Special Olympics is an International Organisation for athletes with learning disability with members in every country world-wide. It holds a World Summer Games and a World Winter Games

every four years similar to the Olympics but in the year prior. In GB a Summer Games is held two years before the World Summer Games. In the intervening years a National Regatta will be held, the next one in 2008.

The mission of Special Olympics is to provide year-round sports training and athletic competition in a variety of Olympic-type sports for people eight years of age and older with learning disabilities, giving them continuing opportunities to develop physical fitness, demonstrate courage, experience joy and participate in a sharing of gifts, skills

and friendship with their families, other Special Olympics' athletes and the community.

Sprint Kayak was on the programme of the Shanghai Invitation Games in China in 2006. British paddlers won medals in the 200m, 500m K1 and the 500m K2 events. A team of six paddlers, 3 men and 3 women have been selected for the next World Summer Games to be held in Shanghai in 2007 there will be races over 200 and 500 metres and K2 races over 200 metres and 500 metres.

The aims and purpose of the British Canoe Union (BCU) Anti-Doping policy are to:

- Uphold and preserve the ethics of Sport
- Safeguard the physical health and mental integrity of the athletes
- To ensure that all Athletes have an opportunity to compete equally

Therefore, the policy of the BCU is to promote Canoeing as a drug-free sport and that the BCU is committed to educate and inform all athletes, coaches and support personnel about the dangers of drugs and to test athletes to confirm and maintain their drug-free status.

ATHLETE RESPONSIBILITIES

Your role as an Athlete carries with it many responsibilities, and your responsibility to compete cleanly and fairly is fundamental. Be responsible: Under the rules of the World Anti-Doping Code and the BCU Anti-Doping rules you are ultimately responsible for any prohibited substance found in your system. This is referred to as **Strict Liability**.

Who do you trust?

You are responsible for whom you trust to take advice from about substances, medication and supplements and you are accountable for those you entrust with access to your food and drink.

This means that if you take medication from your doctor (GP or sports doctor) and do not check whether it is permitted you are at fault. Likewise, if you take a supplement that is contaminated, even after getting a guarantee from the manufacturer, you are still responsible for choosing to use that product.

Here are 5 key responsibilities you must fulfil:

- Stay up to date with the latest Prohibited List of Substances and Methods
- Check the status of any substance before you use it – **It is still considered an Anti-Doping offence if a Prohibited Substance is found in your system – despite how it came to be there**
- Inform all medical personnel responsible for your health and well being that you compete under specific Anti-Doping rules and ensure that medical treatment received does not violate Anti-Doping rules
- Submit a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) for any Prohibited Substance and/or Method you are prescribed for a legitimate medical condition, prior to competing – **International, National and Domestic Testing Pool Athletes Only**
- Provide accurate whereabouts details of Out of Competition testing if required by the BCU, ICF or UK Sport – you will receive notification of the information you must provide – **International and National Testing Pool Athletes Only**

BCU ATHLETE TESTING POOLS

INTERNATIONAL TESTING POOL – Athletes selected for the International Testing pool will be notified in writing and controlled by the ICF and subject to:

- In Competition testing
- Out of Competition testing at Squad training
- Out of Competition testing of Individuals

BRITISH CANOE UNION ANTI-DOPING POLICY

NATIONAL TESTING POOL – Athletes selected for the National Testing pool will be notified in writing and controlled by UK Sport and subject to:

- In Competition testing
- Out of Competition testing at Squad training
- Out of Competition testing of Individuals

The National Testing pool will include the following athletes:

- All athletes included within the International Testing pool
- All World Class Performance Athletes
- Other Athletes identified by UK Sport and/or the BCU

DOMESTIC TESTING POOL – Athletes selected for the Domestic Testing pool will be controlled by the BCU and subject to:

- In Competition testing
- Out of Competition testing at Squad training

The Domestic Testing pool will include the following athletes (except those selected for the International and National Testing pools):

- All World Class Potential Athletes, including:
 - Talented Athlete Programme (Scotland)
 - Elite Cymru (Wales)
- All World Class Start Athletes
- All National Squad Members for:
 - Canoe Polo
 - Canoe Slalom
 - Freestyle
 - Marathon Racing
 - Sprint Racing
 - Wild Water Racing
- Any Athlete in receipt of the following Grants:
 - Talented Athlete Scholarship Scheme
 - SportsAid

Additionally, any Athletes entering the following Discipline Specific Events are advised to comply with the key responsibilities detailed above:

- Canoe Polo – Any athlete ranked in Division 1
- Canoe Slalom – Any athlete ranked in Premier or Division 1
- Marathon Racing – Any athlete ranked in the following Divisions or higher:
 - Men = Division 1, Junior Men = Division 2 and all Women = Division 3
- Sprint Racing – Any athlete ranked in Men's, Women's, Boy's or Girl's A
- Wild Water Racing – Any athlete ranked in Division A
- Any athlete competing in any designated Selection or Assessment event in any Competition Discipline, including Canoe Sailing and Surf

Any athlete entering any BCU competition or event, irrespective of whether they meet the Testing pool criteria outlined above, may be subject to a Drug Test. All athletes competing at the Domestic Testing pool level are to provide current contact details to the BCU Anti-Doping Officer at all times (Address, Telephone and E-mail details). LEPTOSPIROSIS

LEPTOSPIROSIS AND THE CANOEIST

Leptospirosis

This is an animal infection, but after recovery the animal continues to excrete the organisms in the urine. These survive for days or even weeks in moist conditions, but for only a few hours in salt water. Humans catch the infection by direct contact with the urine or the urine polluted environment. Bacteria enter through skin abrasions or via the eyes, nose or mouth.

The Illness

The usual incubation is 7 to 12 days. Normally 'flu-like illness occurs which resolves in 2 -3 weeks. There may be fever, severe headache, pains in the back and calves and prostration. A few cases develop jaundice, when the condition is known as Weil's disease. Although death may occur in about 15% of the jaundiced patients, death without jaundice is virtually unknown. Antibiotics during the first few days may help to limit the infection. Many cases recover without specific treatment.

What to do

If you think you may have the infection, go to your doctor and tell him or her that there may be a risk of Leptospirosis. The diagnosis is by clinical suspicion. Blood tests can rarely confirm the illness in time to affect treatment, though they may subsequently confirm it. The microbiologist at your local hospital is the best source of advice.

Prevention

1. Cover all cuts and abrasions with waterproof plasters
2. Always wear footwear to avoid cutting the feet.
3. Avoid capsize drill or rolling practice in inland waters.
4. Shower as soon as possible after canoeing.
5. If in doubt, consult your doctor early.

Remember that simple precautions can reduce your risk.

SPRINT RACING

BCU FLATWATER RACING COMPETITION RULES

These regulations are bound to the Articles of Association of the British Canoe Union. ("BCU") and were approved by the Board of the BCU ("Board") in December 2004.

1. Title

- 1.1 The Committee shall be called the BCU Sprint Racing Committee.

2. Objectives

- 2.1 The Committee interests itself in all matters arising out of and in connection with canoe and kayak sprint racing in Great Britain. Sprint racing is held over distances up to and including 5000 metres on racing courses which are designed to be as flat and still as possible.
- 2.2 The Committee's objectives are to encourage club, regional, national and international sprint races.
- 2.3 Its primary responsibilities are: -
- (a) To organise and conduct National Championships and other competitions on behalf of the BCU.
 - (b) To set and publish competition rules and make recommendations for the conduct of national and regional regattas.
 - (c) To give advice, guidance, and encouragement to sponsors of sprint racing in Great Britain.
 - (d) To select, train and administer teams representing Great Britain in international events.
 - (e) To select, train and administer teams representing England in international events.
 - (f) To train competition officials.
 - (g) To develop good coaching within regions and clubs.
 - (h) To maintain disciplinary regulations.
 - (i) To act as final authority in disputes, protests and appeals with regard to sprint racing rules and competitions.

3. Committee

- 3.1 The Committee shall comprise up to 12 persons, being Full Individual Members of the BCU. This total shall include the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer but does not include national delegates, co-opted members or the representative from the Regional Development Teams.
- 3.2 Members of the Committee shall serve for approximately two years and shall be eligible to stand for re-election at alternate Annual Consultative Meetings. One half of the elected members shall retire at each Annual Consultative Meeting.
- 3.3 The Chairman of the Committee shall be elected at the Annual Consultative Meeting and shall serve until the next Annual Consultative Meeting and be eligible to stand for re-election.
- 3.4 Persons who are employees of the BCU or National Associations may serve as members of the Committee with the consent of the Board.
- 3.5 The Committee shall appoint from within their membership (including co-opted members), a Secretary, a Treasurer and such other officers the Committee considers necessary for its administration and representation on other committees.
- 3.6 The Chairman has a seat on the World Class Management Group and the Committee shall appoint a representative to sit on the Sports Management Committee (SMC).
- 3.7 One representative of the sprint racing representatives on the English Regional Development Teams shall be entitled to attend meetings of the Committee as a non-voting member.

4. Co-options

- 4.1 Committee may co-opt not more than three Full Individual Members to serve on the Committee until the next Annual Consultative Meeting. Co-opted members shall have the same voting rights as other Committee members.

5. Nominations

- 5.1 Nominations of candidates for election at the Annual Consultative Meeting shall be made to the Secretary of the Committee in writing supported by the signatures of two Full Individual Members of the BCU and must reach the Secretary by 1st August prior to the Annual Consultative Meeting.

6. Proceedings of the Committee

- 6.1 The Committee shall meet at least twice in each calendar year and shall report to the SMC, which in turn shall report to the Board.
- 6.2 At least seven days notice of meetings shall be given in writing (by post, email or fax) to all members of the Committee.
- 6.3 The Secretary shall keep minutes of the proceedings of the Committee and of the Annual Consultative Meeting. Copies of the minutes shall be sent to the SMC. Copies of the agenda and minutes shall be sent to the regional sprint racing representatives.
- 6.4 Six of the members entitled to attend and vote at a meeting shall form a quorum of the Committee. Voting shall be by show of hands only and each member shall have one vote.
- 6.5 The Treasurer shall keep such books of account as the Board and the Committee may from time to time direct. The accounts of the Committee shall be submitted annually to the SMC, made up to 31 October. Approved costs of members attending meetings shall be paid.

7. General Meetings

- 7.1 The Annual Consultative Meeting shall be held during the final National Regatta of the season which is usually in September.
- 7.2 At least 21 clear days' notice of the date, time and place of General Meetings shall be given to each affiliated club that has registered its interest in sprint racing with the Committee. Clubs register an interest by competing at any national or regional regatta in the period since the last Annual Consultative Meeting. The agenda for a General Meeting, details of the business to be discussed at the meeting and of the persons nominated for election shall accompany the notice of meeting.
- 7.3 The business of the Annual Consultative Meeting shall be:
- (a) to receive the report of the Chairman;
 - (b) to receive a summary statement of accounts;
 - (c) to elect persons nominated to serve on the Committee, including the Chairman.
 - (d) to consider any items included in the notice of meeting. Any conclusions reached on such items shall stand as recommendations for further consideration by the Committee.
- 7.4 Only business notified in the notice of meeting shall be transacted.
- 7.5 Any item for the agenda at the Annual Consultative Meeting shall be submitted to the Secretary of the Committee in writing supported by the signatures of two Full Individual Members of the BCU and must reach the Secretary by 1st August prior to the Annual Consultative Meeting. Other items may be discussed at the discretion of the Chairman.
- 7.6 No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless a quorum of members is present at the time the meeting proceeds to do business. A quorum shall be eight Voting Members.
- 7.7 The Chairman of the Committee shall preside at General Meetings. If the Chairman is known to be unable to attend or if he remains absent 30 minutes after the scheduled start time of the meeting, the voting members present may choose a voting member to take the chair.
- 7.8 "Voting Member" means any club or organisation affiliated to the BCU who participate in and have registered an interest in sprint racing. Each voting member represented at a General Meeting by a Full Individual Member shall be entitled to one vote.

