Committee may think fit, the books and accounts shall be audited.

10 Advisory Committee

Without prejudice to its over-riding control of the Section, the Committee may establish :

10.1 Competition Committee

a Sub-Committee responsible for selecting, training and administering the Olympic Racing Squad and teams representing the United Kingdom and the Channel Islands for international events. This Competition Committee shall be composed of a Chairman appointed by the Racing Committee, the O.R.S. Administrator, the O.R.S. Section Coaches and Team Management personnel. Policy decisions of the Competition Committee shall be subject to ratification by the Racing Committee.

10.2 Regatta Committee

a sub-committee responsible for organising and conducting National Championships and other competitions on behalf of the British Canoe Union, and training competition officials. This Regatta Committee shall be composed of members as may from time to time be determined by the Racing Committee. Policy decisions of the Regatta Committee shall be subject to ratification by the Racing Committee.

10.3 Finance Committee

a sub-committee responsible for approving the expenditure programmes of all other sub-committees, monitoring such expenditure and advising the Racing Committee on matters of general financial policy. The Finance Committee shall be responsible for the production of the Section Year Book and other racing publications that may from time to time be required. The Finance Committee shall be composed of the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer of the Section, the Chairman of the Competition Committee and the Chairman of the Regatta Committee. Decisions of the Finance Committee shall be subject to ratification by the Racing Committee.

11 Appointment

The appointment of officials by the Racing Committee within the terms of paragraph 5. shall be subject to the approval of the Annual General Meeting of the Section (2nd part).

THE RACING RULES

Definition

Racing is competition in canoes and kayaks over a course as flat and still as can be obtained over distances up to and including 6,000 metres. Although competition may be organised for any craft the normal classes of boat will be the K1, K2, K4, C1, C2, and C4.

Part I - GENERAL REGULATIONS

There are three levels of competition:- International, National Status and Club.

1. **International Competitions** will take place in accordance with the I.C.F. Rules for competition.
2. **National Status Competitions**
 - 2.1 All competitions announced as National Status competitions shall be held in accordance with the Racing Rules of the British Canoe Union.
 - 2.2 National Status Competitions are those at which promotions within the National Divisions take place.
 - 2.3 National Status Competitions are organised on behalf of the B.C.U.
 - 2.4 All competitors at National Status Competitions must be registered with the Racing Committee and must be B.C.U. members.
 - 2.5 Organisers of National Status Competitions shall declare that the competition is being held under B.C.U. rules.
 - 2.6 National Status Competitions require a permit from the Racing Committee. Application for a Regatta permit shall be directed to the Secretary of the Racing Committee. Such a permit shall require:-
 - 2.6.1 Observance of the B.C.U. Racing Rules.
 - 2.6.2 Inclusion the words "Under B.C.U. Rules" on all printed matter issued in connection with the competition.
 - 2.6.3 Compliance with Part III Rule 14.2 regarding Regatta Officials.
 - 2.7 National Status Competitions will be included in the official B.C.U. Calendar of events.
 - 2.8 Within 14 days of the close of a competition a completed regatta programme with results, and signed by the Competition Secretary, shall be sent to the Records Officer of the B.C.U. Racing Committee.
3. **Club Regattas**
 - 3.1 B.C.U. members are allowed to participate with non B.C.U. members.
 - 3.2 No promotions will be made at Club Regattas. Performance will not affect National Ranking.
 - 3.3 The Rules and Classes may be altered to suit Club requirements.
 - 3.4 Organisers of Club Regattas may advertise their events in the Year Book on payment of the appropriate fee.
 - 3.5 Organisers are asked to encourage all who take part to become B.C.U. members. Where fees are charged, B.C.U. members should be charged a reduced fee.
 - 3.6 To ensure uniformity, organisers are asked to follow the B.C.U. Racing Rules as far as possible.
 - 3.7 Organisers are asked to make it clear in all literature what the events and rules will be.
 - 3.8 a booklet 'Organising a Club Regatta' will be available.
4. No Club or member of a Club or individual member of the B.C.U. may compete outside the United Kingdom without permission from the Racing Committee.

THE RACING RULES(cont)

5. No member of a foreign club may compete or be invited to compete in an open or national competition within the United Kingdom without permission from the B.C.U. Racing Committee. a foreign competitor shall normally be expected to have the sanction of his own National Federation unless he has been domiciled in the United Kingdom for two years or more. This rule does not apply to women competitors who leave their country of origin and acquire by marriage British Nationality. In this case, they can compete without the delay of two years.
6. When a competitor is a member of two or more clubs he shall, by March 1st have declared the name of the club in whose colours he will race that year in individual events. a person joining a second club after March 1st must continue to race for his first club. a competitor who has changed his club is not permitted to race for his new club, unless prior consent of his old club has been obtained. The consent shall not be withheld in the case of a change of residence from one area to another.

7. Amateur Status

The Racing Committee Rules are those of the British Canoe Union

7.1 The British Canoe Union Amateur Rule - (1st January 1983)

"An amateur is a sportsman who devotes himself to sport as a vocation for his own pleasure and for his moral and physical well-being without deriving therefrom, directly or indirectly, any material gain"

7.2 The Eligibility Committee, which is the authority appointed by the Union to advise, when necessary, regarding the interpretation of the Amateur Rule, and to define the amateur status of members, has issued the following Code of Practice, which clarifies the terms contained in the Rule

7.2.1 An amateur canoeist may not:

- 7.2.1.1 Be or have been a professional athlete in any sport.
- 7.2.1.2 Have allowed his person, name, picture or sport performance to be used for advertising, except when the British Canoe Union or its Committees enter into a contract for sponsorship or equipment. All payments must be made to the British Canoe Union and not to the individual.
- 7.2.1.3 Have acted as a professional coach or trainer in any sport.
- 7.2.1.4 In the practice of sport and in the opinion of the British Canoe Union manifestly contravene the spirit of fair play in the exercise of sport, particularly by the use of doping or violence.

7.2.2 An amateur canoeist may :

- 7.2.2.1 Be a physical education or sports teacher or a member of a coaching scheme who gives elementary instruction.
- 7.2.2.2 Be a canoe accessory designer or manufacturer.
- 7.2.2.3 Accept, during a period of preparation and/or actual competition which shall be limited by the rules of the British Canoe Union and its Committees.
 - a. Assistance administered through the National Olympic Committee or the British Canoe Union: food and lodging; cost of transport; pocket money to cover incidental expenses; insurance cover in respect of accidents, illness and disability; personal property, sports equipment and clothing; cost of medical treatment, physiotherapy and authorised coaches.
 - b. Compensation authorised by his or her National Olympic Committee or the British Canoe Union, in the case of necessity, to cover financial loss resulting from his or her absence from work or basic occupation in the Olympic Games and sports competition or other canoeing activities. In no circumstances shall payment made under this provision exceed the sum which the competitor would have earned in the same period. The compensation may be paid with the approval of the British Canoe Union or the National Olympic Committee at their discretion.

THE RACING RULES(cont)

- 7.2.2.4 Accept prizes won in competition or other canoeing activities, within the rules established by the British Canoe Union and its Committees and the International Canoe Federation. (This awaits final approval following a decision of the I.C.F. Congress, when Note 2.2.4 "Cash Prizes" may be revised)
- 7.2.2.5 Accept academic and technical scholarships.
- 7.2.2.6 In all cases which are not covered by the above regulations, the corresponding rules of the International Canoe Federation or the National Olympic Committee shall apply.

7.3. Procedures To Be Undertaken By Those Seeking, Obtaining, and Disbursing Sponsorships, Sports Scholarships and Awards.

- 7.3.1 Details of all personal sponsorship arrangements, sports sponsorships and other awards, offered to or negotiated by individuals, or organisations, must be submitted by beneficiaries to the British Canoe Union Committee responsible for administering the particular activity, for registration and approval. When doubt exists regarding the appropriate Committee to whom information should be furnished, British Canoe Union Headquarters will arrange for the necessary action to be undertaken.
- 7.3.2 a central registry of all personal sponsorship arrangements will be maintained by the British Canoe Union Headquarters, and will be available for inspection by authorised officers of the Union.
- 7.3.3 The Eligibility Committee has advised that the term "personal sponsorship arrangements negotiated by beneficiaries" shall include:
Sponsorship provided by individuals (not family), commercial, industrial, and public authorities, National and Regional Sports Aid Foundations, Local Authorities, Trust Funds, Educational Institutions and agencies, Clubs and other miscellaneous supportive groups.

7.4. Advertising on Boats and Equipment

- 7.4.1 Advertising of any tobacco or tobacco related products on boats or equipment is not permitted by the B.C.U.
- 7.4.2 Use of athlete images during the period of the Olympic Games is regulated by the I.O.C. and the Olympic Charter.
Except as permitted by the I.O.C. Executive Board, no competitor who participates in the Olympic Games may allow his person, name, picture or sports performance to be used for advertising during the Olympic Games except where:
 - 7.4.2.1 The N.O.C. of the athlete has given its express prior written consent to each such use, and
 - 7.4.2.2 that, in any event, such use is not in relation to the athlete's performance at such Games.

8. Classification of Paddlers

- 8.1 **Youth:** a Youth is a competitor under the age of 18 years on the 1st January, who has not been promoted to a Senior status class. On reaching the age of requirement for Senior status, a youth, not previously promoted, will be re-classified to an adult status class.
- 8.2 **Senior:** a Senior is a competitor who has been promoted from Youth or is over 18 years of age on 1st January. Senior status competitors will be nominated to compete in one of the Senior Classes as laid down from time to time by the B.C.U. Racing Committee. Entry to and promotion between Senior Classes will be determined by results gained in competition at regatta venues nominated by the Racing Committee. a Senior status competitor may, at the discretion of the Racing Committee, be permitted to revert to a lower Senior Class at the end of a regatta season.

THE RACING RULES(cont)

- 8.3 **Veteran:** a Veteran is a competitor over the age of 35 years on the 1st January who is not already nominated to compete in Mens A or B
- 8.4 **Mixed Events:** Mixed events where male and female competitors take part in the same boat are permitted.
- 8.5 **Status:** Status in Kayaks has no bearing on status in Canadian Canoes and the converse i.e. a premier Senior Class competitor in Canadian Canoes may be a lower Senior Class in Kayak.
- 8.6 **Special Rules for Kayak Fours:** Senior status competitors may not compete in fours events of a lower senior class than that for which they are nominated as individuals. Senior Class competitors may be members of fours crews competing in higher senior classes than their own without losing their individual Senior Class status. a win in a fours event does not affect the status of the members of the crew.
- 8.7 **Promotions:** All promotions shall be at the discretion of the B.C.U. Racing Committee. Promotions shall normally be decided at the end of each season, although the B.C.U. Racing Committee shall be empowered to promote competitors during a competition season, should it so wish. (see Section 5 in the Team Leaders Handbook).

9. National Championship Entries:

Entries for these events shall be restricted to British Nationals who are members of the B.C.U. Aliens resident in Great Britain for at least two years may be permitted to enter for a National Championship event except in the case of women competitors who conform to the reference to British Nationality contained in Rule 5.

11. Construction

- 11.1 **Kayaks:** All kinds of building materials are permitted. No foreign substances may be added to boats which give competitors an unfair advantage. Sections and longitudinal lines of the hull of the Kayak shall be convex, not interrupted and at all times rigid. Steering rudders are allowed. The maximum thickness of the rudder must not exceed 10 mm in the case of K2 and K1 or 12 mm in the case of K4, in cases where the rudder forms an extension to the length of the kayak. All electric/electronic devices are forbidden from a boat when racing. This includes electric pumps, speed measuring devices, strain gauges, heart monitors.

Part II - CLASSES AND BUILDING REGULATIONS

- 11.2 **Canoes:** All kinds of building materials are permitted. No foreign substances may be added to boats which give competitors an unfair advantage. Sections and longitudinal lines of the hull of the Canoe shall be convex and not interrupted, and at all times rigid. All electric/electronic devices are forbidden from a boat when racing. This includes electric pumps, speed measuring devices, strain gauges, heart monitors. The canoe must be built symmetrically upon the axis of its length. Steering rudders or any guiding apparatus directing the course of the Canoe are not allowed. a keel if any must be straight, shall extend over the whole length of the Canoe and not project more than 30 mm below the hull. The C1 Canoe may be entirely open and may not be covered more than 150 cm from the stem and 75 cm from the stern, reckoned from the outer edge of the stem or stern to the furthest point of the edge of the deck for the fore or aft decks respectively. The C2 Canoe may be entirely open, the minimum length of the opening shall be 295 cm. The C4 may be entirely open, the minimum length of the opening shall be 410 cm.
12. **Measuring**
The length of a Kayak or Canoe shall be measured between the extremes of the stem and the stern. Stem-bands or other protection of the stem or stern, if any, to be included. Any rudder forming a continuation of the length of the Kayak not to be included in the measurement. The beam of the Kayak or Canoe shall be measured at its widest part. Rubbing strake if any is not to be included in the measurement.
13. **Weighing**
No alterations in Canoes or Kayaks are permitted after the measuring and weighing and before the competition takes place. All loose outfits shall be removed. Permanent knee rests attached to the floor board and buoyancy attachments consisting of water absorbing material must be absolutely dry at the first weighing prior to the race. Where possible in National Championships the first four boats in the final as well as all the boats which have qualified for a higher round shall, immediately after the race, be measured and weighed again.

Part III - ORGANISATION OF COMPETITIONS

14. Officials

- 14.1 If its nature and extent demand, each competition shall be held under the supervision of the following officials:

Chief Official	Competition Organiser
Competition Secretary	Starter(s)
Aligner	Course Umpire(s)
Finishing Line Judge(s)	Turning Point Umpire(s)
Measurer(s)	Timekeeper(s)
Press Official	Announcer

If circumstances permit, one person may function in two of the above offices. The Chief Official, Competition Organiser, Starter, Umpires, and Chief Judge should, if possible, be registered British Canoe Union Officials.