SPRINT RACING

BCU FLATWATER RACING COMPETITION RULES

- 7.9 The Chairman shall not be entitled to vote other than when a casting vote is required.
- 7.10 Voting shall be by a show of hands unless two or more voting members are present or the Chairman requests a poll.
- 7.11 A General Meeting may be called at any time at the discretion of the Committee or by notice in writing to the Secretary by not less than 10 voting members. Such notice must state in the form of a motion the business to be discussed and be signed on behalf of the voting members. The Committee shall convene a General Meeting within 60 days of receipt of such notice.
- 8. Sub-committees**
- 8.1 The Committee may, with the prior approval of the SMC, appoint a sub-committee, standing or otherwise, for a specific period and with a specific brief. The Committee shall appoint one of its number to chair the sub-committee and all members shall be Full Individual Members of the BCU. The Committee shall supervise and be responsible to SMC for the work of its sub-committees and shall fund its sub-committees from within its set approved budget.
- 9. Financial Budget**
- 9.1 The Committee shall set a specific annual budget each year for approval by the SMC.
- 10. Trophies**
- 10.1 The Committee shall approve the list of trophies which are the property of the committee and are awarded each year. The Committee shall also determine and publish the basis for competition for these trophies.
- 11. National Championships**
- 11.1 Each year the Committee shall organise or nominate a National Championship Regatta.
- a) This regatta shall include races for the majority of the National Championship classes and distances.
 - b) Any National Championship races not included in the National Championships Regatta shall be included in the other National Sprint Regattas held that season.
 - c) The winners of the classes shall be considered the National Sprint Racing Champions in their respective classes.

BCU FLATWATER RACING COMPETITION RULES

Issue date: 1 January 2004

Introduction

The purpose of this document is to provide the Rules that govern:

- a) Flatwater Racing
- b) The conduct of that Racing

It follows as closely as possible the wording and sequence in Version 4.00 of the International Canoe Federation Flatwater Racing Competition Rules issued on 1 January 2003. However, it also contains some additional regulations or changes to those rules as determined from time to time by the BCU Racing Committee.

The following words, acronyms and abbreviations are referred to in this document:

BCU British Canoe Union (the Governing Body for Canoeing in Great Britain)

BOA British Olympic Association (the National Olympic Committee for Great Britain)

ICF International Canoe Federation

IOC International Olympic Committee

NOC National Olympic Committee

RS Racing Section of the BCU (responsible to the BCU for the control of Flatwater Racing competitions in canoes and kayaks over distances up to and including 5000 metres)

RC Racing Committee (elected by the Racing Section to carry out the objectives of the Section on a day-to-day basis).

Regatta Committee (a sub-committee of the RC responsible for organising and conducting National Championships and other competitions on behalf of the BCU)

Aims and Definition of Flatwater Racing

The aim of a canoe race competition is for people to race each other in kayaks and canoes over a clearly defined unobstructed course in the shortest possible time according to the rules. The course should be as flat and still as can be obtained. Although the course length may be any distance up to and including 5,000 metres and competition organised for any craft, the official events and distances recognised by the BCU and ICF are the following:

For men: K1, K2, K4, C1, C2, C4 200, 500 and 1000 metres

K1, K2, K4, C1, C2 5000 metres but only 2500 for some Junior events

For women: K1, K2, K4 200, 500 and 1000 metres

K1, K2 5000 metres but only 2500 for some Junior events

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BCU FLATWATER RACING COMPETITION RULES

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Part I - GENERAL REGULATIONS

There are three levels of competition: - International, National Status and Club.

1. International Competitions

- 1.1 The ICF has ruled that all International Competitions must take place in accordance with the ICF Flatwater Racing Competition Rules. All competitions organised by either the BCU or a BCU Club are considered international if competitors of a foreign country are invited to participate.
- 1.2 These competitions must be supervised or managed by at least one accredited official in possession of a valid ICF Flatwater Racing Official card.

1.3 Foreign Nationals

- 1.3.1 No member of a foreign Federation or club may compete or be invited to compete in an open or national competition within the United Kingdom without permission from the RC.
- 1.3.2 Only the members of clubs or associations affiliated with an ICF Member Federation have the right to participate in an international competition.
- 1.3.3 A competitor is always allowed to take part individually in an international competition but must in each case obtain special permission from his/her national federation.
- 1.3.4 A competitor may take part on behalf of the BCU provided they are domiciled in the UK, if he/she obtains the authorisation of his/her Federation of origin. This authorisation has to be sent before 30th November prior to the year concerned to the ICF Headquarters with a copy to the Chairman of the ICF Flatwater Racing Committee.
- 1.3.5 If he/she has lived for 2 (two) years or more in the UK, the approval of his/her Federation of origin is no longer required.
- 1.3.6 A competitor may not compete for more than one Federation in any calendar year in the sport of canoeing. This rule does not apply in the case of a competitor who leaves his/her country of origin to marry and live in another country. He/she can, in this case compete for his/her new Federation without awaiting the delay of 2 years.

2. National Status Competitions

- 2.1 All competitions announced as National Status competitions shall be held in accordance with the Flatwater Racing Competition Rules of the BCU.
- 2.2 National Status Competitions are those at which promotions within the National Divisions take place.
- 2.3 National Status Competitions are organised on behalf of the BCU.

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- 2.4 All competitors at National Status Competitions must be registered with the RC and must be BCU members or, if racing in a Junior "D" class, a member of a club which has a registered youth section and is affiliated to the BCU.
- 2.5 Organisers of National Status Competitions shall declare that the competition is being held under BCU rules.
- 2.6 National Status Competitions require a permit from the RC. Application for a Regatta permit shall be directed to the Secretary of the RC. Such a permit shall require:
 - a) Observance of the BCU Flatwater Racing Competition Rules.
 - b) Inclusion the words "Under BCU Rules" on all printed matter issued in connection with the competition.
 - c) Compliance with Part III Rule 13.5 regarding Regatta Officials.
- 2.7 National Status Competitions will be included in the official BCU Calendar of events.
- 2.8 Within 14 days of the close of a competition a completed regatta programme with results and signed by the Competition Secretary shall be sent to the Records Officer of the RC.

3. Club Regattas

- 3.1 BCU members are allowed to participate with non BCU members.
- 3.2 No promotions will be made at Club Regattas. Performance will not affect National Ranking.
- 3.3 The Rules and Classes may be altered to suit Club requirements.
- 3.4 Organisers of Club Regattas may advertise their events in the Year Book on payment of the appropriate fee.
- 3.5 Organisers are asked to encourage all who take part to become BCU members. Where fees are charged, BCU members should be charged a reduced fee.
- 3.6 To ensure uniformity, organisers are asked to follow the BCU Flatwater Racing Competition Rules as far as possible.
- 3.7 Organisers are asked to make it clear in all literature what the events and rules will be.
- 3.8 A booklet 'Organising a Club Regatta' will be available.

4. Competing outside of the United Kingdom

No Club or member of a Club or individual member of the BCU may compete outside the United Kingdom without permission from the RC. See Rules 1.3.2 to 1.3.6, which are also the rules of the ICF and apply to all Member Federations.

5. Membership of more than one club or change of club

When a competitor is a member of two or more clubs he shall, by March 1st have declared the name of the club in whose colours he will race that year in individual events. A person joining a second club after March 1st must continue to race for his first club. A competitor who has changed his club is not permitted to race for his new club, unless prior consent of his old club has been obtained. The consent shall not be withheld in the case of a change of residence from one area to another.

6. Athlete Eligibility and Sponsorships

The rules of the International Canoe Federation or the National Olympic Committee shall apply to all matters relating to Amateur Status. At present there are no regulations specific to Amateur Status other than as broadly listed in 6.2.

6.1 Foreign Teams

Foreign Teams may receive compensation/assistance authorised by the BCU to cover financial expense to participate in an UK competition. Under no circumstances shall any payment exceed the sum of actual expenditure.

6.2 A Canoeist/Competitor may not:

- a) In the practice of sport and in the opinion of the BCU manifestly contravene the spirit of fair play in the exercise of sport, particularly by the use of doping or violence.
- b) Have allowed his person, name, picture or sport performance to be used for advertising, except when the BCU or its Committees enter into a contract for sponsorship or equipment. All payments must be made to the BCU and not to the individual. (See also 6.6.2)
- c) Participate in any competition on condition of a financial consideration.

6.3 A Canoeist/Competitor may:

Accept, during a period of preparation and/or actual competition which shall be limited by the

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rules of the BCU and its Committees:

- a) Assistance administered through the BOA or the BCU World Class Performance Programme: living expenses, insurance cover in respect of accidents, illness and disability; personal property, sports equipment and clothing; cost of medical treatment, physiotherapy and authorised coaches.
 - b) Compensation authorised by his or her NOC or the BCU World Class Performance Programme, in the case of necessity, to cover financial loss resulting from his or her absence from work or basic occupation in the Olympic Games and sports competition or other canoeing activities. In no circumstances shall payment made under this provision exceed the sum which the competitor would have earned in the same period. The compensation may be paid with the approval of the BCU or the BOA at their discretion.
 - c) Accept prizes won in competition or other canoeing activities, within the rules established by the BCU and its Committees and the ICF.
- 6.4 In all cases which are not covered by the above regulations (6.2 and 6.3), the corresponding rules of the ICF or the BOA shall apply.
- 6.5 **Procedures To Be Undertaken By Those Seeking, Obtaining, and Disbursing Sponsorships, Sports Scholarships and Awards.**
- 6.5.1 Details of all personal sponsorship arrangements, sports sponsorships and other awards, offered to or negotiated by individuals or organisations, must be submitted by beneficiaries to the BCU Committee responsible for administering the particular activity, for registration and approval. When doubt exists regarding the appropriate Committee to whom information should be furnished, BCU Headquarters will arrange for the necessary action to be undertaken.
 - 6.5.2 A central registry of all personal sponsorship arrangements will be maintained by the BCU Headquarters, and will be available for inspection by authorised officers of the BCU.
 - 6.5.3 The term "personal sponsorship arrangements negotiated by beneficiaries" shall include: Payments made to athletes selected through the UK Sport Performance Matrix and administered by the BCU Performance Director. Sponsorship provided by individuals (not family), commercial, industrial, and public authorities, National and Regional Sports Aid Foundations, Local Authorities, Trust Funds, Educational Institutions and agencies, Clubs and other miscellaneous supportive groups.
- 6.6 **Advertising on Boats and Equipment**
- 6.6.1 Advertising of any tobacco, tobacco related products or strong spirit drinks on boats or equipment is not permitted by the BCU.
 - 6.6.2 The IOC and the Olympic Charter regulate use of athlete images during the period of the Olympic Games. Except as permitted by the IOC Executive Board, no competitor who participates in the Olympic Games may allow his person, name, picture or sports performance to be used for advertising during the Olympic Games except where:
 - a) The NOC of the athlete has given its express prior written consent to each such use, and
 - b) That, in any event, such use is not in relation to the athlete's performance at such Games.
7. **Classification of Paddlers**
- 7.1 **Junior:** A Junior is a competitor under 18 years of age at the beginning of the current calendar year. A Junior will have junior racing status unless promoted to senior racing status. Each Junior status competitor will be nominated to compete in one of the Junior classes as laid down from time to time by the RC. Juniors who have Senior status may race in the appropriate Junior class for National Championship events.
 - 7.2 **Senior:** A Senior is a competitor who is over 18 years of age at the beginning of the calendar year, and will have Senior racing status. Each Senior status competitor will be nominated to compete in one of the Senior Classes as laid down from time to time by the RC.
 - 7.3 **Veteran:** The first year a Veteran can compete is the year that his (her) thirty-fifth (35th) birthday falls in provided that he is not already nominated to compete in Mens A or B.
 - 7.4 **Promotions:** Entry to and promotion between classes will be at the discretion of the RC and will be based on results gained in competition at regatta venues nominated by the RC. A competitor may, at the discretion of the RC, be permitted to revert to a lower class at the end of a regatta season.
 - 7.5 **Mixed Events:** Mixed events where male and female competitors take part in the same boat are permitted.
 - 7.6 **Status:** Status in Kayaks has no bearing on status in Canadian Canoes and the converse i.e. a premier Senior Class competitor in Canadian Canoes may be a lower Senior Class in Kayak.

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- 7.7 **Special Rules for Kayak Fours:** Senior status competitors may not compete in fours events of a lower senior class than that for which they are nominated as individuals. Senior Class competitors may be members of fours crews competing in higher senior classes than their own without losing their individual Senior Class status. a win in a fours event does not affect the status of the members of the crew.
8. **National Championship Entries:**
 Entries for these events shall be restricted to British Nationals who are members of the BCU. Aliens resident in Great Britain for at least two years may be permitted to enter for a National Championship event. There is no time restriction in the case of men/women competitors who conform to the conditions contained in Rule 1.3.6.

Part II - CLASSES AND BUILDING REGULATIONS

9. Limitations

10. Trademarks

Boats, accessories and clothing may carry trademarks, advertising symbols and written text. All advertising material should be placed in such a way that it does not interfere with competitors' identification and does not effect the outcome of the race.

The advertising of tobacco smoking and strong spirit drinks will not be accepted.

N.B. These rules do not apply to the Olympic Games where there are specific limitations. See 7.5 of the ICF Flatwater Racing Competition Rules.

Any boat, accessory, or article of clothing, which does not comply with the above conditions, will be ineligible for use during a competition. Teams and competitors are responsible for their own equipment.

11. Construction

11.1 The Hull

Section and longitudinal lines of the hull of the kayak and canoe shall not be concave (only horizontal and vertical).

411.2 The Deck

The deck construction may not be higher on any horizontal point than the highest point of the front edge of the first cockpit.

11.3 No foreign substance may be added to boats which give competitors an unfair advantage.

11.4 All electric, electronic devices are forbidden in a boat when racing, this to include:

- pumps
- speed measuring devices
- strain gauges
- heart monitors

Kayaks

11.5 Boats may have one rudder. Over-stern rudders may not be thicker than 10mm for K1 and K2, or 12mm for a K4.

The boat to be designed as to be a sit-in (Kayak type) not a sit-on (Surf Ski type).

Canoes

11.6 The canoe must be built symmetrically upon the axis of its length.

Steering rudders or any guiding apparatus directing the course of the canoe is banned. A keel, if any, must be straight, shall extend over the whole length of the canoe and not project more than 30mm below the hull.

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The C1 and C2 may be entirely open. The minimum length of the opening shall be 280cm and the edge of the side of the craft (gunwale) can extend maximum 5cm into the craft along the whole defined opening. The boat can have maximum three strengthening bars with a width of 7cm each.

The C4 canoe may be entirely open. The minimum length of the opening shall be 390cm and the edge of the side of the craft (gunwale) can extend maximum 6cm into the craft along the defined opening. The boat can have maximum four strengthening bars with a width of maximum 7cm each.

12. Boat Control

12.1 The length of a kayak or a canoe shall be measured between the extremes of the stem and the stern. Stem-bands or other projections of the stem or stern, if any, are to be included. Any rudder forming a continuation of the length of a kayak is not to be included in the measurement.

12.2 No alterations in canoes and kayaks are permitted after the measuring and weighing and before the competition has taken place.

Before Weighing the Boat:

12.3 All loose outfit shall be removed. Permanent knee rests attached in a definitive way to the floorboard and buoyancy attachments consisting of water absorbing material must be absolutely dry at the first weighing prior to the race. Three or more boats according to the decision of the Competition Committee and on a random system shall be recontrolled immediately after the race.

Part III - ORGANISATION OF COMPETITIONS

13. Officials

13.1 If its nature and extent demand, each competition shall be held under the supervision of the following officials:

Chief Official	Aligner(s)
Competition Organiser	Starter(s)
(or Competition Manager)	Turning Point Umpire(s)
Competition Secretary	Course Umpire(s)
Technical Organiser	Finish Line Judge(s)
Announcer	Timekeeper(s)
Boat Measurer(s)	Media Officer

13.2 If circumstances permit, one person may function in two of the above positions.

13.3 The Chief Official, Competition Organiser, Starter, Umpires, and Chief Judge should, if possible, be registered BCU Officials.

13.4 Unauthorised persons must not enter any official's area unless the Competition Committee or the Jury send for officials or team officials in order to solve problems.

13.5 **Competition Committee:** The competition is to be Managed by a Competition Committee consisting of:

- 1) Chief Official
- 2) Competition Organiser / Manager
- 3) One additional person. This person may be one of the officials listed in 13.1 providing their duty is at or near the finishing line at all times. The Competition Organiser / Manager appoints this person.

For status competitions two members of the competition committee must be registered Regatta Officials of the BCU Racing Committee.

For an international regatta two members of the Competition Committee must be in possession of a valid International Flatwater Racing Official card.

13.6 The Competition Committee must:

- a) Organise and supervise the competition.
- b) In the event of inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances which make it impossible to carry out the competition, postpone the competition and decide on another time when it may be held.
- c) Hear any protests that may be made and settle any disputes that may arise.
- d) Decide matters concerning disqualification in cases where the regulations are broken during a race.

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- e) Should a competitor be injured during a heat, the Committee may allow him to participate in another heat.
 - f) The decision of the Committee shall be based on the BCU Flatwater Racing Competition Rules.
 - g) Penalties in accordance with the BCU Rules or the RC Disciplinary Regulations may also be imposed i.e. disqualification for a longer period than the duration of the competition in question.
 - h) Before any decision is made regarding any infraction of the rules, hear the opinion of the Umpire who controlled the race in which the infraction was said to have occurred. The Committee is to seek the opinion of other officials supervising the race, if it is felt to be of importance in clearing up the alleged offence.
- 13.7 The Competition Jury:**
- a) Final authority for National Championship Competitions shall rest with a Jury composed of a Chairman and four members.
 - b) The members of the Jury shall be appointed by a quorum of the RC prior to the commencement of the competition. (In the event of a quorum not being present, the Chairman, Vice Chairman, or another official of the RC and two Committee members may appoint the Jury).
 - c) The Chairman of the Jury will be the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the RC or an elected RC member.
 - d) Subordinate to this Jury are the Chief Official and other officials shown in Rule 13.1.
 - e) A protest made during the competition must be handed to the Competition Committee not later than 20 minutes after publication of the results.
 - f) An appeal against a decision of the Competition Committee must be addressed to the Chairman of the Jury and handed in not later than 20 minutes after the Team Leader has been informed, in writing by the Chairman of the Competition Committee, of the decision against the competitor or crew and has signed the receipt.
 - g) The decision of the Jury is final.
- 13.8 Duties of Officials**
- 13.8.1 The Chief Official**, who is also the Chairman of the Competition Committee, decides all matters arising during the actual contest, which is not dealt with in these rules. *With the confirmation of the Competition Committee, he may disqualify any competitor who behaves improperly or who, by his conduct or speech, shows contempt towards the competition officials, other competitors or onlookers (see Rule 32.7). All officials are responsible to the Chief Official.*
- 13.8.2 The Technical Organiser** deals with all technical electronic equipment of the Regatta-Course. (Automatic start system / Photo/Timing system / Score board / Radio connections / Boat traffic before and during the races / Boat checking, etc.)
- 13.8.3 The Competition Organiser / Manager** supervises the races and is responsible for ensuring that the programme is followed without unnecessary delay. He shall inform the officials concerned punctually before a new race starts. He has to deal also with the good function of the competition administration of the races, (programme, drawings, results, technical documents, boat control, press, protests, etc.) He is responsible for producing the competition programme and should chair the Team Leaders Meeting. When required to do so by the Competition Committee (or Jury in the case of National Championship Competitions) he shall, with the assistance of the measurer, ensure that regulations concerning measurements are complied with. He shall make certain that the announcer gives all the necessary information about the races such as the start order, the name of any competitor failing to start and the results.
- 13.8.4 The Competition Secretary** reports to the Competition Organiser / Manager and shall be responsible for recording the results of the races, arranging the draws for intermediate rounds and finals and distributing the results and draws to those Officials who require them.
- 13.8.5 The Starter** decides all questions concerning the start of the races, and is alone responsible for decisions as to false starts. His decision is final. He shall see that the starting equipment is in good working order. He shall communicate with the Competition Committee and after having received a signal from them that all is ready, he shall order the competitors to their places and carry out the start according to the Racing Rules.
- 13.8.6 The Aligner** the duty of the aligner is to bring the boats to the starting line with the least possible delay, to check the competitor's attire and the competition number on the back and the number of the boats. When all boats are aligned he shall notify the starter by raising a white flag.
- 13.8.7 The Course Umpire** shall see to it that during a race the rules are complied with. If the rules are broken, the Umpire shall report immediately the infraction to the Competition

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Committee.

- a) The Competition Committee shall decide whether any of the competitors concerned shall be disqualified or not. If the Umpire has a report of an infraction of the rules he shall show a red flag after the race and shall make a written report before the next race takes place. In such a case, the Competition Committee shall make known its decision immediately and before the result of the race is announced.
 - b) If there is no infraction to report, the Umpire shall show a white flag.
 - c) In races of 500 and 1,000 metres, the Umpire shall follow the race in a motorboat.
 - d) He shall be completely unhampered during the race. No one except the Umpire and the driver shall be admitted to the boat reserved for him.
 - e) In long distance races with many competitors, more than one Umpire may be nominated. One of the Umpires shall, if possible, follow the leading group in the race, but without disturbing the other competitors.
 - f) In case of hindrances the Course Umpire must stop the competition passing all boats in the race and waving the red flag or using a sound signal until all boats have stopped paddling. After this all boats shall return to the start. The Course Umpire shall report immediately the infraction to the Competition Committee.
 - g) When a motorboat is not used, one or more Umpires shall be placed in such positions from which they can ensure that the rules are being complied with
- 13.8.8 **The Turning Point Umpires**, when a race is run along a course with one or more turning points, one or more Umpires and one recorder must be stationed at each turning point, where they gain the best view of the turn. The Turning Point Umpire shall see that the competitors turn according to the rules. The recorder shall make a list of all who pass the turning point. Immediately after the race, the Turning Point Umpire shall report to the Competition Committee as to who has turned and if any infraction of the rules has taken place.
- 13.8.9 **The Finishing Line Judges** decide the order in which the competitors passed the finishing line. The Judges shall be placed in a position where all lanes at the finish line can be clearly seen. If the Judges differ regarding the placing of two or more competitors, a simple majority shall decide the dispute, in the absence of photo finish. In the case of equal voting, the Chief Judge has the casting vote. When the photo finish is used the result determined by the Finish Line Judges shall be compared with it, with the photo finish being decisive. Video films are not a substitute for photo finish.
- 13.8.10 **The Timekeepers** are responsible for recording the times. This shall be done by means of stopwatches or suitable electronic equipment. It is the responsibility of the Chief Timekeeper to ensure that the timing equipment is working correctly. The Chief Timekeeper shall divide the work amongst the timekeepers. At the end of each race, he shall compare the official times with the other timekeepers and immediately inform the Competition Organiser (or Manager) of them. Each race shall be timed by at least two watches. When the watches have not recorded the same time, the longest (worst) time shall be taken as correct. The stopwatches are to be started when the electronic or optical signal from the start is received. Timekeepers may also officiate as Finish Line Judges.
- 13.8.11 **The Boat Measurer(s)** shall assist the Technical Organiser to test the craft taking part in the race. Should any of the boats not fulfil the BCU requirements concerning classification (Rules 9 to 12), they shall be excluded from the competition.
- 13.8.12 **The Announcer** shall, on the instructions of the Competition Organiser, announce the start of each race, the order of the starting and the position of the competitors during the race. After the race is finished, he will announce the results.
- 13.8.13 **The Media Officer** must supply all the necessary information to the representatives of the press, radio and television about the race and its progress. He is authorised therefore to ask for information from the different Officials who must procure for him as soon as possible the copies from the official results.
14. **Invitations**
An invitation to an Open Regatta shall contain the following information:
- a) Time and place of the regatta.
 - b) Situation and plan of the course.
 - c) Classes and distance of the races.
 - d) Whether the races are to be held on still or running water, up or down stream.
 - e) Amount of entry fee.
 - f) Address to which entries should be sent and the final date for receiving entries. This date

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shall not be earlier than 14 days prior to the first day of the competition.

15. Entries

Entries for Open Regattas can only be made in accordance with the regulations given in the invitation. An entry shall, however, always contain the following information:

- a) Name and address of competitor or crew.
- b) Name of club to which competitor or crew belong.
- c) Classes and distances in which the competitor or crew propose to compete.
- d) Similar details of reserves if any.
- e) The Racing Registration number of each competitor, member of the crew or reserves.
- g) All entries should be in writing (Letter, Fax, Email, Telegram, Telex, etc). Where verbal communication is used, it must also be confirmed in writing by the given deadline (midnight on the due date). In the event of conflicting information, the information with letterhead and/or signature will take precedence.
- h) Late entries shall not normally be accepted. The acceptance of late entries shall be at the discretion of the Competition Committee who may charge up to double the entry fee.