- 14.2 For status competitions two members of the competition committee must be registered Regatta Officials of the B.C.U. Racing Committee.

Part III - ORGANISATION OF COMPETITIONS(cont)

- 14.3 Competition Committee: The top management of the competition shall be in the hands of a Competition Committee which shall consist of:

Chief Official

Competition Organiser

One additional person who may be one of the other officials provided that his function allows him to be near the finishing line at all times. This person is appointed by the Chief Official.

The Competition Committee must:

- 14.3.1 Organise the competition and supervise its arrangement.
 - 14.3.2 In the event of inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances which make it impossible to carry out the competition, postpone the competition and decide on another time when it may be held.
 - 14.3.3 Hear any protests that may be made and settle any disputes that may arise.
 - 14.3.4 Decide matters concerning disqualifications in cases where the regulations are broken during the competition. Should a competitor be injured during a heat, the Committee may allow him to compete in another heat or in the final.
 - 14.3.5 Make decisions based on the Racing Rules. Penalties in accordance with the B.C.U. Rules or the B.C.U. Racing Section Disciplinary Regulations may also be imposed i.e. disqualification for a longer period than the duration of the competition in question.
 - 14.3.6 Before any decision is made regarding any infraction of the rules, hear the opinion of the Umpire who controlled the race in which the infraction was said to have occurred. The Committee shall also seek the opinions of other officials in the race, if it is felt to be of importance in clearing up the alleged infraction.
- 14.4 The Competition Jury: Final authority for National Championship Competitions shall rest with a Jury composed of a Chairman and four members.
- 14.4.1 The members of the Jury shall be appointed by a quorum of the Racing Committee prior to the commencement of the competition. (In the event of a quorum not being present, the Chairman, Vice Chairman, or another official of the Racing Committee and two Committee members may appoint the Jury).
 - 14.4.2 The Chairman of the Jury will be the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Racing Committee or an elected Racing Committee member.
 - 14.4.3 Subordinate to this Jury are the Chief Official and other officials shown in rule 14.1.
 - 14.4.4 Protests shall be referred to the Chief Official for decision by the Competition Committee in accordance with Rule 24.
 - 14.4.5 An appeal against a decision of the Competition Committee must be addressed to the Chairman of the Jury and handed in not later than 20 minutes after the Team Leader has been informed, in writing by the Chief Official, of the decision against the competitor or crew and has signed the receipt.
 - 14.4.6 The decision of the Jury is final.

14.5 Duties of Officials

- 14.5.1 The Chief Official, who is also the Chairman of the Competition Committee, shall observe and supervise the races and decide on all matters arising during the actual contest which are not dealt with in these Rules. The Chief Official may disqualify any competitor who behaves improperly or who, by his conduct or speech, shows contempt towards the competition officials, other competitors or onlookers.

Part III - ORGANISATION OF COMPETITIONS(cont)

- 14.5.2 The Competition Organiser is responsible for organising the competition and producing the competition programme. He should chair the Team Leaders Meeting and is responsible for the smooth running of the competition and the general co-ordination of officials and competitors during the competition. When required to do so by the Competition Committee (or Jury in the case of National Championship Competitions) he shall, with the assistance of the measurer, ensure that regulations concerning measurements are complied with. He shall make certain that the announcer gives the onlookers all the necessary information about the races such as the starting order, the names of competitors failing to start and the result.
- 14.5.3 The Competition Secretary shall be responsible for recording the results of the races, arranging the draws for intermediate rounds and finals and distributing the results and draws to those Officials who require them.
- 14.5.4 The Starter decides all questions concerning the start of the races, and is alone responsible for decisions as to false starts. His decision is final. He shall see that the starting gun or pistol or other starting device is in good working order. By means of a signal, he shall communicate with the officials at the finish line and, after having received a signal from there that all is ready, he shall order the competitors to their places and carry out the start according to the Racing Rules.
- 14.5.5 The Aligner is to bring the boats to the starting line with the least possible delay, to check the competitors' attire and the competitors' number. When all boats are level he shall notify the starter by raising a white flag.
- 14.5.6 The Course Umpire shall see to it that during a race the rules are complied with. If the rules are broken, the Umpire shall report to the Chief Official, who in turn shall refer it to the Competition Committee. The Competition Committee shall decide whether any of the competitors concerned shall be disqualified or not. If the Umpire has a report of an infraction of the rules he shall show a red flag after the race and shall make a report before the next race takes place. In such a case, the Competition Committee make known its decision immediately and before the result of the race is announced. If there is no infraction to report, the Umpire shall show a white flag. In races of 500 and 1,000 metres, the Umpire shall follow the race in a boat. He shall be completely unhampered during the race. No one except the Umpire and his secretary shall be admitted to the boat reserved for him. When a launch is not used, one or more Umpires shall be placed in such positions from which they can ensure that the rules are being complied with. In long distance races with many competitors, more than one Umpire may be nominated. One of the Umpires shall, if possible, follow the leading group in the race, but without disturbing the other competitors.
- 14.5.7 The Turning Point Umpires, when a race is run along a course with one or more turning points, one or more Umpires and one secretary must be stationed at each turning point, where they gain the best view of the turn. The Turning Point Umpire shall see that the competitors turn according to the rules. The Secretary shall make a list of all who pass the turning point. Immediately after the race, the Turning Point Umpire shall report to the Chief Official as to who has turned and if any infraction of the rules has taken place. The authority and duties of the Turning Point Umpire correspond with those of the Course Umpire.

Part III - ORGANISATION OF COMPETITIONS(cont)

- 14.5.8 The Finishing Line Judges decide the order in which the competitors passed the finishing line. The Judges shall be placed at the finishing post. If the Judges differ regarding the placing of two or more of the competitors the dispute in the absence of photo finish, shall be decided by simple majority. In the case of equal voting, the Chief Judge has a casting vote. When the photo finish is used, the final decision should be co-ordinated with the results of the photo finish. The Chief Judge shall inform the Officials concerned in good time before a fresh race is started. The decision of the Judges is final.
- 14.5.9 The Timekeepers are responsible for recording the times. This shall be done by means of stop watches. Before each individual race, the Chief Timekeeper shall see that the watches have been wound and tested and shall divide the work among the timekeepers. At the end of each race, he shall compare the official times with other timekeepers and immediately inform the Competition Secretary of them. Each race shall be timed by at least two watches. When the watches have not recorded the same time, the longest (worst) time shall be taken as correct. The stop watches are to be started when the starting flag is lowered or when the smoke from the starting pistol or gun is visible, not when the sound of the shot is heard.
- 14.5.10 The Announcer shall, on the instructions of the Competition Organiser, announce the start of each race, the order of the starting and the position of the competitors during the race. After the race is finished, he will announce the results.
- 14.5.11 The Press Official must supply all the necessary information to the representatives of the press, radio and television about the race and its progress. He is authorised therefore to ask for information from the different Officials who must procure for him as soon as possible the copies from the official results.

15. Invitations

An invitation to an Open Regatta shall contain the following information:-

- 15.1 Time and place of the regatta.
- 15.2 Situation and plan of the course.
- 15.3 Classes and distance of the races.
- 15.4 Whether the races are to be held on still or running water, up or down stream.
- 15.5 Amount of entry fee.
- 15.6 Address to which entries should be sent and the final date for receiving entries. This date shall not be earlier than 14 days prior to the first day of the competition.

16. Entries

Entries for open Regattas can only be made in accordance with the regulations given in the invitation. An entry shall, however, always contain the following information:-

- 16.1 Name and address of competitor or crew.
- 16.2 Name of club to which competitor or crew belong.
- 16.3 Classes and distances in which the competitor or crew propose to compete.
- 16.4 Similar details of reserves if any.
- 16.5 The Racing Registration number of each competitor, member of the crew or reserves. An entry may be sent by facsimile if it is despatched before midnight on the last day for receiving entries. Entry by facsimile must be confirmed immediately by letter and in the eventuality of conflicting information, the information by letter would take precedence. Late entries shall not normally be accepted. The acceptance of late entries shall be at the discretion of the Competition Committee who may charge up to double the entry fee.

ORGANISATION OF COMPETITIONS(cont)

17. Acceptance of Entries

Confirmation that the entry has been accepted, together with notification of the result of the draw and time of events, shall be sent to the entrant on written request by him and on production by the entrant to the Competition Organiser of a "stamped addressed" envelope.

18. Alterations to Entries and Withdrawals

Any competitor named in the final entry or at the Team Leaders Meeting may substitute for any other in the given type of racing (kayak men, kayak ladies, canoe men). Notification of alterations in the entries must be given in written form to the Chief Official at least one hour before the first race of the morning or afternoon session. The withdrawal from a race is considered final and no renewed entry of the same crew is allowed. Every competitor whose entry has been confirmed by his own club, at the time of the meeting of the team leaders, called for this purpose, is obliged to take part in the due event. If the competitor does not start, and has no valid reason approved by the Competition Committee, he shall be disqualified for the whole competition. A competitor who arrives too late at the start, shall be considered to have voluntarily withdrawn and shall be disqualified from taking any further part in the event, under this rule.

The refunding of entry fees for entries withdrawn not less than 24 hours before the competition is at the discretion of the Competition Committee.

19. Alterations in the sequence of events

The sequence of races given in the programme and the intervals between races as given in the racing programme are binding on the organisers. Alterations cannot be made unless the respective Team Managers at the competition give their consent.

20. Marking Signs

For National Championships and where possible for other competitions the turning points shall be marked by at least six flags (or buoys) which shall be readily distinguishable and shall, if possible be diagonally divided with one half in red and the other half in yellow. Both the start and the finishing lines shall be marked with red flags or buoys, at the points where these lines intersect the outer limits of the course.

21. Courses

Before the start of the races the racing course shall be measured and marked by means of clearly visible flags mounted on buoys. The course at the start shall permit a clear width where possible, of at least 5 metres for each boat. For National Championships the starting and finishing lines shall be at right angles to the course. The finishing line shall be at least 45 metres long and be marked by two flags. The Finishing Line Judges must be placed as near to the finishing line as possible. For National Championship races up to 1,000 metres, the course must be straight and in one direction. For races exceeding 1,000 metres turning points are permitted. In this case the following conditions should be fulfilled, (unless a special dispensation has been obtained from the Racing Committee).

21.1 For National Championships the following conditions should be fulfilled:-

21.1.1 The distance between the starting line and the first flag of the first turning point (first open stretch) shall be straight and at least 1,850.5 metres.

21.1.2 The distance between the last flag of the first turning point and the first flag of the second turning point (second stretch), shall be straight and maximum 1750.5 metres.

ORGANISATION OF COMPETITIONS(cont)

- 21.1.3 The distance between the last flag of the second turning point and the first flag of the third turning point (third stretch) shall be a minimum of 500 metres.
- 21.1.4 The conditions of all other stretches shall be in accordance with point c. (from the 4th to the 12th or more stretches)
- 21.1.5 The radius of each turn should, if possible be at least 40.5 metres.
- 21.1.6 Both the start and the finish of the race shall be in front of the finish tower.
- 21.1.7 The red flags of the finish line shall be placed as much to the outside possible in order to get the widest possible finish line.
- 21.1.8 The starting pontoons for the 500 metre races are to be removed if possible.
- 21.2 For competitions other than National Championships these conditions should be complied with, where possible, and the Racing Committee approval for the course sought through the Secretary.
- 22. **Canoe Numbers**

All kayaks and canoes shall carry a vertical number plate marked with black numbers on yellow ground indicating the lane. The plates shall be placed on the centre line of the after deck (Canadian Canoe foredeck). The approximate size of the number plate shall be 18 x 20 cm.
- 23. **Instructions for Competitors**

Written instructions shall be available for competitors 2 hours before the start of the competition, containing the following information:

 - 23.1 Detailed information of the courses and course markings.
 - 23.2 Starting time.
 - 23.3 Starting line.
 - 23.4 Finishing line
 - 23.5 Competitors racing number.
- 24. **Protests**

a protest against the right of a crew to take part in a race shall be referred to the Chief Official not later than one hour before the start of the race.

 - 24.1 a protest made later (within 31 days from the date when the race in question was held) is only permitted if the officials of the club of the competitor making the protest can prove that the facts on which the protest is based, came to their knowledge later than one hour before the start of the race.
 - 24.2 a late protest shall be referred to the B.C.U. Racing Committee accompanied by the prescribed fee (see below).
 - 24.3 a protest made during a competition must be addressed to the Competition Committee and be handed to the Chief Official not later than 20 minutes after the Team Leader has been informed by the Chief Official of the protest against his competitor or team. All protests must be made in writing and be accompanied by a fee of £5.00 (International Competitions £15.00) which shall be returnable if the protest is upheld. If the protest is not upheld the fee may not be returned at the discretion of the Competition Committee.

Part IV - RACING REGULATIONS

25. Disqualifications

Any competitor who attempts to win a race by any other than honourable means, who breaks the Racing Regulations, or who disregards the honourable nature of the Racing Regulations, shall be disqualified for the duration of the race concerned. Should a competitor have completed a race in a kayak or canoe which is shown on inspection not to fulfil the classifications (see Rules 10-13), he shall be disqualified from the race in question. It is forbidden to receive during a race, outside help, or to be accompanied by other boats along the course - even outside the lanes - or by throwing objects into the course. All such acts shall entail the disqualification of the competitor(s) concerned. For National Championships, and where possible all other competitions, all disqualifications by the Competition Committee have to be confirmed in writing immediately with reasons. The Team Leader has to acknowledge the receipt on a copy with the exact time, which is the start of the protest time.