15.1 Racing Colours

When making the entries, Clubs must give the colours of the clothing worn by the competitors and these colours must not be changed during the competition. **N.B.** Every racing club must register their racing colours with the RC (and any changes thereto). All competitors from a club must wear the correct colours at all times.

16. Heats and Finals

- 16.1 At least three kayaks or canoes must be entered before a race can be held. If the number of entries in race up to and including 1,000 metres is so great that heats are necessary, the number of kayaks or canoes in each heat and in the final must not exceed nine (9).

- 16.2 The division of competitors into heats shall be determined by drawing lots.

- 16.3 Where the width of the course permits, eight or nine kayaks or canoes shall participate in the final if more than this number has been entered in the entire race, as follows:

3 to 9 entries	Direct final.
10 to 18 entries	Two heats, three from each to final A, 4/7 (+ 8th best time if possible) to one semi-final and from the semi-final three first to final A
19 to 27 entries	3 heats, 1 from each to final A, 2nd to 7th to the semi-finals, rest out Two semi-finals three first to final A. 4th to 7th (+ 8th best time if possible) to final B
over 27 entries	Required number of heats and semi-finals. By three semi-finals first three from each of the semi-finals to final A and 4th to 6th to final B By four semi-finals first 2 (+ 3rd best time if possible) to final A and 3rd and 4th (- 3rd best time) + 2 best next time to final B

- 16.3.1 A "B" final will only be held when there are more than 18 boats in that particular event.

- 16.4 When making the draw, the difference between the number of competitors in the heats of the race shall not exceed one. If the number of competitors in the heats varies, the earlier heats shall have the largest numbers.

- 16.5 Any crew which has not taken part in a heat as instructed shall not be allowed to compete in the final.

- 16.6 The composition of a crew which has qualified for semi-finals or for the final must not be changed. Heats and the final shall be run on the same stretch of water.

- 16.7 For races of more than 1,000 metres, heats shall not be held, and all boats taking part shall start simultaneously.

- 16.8 Should the width of water not permit a simultaneous start, starts at regular intervals shall be permitted.

- 16.9 The procedure for selecting competitors to race in finals will be on the basis of one of two criteria: either times or positions obtained in heats. The criterion used for each event will be decided by the RC and published in advance of the event.

17. Acceptance of Entries

Confirmation that the entry has been accepted, together with notification of the result of the

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draw and time of events, shall be sent to the entrant on written request by him and on production by the entrant to the Competition Organiser of a "stamped addressed" envelope.

18. Team Leaders' Meeting

At least 2 hours before the first race of the competition (12 hours for an International Competition), the team leaders' meeting is to be held. At this meeting the names of team leaders should be advised. The organisers will describe the regatta course and all other arrangements, which should be adhered to for the duration of the competition. The Chief Official will describe the regatta programme and ask for any changes to the entries.

19. Alterations to Entries and Withdrawals

- 19.1 Any competitor named in the final entry or at the Team Leaders Meeting may substitute for any other in the given type of racing (kayak men, kayak ladies, canoe men). Notification of alterations in the entries must be given in written form to the Chief Official at least one hour before the first race of the morning or afternoon session.
- 19.2 The withdrawal from a race is considered final and no renewed entry of the same crew is allowed.
- 19.3 Every competitor whose entry has been confirmed by his own club, at the time of the meeting of the team leaders, called for this purpose, is obliged to take part in the due event. If the competitor does not start, and has no valid reason approved by the Competition Committee, he shall be disqualified for the whole regatta. A competitor, who arrives too late at the start, shall be considered to have voluntarily withdrawn and shall be disqualified under this rule.
- 19.4 The refunding of entry fees for entries withdrawn not less than 24 hours before the competition is at the discretion of the Competition Committee.

20. Alterations in the sequence of events

The sequence of races given in the programme and the intervals between races as given in the racing programme are binding on the organisers. Alterations cannot be made unless the respective Team Managers at the competition give their consent.

21. Courses

Marking Signs

- 21.1 For National Championships and where possible for other competitions the turning points shall be marked by at least six flags (or buoys) which shall be readily distinguishable and shall, if possible be diagonally divided with one half in red and the other half in yellow.
- 21.2 Both the start and the finishing lines shall be marked with red flags or buoys, at the points where these lines intersect the outer limits of the course.

Layout

- 21.3 Before the start of the races the racing course shall be measured and marked by means of clearly visible flags mounted on buoys.
 - a) The course at the start shall permit a clear width where possible, of at least 5 metres for each boat.
 - b) For National Championships the starting and finishing lines shall be at right angles to the course.
 - c) The finishing line shall be at least 45 metres long and be marked by two flags. The Finishing Line Judges must be placed as near to the finishing line as possible.
 - d) For National Championship races up to 1,000 metres, the course must be straight and in one direction.
- 21.4 For races exceeding 1,000 metres turning points are permitted. For National Championship races exceeding 1,000 metres the following conditions should be fulfilled, if possible:
 - a) The distance between the starting line and the first flag of the first turning point (1st leg) shall be straight and at least 1,859.25 metres.
 - b) The distance between the last flag of the first turning point and the first flag of the second turning point (2nd leg) shall be straight and maximum 1759.25 metres.
 - c) The distance between the last flag of the second turning point and the first flag of the third turning point (3rd leg) shall be a maximum of 500 metres.
 - d) The specifications of all other stretches shall be in accordance with point "c".
 - e) The radius of each turn should, if possible be at least 40.5 metres.
 - f) Both the start and the end of the race shall be in front of the Finishing Tower.

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- g) The red flags of the finish line shall be placed as much to the outside possible in order to get the widest feasible finish line.
 - h) The starting pontoons for the 500 metre races are to be removed.
- 21.5 For competitions, including the National Championships, these conditions should be complied with, unless a special dispensation for the course has been obtained from the RC through the Secretary.

22. Canoe Numbers

All kayaks and canoes shall carry a vertical number plate made of non-transparent material marked with black numbers on white background (for Internationals) or yellow background indicating the lane. The numbers on the plate must measure 15 cm in height and 25 mm in thickness. The plates shall be placed on the centre line of the after deck (Canadian Canoe foredeck). The approximate size of the number plate shall be 18 x 20 cm.

The personal numbers provided by the organisers shall be placed on the back of the competitor only.

23. Instructions for Competitors

Written instructions shall be available for competitors 2 hours before the start of the competition, containing the following information:

- a) Detailed information on the courses and their markings
- b) Starting time
- c) Starting line
- d) Finishing line
- e) Competitors racing number
- f) Type of boat control

Part IV - RACING REGULATIONS

24. Means of Propulsion

- 24.1 Kayaks shall be propelled solely by means of double-bladed paddles.
- 24.2 Canadian Canoes shall be propelled solely by means of single-bladed paddles.
- 24.3 The paddles may not be fixed on the boat in any way.
- 24.4 If a paddle is broken a competitor may not be provided with a new one by a supporter.

25. Start

- 25.1 Lots shall be drawn to determinate in the heats the lanes of boats at the start. Number one shall be on the left, then number two and so on.
- 25.2 In competitions where heats are required, lots must be drawn separately for each heat.
- 25.3 Competitors shall be at the starting area in time to allow a satisfactory preparation for the start. The start shall be given without reference to absentees. The position of the boats at the start shall be such that the bows of the competing boats are on the starting line.
- 25.4 Boats must be stationary.
- 25.5 The Starter will announce to the competitors the time remaining to the start by "START WITHIN TEN SECONDS ", when he is satisfied he will give the starting signal by a shot or a short powerful sound.
- 25.5.1 In the long distance races the starter shall declare "START WITHIN ONE MINUTE" when he is satisfied he will give the starting signal by a shot or a short powerful sound.
- 25.5.2 The starting signal can also be the word "GO".
- 25.5.3 If the Starter is not satisfied with the line-up he will call "STOP", and hand over to the Aligner for repositioning.
- 25.6 If the competitor starts paddling ahead after the words "START WITHIN TEN SECONDS or ONE MINUTE", and before the starting signal has been given, he has made a false start.
- 25.6.1 The starter must immediately fire two shots and warn the offending competitor/s. If two false starts are made by the same competitor/s the starter must exclude him/them from the race. A warning and subsequent disqualification by the starter applies only to the boat/competitor which/who caused the false start.

26. Interruptions

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BCU FLATWATER RACING COMPETITION RULES

- 26.1 The Umpire has the right to interrupt a correctly started race if unforeseen hindrances arise. The course umpires with a red flag and sound signal may effect such an interruption. Competitors must immediately stop paddling and await further instructions.
- 26.2 If a race is declared null and void, no change of the composition of a crew is permitted at the new start.
- 26.3 In the event of a capsize the competitor or crew is eliminated from the race if he/she or they are not able to get in again without outside help.
27. **Pacing and Wash Riding**
- 27.1 Taking pace or receiving assistance from boats not in the race or by any other means is not permitted.
- 27.2 When a race is in progress crews not taking part in the race are strictly forbidden to proceed over whole or part of the course, even outside the marking buoys.
- 27.3 Races up to 1,000 metres.
In races up to 1,000 metres competitors must keep to their lane from the start to the finish of the course. They shall keep as far as possible the centre of their lane. No boat must come nearer than five metres in any direction to another competitor.
- 27.4 Races of more than 1,000 metres.
In races of more than 1,000 metres competitors may deviate from their lane providing they do not impede other competitors.
- 27.5 In long distance races every competitor shall be warned by a sound signal (e.g. a bell), when he passes a point 1000 metres from the finishing line.
28. **Turns**
- 28.1 When a race is run on a course with turning points these shall be passed to port (i.e. in an anti-clockwise direction).
- 28.2 When going around a turning point, the competitor on the outer course must leave room for the competitor on the inner course if that competitor has the bow of his boat at least level with the front edge of the cockpit of the boat on the outer course. With respect to K2 and K4, this refers to the fore-cockpit. With respect to C1, it refers to the level of the competitor's body, and for C2 it refers to the level of the body of the foremost member of the crew.
- 28.3 A competitor will not be disqualified for touching a turning buoy, unless, in the opinion of the Turning Point Umpires, an advantage has been gained therefrom. In making a turn, the boat shall follow as closely as possible the course as marked by the buoys at the turning points.
29. **Overtaking**
- 29.1 When a canoe or kayak is overtaking another canoe or kayak in a race, it is the duty of the overtaking craft to keep clear at all times of the boat being overtaken.
- 29.2 On the other hand, the craft being overtaken must not alter its course to make difficulties for the overtaking craft.
30. **Collision or Damage**
Any competitor who is responsible for a collision or who damages the canoe or kayak or paddle of another can be disqualified and can be required to pay damages.
31. **Finish**
- 31.1 The boat has finished the race when its bow crosses the finish line with all crew members in it.
- 31.2 If two or more boats reach the finishing line at the same time they are awarded the same classification in the final. In the case of a dead heat finish for any position, which determines the advance to the next level of the competition the following rules will apply:
- Wherever there are sufficient number of lanes available in the next level of the competitions, drawing of lots will determine to which race each boat will advance. If possible it may use also lane number 10.
 - Wherever there are not enough lanes available there will be a re-race between the boats involved 30 minutes after the race (and for International Competitions one hour after the last race of the day, or half day programme)
 - In the case of a dead heat in the re-race, drawing of lots will determine the outcome.
32. **Disqualifications**

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BCU FLATWATER RACING COMPETITION RULES

- 32.1 Any competitor who attempts to win a race by any other than honourable means, who breaks the Racing Regulations, or who disregards the honourable nature of the Racing Regulations, shall be disqualified for the duration of the race concerned.
- 32.2 Should a competitor have completed a race in a kayak or canoe which is shown upon inspection not to conform with the classifications (see Rules 9-12), he shall be disqualified from the race in question.
- 32.3 It is prohibited to receive external assistance during a race.
- 32.4 No crew may be accompanied along and adjacent to the racecourse by other boats while the race is in progress.
- 32.5 No crew may receive assistance by using objects thrown into the course. Any of the above infractions will result in the disqualification of the competitor(s) concerned.
- 32.6 All disqualifications by the Competition Committee have to be confirmed in writing immediately with the reasons. The Team Leader has to acknowledge the receipt on a copy with the exact time, which is the start of the protest time.
- 32.7 The Competition Committee may discipline any competitor or Official whose behaviour is detrimental to the good order and conduct of the competition. The Competition Committee may after repeated action by the offender disqualify him/her for that competition.