26. Means of Propulsion

Kayaks shall be propelled solely by means of double bladed paddles. Canadian Canoes shall be propelled solely by means of single bladed paddles. The paddles may not be fixed on the boat in any way. If a paddle is broken (except at the start; see Rule 28) a competitor may not be provided with a new one by a supporter.

27. Heats and Finals

At least three kayaks or canoes must be entered before a race can be held. If the number of entries in race up to and including 1,000 metres is so great that heats are necessary, the number of kayaks or canoes in each heat and in the final, must not exceed nine. The division of competitors into heats shall be determined by drawing lots.

- 27.1.1 Where the width of the course permits, eight or nine kayaks or canoes shall participate in the final, (if more than this number have been entered in the entire race the recommended procedure is:-

3 to 9 entries direct final.

10 to 15 entries two heats and three from each to final, rest to 1 semifinal, with 3 through to the final.

16 to 27 entries 3 heats, 1-2 to final : 3-5 to semifinal, with 3 to the final

- 27.1.2 The division into heats must be made in such a way that at least three competitors proceed to the final (or intermediate heats) from each preceding heat.

- 27.2 When making the draw, the difference between the number of competitors in the heats of the race shall not exceed one.

- 27.3 If the number of competitors in the heats varies, the earlier heats shall have the largest numbers. Any crew which has not taken part in a heat as instructed shall not be allowed to compete in the final. The composition of a crew which has qualified for intermediate heats or for the final must not be changed.

- 27.4 Heats and the final shall be run on the same stretch of water. Participation in the final must depend upon times attained in the heats. For races of more than 1,000 metres, heats shall not be held, and all canoes or kayaks taking part shall start simultaneously.

- 27.5 Should the width of the water not permit a simultaneous start, starts at regular intervals shall be permitted.

28. Start

Lots shall be drawn to determine the stations of boats at the start. Lane One shall be on the left (when facing the finish), then lane two and so on. In competitions where heats are required, lots must be drawn for each heat separately (opening, intermediate, and final).

- 28.1 Competitors shall be at the start at the time specified in the racing programme. The start shall be given without reference to absentees.

Part IV - RACING REGULATIONS(cont)

- 28.2 The position of the boats at the start shall be such that the bows of the competing boats are on the starting line.
- 28.3 The starter shall call the attention of the competitors at the start with the words "Attention Please" and if the line is satisfactory shall give the starting signal by a shot. The shot can be replaced by the word "GO". The interval between the word "please" and the starting signal shall be between one and five seconds. If the starter is not satisfied with the line he will call "STOP" and hand over to the aligner for repositioning.
- 28.4 When races start from a pontoon or a dock an assistant holds the stern of the boat and releases it on the word "GO" (shot).
- 28.5 If a boat moves beyond the starting line after the word "Please" and before the starting signal, the competitor(s) has/have made a false start. The starter must immediately warn the offending competitor/s and if two false starts are made by the same competitor/s the starter must exclude him (her) from the race. a repeated warning and subsequent disqualification by the starter applies only to the boat/competitor(s) who caused the false start. Any competitor who disregards the second warning of the starter to take up the correct position at the start, and who keeps ahead of the other competitors, shall be excluded from the race in question.
29. **Interruptions**
The Umpire has the right to interrupt a correctly started distance race if unforeseen hindrances arise. The competitors must immediately stop paddling and await further instructions. If a race is declared null and void, no change of the composition of a crew is permitted at the new start. In the event of a capsize the competitor or crew is eliminated from the race if he or they are not able to get in again without outside help.
30. **Taking Pace and Hanging**
Taking pace or receiving assistance from boats not in the race or by any other means is not permitted. When a race is in progress crews not taking part in the race are strictly forbidden to proceed over whole or part of the course, even outside the marking buoys.
- 30.1 Races up to 1,000 metres. In races up to 1,000 metres competitors must keep to their lane from the start to the finish of the course. It is forbidden to hang, and no competitor must come nearer than five metres in any direction to another competitor.
- 30.2 Races of more than 1,000 metres. In races over distances of more than 1,000 metres competitors may deviate from their lane providing they do not impede other competitors.
31. **Turns**
When a race is run on a course with turning points these shall be passed to port (i.e. in an anti clockwise direction). When going around a turning point, the competitor on the outer course must leave room for the competitor on the inner course if that competitor has the bow of his boat at least level with the front edge of the cockpit of the boat on the outer course. With respect to K2 and K4, this refers to the fore-cockpit. With respect to C1, it refers to the level of the competitor's body, and for C2 it refers to the level of the body of the foremost member of the crew. a competitor will not be disqualified for touching a turning buoy, unless, in the opinion of the Turning Point Umpires, an advantage has been gained therefrom. In making a turn, the boat shall follow as closely as possible the course as marked by the buoys at the turning point.

RACING REGULATIONS(cont)

32. Overtaking

When a canoe or kayak is overtaking another canoe or kayak in a race, it is the duty of the overtaking craft to keep clear at all times of the boat being overtaken. On the other hand, the craft being overtaken must not alter its course to make difficulties for the overtaking craft.

33. Collision or Damage

Any competitor who collides with another, or who damages the craft or paddle of another can be disqualified.

34. Finish

The finishing line is reached when the bow of the canoe or kayak with the competitor/s in it passes the line between the red flags. If two or more boats reach the finishing line at the same time they get the same classification in the final. In the case of a dead heat finish for any position which determines the advance to the next level of the competition the following rules will apply:

34.1 Wherever there are sufficient number of lanes available in the next level of the competition, drawing of lots will determine to which race each boat will advance.

34.2 Wherever there are not enough lanes available there will be a re-race between the boats involved 30 minutes after the race (and for International Competitions one hour after the last race of the day, or half day programme)

34.3 In the case of a dead heat in the re-race, drawing of lots will determine the outcome.

35. Racing Colours

Every racing club must register their racing colours with the Racing Committee (and any changes thereto). All competitors from a club must wear the correct colours at all times.

Part V - SPECIAL RULES FOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS

36. Only members of the B.C.U. who qualify under Rule 9. may participate in National Championship events. The only exceptions to this rule are those exempted under Rule 5.

37. All canoes and kayaks must comply with the classes and building rules as laid down in Part II of these rules.

38. Officials: Fully in accordance with Rules 14.1 and 14.3.

39. Competition Committee: Fully in accordance with Rule 14.3.

40. Competition Jury: Fully in accordance with Rule 14.4.

41. Marking signs: In accordance with Rule 20.

42. Courses: In accordance with rule 21.

43. Disqualifications: In accordance with Rule 25.

44. Heats and Finals:

In the event of there being fewer than three kayaks or canoes in a National Championship event then no medals will be awarded. If four kayaks or canoes are in an event then only a Gold Medal will be awarded. If five kayaks or canoes are in an event then only Gold and Silver Medals will be awarded. If six or more kayaks or canoes are in an event then Gold, Silver & Bronze medals will be awarded.

Part VI - DISCIPLINARY REGULATIONS

45.1 These regulations may be applied without alteration to any Specialist Section of the B.C.U. by means of a resolution passed by a general meeting of the Section Specialist Committee. The Racing Section adopted this code of practice at a Special General Meeting in April 1989.

45.2 General procedure

45.2.1 a complaint that an individual member of the Union has behaved in a manner that is, or is likely to be, prejudicial to the conduct of a Section event or of a Section training facility, or to the interests of the Section, or to the general interests of canoeing, may be lodged by means of a statement of complaint signed as provided below and setting out the facts on which this complaint is grounded.

45.2.2 a complaint by an affiliated club or by a committee organising an event or training facility shall be signed by two members of the club or organising committee who are B.C.U. members, one of whom must be the chairman or secretary of the club or committee.

45.2.3 a complaint by any other person shall be signed by the person concerned and state that person's address.

45.3 The complaint shall be sent to the chairman or secretary of the Specialist Executive Committee, who shall take immediate steps to convene the Executive Committee within 30 days to consider the complaint and any rebutting or mitigating statement furnished by the alleged offender.

45.4 The Section Executive Committee shall ensure that a copy of the complaint is or has been handed personally to the individual member to whom it relates, or has been sent by recorded delivery post to that member, together with an invitation to furnish in writing within 21 days any rebutting facts or mitigating explanation or submission and a notification of the date when the Section Executive will meet to consider them. At the same time the member shall be asked whether he wishes to be present, in which case he may be asked questions, when the complaint is being considered, and informed that if no reply is received within a period of 21 days the section Executive will consider the complaint in his absence on the basis of the facts and statements in their possession. The Section Executive may invite the complainant to comment on the member's reply, and shall supply a copy of any such comments to the member before the meeting.

45.5 At the meeting the Section Executive Committee shall consider the complaint and any statement made in writing or orally by the member concerned. If the member has asked to be present at the meeting he must have been invited to attend. The Section Executive Committee may question either party, if present, or call on them to supply additional evidence. If the section Executive Committee has not completed its consideration of the complaint within 30 days from the date of the meeting referred to in Regulation 45.3 (above) it shall be taken to have rejected it, but the complainant may in that event address a complaint to the B.C.U. Council for consideration under Article 9 of the Articles of Association of the British Canoe Union.

45.6 On completing consideration the Section Executive Committee shall draw up its findings of fact, and may decide:

45.6.1 To reject the complaint.

45.6.2 To warn or reprimand the individual member concerned.

45.6.3 To suspend the individual member from participating in specified section events or training facilities either -

45.6.3.1 For a period not exceeding 3 months, starting at least 10 days after notification of the decision to the member, or

45.6.3.2 For a specified number of such events or facilities, not exceeding five in number, consecutively where all that number would not have taken place within the period specified in 45.6.3.1 above.

Part VI - DISCIPLINARY REGULATIONS(cont)

45.6.4 To recommend to the B.C.U. Council that a suspension should be for a longer period, or that the member should be suspended from all B.C.U. membership rights, or expelled from the Union, or that some other specified penalty should be imposed by the Council.

Where the complaint was originally lodged by the Section Executive Committee itself, it shall not impose a penalty under 6.3.1 or 6.3.2 above, but may recommend that the penalty be imposed by Council.

45.7 The Section Executive Committee shall notify the member by recorded deliver post of its findings of fact and of its decision or recommendation and shall inform him of his right of appeal under regulation 8 below, where applicable, and shall send a copy of the notification to the B.C.U. Council.

45.8 In the case of a decision falling under regulation 6.3 or 6.4 or involving a recommendation under regulation 6.2, the individual member concerned may appeal to the B.C.U. Council within 10 days of the date of notification, setting out the grounds for appeal in writing: where an appeal is made the penalty shall be treated as in abeyance pending consideration of the appeal by Council.

45.9 The B.C.U. Council shall consider, within 30 days of being notified of the complaint, the Section Executive Committee's findings and decision and give the member an opportunity within a specified time to make orally any further explanation or defence that he desires to submit.

45.10 The B.C.U. Council's functions under regulation 9 may be performed by a standing Committee appointed for the purpose under Article 42 of the Articles of Association of the B.C.U.

45.11 **Immediate Discipline**

Organisers of events or training facilities in the Section's programme may, without prejudice to the making of complaints under Regulations 45.2-45.10 above, summarily exclude or disqualify members or competitors for violent or very unreasonable behaviour from the event or session concerned or from subsequent events or facilities held at the same site within 2 months of the offence.

DOPING CONTROL RULES

June 1995

of

B.C.U. Sports Management Committee

46 Definitions

- 46.0.1 'Prohibited Drugs' means drugs and other substances that may be taken for the purpose of enhancing performance in sport or that are included in lists published from time to time by the International Olympic Association and/or the International Canoe Federation (I.C.F.) as being prohibited drugs and substances.
- 46.0.2 'Doping' means the use by or distribution to an athlete of a prohibited drug
- 46.0.3 'Designated sampling officer' means a person designated by the British Canoe Union (B.C.U.) or a National Canoeing Association or an independent sampling officer appointed by the Sports Council or the International Canoe Federation (I.C.F.) for the purpose of collecting samples of a body fluid from athletes in the course of training or competing for testing for the presence of a prohibited drug.

46.1 Prohibition of Doping

- 46.1.1 Doping is prohibited.

46.2 Submission to Tests

- 46.2.1 Any athlete shall, if requested by a designated sampling officer, submit to a doping control test.
- 46.2.2 Every athlete invited on to a B.C.U. national team or squad shall be required to sign a declaration in the form required before being allowed to participate in the said team or squad. See Appendix 1.
- 46.2.3 Any refusal or failure to submit to a doping control test when required to do so shall be treated as prima facie evidence of a contravention of rule 1.1 and shall be reported to the B.C.U. Drugs Advisory Committee, who shall institute disciplinary procedures as if the test had been carried out and a positive result found.
- 46.2.4 The athlete concerned shall immediately be suspended from all B.C.U. or I.C.F. competitive events pending a decision under the disciplinary procedures.
- 46.2.5 The identification of a prohibited drug or one of its metabolites, or the presence of specified amounts of endogenous substances subject to quantitative analysis in a body fluid shall be prima facie evidence of a contravention of rule 1.1 and disciplinary procedures will be instituted.
- 46.2.6 Any person assisting or inciting others in the contravention of any provision of these Rules shall be presumed to have committed an offence against these Rules and may be subject to disciplinary action.

46.3 Sampling procedures

- 46.3.1 Samples may be taken at any international or domestic competitive or squad training event for the management of which the B.C.U. or the I.C.F. is responsible or on other occasions as determined by the Sports Management Committee or Specialist Committee concerned. (Committees to minute a requirement for out of competition testing)
- 46.3.2 The competitor shall provide a minimum of 100 ml. of urine under the direct observation of the sampling officer. The sample shall be divided (either by the competitor - or if requested by the sampling officer) into two parts. The first, the 'A' sample shall be approximately 2/3 of the total volume and the second part shall be 1/3 of the total volume.

DOPING CONTROL RULES

June 1995

- 46.3.3 Both 'A' and 'B' samples shall be submitted to an I.O.C. accredited laboratory. The 'A' sample will be analysed for the presence of substances of the I.O.C. Doping Classes and Methods. The 'B' sample will be securely stored by the laboratory pending the results of the 'A' sample analysis. If the 'A' sample report is negative, the 'B' sample will be destroyed. However, if the 'A' sample is found to contain a substance of the IOC Doping Classes or Methods the 'B' sample shall be retained.

46.4 Procedures following the testing

- 46.4.1 If the result of the test is positive the athlete concerned shall be notified immediately by the B.C.U. and shall be suspended from all B.C.U. competition pending an investigation by the B.C.U. Drugs Advisory Committee.
- 46.4.2 The reserve sample shall be tested by the Drugs Testing Unit, normally within 7 days of the notification to the athlete concerned of the result of the first test. The athlete or his or her nominee shall be offered the opportunity to attend the testing laboratory on the date when the reserve sample is to be tested by the Drugs Testing Unit.
- 46.4.3 If the result of the test of the reserve sample is negative, the athlete concerned shall be notified accordingly and the suspension lifted and no further action shall be taken.
- 46.4.4 If the result of the testing of the reserve sample is positive the test result shall be taken as conclusive and the athlete concerned shall be informed immediately of this result.
- 46.4.5 The B.C.U. Drugs Advisory Committee shall investigate the circumstances at a meeting to be held within 28 days of the notification to the athlete concerned and he/she shall be invited to attend the meeting, or be represented, and give an explanation of the circumstances. The athlete shall be informed that he or she may submit a written explanation prior to the meeting instead of or as well as attending in person.
- 46.4.6 The B.C.U. Drugs Advisory Committee shall consider the circumstances in the light of the explanation and any advice available from the Drugs Testing Unit as to the interpretation of the results and shall then decide whether a penalty should be imposed, and if so that penalty, and shall report its decision immediately to the B.C.U., stating the reasons for the conclusions it reached in the course of considering the circumstances and any explanation given by the athlete.
- 46.4.7 Where an athlete has refused or failed to attend to submit to a doping control test as requested under Rule 2.1 the B.C.U. Drugs Advisory Committee shall invite him or her to provide an explanation and shall proceed to consider the circumstances as if the results of the test had proved positive.

46.5 Penalties

The B.C.U. Drugs Advisory Committee may:

- 46.5.1 Decide to warn or reprimand the athlete or
- 46.5.2 Impose a period of suspension from any or all B.C.U. competitive event for a stipulated period or
- 46.5.3 Impose a period of suspension from any or all B.C.U. competitive events up to and including a specified major championships or
- 46.5.4 Impose a life-time ban on participation in any or all B.C.U. competitive events or
- 46.5.5 In addition to or instead of any of the above penalties recommend to the B.C.U. Council of Management that the athlete should be suspended or expelled from B.C.U. Membership.

46.6 Subsequent procedures

- 46.6.1 The Chief Executive of the B.C.U.(or an officer delegated by him) shall, within 7 days of being notified by the Drugs Advisory Committee of its decision and conclusions, notify to the athlete the decision and conclusions of the B.C.U. Drugs Advisory Committee and the date when any penalty imposed or recommended under Rule 5.2, 3,4 or 5 will become operative and that he or she has a right of appeal against the decision within 14 days to the B.C.U. Council by sending to the Chief Executive of the B.C.U. a written statement setting out the grounds of the appeal. The B.C.U. Council or Standing Committee appointed by Council under Rule 6.3 shall meet within 30 days of receipt of the appeal. Where an appeal is made any penalty imposed shall be treated as in abeyance pending consideration of the appeal by the B.C.U. Council.
- 46.6.2 The decision of the B.C.U. Council shall be final, and shall be notified to the Sports Council and the I.C.F., and the name of the offender and the penalty imposed may be published.
- 46.6.3 The B.C.U. Council's function under Rules 6.2 and 6.3 may be performed by a standing committee appointed for the purpose under Article 42 of the B.C.U. Articles of Association.

46.7 Application to members of Canoe Association of Northern Ireland, the Scottish Canoe Association, or the Welsh Canoeing Association, or other governing body of sport recognised by the Sports Council and/or the Central Council of Physical Recreation and/or I.C.F.

- 46.7.1 Where the athlete is a member of the Canoe Association of Northern Ireland, the Scottish Canoe Association, the Welsh Canoe Association or governing body of sport as defined above, the outcome shall be reported to that Association or governing body of sport with a view to their applying a comparable penalty to competitive events for which they are the governing body.

46.8 Application of a decision under the Drugs Control Rules of C.A.N.I., S.C.A., or W.C.A., or other governing bodies of sport recognised by the Sports Council and/or the Central Council of Physical Recreation and/or the I.C.F.

- 46.8.1 Where the B.C.U. is notified by the Canoe Association of Northern Ireland, the Scottish Canoe Association or the Welsh Canoeing Association or other governing body of sport as defined above of the outcome of comparable disciplinary proceedings against a B.C.U. member, a comparable penalty shall apply to B.C.U. competitive events.
- 46.8.3 Any athlete who is suspended or banned from competition by any governing body of sport or who has been suspended or expelled from that organisation for offences against the rules for the control of doping within that sport shall not be eligible for participation in competitive events held under the jurisdiction of the B.C.U..

APPENDIX 1 - SENIOR PADDLERS

Each Training Squad Manager is to asked to ensure that every SENIOR paddlers invited onto a national squad signs the following declaration:

Agreement By Competitor

I, _____ Agree not to use any of the substances on the list of prohibited drugs★ prepared by the International Olympic Committee(the I.O.C. prohibited drug list) and the International Canoe Federation and hereby agree that not withstanding my selection for the British Canoe Union Team, I may be excluded from competition by the British Canoe Union or suffer such other penalty as permitted under the Doping Control Rules if I fail to comply with one or more of the following conditions:

- 1 To supply the B.C.U. and/or the I.C.F. and/or the Sports Council or other body as be designated under the Doping Control Rules contained in the Yearbook for each discipline of Canoeing upon request with full information concerning medications and medical treatments which have been prescribed for me or which I have undergone.
- 2 To submit to such medical control and examination as may from time to time be required by the B.C.U. and/or I.C.F. Medical Commission and/or Sports Council etc..
- 3 To abstain from the use of any and all drugs included in the I.O.C. prohibited drug list together with chemically and pharmacologically related compounds.
- 4 To abstain from the practice known as 'blood doping'.

APPENDIX 2 - JUNIOR PADDLERS

Each Training Squad Manager is to be asked to ensure that the parent or guardian of every junior paddlers invited onto a national squad signs the following declaration:

Dear Parent/Guardian

Your son/daughter(name) _____ is being considered for selection to represent

In order to be able to participate, he/she must be prepared to submit himself/herself, if selected, to Doping Control Procedures. This involves providing a sample of urine under observation by a trained sampling officer, in accordance with the B.C.U.'s rules for the Control of Doping, which are contained in the Yearbook, or can be forwarded upon request to the B.C.U. office.

Your agreement is required for your son/daughter's participation in Doping Control Procedures. Failure to give this agreement will mean that your son/daughter will not be eligible for selection.

Do you use a Ventolin Inhaler?

If you have been prescribed a Ventolin Inhaler, and compete at a level which might make you subject to a doping test, you are invited to register the fact with the B.C.U.'s Medical Officer.

Ventolin inhalers involve a drug called Salbutomal which is a banned substance under the International Olympic Committee's rules. It has been agreed, however, that users of inhalers, who register the fact with their governing body, will not be subject to the normal disciplinary procedures which follow the identification of a banned substance, if the amount detected is consistent with the declared use of a Ventolin inhaler.

Please send to the B.C.U. office for a registration form for completion by your general practitioner. Upon its return to the B.C.U. office, receipt will be acknowledged and the team doctor of your discipline will be informed. Should you be subject to a doping test the fact that your use on an inhaler has been declared should be made known to the officials concerned.

Banned Substances

The list of permitted and prohibited drugs is constantly changing. Members of national squads should received a card giving some basic advice. On no account should a member of a national squad take a new medication without first checking that it is not on the banned list.

Some medications on the banned list will be allowed if the athlete has registered them with the B.C.U.'s Medical Officer. This particularly applies to Ventolin inhalers.

Athletes and coaches requiring further advice on medication should ring the Sports Council Advice Line.

BCU MEMBERSHIP AND EVENT TICKETS

1999 sees a new system for the membership for Juniors of a B.C.U. Affiliated Club.

A junior club member need not be a full member of the B.C.U. in order to race in the lower divisions (7, 8, & 9) of the Marathon Racing System, or in the other two categories of marathon races. He or She must be a member of his or her club, and the number used for his or her identification will be club's affiliation number followed by his or her own individual club number.

Should he or she be promoted, however, into a higher division (6 & upwards) he or she must then become a full member of the B.C.U. in his or her own right.

Race Organisers **MUST** still check that his or her membership is current either by photocopy of membership with entry or seeing the card on the day of the race.

If the card is unavailable or forgotten the paddler may purchase an "Event Ticket" as a "stop gap" but only once per season. A check on event ticket issue is carried out for all race results by the records officer and those paddlers abusing this system will be penalised.

The system is as follows:

1. The tickets are for use by non-members at the entry level only of National Competitions requiring membership, ie Divisional Racing.
2. For use at a BCU event when the organiser believes a participant may be a member but the member cannot provide proof by way of a membership card.
3. Fees are set by event organisers, minimum £2.00, maximum £5.00. In every case £1.50 will be sent to the organiser's regional treasurer and the rest kept by the organising committee.
4. Event Ticket fees are not refundable.
5. The overall consideration is to encourage, in the best possible way, membership of the country's governing body for canoesport.

MARATHON INTERNATIONALS

REVIEW OF 1998

World Championships, Cape Town, South Africa.

The event, of four 9.5 km laps, was held on a long lake, with side channels through a house lined marina. There were 4 portage at the start and finish area. It provided a very testing course, with many bends, narrow bridge, as well as the open lake. Numerous advantage points for spectators and television cameras, were available, and an excellent television film was made of the event. The start sheets, showed the strongest field ever assembled for a Marathon World Championships.

The Junior World Cups events over a 20Km course in some very difficult windy conditions produced some excellent result for us, with Paul Prestwood / Daniel Matthews winning the K2, in a very tight finish, with the young crew of Nathan Johnson / Tim Sowry, 5th. Joel Wilson was just beaten into 3rd place on the line, in the K1. Keith Moule was forced to retire feeling unwell. The young junior women, Joanna Bates, and Jenny Spencer (15 years old) did very well to finish 6 and 10, not far behind the winners.

For the World Championships, all the singles classes were raced on the Saturday, in ideal conditions, of 20 degrees, and very little wind. Ivan Lawler always looked in control of the Men K1 race, never out of the front group, which was 20 strong for the first lap, and then down to 4 for the final one. He won the event, by a length, in magnificent style, to claim his 4th World Title. He has finished with a Gold or Silver Medal at every World Championships or World Cups Final, since 1988, an outstanding achievement. James Block finishing a very excellent 7th, having been knocked in while in the front group, a third way into the race.

Our ladies, were part of a 7 strong group for all the race, until the final lap, when it reduced to 5. Out of the last portage, with 3Km to go, Anna Hemmings broke clear with the Dutch girl, who was not, unfortunately, prepared to share the work. They were caught again, and in a very close finish, Anna was beaten on the line by the Swedish reigning World Champion. Patricia Davey lost touch after the final portage, but finished an excellent 5th.

James Lee in the C1 gave a very determined performance, improving his position throughout the race, to finish 5th, his best performance yet.

The doubles events took place on the Sunday, when weather conditions were not so good. A strong wind and large waves made conditions on the lake sections very difficult. Our crew of Jules (Tim) Brabants/Conor Holmes, were always in the front group of 8, although not always in the best position. In the final lap, the group was reduced to 3 and the Hungarian crew just held them off, and they were beaten into 2nd place. Steve Baker/Steve Harris were unfortunate not to make the front group off the start, and were always just behind. They paddled a determined race to finish 8th.

Andrea Dallaway/ Helen Gilby were in the front group of 7 from the start. The powerful Swedish boat broke away after 2 laps, which then left 3 boats to contest the other medals. Our ladies came 3rd, in a close finish. Sonja Bapty/Alison Thorogood were disappointed with their 12th place, following being turned twice, at vital points in the race.

Steve and Andrew Train were again dominant in the C2. They worked with 2 Hungarian crews for half the race, and then applied the pressure, to pull away, and win by 2 minutes. They therefore retained their World Championship title, for their 3rd Gold medal, the first of which they won in 1988.

In the overall team classification, GBR won the Nations Trophy by 115 points from HUN with 111 and GER 84. In the World Cups Team Trophy competition, GBR were again top nation, with 228 points, from HUN 200 and GER 164.

These outstanding final results for the season, 2 Gold, 2 Silver, and 1 Bronze, and 1st Nation at the World Championships, means we have surpassed all targets and expectations, in a very rewarding season.

Other Major Internationals results

The World Cups 1 event, at Tyn, in the Czech Republic, on a wide river course, saw Ivan winning the K1, with James Block 5th. Tim / Conor were 2nd in K2. Andy / Helen won the K2, with Trica 3rd. Steve Train paddling with Malcolm Lane, were a very good 4th in C2.