33. Protests

- 33.1 A protest against a crew to compete in a race shall be advised to a member of the Competition Committee not later than one hour before the start of the race. A protest made later - within 30 days from the date when the race in question was held - is only permitted if the officials of the club of the competitor making the protest can prove that the facts on which the protest is based came to their knowledge later than one hour before the start of the race.
- 33.2 A late protest shall be referred to the RC accompanied by the prescribed fee (see below).
- 33.3 A protest made during a competition must be addressed to the Competition Committee not later than 20 minutes after the Team Leader has been informed on the decision against his/her competitor or team and has signed the receipt.
- 33.4 All protests must be made in writing and be accompanied by a fee of £5.00 (International Competitions £15.00). The fee will be refunded if the protest is upheld. *If the protest is not upheld the fee may not be refunded, at the discretion of the Competition Committee or RC hearing the protest.*
- 33.5 When a protest or a report is made against an athlete or a team, the team leader of the athlete/team in question shall be presented with the protest or report to read.

34. Appeals

Competitors have the right to appeal to the RC through their club or team management against a decision of the Competition Committee, within 30 days from the date when the race was held. In the case of National Championship Competitions the appeal must be made to the Competition Jury in accordance with Rule 13.7. A fee of £15.00 shall accompany the appeal. The fee will be refunded if the appeal is upheld. The BCU RC (or Jury in the case of a National Championship) shall pronounce the final decision.

Part V - SPECIAL RULES FOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS

- 35. Only members of the BCU who qualify under Rule 8 may participate in National Championship events. The only exceptions to this rule are those exempted under Rule 1.3.
- 36. All canoes and kayaks must comply with the classes and building rules as laid down in Part II of these rules.
- 37. Officials: Fully in accordance with Rules 13.1 to 13.4.
- 38. Competition Committee: Fully in accordance with Rule 13.5.
- 39. Competition Jury: Fully in accordance with Rules 13.7 and 34.
- 40. Marking signs: In accordance with Rule 21.
- 41. Courses: In accordance with rule 21.
- 42. Disqualifications: In accordance with Rule 32.

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BCU FLATWATER RACING COMPETITION RULES

43. Heats and Finals:

In the event of there being fewer than three boats in a National Championship event then no medals will be awarded. If three boats are in an event then only a Gold Medal will be awarded. If four or more boats are in an event then Gold, Silver & Bronze medals will be awarded.

Notes to the BCU Flatwater Racing Competition Rules

Races Exceeding 1,000 Metres at the National Water Sports Centre Nottingham, Rules 21.4 and 21.5

Because of limitations at the National Water Sports Centre - mainly the start pontoon being fixed for the Start of two 5000 metre and one 2500 metre events - it is not possible to comply with the Rule and provide the three courses required. The 2nd leg under the Rule is 47.75 metres too long. The requirements given in the Rule are those of the ICF, which the BCU must shadow in its own Rules.

Long Distance Courses at the National Water Sports Centre, approved by the RC

To provide flexibility there are four turning points with the start and finish of the turns as follows:

1. 10 metres beyond the finish line
2. 450 metres from the finish line
3. 1123 metres from the finish line
4. 1796 metres from the finish line.

NB With a fixed start position and by using the same turning buoys for the 5000 metre course an exact 2500 metre course cannot be obtained. It is 20.5 metres short.

Interpretation of Rule 27.3 - Races up to 1000 metres (including the 5 metre rule)

The rule requires competitors to keep to their lane from the start to the finish of the course and for their boat not to come nearer than five metres in any direction to another boat. Rule 42.1 in the Rules for World Championships requires the lanes along the length of the course to be marked by buoys not more than 25 metres apart.

This means that the competitor may progress along the course in any part of their lane provided that their boat does not come within five metres of another boat. Their boat must pass between all the buoys that mark their lane along the length of the course.

For a boat to momentarily deviate out of the line marked by the buoys but still pass between all the buoys is not an infraction provided that the boat does not come within five metres of another boat.

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BCU FLATWATER RACING COMPETITION RULES

However, it is reportable and a red flag must be shown at the end of the race with a written report in the normal way.

The rule also says, "They shall keep as far as possible the centre of their lane." The wording appears to conflict with the first part of the rule - "Keep their lane." However, it is not intended to. Competitors are not permitted to race down the side of their lane following the line of buoys that mark the lane. They must follow a line as close to the centre of the lane as they find they are able to do. If a competitor should race very close to the buoy line for 100 metres or more, that is an infraction.

BCU Racing Section - DISCIPLINARY REGULATIONS

By a directive of the BCU Council, these regulations may be applied without alteration to any Specialist Section of the BCU by means of a resolution passed by a general meeting of the Section Specialist Committee. The Racing Section adopted this code of practice at a Special General Meeting in April 1989.

General procedure

- 1.1 A complaint that an individual member of the Union has behaved in a manner that is, or is likely to be, prejudicial to the conduct of a Section event or of a Section training facility, or to the interests of the Section, or to the general interests of canoeing, may be lodged by means of a statement of complaint signed as provided below and setting out the facts on which this complaint is grounded.
- 1.2 A complaint by an affiliated club or by a committee organising an event or training facility shall be signed by two members of the club or organising committee who are BCU members, one of whom must be the chairman or secretary of the club or committee.
- 1.3 A complaint by any other person shall be signed by the person concerned and state that person's address.
2. The complaint shall be sent to the chairman or secretary of the Specialist Executive Committee, who shall take immediate steps to convene the Executive Committee within 30 days to consider the complaint and any rebutting or mitigating statement furnished by the alleged offender.
3. The Section Executive Committee shall ensure that a copy of the complaint is or has been handed personally to the individual member to whom it relates, or has been sent by recorded delivery post to that member, together with an invitation to furnish in writing within 21 days any rebutting facts or mitigating explanation or submission and a notification of the date when the Section Executive will meet to consider them. At the same time the member shall be asked whether he wishes to be present, in which case he may be asked questions, when the complaint is being considered, and informed that if no reply is received within a period of 21 days the section Executive will consider the complaint in his absence on the basis of the facts and statements in their possession. The Section Executive may invite the complainant to comment on the member's reply, and shall supply a copy of any such comments to the member before the meeting.
4. At the meeting the Section Executive Committee shall consider the complaint and any statement made in writing or orally by the member concerned. If the member has asked to be present at the meeting he must have been invited to attend. The Section Executive Committee may question either party, if present, or call on them to supply additional evidence. If the section Executive Committee has not completed its consideration of the complaint within 30 days from the date of the meeting referred to in Regulation 2. above it shall be taken to have rejected it, but the complainant may in that event address a complaint to the BCU Council for consideration under Article 8 of the Articles of Association of the British Canoe Union.
5. On completing consideration the Section Executive Committee shall draw up its findings of fact, and may decide:
 - 5.1 To reject the complaint.
 - 5.2 To warn or reprimand the individual member concerned.
 - 5.3 To suspend the individual member from participating in specified section events or training facilities either -
 - 5.3.1 For a period not exceeding 3 months, starting at least 10 days after notification of the decision to the member, or
 - 5.3.2 For a specified number of such events or facilities, not exceeding five in number, consecutively where all that number would not have taken place within the period specified in 5.3.1 above.

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- 5.4 To recommend to the BCU Council that a suspension should be for a longer period, or that the member should be suspended from all BCU membership rights, or expelled from the Union, or that some other specified penalty should be imposed by the Council.
Where the complaint was originally lodged by the Section Executive Committee itself, it shall not impose a penalty under 5.3 above, but may recommend that the penalty be imposed by Council.
6. The Section Executive Committee shall notify the member by recorded deliver post of its findings of fact and of its decision or recommendation and shall inform him of his right of appeal under regulation 8 below, where applicable, and shall send a copy of the notification to the BCU Council.
7. In the case of a decision falling under regulation 5.3.1 or 5.3.2 or involving a recommendation under regulation 5.4, the individual member concerned may appeal to the BCU Council within 10 days of the date of notification, setting out the grounds for appeal in writing: where an appeal is made the penalty shall be treated as in abeyance pending consideration of the appeal by Council.
8. The BCU Council shall consider, within 30 days of being notified of the complaint, the Section Executive Committee's findings and decision and give the member an opportunity within a specified time to make orally any further explanation or defence that he desires to submit.
9. The BCU Council's functions under regulation 8. may be performed by a standing Committee appointed for the purpose under Article 42 of the Articles of Association of the BCU.
10. **Immediate Discipline**
Organisers of events or training facilities in the Section's programme may, without prejudice to the making of complaints under Regulations 1. to 9. above, summarily exclude or disqualify members or competitors for violent or very unreasonable behaviour from the event or session concerned or from subsequent events or facilities held at the same site within 2 months of the offence.

The BCU Racing Committee adopted additional regulations on 1 January 2001 as follows:

11. **Code of Ethics**
Everyone within the BCU Racing Section is subject to the conditions and ethics as given in Section 5 of the BCU 'Coaching Code' published by the BCU UK Coaching Service, and are required to operate under the same general Sport and Recreation Code of Ethics.
12. **Regatta Officials**
 - 12.1 It is vital for the honourable nature of the Sport that Officials are not subjected to any act that may compromise their position.
 - 12.2 Regatta Officials must not be threatened or subjected to harassment, intimidation or abuse. No attempt should be made to persuade Regatta Officials to take an action which is dishonest or contrary to the Official's code of ethics or honourable nature of the Racing Regulations. This applies at anytime, in or out of competition. It is incumbent on each Official to report all such acts.
 - 12.3 The report should be in writing and sent without delay to the Racing Committee (through the Section Secretary) who will consider the matter in accordance with the Section's Disciplinary Regulations.
 - 12.4 In the event of an action taken immediately prior to or during a BCU Regatta, the Official should hand their written report to the Chief Official. The Chief Official with the Regatta Committee must take action in accordance with the Section's Disciplinary Regulations.

The National Water Sports Centre is situated just off the main A52 road from Nottingham to Grantham. It is signposted on all main roads leading into Nottingham. Accommodation

Lunches and snacks are available from the Centre Cafeteria and Snack Bars.

There are many **hotels** of different sizes and cost in Nottingham, several in the vicinity of the NWSC. The website at www.visitnottingham.com lists a large number of hotels, B&Bs, farmhouses etc. at all prices.

There is a **camp site** run by N.W.S.C. just across the road from the course. Facilities include a toilet, washing and shower block; water points; waste disposal; electric hook-up points and a shop.

The site is open to all competitors, officials and supporters. No booking is required.

There is no overnight **boat storage** available in the boathouses. All canoes should be removed on Saturday night. All canoes on the outside racks at the Centre are left entirely at the owner's risk.

Regatta programmes will be on sale at the Watersports Centre and the campsite on the Friday evening before the Regatta and on Saturday at the Centre.

Dorney Lake, Eton

Dorney Lake, Eton, the venue due to be used for the 2012 Olympics, is situated just off the A4, halfway between Maidenhead and Slough. It is close to junction 7 of the M4.

All kayaks and canoes must have **adequate buoyancy**, be fitted with a number slot and comply with current regulations as to weight. Boat Control will be carried out during regattas.

Paddlers must supply their own lane numbers (1-9).

Regatta Officials Training

The training of officials is a highly important area of our activities from both a National and Regional point of view. Anyone interested in assisting at National regattas is encouraged to come and sit alongside more experienced officials to learn what is involved. Each year in November we meet for a weekend of discussion, debriefing, and training, plus our annual dinner. Through officiating at our own National and International Regattas any official can progress to a standard where they become eligible to take the International Canoe Federation examination, thus becoming qualified to officiate at World Championships.

Newcomers are welcome and, if there is sufficient interest, we are happy to run a basic course aimed at complete beginners – no previous knowledge or experience is assumed. All aspects of regatta organisation would be covered in a basic and practical way, including the organisation of low key, local events of all kinds. This course would be followed by practical experience at regattas, working alongside a more practised official to gain knowledge and experience. Additional training can be given in specialised fields for those aiming to take the I.C.F. examination.

There may also be discussion groups of more experienced officials who meet to iron out any problems which have arisen during the season and find methods of solving them.