In France, the World Cups 2 event was raced in very rough conditions on a lake. Many crews sank. Andy/Helen coped well to win the K2, and James Block and Paul Slater were 5th and 7th in the K1. Our Juniors did very well, with Paul/Danny and Nathan/Tim 1st and 2nd in the K2, with Joel 2nd in K1. Abi Cattle won the K1

Daniel Golder had an excellent result to take 2nd place in the K1 event, at the Tour de Gudena. Lucy Hardy/Beth Campbell won the Womens K2 class, with Richard Griffiths 2nd in the Under 16K1. Daniel Beazley/Paul Enoch were 4th in the K2 event.

PROGRAMME FOR 1999

At the time of going to press, the overall funding for our programme from the Lottery, has not been finally resolved. It is clear however that the money will be supplied from different sources, which will mean tight restrictions on its use. It is the Committee's intention to provide as fuller programme as possible for 1999, within the restraints. The World Championships, every year from now on, will be in Hungary, in the last weekend in July. The 2 World Cups events are in Italy and the Czech Republic, and the European Championships in Poland.

The main events for the year are therefore:-

The World Cups Trophy is awarded for the best 2 results from the three events. Each country can enter 3 crews, (2 at World Championships) in each class, with only the first finisher to count. In the Junior World Cups there are classes for Men K2, K1, C1 and Women K1& K2

In addition to the 4 main events, we plan to finance small teams to Eindhoven, Crestuma, Bosbaan, Pontrevedra and the Tour de Gudena, depending on the assistance we receive from the Organisers.

Those wishing to compete Internationally, are encouraged to get out and race as much as possible, and to take part in the following events, as part of their training programme.

They are recognised in the Performance Plan, and in the future Potential Plan. The list is not available for publication at the time of going to press, but the Committee will assist all squad members to seek additional personal sponsorship.

INTERNATIONAL SELECTION

The selection of teams for all internationals will be made on a continuous assessment, open to all basis. The composition of the team for each event will depend entirely on paddlers being and proving that they are of sufficiently high standard. All Senior and Junior Kayak Men should race in the Assessment classes, and Senior and Junior Women, and Canoes, in Division 3 unless otherwise instructed. Paddlers wishing to be considered for International Events, must comply with the following conditions.

- 1 They must be Comprehensive BCU members, throughout the year.
- 2 They should apply to the Team Manager, Jim Rossiter, by completing fully, the Application Form, and returning it before:-

28 March (Tonbridge) for ALL EVENTS PRIOR TO WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

30 May (Bedford) for the WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS , EUROPEAN
CHAMPIONSHIPS AND TOUR DE GUDENA

- 3 They should be prepared to meet all assembly costs and pay £50 per person per event as a contribution towards food.
- 4 They should be prepared to travel and be accommodated in the best interest of the team.
- 5 They must be prepared to accept the Team Coach's direction with regard to training and racing while abroad.
- 6 They must be prepared to dress and conduct themselves in a manner befitting a British Team representative, and promote the good name of British canoeing both at home and abroad.
- 7 They should be prepared to give support to the Sports Council in promotional aspects, in return for the Grant Aid received.
- 8 They should wear the GB tracksuit and team clothing provided, on all suitable occasions.
- 9 They should compete in the appropriate assessment events, and make themselves available for at least one World Cups event, if they wish to be considered for the World Championship and European Championships

MARATHON RACING CONSTITUTION

PART A. - CONSTITUTION AND ADMINISTRATION

1. The Marathon Racing Section of the BCU interests itself in all matters arising out of Marathon Racing in Great Britain.
Its aims are as follows :-
 - a) To encourage Club, Regional, National and International Marathon Events.
 - b) To draft rules and make recommendations for the conduct of National and Regional marathons.
 - c) To give advice, guidance, and encouragement to sponsors of Marathon racing in Great Britain.
 - d) To select, train and administer teams representing Great Britain in International events.
 - e) To select, train and administer teams representing England in International events.
 - f) To confirm and record cross channel canoe and kayak record attempts.
 - g) To foster the development of suitable craft and equipment for Marathon Racing.
 - h) To act as final authority in disputes and protests.
2. Annual General Meetings shall consist of a Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, National Racing Coach and other such officials as the Annual General Meeting consider it necessary to elect, together with the representatives appointed by the clubs and organisations. Each canoe club affiliated to the BCU, and having five full members of the BCU, may appoint two representatives to attend the Marathon Racing Annual Meetings. Under current arrangements the Race Records Officer has a clerical function only and is not an elected member of the Executive Committee.
3. Each club or organisation affiliated to the BCU and represented at an AGM will be entitled to one vote. The Chairman will not be entitled to vote, except in the case where a casting vote is required. A quorum shall consist of six represented clubs.
4. The AGM or Executive Committee may co-opt additional members as they think fit in the interests of the sport, but co-opted members will not be entitled to vote. The AGM or Executive Committee may co-opt members or persons who are full time employees of the Union or who have a commercial interest in canoeing only with the permission of Council.
5. At least one meeting will be held during the year in addition to the AGM. Where clubs wish to raise alterations or additions to the 'Rules for Competition' at this half year meeting, the proposal must be forwarded to the secretary in writing and be correctly proposed and seconded by two individual members by 12th June. Proposals and matters for discussion shall be promulgated to clubs at least two weeks prior to the meeting. Any additions or alterations to the 'Rules for Competition' agreed by the meeting will come into force on 1st September following the meeting.
6. Where clubs wish to raise matters of policy or alteration of existing rules at the AGM, the proposal must be forwarded to the secretary in writing and be correctly proposed and seconded by two full individual BCU members by 12th October. Proposals and matters for discussion shall be promulgated to clubs at least two weeks prior to the meeting.
7. The AGM shall elect an Executive Committee, consisting of officers and other members up to a total of 12, for the purpose of day to day administration. The quorum of the Executive Committee shall be four voting members. The executive shall be responsible to the AGM.
8. The officers and members of the Executive Committee shall serve for two years and shall be eligible for re-election, half retiring one year and the other half the following year. Nominations for election shall be in writing supported by the signatures of two full BCU Members and must reach the Secretary before October 12th prior to the meeting at which the annual election takes place. If more than one nomination is received for a post, the AGM will elect by ballot. If no nomination is received for a post the previous officer will be automatically re-elected provided they are willing to stand.
9. Marathon racing funds shall be administered by the Executive Committee.

MARATHON RACING CONSTITUTION

10. The executive Committee shall approve the list of trophies which are the property of the committee and are awarded each year. The executive will also determine and publish the basis for competition for these trophies.
11. Each Year the Executive Committee shall organise or nominate a Championship Marathon event :-
 - a) The course must be typical of present courses.
 - b) The winners of the classes shall be considered the National Marathon Racing Champions in their respective classes.
 - c) Clubs wishing to stage the National Marathon Racing Championships should apply to the marathon Executive (by the end of May two years preceding the Championships). The venue for the following year shall be announced at the half year meeting.
 - d) The Marathon Executive shall appoint a Chief Official from outside the organising club to oversee the running of the National Championships. He/she will be the liaison between the marathon Executive and the organising club, and will be empowered to approve such things as courses, entry fees, distance and the difficulty of courses, start times etc.
 - e) The organising club will provide a set of accounts of the event to the Marathon Committee by the end of December.
 - f) Sponsorship deals for the event shall be approved by the Marathon Committee.
 - g) The event shall be called the British National Open Marathon Racing Individual and Team Championship.
12. The treasurer shall keep such books of account as the executive shall instruct, and produce annual accounts for approval.

PART B - RULES FOR COMPETITION

1. A Marathon Race is a race over distances set out in Part B.7g) of these rules.
2. Canoeing is a non-contact sport and competitors shall race in a fair manner.
3. **CLUB MEMBERSHIP** - When a competitor is a member of more than one club, he shall declare before the 1st September to the secretary and race records officer of the executive committee the name of the club in whose name he will race that year. When a competitor changes his club in mid season, he is permitted to compete for his new club instead of his old, provided that prior consent of the old club be obtained. This consent shall not be withheld unreasonably in the case of a change of residence from one area to another. The agreed change shall be advised to the Race Records Officer, in writing, before points can be allocated to the new club in Hasler Competition.
4. **BOAT DESIGNS** - Any type of canoe or kayak can be used but only within the ICF regulations for length and breadth, as detailed below.

Boats over 460 cm in length must not have concave sections unless classified as Wild Water racing boats and falling within the ICF regulations for such boats.

Kayaks shall be propelled solely by means of double bladed paddles.

Canoes shall be propelled solely by means of single bladed paddles.

The paddles may not be attached to the boat in any way, being supported only by the hands.

MARATHON RACING COMPETITION RULES

5. THE RACING STRUCTURE

The Marathon Racing system has been designed to encourage all levels of competitor from the raw beginner to top class international competitors.

THERE ARE FIVE CATEGORIES OF RACE :

GROUP A

- a) Divisional races (under rule B7) approved by the executive Committee.

Promotions between division will take place as shown in 7d). For these races a minimum of the required classes agreed with the Regional Hasler Advisor must be held.

- b) Races and time-trials approved by the executive Committee not in the Divisional system, such as stage marathons, descents, Royal K1, Richmond K2, Thameside etc.

- c) **THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS** - see rule 12

(The race levy must be paid for events in 5a), 5b), and 5c), and BCU Comprehensive membership is required)

GROUP B

- d) Those races in the regions and clubs not appearing in the calendar. These will include handicap and fun marathons. No promotions will take place at these races.

- e) Races approved by the Executive Committee but organised by outside bodies such as the DW committee and the BWB.

6. RACE LEVY SCHEME

At all races in 5a), 5b), and 5c), published in the Racing Handbook the race organiser is to remit the race levy of 60p per head for each paddler booked in (irrespective of whether they start or finish the race) to the regional Hasler Advisor together with the race results. This levy is to be sent within 14 days of the race. Cheques to be made payable to the Marathon Racing Committee.

7. THE DIVISIONAL SYSTEM

- a) There are singles events in division 1-9, and a promotion scheme which provides a challenge for everyone.

- b) There are doubles events for division 1/2, 3/4, 5/6, 7/8 and 9.

- c) The events in 7a) and 7b) :

- i Will be the official BCU race which determines a paddlers National Ranking.
- ii Will require Comprehensive BCU membership.
- iii Must be held at all races counting towards the National Team league Championship - The Hasler Trophy, except where varied as agreed with the Regional Hasler Advisor.

d) PROMOTIONS / DEMOTIONS

- i Promotions may take place on either singles or doubles performances.
- ii The executive Committee has discretion to promote and demote where this is found to be necessary.
- iii Status in Canoe will not affect status in Kayak and vice versa.
- iv Generally no kayak or canoe paddler will be promoted higher than division 3 and no junior kayak higher than division 2.
- v Each year a divisional list will be published in the Racing Handbook for Division 1-8. We recommend that entry into the Divisional system should be based on the standards detailed in the section 'standards for racing'.
- vi Promotions between the lower divisions throughout the season will be calculated as follows.

Divisions 8 & 9

All finishers whose time is equal to or faster than the fastest paddler not promoted in the next higher division + 3 minutes, are promoted to the higher division provided there are a minimum of 5 starters in that higher division.

MARATHON RACING COMPETITION RULES

Division 7

Promotions will be made at the discretion of the Regional Hasler Adviser of the region in which the race takes place. The Regional Adviser's decision will take into account the performance of the paddler compared with the regional division 6 paddlers. If any paddler or team leader feels that this has resulted in an inappropriate promotion they should appeal to the ranking officer to correct the situation.

Divisions 5 & 6

All finishers whose time is equal to or faster than the fastest paddler not promoted in the next higher division + 4 minutes, are promoted to that higher division provided there are a minimum of 5 starters in that higher division.

Division 4

Promotions from division 4 to division 3 will be decided by the ranking officer for divisions 1-3 and can be made at any time.

Note 1

Promotions are not limited to one division. For example a Division 9 paddler with a time within 3 minutes of the division 7 winner would be promoted straight to division 7. Similarly a division 6 paddler with an appropriate time could be promoted to division 4.

Note 2

The lower limit of 5 paddlers to render a race quorate for promotion purposes, as described above, is intended to ensure that the winners time is a realistic one for that division. However the regional Hasler Advisor may amend or dispense with this limit if persistent low numbers in a division are clearly preventing the promotion system from operating as intended.

Note 3

Since there are not usually any promotions from division 7 to division 6 or from division 4 to division 3 on the day, it is normally the winner of division 7 whose time is used for calculating promotions from division 8 to 7 and the winner of division 4 whose time is used for calculating promotions from division 5 to 4. These promotion calculations hold good even if subsequently the ranking officer does promote the winner of division 7 and others to division 6 and the winner of division 4 and other to division 3.

- vii Demotions between the lower divisions throughout the season will be calculated as follows:-

All those finishing with a time slower than the fastest paddler in the division not promoted, + 10% will be designated 'D'. With 3 'D' notices a paddler will automatically be demoted to the next lower division.

Note 1

Demotions from any division will not normally be considered by the ranking officer immediately prior to the National Championships and the Hasler Faunal during the months of July and September.

Note 2

All paddlers, both from within the region and from other regions are eligible for promotions and 'D' notices. The only exceptions are paddlers transferred from another division under rule 7f).

- viii Promotions and demotions between divisions 1, 2, 3, & 4 will be determined by the ranking officer for divisions 1-3 in conjunction with the national and regional coaches. It will be based on performance in all races.
- ix Once promoted paddlers MUST race in their correct division, or higher division except under the provision of rule 7e). Any competitor found racing in a lower division, singles or doubles except under the provision of the above rule, may be disqualified from the event and be banned from Marathon competition for 12 months from the date of the event when the misdemeanour took place.

MARATHON RACING COMPETITION RULES

- x Each year the divisional lists are checked and any paddler not having competed for two successive seasons will be removed from the lists. Each autumn clubs are asked to submit a list of the paddlers who will not be active for the coming season and where appropriate, to amend a draft of the proposed divisional lists.

e) **COMPETING IN A CREW BOAT**

A paddler is normally ranked on singles performances. However when competing in doubles events the competition ranking shall be the average of the paddlers individual rankings (all halves rounded down).

eg. Paddler A - Div 3, Paddler B - Div 8

$3 + 8 = 11 = 5\frac{1}{2}$ The entry would be division 5.

ALL PADDLERS COMPETING IN CREW BOATS must show their singles ranking in the entry form and these rankings **MUST** be shown on all results. Paddlers not declaring their singles rankings will not be eligible for Hasler Points(see note to Rule 12a)).

f) **HANDICAP SYSTEM FOR LOW ENTRIES**

If there are less than three entries in a division then the organiser may transfer those entries to another division. This will be the next lower division provided the race distance is the same. Otherwise it will be the next higher division. A handicap (if moved down) or an allowance (if moved up) will be used to calculate the results which will count for Hasler points. The handicap or allowance to be :-

12 mile course. 3 minutes singles ; 6 minutes doubles.

8 mile course. 2 minutes singles ; 4 minutes doubles

4 mile course. 1 minute singles ; 2 minutes doubles

Note - transferred paddlers racing in a different division will count for prizes and Hasler points but will be ignored in calculating promotions and 'D' notices.

g) **TYPES OF COURSE**

Whilst there will be some variations due to local conditions and types of course available, the normal distances will be :-

DIV 1, 2, & 3 Singles, 1/2 & 3/4 Doubles.

Full senior course of more than 12 miles (20 Km) with any degree of severity.

DIV 4, 5, & 6 Singles, 5/6 Doubles.

Course of about 8 miles (13Km) which may included portages and/or weir shoots.

DIV 7, 8, & 9 Singles, 7/8 & 9 Doubles.

Course of about 4 miles (6.5 Km) with the minimum practical hazards.

h) **CLUB HANDICAP RACES**

As an introduction to competing in the divisional system, clubs are encouraged to hold handicap races throughout the year. These should be over a 5 -10 Km course, with handicaps based on age, experience and type of boat.

i) **SPECIAL PRIZES**

Race Organisers are encouraged to give prizes for special groups of paddlers. eg. First under 16, First C1, in particular they are strongly recommended to give a prize for the first lady in each division and for the highest placed TC2. This kind of encouragement is particularly important in the divisional system.

- 8. The organiser of a race must apply for that race to be registered. This must be done in the Autumn of the year preceding the event. The event must be organised and run under the Marathon Racing rules. Registered races may advertise through the Union and may appeal through the Executive Committee in cases of dispute or difficulty. (See also BCU Disciplinary Code - see index)

Registration shall be the minimum requirement for a race to be recognised. Registration fee will be by the levy which will apply to races defined in Rule B5 a), b), and c).

MARATHON RACING COMPETITION RULES

9. The organisers of a Marathon Race may apply for it to be classified as a Group A Race. These races shall be run with a higher degree of organisation. They shall be properly advertised. Adequate pre-race instruction shall be made available in adequate time. Properly documented results shall be sent to the Executive Committee and to competitors who provide a stamped addressed envelope.

The status of a race shall be decided by the Executive Committee on the basis that a race has been run satisfactorily by the same organisation over essentially the same course.

10. Assessment races will be picked by the Executive Committee from the most suitable races for the events to which British Teams will be going, and advised to the organiser by March 1st each year, via the Racing Handbook. In these races, assessment classes may be separated from the race classes, and may be run over the same or different courses.

11. RULES RELATING TO RACES

a) GROUP A RACES

- i Organisers **MUST** be affiliated to the British Canoe Union.
- ii Organisers of Divisional races must provide at least the required range of classes as agreed with the regional Hasler Advisor.
- iii Organisers shall issue adequate instructions on request, up to one month before the event to prospective competitors or interested group leaders. After the race organisers shall issue complete result sheets to all competitors providing Stamped Addressed Envelopes.
- iv Organisers shall charge an entry fee for each competitor, to include the levy cost. This fee may be reduced for Juniors or augmented for late entries.
- v **WITHIN 14 DAYS OF THE RACE**, the race organiser shall send five copies of the results together with the race levy to the regional Hasler Advisor.
- vi Changes of division and late entries shall be permitted if the organiser so wishes. Information regarding late entries and division changes should be available to competitors at least 30 minutes before the start time of the Division concerned.
- vii Group A races shall be open to amateur canoeists who are members of an ICF affiliated Federation.
- viii A Competitor shall number his boat for a race in the following manner for Divisions 1-8. The number plate will be yellow and displayed vertically in a slot placed on the middle of the back deck about 500 mm (20") behind the cockpit in the case of kayaks, and on the front deck in the case of Canoes. The slot will be fitted with a locking pin. The characters on the vertical plate will be the same standard as a car number plate. The dimensions of the plate will be 200 mm long x 150 mm high, with the top corners rounded to a 10 mm radius. Paddlers in Division 1-8 not displaying vertical numbers plates will not score Hasler Points. Division 9, club and fun race paddlers may alternatively use 9" diameter white discs which should be displayed on fore and aft decks or as directed by the organiser.
- ix In a Divisional race each class of three or more starters must start separately.
- x Competitor may not hang on the washes of powered craft.
- xi A competitor must not change boats during a race, but may change paddles in the case of breakage.
- xii A competitor may receive food and drink during a race, but no other assistance unless permitted by the organiser. This applies particularly to help at portages.
- xiii The organisers of a race shall provide a Protest Committee consisting of four officials or members of the organising body to hear and settle all protests by any competitor in that event. The following rules will be observed :-
 - (a) The protests must be received within 30 minutes of completion of the appropriate race and before the announcement of the final results. Failure to observe this will invalidate the protest.
 - (b) The protest must be in writing, to an officer of the organising body and must give full details of the alleged infringement of the rules.

MARATHON RACING COMPETITION RULES

- (c) The protest committee must meet immediately, to hear all the evidence and to consider the protest's validity in accordance with BCU and Marathon Racing Rules.
 - xiv A protest against an organising body may only be dealt with by the Executive Committee. Any such protest must be made immediately and in writing to the Secretary of the Executive Committee and give full details of the alleged infringement of the rules. The person making the protest must also inform the secretary of the club or body concerned. Failure to comply with these conditions will invalidate the protest.
 - xv Appeals against the decision of the Protest Committee are permitted and these will be heard by the Executive Committee.
 - xvi Additionally to 11a) (xii, xiv, xv) above Marathon Racing is subject to the BCU disciplinary Code. (See index)
 - b) **GROUP B RACES**
Rules apply as above in 11a) (i,iii,vi,vii,x,xi,xii,xiii,xiv,xv,xvi)
12. **NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS**

There are two National Events.

A. THE HASLER TROPHY.

This is competed for throughout the season (1st September - 31st August) on a regional basis. The top four scoring clubs from each region (eight clubs from the combined Midlands Region), plus a team from the organising host club (where there are two organising clubs then both qualify, as of right), the Combined services and the Isle of Wight, compete in the National Final at the end of the season.

Five other trophies are competed for at the Hasler Final.

- i The Rhodes White Trophy, awarded to the Senior Regional Champion who gains the most points in Division 1 at the Hasler Final.
- ii The David Shankland Trophy, awarded to the Lady Regional Champion who gains the most points in Division 3 at the Hasler Final.
- iii The Barber Trophy, awarded to the Junior Regional Champion who gains the most points in Division 2 at the Hasler Final.
To be eligible to compete for these trophies, individual Regional champions will be identified from the Regional Hasler Competition. These will be the individuals scoring the highest number of points in the appropriate division for the final trophy award in their own Regional Hasler Races.
- iv The Adam Thomason Trophy, awarded to the winner of Division 2 at the Hasler Final.
- v The Regional Trophy is awarded to the Region with the highest aggregate score from their three highest scoring clubs.

The Hasler Trophy Rules are:

- a) Each region shall run its own league Championships throughout the year. The regions are defined as the Sports Council Regions for England plus Scotland East, Scotland West and Wales.
- b) The best four clubs from each region (eight clubs from the Combined Midlands Region), may compete in the final, together with teams from the host club (where there are two organising clubs, then both qualify as of right), the Combined services and the Isle of Wight.
- c) Each region will decide which races are to count. It is hoped that eventually there will be enough races in each region to have the best of 8 or 9 results. These races will be group A status.
- d) Each club will be allowed as many competitors as it wishes.
- e) At the Hasler Final where crew members in doubles events are ranked in separate divisions they must race in the classification of the highest ranked paddler. In the Regional Competitions rule 7e) shall apply to crew boats.
- f) The points system throughout the year will be as follows:-
 - i Divisions 1-9 singles and 1/2,3/4, 5/6, 7/8, & 9 doubles will count for points.

MARATHON RACING COMPETITION RULES

- ii Points will be awarded per paddler in both singles and doubles - 20 for 1st, 19 for 2nd, 18 for 3rd and so on down to 2 points for all paddlers who finish within 110% of the time of the fastest boat not promoted. One point only for paddlers who finish outside 110% of the fastest boat not promoted irrespective of their position. To apply to all divisions except division 9 which will receive 20 for first, 19 for 2nd, 18 for third and so on down to 2 points for all paddlers who finish.
- iii Clubs qualifying for the final will start the final competition with 1 point for each promotion gained by any of their members in regional competitions (up to maximum of 12) irrespective of whether the promoted paddlers are racing in the final or not.
- iv Each club will count its six best scores in any division for singles.
- v Each club will count its three best scores in any division for doubles.
- vi For each race the winning club will get 10 points, nine for second and so on.
- vii The final will normally be in late September.

NOTES

1. *In the regional races leading to the final, only those clubs within the region will score points. Paddlers from other regions will not be taken into account when calculating points except that their time will be used for the 110% calculations if they are the fastest boat not promoted.*
2. *Competitors must be COMPREHENSIVE BCU members for all divisions 1-9. BCU numbers must be quoted on entries and results, and a valid BCU membership card or photocopy MUST be produced at race check in.*
3. *Those unable to prove membership will be required to pay an extra Event Fee of a minimum of £2.00 and a maximum of £5.00. This covers the organiser for insurance purposes. (Race organisers see guidance).*
4. *All competitors in doubles in both regional competitions and the final MUST show their singles ranking at race check-in. Competitors not doing so do not count for eligibility to compete in the final or score points in the regional competition or final.*
5. *Clubs who are included for points must be affiliated to the Union.*
6.
 - a) *A paddler must compete in 3 qualifying events at his or her current ranking, during the season (Sept 1st - Aug 31st) before being eligible for the final. The exceptions are Div 1 senior kayaks, Div 2 junior kayaks and Div 3 canoes and lady kayaks who must compete in 2 qualifying events.*
 - b) *A paddler competing in the National Championships on one or both days may count this as one qualifying race for eligibility in the Hasler Final.*
 - c) *The qualification must be in the same type of boat (ie Canoe or Kayak)*
 - d) *A paddler can only compete in one division in a qualifying event or final.*
 - e) *Paddlers are only eligible to paddle in a singles race at the Hasler Final if they have competed in 3 qualifying events in singles. The exceptions are paddlers already ranked in their highest division (senior kayaks Div 1, Junior Kayaks Div 2, Ladies in Div 3 and Canoes in Div 3) although they must still comply with rule 6a).*
7. *The Regional Hasler Co-ordinator is to check the eligibility of paddlers from his region at the final. (The Records Officer will be able to produce listings on request to help clubs and Hasler Co-ordinators carry out this task)*

B. THE BRITISH NATIONAL OPEN MARATHON RACING INDIVIDUAL AND TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

These championships will identify the various national Champions set out in the rules below, and a trophy (The Spanish House) will be awarded to the club scoring the most points at these championships.