The Racing Registration Scheme

The Scheme also enables the committee to establish how many active racing canoeists there are in the country at any one time, and provides a means of communicating with them.

The Registration Number is the unique numerical identification for each paddler, and is used in computer programmes when programming a regatta. Only Registered Paddlers will be allowed to compete in B.C.U. events at the National Watersports Centre. Entries submitted without a Registration Number will not be accepted.

Initial Registration

This may be done in one of two ways:-

1. At any N.W.S.C. Regatta, at the Secretary's desk.
2. By post with the Registration Officer (Send S.A.E. please).

In all cases the following are required:

1. Full Name and Address.
2. Date of Birth.
3. Club.
4. Your ranking (if known).
5. A Coaching Scheme Certificate of Standard for 500m which states the actual time taken for your trial.
6. Proof of current B.C.U. Membership (a photocopy of your card is acceptable).

Renewal of Registration

Competitors will remain on the active register until such time as they have not competed for two years, or their B.C.U. membership has lapsed. On production of a current B.C.U. card, anyone not listed on the active register may apply to be reinstated.

Current Lists of Registered Paddlers are intended as 'working' lists and only include paddlers who have raced during the last two years and those who are fairly certain to race in the current season. Anyone who does not appear on the lists will have been transferred to the storage file and can be brought back to the 'live' file at any time they return to racing.

Youth paddlers who initially registered as Cadet Members will remain on the register but should join the B.C.U. as full Youth members at the end of the first year. They should inform the Registration Officer of any change of number.

Summary

At the Club

- a) Ensure that club members achieve the relevant standard to qualify for competing at National Regattas.
- b) Advise the Colours Registration Officer of their appointment, and include details of any changes in the Club Racing Colours.
- c) **Check that all boats have adequate buoyancy.**

Entries

- a) Advertise the Regatta to all club members, collate entries, and return Entry Form by closing date accompanied by the correct entry fees.
- b) Check Timetable for clashes & problems.
- c) Ensure that paddlers are conversant with the Rules of Racing for Competition & Conduct as shown in the Handbook, and hold current membership of the British Canoe Union. Ensure that all paddlers have been registered.
- d) Encourage paddlers to purchase their own Racing Handbooks.

Before the start of Racing

- a) Collect and check the detailed regatta programme ensuring that every entry made is shown correctly.
- b) Arrive on time for the Team Leaders' Meeting. All scratches, crew changes, and late entries should be made during the meeting.
- c) Advise paddlers of any changes and/or alterations to the programme.
- d) Ensure that paddlers and their boats are adequately dressed and equipped for the conditions.
- e) Ensure that all paddlers are fully aware of safety measures.

During Competition

- a) Ensure that paddlers arrive in time for their races, wearing club colours, and with the correct lane number.
- b) Ensure that K4s, if required, are booked in advance. Boat hire is included in the Race Entry Fee.
- c) Be available to receive notification of disqualifications, and deal with any problem involving paddlers from their club.
- d) Collect from, and promptly return to, the Secretary's Desk all Long Distance Numbers. A deposit of £10.00 is required.
- e) Hand in S.A.E. to the Regatta Secretary for a copy of the results.

After the Regatta

- a) Return Long Distance numbers promptly to the Secretary's Desk.
- b) Display results on club notice board.
- c) Note promotions of Club paddlers.

1. Appointment

Club Secretaries must inform the Colours Registration Officer who is the Team Leader for their club (and if you wish a nominated reserve), before January 1st each year. If a club is to be represented by another person at the N.W.S.C. the regatta organiser should be informed by the registered Team Leader, preferably when the entries are submitted.

2. Communication

At all regattas, the organisers will only communicate with the Club Team Leader or his/her nominated reserve, in respect of:-

- a) Making entries
- b) Making late entries.

- c) Communication from the organisers to his/her club paddlers - including disqualifications.
- d) Making protests.
- e) Receiving results.

3. Safety

The Team Leader is primarily responsible for the safety of his club members. Team Leaders should ensure that paddlers are:-

- a) suitably dressed for the weather, water and race conditions.
- b) able to perform basic capsizing drills and are briefed on what to do when approached by a umpire boat.
- c) able to swim at least 50 metres in wet clothing without a lifejacket.
- d) that all canoes are fitted with buoyancy, sufficient to ensure that the canoe will remain afloat and support the crew in the event of a capsize.
- e) that all competitors in Junior or Youth classes are in possession of a lifejacket or buoyancy aid which conforms to the standard of the I.C.F or S.B.B.N.F.

In the event of cold and/or windy conditions the organisers may at their discretion cancel or postpone a race, or insist on the wearing of buoyancy aids.

In the event of an electrical storm paddlers will be required to leave the course immediately. A tannoy announcement will be made and umpire boats will ring a bell. Racing will not recommence until deemed safe by the competition committee.

4. Entries

Please note all the information given on the completion of the Official Entry Form which appears on the following page.

All entries must be made on the Official Form. Please do not break up the form. Send the complete form, even if you are making only one entry. Please ensure that you use the correct form.

Some fees for this season have been increased and the charge bands are as follows:-

- a) All entries for an N.W.S.C. Regatta must be made on the Official Entry Form, or a photocopy. A blank form is included on the entry form for this purpose.
- b) **One page for each class** must be used.
- c) At the top of each page, enter the names of **all** the paddlers who are to be entered in that class. Indicate the paddler's Initial, Name, and Club as shown below. If, in a crew boat, you include a paddler who is registered in the name of another club, make sure that his name & club are shown.
- d) Use the first four figures of the box for the paddler's Registration Number.
A full list of these is shown in Section D.
- e) If a paddler has a 3 figure Registration Number, e.g. 027, prefix it with another zero e.g. 0027. **No entry will be accepted without a Registration Number**
- f) Enter A.N.Other and four zeros for unknown crew members.
- g) Do not use one page for more than 12 names. Photocopy or use the spare page at the back of the entry booklet.
- h) Telephone Entries are not accepted.
- i) The closing date for entries is normally the Wednesday 2½ weeks before the event. Any entries arriving after the closing date must be made by the Team Leader at the

- j) Entries made without the correct fee(s) will be charged as Late Entries.
- k) In the event of cancellation of part of or the whole of the competition owing to inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances there will be no refund of race fees.

5. Notes on Classes

- a) Kayak competitors are divided into three age groups, Youth, Senior and Veteran. These three kayak classes are then divided into Men and Women. These two subdivisions then being further divided into ability groups. Canadian paddlers are divided into three ability groups.
- b) Youth Paddlers will paddle in the four youth divisions according to their individual ability. Promotions within these classes will be done on the basis of improvement in standard of performance. When applying for registration the time certificate submitted should show the time recorded on the 500m test in order that new paddlers can be classified correctly. Beginners do **not** automatically start in the "D" group.
- c) The chart 'Standards for Racing' on page B1 demonstrates the way in which the subdivisions are made according to speed.
- d) The status of a paddler in a kayak class has no bearing on his status in a canoe.
- e) Mixed Events, in which male and female competitors race together in the Men

classes, are permitted, provided the races are of parallel standard to that of their designated classes.

- f) Open Events - In order to facilitate programming we reserve the right to combine classes in any distance at any regatta, with the exception of National Championship events, which will all start separately provided there are sufficient entries.
- g) Paddlers must race **ONLY** in their designated class for singles events (K1 and C1) at N.W.S.C. Regattas. Competitors may race above their designated class in crew boats only. Exceptions may be made when O.R.S. coaches wish to enter squad paddlers in higher classes.
- h) A Youth paddler may race in crew boats in a senior class equivalent or above the standard of his own youth standard. E.g. BAK= MBK (see chart).
- i) All paddlers will be graded into classes according to the standards set out in the Standards for Racing. Coaches should use the Coaching Scheme 500m Racing Tests as preparation for paddler's entry into racing.
- j) Youth National Championships
Youth Paddlers will race in the following Age Groups
 UNDER 18 (BORN 1989 or 1990)
 UNDER 16 (BORN 1991 or 1992)
 UNDER 14 (BORN 1993 or later)

A youth paddler, who has been promoted to Senior Status on ability, may for National Championship Events only race in his/her youth age group.

- k) Promotions/Demotions
 - Will be made throughout the year on the basis of standards laid down, and using the race results.
 - Are not automatic, and need to be ratified by the S.R.C nominee before taking effect.
 - Will be notified on the regatta results and should take effect at the next regatta.
- l) Masters
Paddlers born before 1972 may compete in the Masters class unless Men's A or B

6. Check your Programme

Prior to the Team Leaders' Meeting, it is essential for each Team Leader to make a careful check of all his entries. It is best to keep a copy of your entry for this purpose. If there are any omissions or if you wish to make substitutions, mark your programme: the Team Leaders' Meeting goes very quickly, and leaves no time for hesitation.

It is not uncommon for the regatta organisers to make a few mistakes with the entries, but it is your responsibility to check the programme. Once a race has been passed during a meeting it is not normal to go back.

The event organisers will do their best to arrange the programme so that all races in each class are well spaced out, giving a minimum rest period of 40 minutes between races. Any competitor racing outside his designated class in crew boats cannot depend on the programme accommodating this situation satisfactorily.

7. Team Leaders' Meeting

It is intended to hold only one meeting per regatta, at 0800 hrs on the Saturday morning (unless otherwise stated) at the regatta course. If the meeting cannot be completed in a reasonable time it will be adjourned and the time of the reconvened meeting announced. Each club must nominate one representative to deal with alterations and late entries at the meeting. This nominated representative will be responsible for all the money owed for the entries he submits. This money must be paid by 4.00 p.m. on Saturday. Failure to pay on time will incur a £20.00 surcharge that must be paid by the end of racing on Saturday. Failure to meet this deadline will result in all paddlers from that club being disqualified from Sunday's racing.

Procedure

- a) Team Leader signs in on arrival.
- b) Meeting commences promptly at 8.00 a.m.
- c) Technical announcements.
- d) If there are any objections to the programmed order of events they must be raised at this stage.
- e) Late entry provision:-
 - i. Events will be dealt with in order.
 - ii. The Competition Organiser will call out in order each set of heats (or finals, if there are no heats). Team Leaders should scratch any competitors who do not intend to race, or make suitable substitutions. They should call out the lane number first then the competitors name(s).
 - iii. If there are any vacant lanes the Competition Organiser will then ask Team Leaders to raise one hand for each late entry they wish to make. If there are more late entries required than there are vacant lanes available, a draw will take place.
 - iv. It is not permitted to return to an event that has been concluded.

8. Entries after the Team Leaders' Meeting

Entries after the meeting for laned races will only be accepted in exceptional circumstances and at the discretion of the Competition Organiser. **Any such entries will be charged a double entry fee.**

Late entries will be accepted for long distance events (2.5 km, 5 km, 10 km.), up to one hour before the race, on payment of the appropriate late entry fee. Entries can be made on the form available from the regatta secretary's desk.

9. Club Colours

Club colours must be worn by all competitors in all events at the N.W.S.C. regattas.

- a) In K4 crews where more than one club is represented, paddlers must wear the colours for the club in whose name they are registered.
- b) Clubs racing for the first time at an N.W.S.C. regatta may request exemption from this rule by application to the Regatta Organiser; but the competitors should wear a plain white shirt with no markings. The club must then register its colours before taking part in subsequent events.

10. Numbers

- a) It is a requirement that clubs should provide their own lane numbers as prescribed in the Racing Rules for races up to 1000m in length.
- b) Sets of numbers 1-9, and suitable mounting brackets for kayaks and canoes, are available for sale from the regatta secretary's desk.
- c) For races over 1000m in length, the competition organisers will issue numbers. These will be of a type that fix into a slot on the deck of the boat, all competitors must ensure that their boats are fitted with these slots.
- d) Numbers for long distance racing must be obtained from the regatta secretary's desk and may be collected by Team Leaders ONLY. A deposit of £10.00 must be left by every club collecting numbers, regardless of how many numbers are required. This money can be reclaimed at the end of the day when all numbers are returned; alternatively it can be left at the desk to cover for numbers which will be required for Sunday's racing, and would then be returned Sunday evening when all numbers were collected in.
- e) Lost Numbers will be charged at £5.00 per number, and the amount deducted from the deposit before it is returned.
- f) A form will be available at the meeting on which the Team Leaders should order the numbers required for the day's long distance races in advance. This form should be handed in to the regatta secretary's desk. He will then make up your requirements for collection later in the morning, (after 11.00).