MARATHON RACING COMPETITION RULES

a) Senior Mens Kayak

- i Paddlers ranked in Division 1 shall race together over a course of approximately 15 miles. The winner of this race shall be deemed the Senior Mens National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
- ii Paddlers ranked in Division 2 & 3, shall race together over a course of approximately 12 miles. The winner of this race shall be deemed the Senior Mens National Kayak Marathon Champion of Division 2.
- iii Paddlers ranked in division 4, 5, & 6 shall race together over a course of approximately 8 miles. The winner of this event will be deemed Senior Mens National Kayak Champion of Division 4.
- iv Paddlers ranked in divisions 7, 8 & 9 shall race together over a course of approximately 4 miles. The winner shall be deemed the Senior Mens Kayak Marathon Champion of Division 7.
- v Senior Men paddlers may race in events specified for those of higher ranking, but will not be allowed to race in events specified for those of lower ranking.
- vi The classification above a)(i, ii, iii & iv) will similarly apply to doubles events. Where the crew members are ranked in separate division they must race in the classification of the highest ranked paddler.

b) Senior Mens Canoe

- i Paddlers ranked in division 3 shall race over a course of between 12 & 15 miles. The winner of this event shall be deemed Senior Mens National Canoe Champion of Great Britain.
- ii Paddlers ranked in divisions 4, 5, & 6, shall race together over a course of approximately 8 miles. The winner of this event shall be deemed Senior Mens National Canoe Champion of Division 4.
- iii Paddlers ranked in Divisions 7, 8 & 9 shall race together over a course of approximately 4 miles. The winner of this event shall be deemed Senior Mens National Canoe Champion of Division 7.
- iv Senior Mens canoe paddlers may race in events specified for those of higher ranking but not in those specified for paddlers of lower ranking.
- v The Classification above b)(i, ii, & iii) will similarly apply to double events. Where the crew members are ranked in separate divisions they must race in the classification of the highest ranked paddler.

c) Senior Womens Kayak

- i Paddlers ranked in divisions 3 shall race together over a course of between 12 and 15 miles. The winner of this race shall be deemed the Senior Ladies National Kayak Champion of Great Britain.
- ii Paddlers ranked in division 4, 5 & 6, will race together over a course of approximately 8 miles. The winner of this event shall be deemed Senior Ladies National Kayak marathon Champion of Division 4.
- iii Paddlers ranked in divisions 7, 8 and 9 will race together over a course of approximately 4 miles. The winner of this event will be deemed Senior Ladies National Kayak Champion of Division 7.
- iv Senior Women paddlers may race in event specified for those of higher ranking but will not be allowed to race in events specified for those of lower ranking.
- v Senior Women paddlers may race in a doubles crew in senior mens kayak events of the same or higher ranking.
- vi The classification above c)(i, ii, and iii) will similarly apply to double events. Where the crew members are ranked in separate division the crew must race in the classification of the highest ranked paddler.

d) Junior, Youth and Cadet

The classification for these is as follows:-

Junior Mens Kayak	Under 18	Course approx. 12 mls
Youth Mens Kayak	Under 16	Course approx. 8 mls
Cadet Mens Kayak	Under 14	Course approx. 4 mls (no portages)
Junior Mens Canoe	Under 18	Course approx. 12 mls
Youth Open Canoe	Under 16	Course approx. 8 mls
Cadet Open TC2	Under 14	Course approx. 4 mls (no portages)
Junior Ladies Kayak	Under 18	Course approx 12 mls
Youth Ladies Kayak	Under 16	Course approx 8 mls (no portages)
Cadet Ladies Kayak	Under 14	Course approx 4 mls (no portages)

All ages are as at the 1st January of the year of competition.

e) Veteran

- i Veterans are classified as being over 35 on 1st January of the year of the competition.
- ii Veteran Mens Kayak - Course approx 12 miles. The winner of this be deemed the Veterans Mens National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
- iii Veteran Mens Canoe - Course approx 8 miles. The winner of this race shall be deemed the Veteran Mens Canoe Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
- iv Veteran Womens Kayak - Course approx 8 miles. The winner of this race shall be deemed the Veteran Womens National Champion of Great Britain.
- v The classification above eii, eiii, eiv, will similarly apply to doubles events.
- vi Veteran Women paddlers may race in a doubles crew in Veterans Mens Kayak events.

f) **GENERAL RULES FOR COMPETITION**

- i All competitors must be COMPREHENSIVE BCU members. BCU numbers must be quoted on entries and results and a valid BCU comprehensive membership card must be produced at race check in. Those unable to prove comprehensive membership will be required to pay an extra Event Fee of £2.00 and a maximum of £5.00. This covers the organisers for insurance purposes.
- ii All competitors in singles and doubles must show their singles ranking to be eligible for team points.
- iii The Spanish House will be presented to the club gaining the most points at the Championship.
- iv The points for the Clubs Cup competition will be awarded per paddler both in singles and doubles events 20, 19, 18, etc and so on down to one point for each finisher.
- v There must be at least three entries for a National Championship to take place.
- vi Boat specifications should be those set out by the ICF Marathon Racing Committee and the BCU Marathon Committee.
- vii Although no automatic promotions will take place, the committee may exercise their right under rule 7d) to promote or demote on the basis of the results. The event will not count as a regional Hasler Event nor be used to allocate points for regional Hasler events however it may be counted by a paddler as a qualifying race in the Hasler final.
- viii With regard to safety refer to Rule 14a, 14g, 14h and 14i.

13. NATIONAL MARATHON CHAMPIONSHIPS VENUE AND ORGANISATIONAL CRITERIA

The Marathon committee will look to the following ideal criteria when considering applications for the National Championships and the Hasler Final.

Any club wishing to host the National Championships or Hasler Final will be expected to make a short presentation to the half year meeting outlining their proposals for the course and organisation to meet these criteria.

MARATHON RACING COMPETITION RULES

THE COURSE

- a) The course should be wide enough at the start to provide a fair start for all paddlers. It should also be wide enough throughout its length for competitors to easily overtake and pass each other in opposite directions.
- b) The course should be designed to be paddled in an understern rudder boat.
- c) Portages should allow enough space at each end for four k2s to portage simultaneously. They should not be of excessive number or length.
- d) Access to portages areas for spectators should be good with adequate parking, or pool transport should be provided.
- e) The course should be reasonably accessible for spectator viewing.
- f) There should not be too many other conflicting river users.

ORGANISATION

- g) The organising club(s) should have a proven track record in organising normal Divisional Marathon Events.
- h) There should be adequate parking at start and finish.
- i) There should be adequate covered checking in and refreshment areas at the start and finish, and a result display area.
- j) There should be adequate toilet facilities at start and finish.
- k) The venue should have good access by road and not be too far for the majority of paddlers to travel.
- l) There should be a computerised results facility capable of showing Divisional results and team scores immediately after the event.
- m) Prizes at the National Championships will be the official BCU National Marathon Championship medals. At the Hasler Finals there should be good prizes.
- n) There should be an adequate PA system at the start, briefing and prize giving areas.
- o) There should be adequate First Aid cover in appropriate areas.
- p) The starting of all races is to be as the procedure set out on page G25.

14. SAFETY

- a) Competitors must render their boats sufficiently buoyant to remain afloat and to support the crew in rough water in the event of capsize.
 - b) Race organisers may require life jackets or buoyancy aids to be worn. Such equipment must be provided by the competitors.
 - c) On open water adequate spray covers must be worn.
 - d) Competitors must be able to swim adequately in the waters on which the race is being held.
 - e) The wearing of life jackets or buoyancy aids is compulsory for division 8 and 9.
 - f) Team Leaders should decide if paddlers under 16 in the higher divisions should wear life jackets or buoyancy aids.
 - g) Race organisers would have the FINAL say as to who should wear life jackets or buoyancy aids, except where this is covered by rules 14e and 14i, depending on weather and water conditions.
 - h) The life Jackets/buoyancy aids referred to on b,e,f,g, and l will conform to BCU/BCMA STANDARD BA 83.
 - i) At the National Championships ALL paddlers in the U16 and U14 classes and in the Division 7/8/9 classes WILL wear life jackets or buoyancy aids as in h).
15. In the event of circumstances which render it impossible or unsafe to run the race as planned, the organiser shall take all reasonable steps to inform the competitors and supporters at the earliest possible moment.
16. To aid the description of races the courses shall be classified as follows:-
- 'A' shall denote sea, tidal, estuary, lake or other open water.
 - 'B' shall denote fresh water, river and canals.
 - 'P' shall denote portages.

17. In the event of a tie for any BCU trophy an extra race shall be taken into account, and this repeated as often as is required to settle the matter where this is appropriate. If the matter is still unresolved the trophy shall be held jointly, the order of the inscription being alphabetical and each party holding it for an equal fraction of the year.
18. **DISCIPLINE**
Marathon racing is subject to the BCU Disciplinary code reproduced in full earlier in this book (see index).
19. **DRUGS**
Marathon racing is subject to BCU Doping Control Rules as reproduced in an earlier section of this book (see index).

PART C RECOMMENDATIONS

These recommendations are intended to guide organisers and others in the interpretation of the Rules for Racing, and in the provision of acceptable races.

A. ADVANCE INFORMATION

- 1 Do not attempt to run a race without visiting a few to find out how things work.
- 2 Advance information sent out to competitors and clubs should at least set out the following details as shown in the specimen.
 - a) Name date and status of the race.
 - b) Name of the organising body.
 - c) Closing date for entries and whether or not late entries will be accepted.
 - d) Address to which entries and enquires should be sent, and if possible a corresponding telephone number.
 - e) Entry fees, and to whom they these should be payable.
 - f) Locations of start and finish, and directions for getting to these places.
 - g) Time of start and closure of checking in.
 - h) Brief description of the course, sufficient to give a newcomer a general picture of the type of course and a warning of any details of the course that he should inspect in advance.
 - i) Any special regulations that a competitor should be aware of before he arrives.
 - j) Any major changes since last year.
 - k) An entry form asking for full details of competitors. (A specimen race details follow these recommendations).

B. PRE RACE INFORMATION

Every boat should be inspected at check-in to ensure that it is numbered clearly, correctly and durably. Check that water-soluble ink has not been used. Although it is the competitors responsibility to number his boat, it is your responsibility to be sure that he has done it. One way of doing this is to ask that he presents a clean number plate and then number it yourself, not revealing the number in advance. It is human nature that some competitors will fail in this responsibility. Have with you the wherewithal to number boats and use it when the occasion demands.

It is customary to deliver a briefing shortly before a race. This is the time to explain the starting procedure and order, to describe any special features of the race course and to emphasise any special regulations.

There may be a wide range of ambitions present at the race, some people go for a pleasant paddle, some with Olympic hopes, try not to let them stumble over each other. Both parties are aggravated when a fast crew is confronted by a slow crew blocking a critical portage. Let the fast classes start first. Local conditions, variations in the course for different classes etc should be taken into consideration when arranging the start order. Ensure that

the course is clearly marked at all points where there could be doubt. Marshals should be positioned at turning points, and should tick off numbers on a check list. It is desirable to position marshals at portages and shoots. The marshal should keep the passage clear for competitors, keep spectators and competitors off forbidden land and report any misdemeanours to central control. A marshals directions should override any prior instructions. A marshal should be clearly identifiable.

C. STARTING

A clean start is important and difficult to achieve. Most people can start the lower ranks of competitors in order but a strong personality is needed to keep those in higher divisions in good order.

The starter must never lose control of the start, either through physical inability to make himself heard, or through weakness of will. Preferably get an experienced racer to start your race and supply them with a megaphone. Massed starts are good value for bullfighting addicts, but can be bad for competitors. Do not start classes together if it means overcrowding the start line. In Group A races, each class of three or more competitors must start separately.

Do not let yourself be bullied by the competitors. They often try out the strength of the starter while waiting on the line. In the very last resort you can disqualify on the spot. On the other hand do not keep competitors hanging around unnecessarily. They are often nervous before a race, may be getting cold or just plain bored. In fast water or wind it is often difficult for them to hold their positions. If you have got them into a fair line than start them without further delay. Say 'READY GO'.

Record the time of the start of each Division.

Do not use a system which relies on a set start time. You cannot guarantee starting on the exact second.

D. FINISHING AND RESULTS

Signify a crossing of the line audibly, by bell, whistle or some such device. Mark the finishing line clearly. It is not always obvious to the paddler exactly where the finishing line is, particularly since he may be exhausted.

Have a reliable clock which is readable, and have a backup in case of malfunctions. Make a record of the finishing order of every boat as it passes the finishing line. Have one person making an independent list of boat numbers, another should make a list of boat numbers and finishing times: this person should have a pad of paper with each sheet numbered in advance so that you will know later if any sheet has been mislaid. On each sheet mark say ten lines. When a boat finishes record its number and finishing time alongside.

Never mind computation at this stage, you will have your hands full enough just recording the finishing order correctly. When a page is full pass it on to someone else to analyse. It is also useful to have a portable cassette recorder running constantly at the finish line. You can record everything that happens at the finish, and the tape can be used to double check your finish order and timing if for any reason the finishing team becomes overwhelmed by mass finishes. Give the recorder to one of the finishers and tell him to 'talk' every boat over the line, giving number and time. One C60 tape should last for most marathon races.

Have somewhere out of the wind and rain, and away from possible distractions from paddlers, to analyse your finishing results. Arrange a system for displaying the results as soon as you know them. If there are any errors the paddlers will usually spot them, and they can be queried before prize giving. Have a results display system that is not dependant on good weather. The thing that competitors want to see quickly is a list of finishing order with overall times. Other details such as start and finish times are essentially irrelevant and only clutter the display.

Have the prize giving as soon as possible and announce any divisional promotions at this stage.

E. SAFETY

Safety measures are largely at the discretion of the organiser, since adequate measures vary considerably with course and conditions. Unnecessary precautions are wasteful and irksome, but inadequate precautions can lead to disaster. A senior paddler on inland waters seldom needs a life jacket, but for a division 8 or 9 paddler it is a stipulation. On open sea it is probably wise to insist on buoyancy aids for all. On open water rescue boats are very important. It does not take long to paddle half a mile out to sea, but it takes a long time to swim back, especially in cold water. A weir may be trivial to a fresh paddler but a different story to one who has just raced 15 miles. It is sometimes a good idea to position frogmen below a weir to pull people and equipment out as they drift past, but make sure that the rescuers are competent. An incompetent rescuer can be more of a hindrance than a help. An important precaution is to make sure that no-one is stranded or lost halfway round the course. On open sea races it is important to account for everyone: on calm waters it is usually sufficient to have a back marker paddler over the course at the tail of the race.

F. RESULTS

After the event is over, buckle to and get the final result sheet sorted out. If you put it off, your memory will dim, pieces of paper will get lost, your enthusiasm will wane and competitors will get very cross.

Result sheets should be arranged by divisions in finishing order. They should include position, name, division ranking, club, BCU number, points and promotions to higher divisions. (Three flow charts follow this section to aid the calculation of promotions, demotions and Hasler points). Totals of points scored by clubs should also be included. (These however will be verified by the Hasler Advisers). A specimen result sheet extract follows. (see Index).

The race organiser will record at the top of the result sheet, the number of paddlers who have entered the race. Five copies of the results, will be sent to the regional Hasler Advisor within the 14 days stipulated (Rule 11a) iv) together with the Race Levies. The advisor will then check/correct promotions and Hasler Points before sending on the results to the Records officer and the two Divisions Advisors.

THE STARTING OF ASSESSMENT RACES, HASLER FINAL & NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

There is a necessity to maintain the standard of starting for selection races. The following will apply to all assessment races.