ALL CANOES AND KAYAKS MUST BE FITTED WITH NUMBER SLOTS

11 K2/K4 Crew Names

Notification of crew names must be made at the Regatta Office at least 30 minutes before the race. Any crew which has not notified the full set of names will be allowed to start the race but will not appear in the results, nor will they go forward to the next round of the competition. Paddlers who take the place of other paddlers without the proper substitution will be allocated 1 penalty point and disqualified from the event.

12 K4s

- a) They will be stored on racks outside the boathouse.
- b) Crews must not sit in the K4s *except when they are on the water*.
- c) Young paddlers must be supervised by a responsible adult when handling the K4s onto and off the water. The K4 Official reserves the right to refuse the boat to any youth crew that is not accompanied by an adult.
- d) Check your K4 before you use it. If it is not in order please report the fact to the Official. The crew that previously used the boat will be held responsible.
- e) K4s can be booked for any race during the course of the day as soon as the boathouse is open and the K4 Official is present.
- f) Crews must supply their own wing-nuts and toggles when they report to collect the boat they have booked.
- g) Crews must use the boat allocated.

13 Protests & Disqualifications

- a) Notification of disqualification will always be made to the Team Leader or his nominated reserve.
- b) In a National Championship event, a protest must be made by the paddler's Team Leader.
- c) Team Leaders should realise that it is impossible to adequately umpire all races in every regatta. Where infringements are observed by an umpire, these will be reported to The Chief Official who will, if necessary, inform the offending paddler's Team Leader.
- d) Often however, infringements will not be observed by the umpires, and Team Leaders should realise that they have a responsibility to explain the situation to young paddlers who may easily become frustrated by what might seem to be an arbitrary system of justice.

14 Results

If a copy of the results is required, please send a S.A.E. marked RESULTS with your entry, or leave an addressed envelope and the appropriate postage at the Regatta Office. A fee of £2.50 is payable for each copy.

15 Car Parking

Team Leaders MUST take an active part to see that club members observe the car parking lines. Parked cars must not obstruct the launching access for K4s to the concrete pontoons in front of the boathouses. Particular attention should be paid to the access road in the vicinity of the Centre Buildings. Access for emergency vehicles must NOT be impeded.

The pontoon on the seating side of the tower on the waterfront is a No Parking Area, and must not be used by competitors. This area is solely for the use of umpire boats.

BCU Regatta "Liability" Statement

Canoeing and Kayaking are assumed-risk water-contact sports. Participation in these sports carries an inherent risk of injury to competitors and damage to property. Participants should be aware of the risks involved in these sports and are responsible for their own actions and their involvement in these sports.

In all cases competitors compete entirely at their own risk.

Each of the Regatta Organisation, the Sprint Racing Executive, the British Canoe Union exclude liability for any loss or damage that may occur to competitors or property during participation in canoeing and kayaking to the fullest extent permitted by law.

All competitors must be current comprehensive members of the British Canoe Union except for juniors ranked in 'Girls D' or 'Boys D' who are members of clubs with registered juniors sections.

Regatta Entries are accepted on the basis that each competitor and Parent/Guardian of a junior is aware of and has accepted the above conditions. Team Leaders are requested to ensure that all of their club competitors are aware of and accept the above statements.

Particular attention is drawn to safety requirements, especially the need for adequate buoyancy in all boats.

Sufficient fixed buoyancy must be securely fitted to all boats before they are allowed on the water. Severe penalty points (and disqualification) will be incurred by all those ignoring this requirement. This is intended to ensure the safety of all those on the water.

System for the membership for Juniors of a B.C.U. Affiliated Club.

A junior club member need not be a full member of the B.C.U. in order to race in Junior D Classes. He or she must be a member of his or her club, and the number used for his or her identification will be the club's affiliation number followed by his or her own individual club number.

Should he or she be promoted, however, to 'C' or above, he or she must then become a full member of the B.C.U. in his or her own right.

It is the responsibility of the Team Leader to advise the Registration Officer of the full B.C.U. Number.

'Tiddly Winks' and Boards

Coloured counters (known affectionately as Tiddly Winks) are awarded for the first three places in all Finals 1 in junior classes. These can be collected by the paddler from the Secretary's desk.

Also available, at a cost of approximately £4.50, is a small engraved wooden board on which the self adhesive counters can be mounted for posterity!

The MacGregor Paddle Competition



John MacGregor M.A., Trinity College, Cambridge; (1825-1892) Barrister-at-Law, Captain of the Royal Canoe Club, through his extremely popular books and magazine articles from 1865 to 1892, practically invented the sport of canoeing (or kayaking).

The beginning of recreational canoeing can be traced directly to an Englishman, called John MacGregor, in the middle of the nineteenth century. He was a man with a penchant for boat design and exploration, who developed his craft based on the Eskimo Kayak, which he named *Rob Roy*. He took the boat on long journeys along the rivers and across the lakes of Europe, lecturing and writing about his travels as he went. His tales attracted quite a following and soon there were many kayaks in Great Britain based on his kayak design that is still referred to as a *Rob Roy*.

Canoes are the larger category under which kayaks fall: while all kayaks are canoes, not all canoes are kayaks. Paddlers in kayaks sit with their legs stretched out in front of them and canoeists generally paddle from a kneeling position. Most canoes are open hulled; while kayaks have covered decks. Canoe paddles are typically single bladed, while kayak paddles are double ended.

Some might say these differences occur because of the type of water available, but a look at the evolution of British canoeing culture during the past one hundred and twenty years would suggest that the major changes are due to those who have written and taught, coupled with the availability of canoes or kayaks.

The first period from 1865 evolved from the founder of British canoeing, John MacGregor. His book, *A Thousand Miles in the Rob Roy Canoe*, fired the imagination of the Victorians. The '*Rob Roy*' was a stable kayak, went in a straight line and had a large cockpit. Made of wood, it was easy to handle and a boat in which any beginner would have felt safe. In this period, wooden canoes were imported and were used for family outings and touring, the limitation to the growth was the cost of the wooden craft.

The second period from the 1930s to the 1950s is identified with the wooden frame and canvas kayaks and the start of the BCU Coaching Scheme. Percy Blandford wrote books and produced a host of designs for the Scout movement, which brought canoeing to a much wider number of people. The low cost, make-it-yourself PBK (Percy Blandford Kayak) designs, were, like the '*Rob Roy*', stable, went in a straight line, and had large cockpits. The BCU Coaching Scheme was started in the 1950s by John Dudderidge. The original proficiency tests were designed around the use of the open cockpit straight-line kayak.

The third period, which had a massive impact on both the expansion and the change in direction of British canoeing culture started around the early 1960s, when in 1962, the BCU appointed its first Director of Coaching, Oliver Cock, giving added drive to what was to become a very powerful teaching scheme. For various reasons, the Coaching Scheme became more and more interested in rough water canoeing. At the same time, glass reinforced plastic became available. Moulds were produced for the home builder and the designs reflected the interest in rough water. Thousands of kayaks were produced with rockered hulls and small cockpits. By 1980, the Coaching Scheme had 3,000 members almost all teaching in the close fitting cockpit kayak. So powerful had that culture become that, if the word 'canoeing' is mentioned to almost anyone in Britain, their immediate image would be that of a young man or woman strapped into a kayak, wearing a crash helmet and wetsuit, performing turns and rolls on rapidly moving rivers. This was a great image for the adventurous teenager but daunting for many others who might wish to paddle. Indeed, a far, far cry from the canoeing of MacGregor.

MacGregor spent part of his youth in Halifax, Nova Scotia, where his father was stationed in the 1830s in a fort. He may have picked up some canoeing experience there.

Reading his books one notices he carried in his canoe a number of religious tracts (in a movement called "Muscular Christianity") written in the local language and was always ready to hand them out. He did not travel on Sundays, but did lecture on his travels and gave much of the profits to charities, especially to boys in the inner cities.

He published accounts of several other canoe cruises, including one to Scandinavia and another to Jordan and Egypt. The appendix to that book gives some construction details for his canoe designs.

His wooden split paddles were presented to Royal Canoe Club in 1959. Subsequently these were used as the trophy at the BCU National Inter-Club Flatwater Sprint Regatta, being first presented in 1977 to the winning club Fladbury and still fought over annually in September. A full list of winners can be found on page C8.

Scoring for the MacGregor Paddle competition

Under the following system most clubs should have an equal opportunity to achieve a winning score:

1. Each Club will automatically score 1 point for every paddler competing in the Inter Club Regatta.
2. Each Club will score 1 point for each promotion accredited to their paddlers during the four previous Regattas i.e. April, May, June, & July of the same year.
3. The scoring at the Inter Club Regatta will be on the following basis:

Each Club will score its best	12	K1/C1 results in all finals
	6	K2/C2 results in all finals
	3	K4 results in all finals

Scores will be awarded, provided there are at least three crews participating, on the following basis:

First 20 points, second 19 points, third 18 points and so on.

Penalty points accrued by paddlers during the season's five regattas will be deducted from their team's score.

4. Notes:
 - a) Composite crews, with members from more than one Club, do not score.
 - b) At least 50% of the crew must be registered in the class in which they are racing.
i.e. 2 paddlers K4 and 1 paddler K2. Crews may be made up with paddlers from a lower ability group with the following exceptions:
 - i) Men may not paddle in Women's races.
 - ii) Boys may not paddle in Girls' races.
 - iii) Seniors may not paddle in Junior races.
 - c) No one may enter any singles class other than their designated class as shown on the Registration File.

Disciplinary Procedures

Offences Incurring Penalty Points

The Chief Official will be solely responsible for all disciplinary matters of a minor nature, under the operation of a penalty points system. At his/her discretion, he/she may issue one penalty point to each paddler involved in each of the following offences. These offences are considered to be detrimental to the efficient operation of regattas and/or potentially hazardous.

- Racing in incorrect colours
- Racing with incorrect or missing number
- Failure to observe water zoning procedures
- Unauthorised substitution for another paddler
- Failure to report, having qualified, for semi-finals or finals
- Conduct during racing likely to cause injury or damage to equipment
- Use of offensive language
- Underweight boat (see note 1)
- Failure to report for boat weighing immediately (see note 2)
- Insufficient buoyancy (see note 3)

Notes

1. Weights must be properly fixed to the boat or seat. Stones in bags or any other temporary system will not be accepted.
2. Boats required for weighing will be notified either shortly before the start of the race or shortly after the finish of the race.
3. Buoyancy will be checked by both systematic and random inspections at launching points. If a boat is found to have insufficient buoyancy, it will be turned back.

Accumulation of Penalty Points and Penalty Fines

1. When a paddler accumulates a total of 4 or more penalty points, he/she is liable for a fine of £10 per point in excess of 3 points.
2. Fines are to be paid at the Regatta Office.
3. A paddler liable for a fine cannot race until the fine has been paid.
4. Penalty points are accumulated over 4 consecutive regattas and are not restricted to a single year. Thus, for example, penalty points incurred in the last regatta of the year will remain active until the start of the 4th regatta of the following year.

Notification

Team leaders will be notified when a penalty point has been issued to a paddler from his/her team. This notification will also be recorded on the end of regatta results sheet.

Disciplinary Matters of a More Serious Nature.

In respect to all other disciplinary matters the Chief Official, Competition Committee and the Competition Jury must act as described in the Racing Rules which include penalties in accordance with B.C.U. Rules or the Racing Section Disciplinary Regulations.

- N.B.** A reported incidence of dissent/abuse towards a Regatta Official, another competitor or their equipment, or a spectator must be treated as conduct prejudicial to the interests of the sport and dealt with under the Section Disciplinary Regulations.

REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT REGATTAS

The Sprint Racing Committee would like to offer support to any club wishing to hold a regional regatta.

The schemes below outline various levels of support for different types of events.

There are three main areas where we would hope to have more regional Sprint competitions.

1. **Large Regional Sprint competitions:**
2. **Medium sized events:**
3. **Sprint events for local clubs:**

The aim of all these schemes is to help to encourage more clubs to organise a regional sprint event.

1. Large Regional Competitions for 10-15 Clubs.

Support here would be aimed at Clubs who have already run successful medium sized regional sprint events and would like to organise larger regional events but are unable to due to the costs and risks to club funds. These clubs could be eligible to apply to the SRC for support to organise a larger regional sprint competition. This type of competition should attract 10-15 clubs and between 100-200 paddlers depending on the region.