REQUIREMENTS

- 1 The startline should be clearly defined on both banks.
- 2 A clearly defined marshalling line must be established about 50 metres behind the start line.
- 3 The race must be started by a person drawn from the approved starters list below, who will have an experienced assistant.
- 4 The marshalling line should be controlled by at least two experienced officials.
- 5 The above should all be equipped with PA Equipment or loud hailers which it is the responsibility of the race organiser to provide.
- 6 Where river conditions require it, Division 1 starts will be seeded into 2 or more lines. The starter will liaise with the race organiser prior to the briefing to establish the starting ranks.

THE FOLLOWING RULES WILL APPLY TO ALL DIVISIONS AT AN ASSESSMENT EVENT, HASLER FINAL AND TO ALL RACES AT THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1 An audible warning will be given 5 minutes before the first start, From that time on, no paddler is to pass in front of the marshalling line. All paddlers who are already in front of the marshalling line have three minutes to get behind it.

- 2 A second audible warning will be given 2 minutes before the first start. Any paddler in front of the marshalling line will be penalised. No paddler to go in front of the marshalling line until so instructed by the marshal.
- 3 Once released by the marshal, the paddlers will be under the starters control. Any paddler going in front of the start line before the 'GO' will be penalised.
- 4 For each contravention of the above rules, a two minute penalty will be imposed.

NOTE The Marathon Team Selectors have been instructed by the Executive Committee that they will use the results INCLUDING any penalty, as the basis for selection.

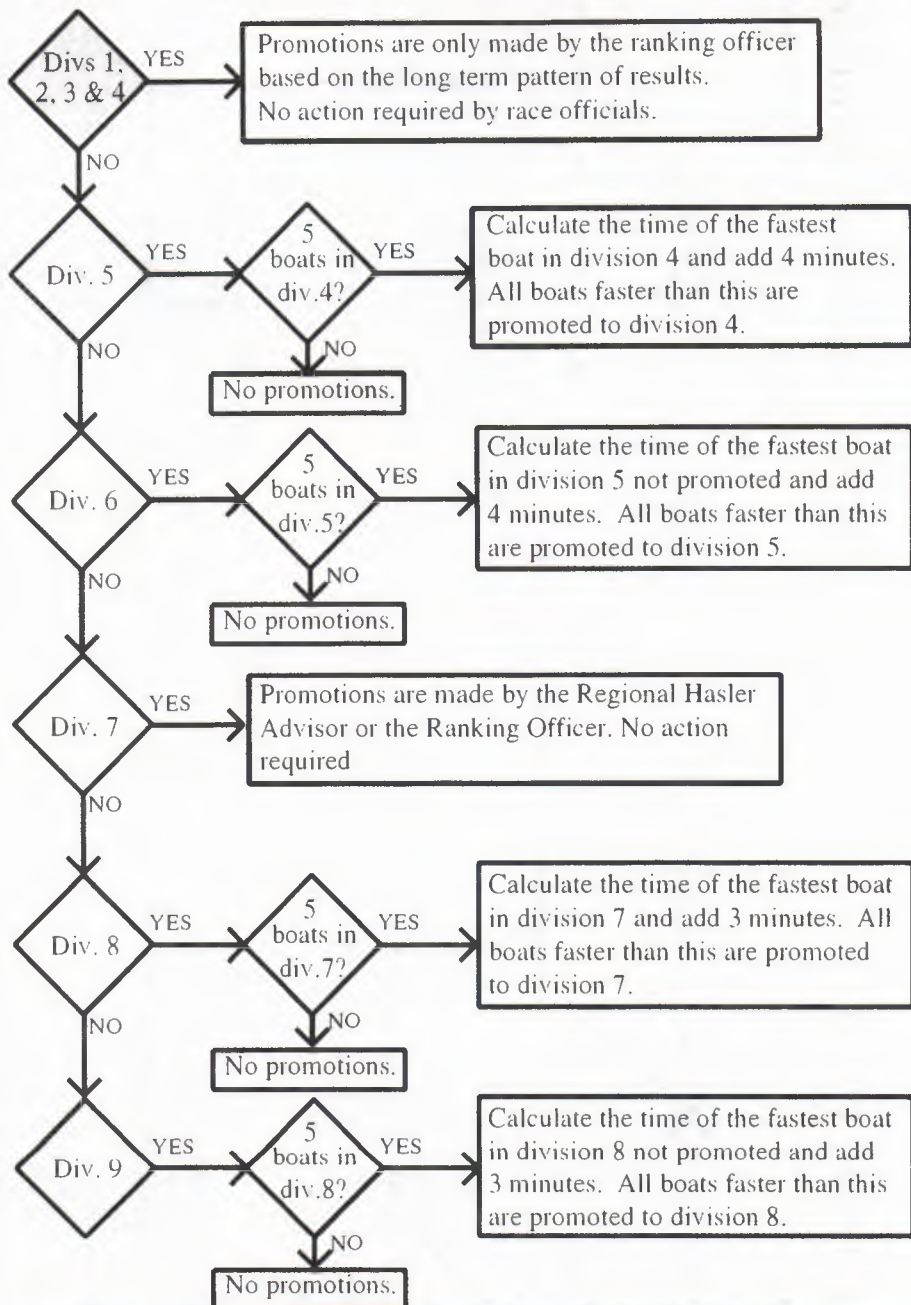

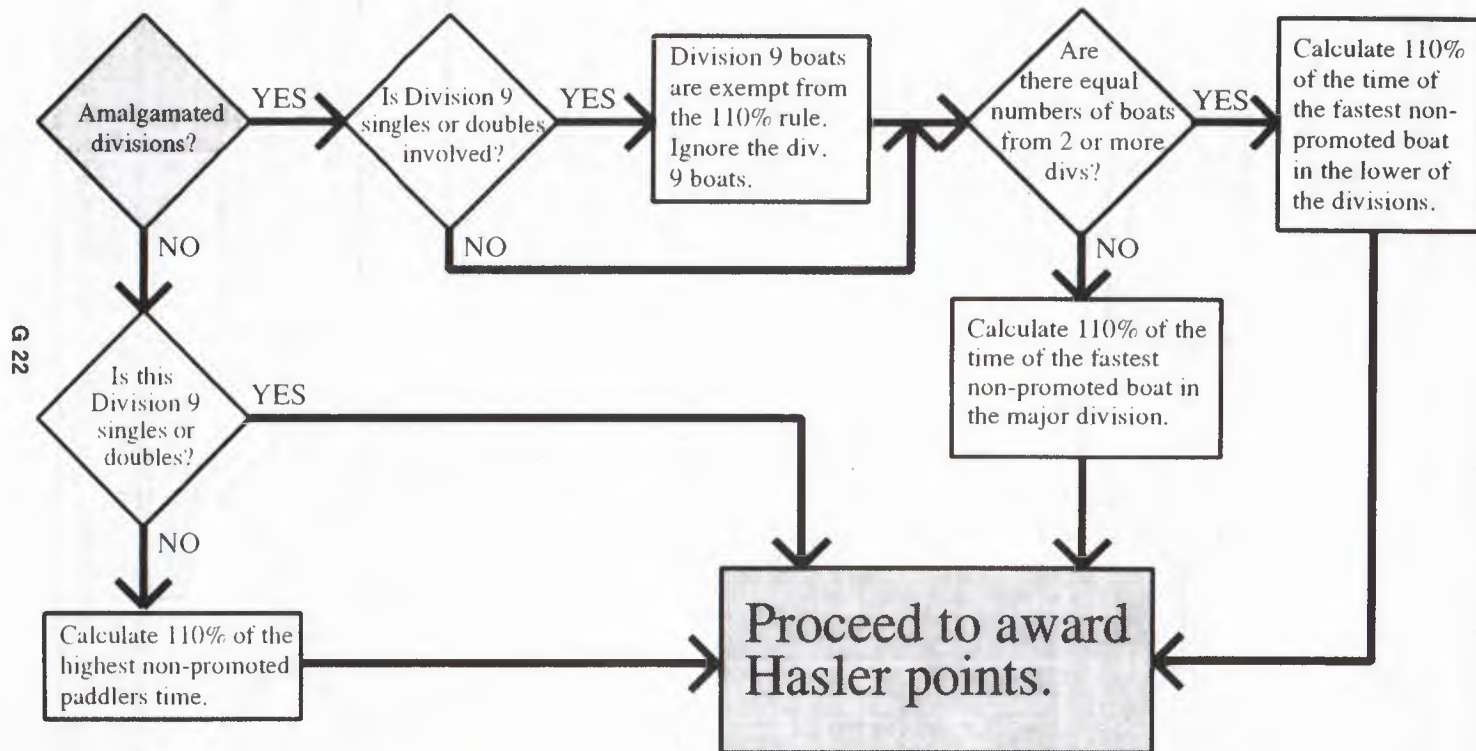

Calculating Promotions (singles divisions only).

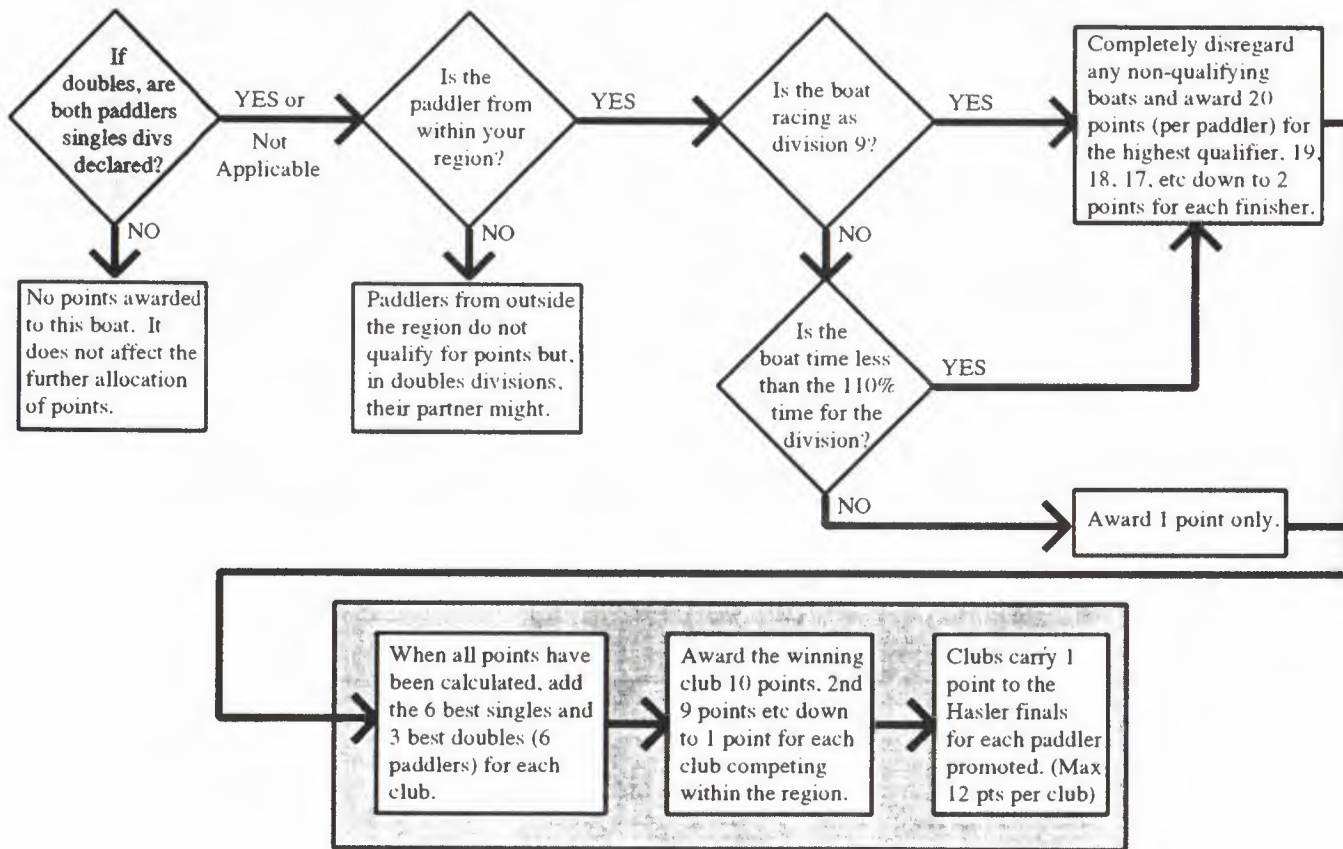


Check whether boats in division 6 qualify for promotion to division 4.

MARATHON RANKINGS 1999

The Ranking System

The purpose of the promotional system within the divisional system is to have every paddler competing in the in the correct division for his/her personal ability, and thereby gaining maximum advantage from their racing.

The administration of the system has seen continued improvement during the 1998 season, and with continued co-operation of the Regional and National Advisors, Race Organisers, and Club Team Leaders, this should continue in 1999. The prompt return of the race results and levies by the Race Organisers to the Hasler Advisors is the one area which still continues to need improvement. The quicker these are received, the quicker they can be processed through the system, and confirmation of promotions made before paddlers race again.

The Divisional Lists have been updated after each set of results has been received by the Records Officer during 1998. However, not all Club Listings(57 out of 115) were returned by the Club Team Leaders by the closing date for inclusion in the Year Book, inevitably there will be some errors. If you feel that the promotion/demotion system will not serve to correct these errors quickly enough, please contact the Divisions Advisor concerned for that Division(address elsewhere in this handbook) stating the nature of the problem.

In addition, by request from Race Organisers, a list of clubs with abbreviations used by the Marathon Committee has been included. Please note that these differ in some cases from those used by the Sprint Racing Committee. This is with the approval of the clubs concerned to avoid confusion between clubs with similar names.