The SRC would offer grant aid to clubs wishing to hold this level of event. The grant could be used for the provision of facilities, prizes and organisation. The level of grant would depend on the circumstance and needs in the region. Grants for this level of competition would normally be between £250 and £1000.

Clubs wishing to apply for support running a large regional Sprint Competition should apply to the SRC secretary at least six months prior to the date of the competition. They should include an outline programme of the proposed competition and a simple budget. They should also prepare a simple plan showing the targeted clubs as an estimate of the likely number of competitors.

2. Medium sized events:

This scheme is aimed at encouraging clubs to organise and attend more Sprint Competitions. The SRC will provides support by donating cash prizes which encourage clubs to attend regional events. Clubs compete with any size team and score points for their best 4 to 8 paddlers depending on the size of the competition. The level of support varies according to the size of the competition.

SRC donates cash prizes for 4-6 regional Sprint Competitions.

REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT REGATTAS

These Medium size Sprint events can use any combination of recognised sprint racing discipline or distance.

1. The competition will be open to all BCU affiliated clubs.
2. Clubs can enter any size team with the results from the best 4 to 8 competitors scoring points.
3. There is no restriction on the number of races a competitor can enter but only the best three results can be used to score points.
4. Points are award with 20 points for a first place and 19 for a second place etc in singles.
5. Points in doubles are scored 40 points for a first place and 38 points for a second place etc.
6. At the end of the competition the team leaders declare the results of their best 4 to 8 paddlers.
7. The organisers check these scores and award prizes as above.

Any club wishing to hold this type of regional regatta should apply to the SRC secretary before the 1st April 2007. Clubs should declare the number of competitors they expect to attract when making their application.

In the event there are more competitions than the SRC has budget for the SRC will nominate the events it will support in 2007.

Prize funding paid will be in line with the number of competitors entered in the competition.

3. Sprint events for local clubs: Minimum of 3 clubs

The SRC will support clubs who haven't held a sprint event before to provide new events in the Region:

The SRC will give financial assistance to clubs who want to develop new Sprint events in the regions. Clubs can be put off organising competitions because they have little or no funding to provide services or buy prizes. The SRC would like to hear from clubs who want to hold a new sprint event.

Any club wishing to hold a regional sprint event could apply to the SRC for a small grant. This grant could be used to provide prizes or facilities as required. Grant for this type of competition would be between £50 and £100.

These Sprint events can use any combination of recognised sprint racing discipline or distance. The competitions should aim to attract a minimum of thirty entries from at least three clubs.

Applications for assistance for this type of competition should be made to the SRC secretary at least six months before the date of the event.

The Sprint Racing Committee will give an early response to the application, particularly the larger events. Any club who would like to apply for support from the SRC for an event in 2007 please do so as soon as possible. The Lightning Series 2007

The Lightning Series is a series of four regattas timed to run alongside the National Sprint Regattas held at Holme Pierrepont in Nottingham and at Dorney Lake, Eton. The events take place during the May, June, July and September regattas with racing now fully integrated into the regatta programme. Paddlers compete over 500 metres and 1K in Lightning K1 and the Hody K2.



The Lightning series has been specifically developed to suit the needs of young people, aged under 12. Setting the foundation to help them progress into whichever discipline of canoeing they like! The programme has taken into account that full sized K1s and K2s are too big for young people, so together with the BCU Young People's Programme and the BCU Sprint Racing Committee, we developed the Lightning Series.

The BCU is working with clubs around the country to provide a quality-assured Lightning programme, run by BCU qualified coaches, in as many clubs as possible. This training paired with regional and national competitions will support and nurture the development of young people who enjoy the challenge of racing.

Lightning Sprint Cup

Points will be awarded for each event culminating in the final event where double points will be awarded. Points are accumulated at each nominated event leading to a final at the Inter Club Championships in September. The Sprint Cup includes overall prizes for both individuals in each category and overall club prize.

Categories

Boys U10, Girls U10, Boys U12, Girls U12 **Note: Age on 1st January 2007.**

Events:

May, June, July and Finals Inter Clubs September Regatta 2007

Points scoring:

All National winners (individual) are awarded on the same system – 2 best regatta scores added to their Inter Clubs score.

Points scored will count towards the team & individual event

National Regattas (May, June, July): 500m & 1K in both K1 & K2

First place scores 25 points, second place scores 24 points etc. From twenty fifth place where everyone after that scores 1 point. The total number of points scored across 500m & 1K in Both K1 & K2 will be added together to determine the results at each regatta. For the K2 races the same points scoring system will be used i.e. the winning crew will receive 25 points each.

Inter Clubs Regatta (September): 500m & 1K in both K1 & K2

1st place scores 50 points, 2nd place scores 49 points etc. down to 50th place where everyone after that scores 1 point. The total number of points scored across 500m & 1K in Both K1 & K2 will be added together to determine the results. For the K2 races the same points scoring system will be used i.e. the winning crew will receive 50 points each.

Team event:

The points scoring system is based on each clubs best 2 regatta results scores added to their Inter Club's points score. Points are based on each clubs best 4 scoring boats from any of the age/Gender/Boat class groups over 500m or on kilometre (start from pontoon for one kilometre)

Promotions:

Promotion into Boys D and Girls D is based on normal regatta entry guidelines. See Racing Handbook for details

Prizes:

Medals will be awarded for 1st, 2nd & 3rd in each category. Certificates will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd places in each final/race. All participants will be awarded a Certificate at prize giving.

Senior Team

The significant events of the 2006 calendar were the Senior World Championships and the European Championships.

The best performances of the season go to Tim Brabants. Tim dominated his K1 1000m to win the title of Champion and gold medal. He continued his good preparation for the Worlds and had an emphatic race to finish in silver medal position.

Also of note was the performance of Abi Coulson and Louisa Sawers in the WK2 500m event. They raced well to finish in 12th position.

Peter Almasi and Paul Wycherley won the B final in the MK2 1000m with a strong performance.

U23s

Great Britain contended the U23 European Championships in Athens.

Tom Daniels had an excellent result finishing in 4th place in the K1 1000m. The women's K4 consisting of Kim Dawson, Shuna Braithwaite, Jenny Spencer and Tara Nutt also made the final, as did Jenna Hawkey – who made her debut in senior international racing this year.

Juniors

The main junior sprint event was the European Championships. Louisa Sawers raced exceptionally well to finish in 5th place in both the K1 500m and K1 1000m events. Rachel Cawthorn and Jessica Walker also put down some great performances to make finals in both the 500m and 1000m events, bringing GB's total of finals made to 4.

Congratulations to Louisa and Jessica who went on to become junior marathon racing world champions. Louisa in K1 & K2 and Jess in K2.

Our Strategy for 2007

Our focus for the 2007 season is performance at the Senior World Championships which is the first round qualification event for the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games.

Our aim is to qualify as many places as possible for Great Britain at this event.

Our aim for the development programmes is to identify and prepare athletes for the Podium Programme.

Training and Competition

For the incoming season, we will continue to commit to supporting a 2 centre system, with coaches based at Nottingham and West Thames. The canoe athletes will continue to use Nottingham as their principle training venue, along with part of the senior women's squad.

The West Thames area.

The BCU World Class Directorate now has offices at Bisham Abbey near Marlow and Dianne Ward is the office administrator. Any member of racing staffing can be contacted through Dianne.

Bisham Abbey is a High Performance Centre, with full EIS support on site. The number of programme athletes using the facility is growing and it is anticipated that the World Class racing operations will be fully based from that site from September 2008 onwards.

Until this point, and as the transition phase evolves, the men's kayak squads will be based in the West Thames area along with part of the senior women's squad using facilities such as Dorney, St Mary's and Royal CC

We will continue to maximise our team opportunities for 2007 with competitions for different age and ability groups. Our priority is, as ever, results in sprint racing.

Claudine Le Roux – Development Programmes Coach, will be focusing on delivering support to the junior racing programme.

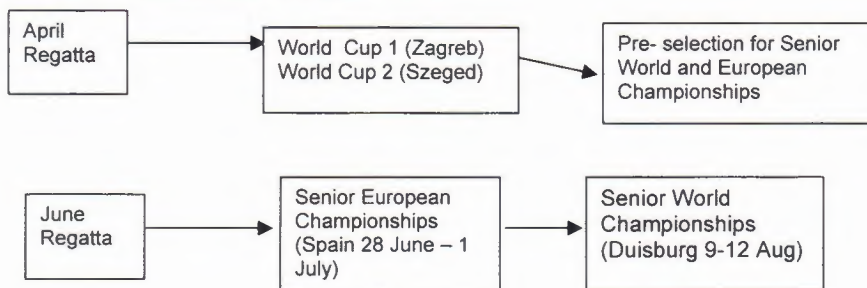

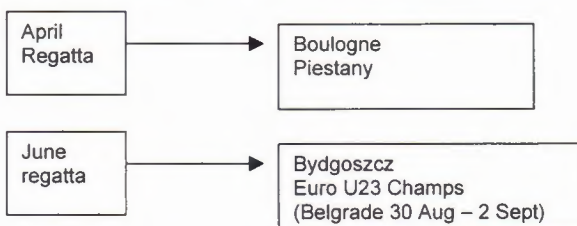

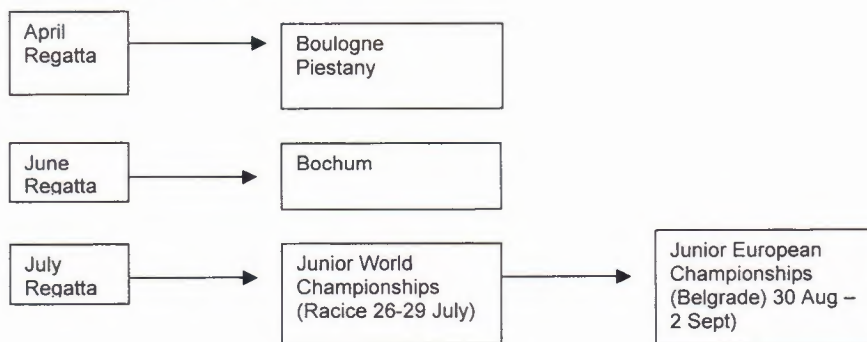
2007 - Key Races for Senior Podium athletes are:

1. This 'Matrix' will be used to identify athletes that 'may be considered for inclusion' on the UK Sport Performance Programme.
2. To be considered for inclusion on the WCPP athletes must as a minimum achieve the above performance criteria. However, although these criteria should be seen as a pre-requisite for inclusion in the WCPP, it does not necessarily guarantee inclusion.
3. Special circumstances may be considered in terms of athletes who had been included the previous year, based on results, but were unable to compete (e.g. injury).
4. The reason for inclusion of any athlete in the WCPP is that the athlete is deemed to have a strong and realistic chance of winning medals at Olympic and/or World Championships over the next four years.
5. Athletes considered for inclusion on the WCPP, using these criteria, will then be profiled using the BCU Performance ranking system and a final decision will be taken on their inclusion, at the discretion of the Performance Director, up to a quota agreed by UK Sport.

Principles and Criteria for inclusion onto the Olympic Development Programmes 2007/8

The Olympic Development Programmes consist of athletes who are typically 17-23 and at a level to represent GBR at World/European Championship level.
The athletes included are expected to have a profile for the 2012 Olympic Games.

The number of athletes included within the programme at any one time is dependent upon the finance and resources allocated by UK Sport. A maximum of 52 athletes can be included at any one time, subject to achieving the performance standards required.

Sprint Racing results remain the priority selection criteria, however, in the case of juniors, Marathon results from World Championships may be taken into account to support Sprint racing results.

Criteria for Inclusion

The main ways of inclusion onto the Development squad are:

1. Selection for and performance at the Senior European and World Championships in 2007
2. Selection for and performance at the European U23 Championships in 2007
3. Selection for and performance at the Junior World and European Championships in 2007

An athlete matching the profile above may automatically qualify a place on the programme **typically** based on the race positions in the following table.

SPRINT RACING SELECTION POLICY

(International Panel)

Revised 05 December 2006

1 General Notes on Selection

As an outdoor sport that can be affected by weather conditions and lane draws, it will be necessary to operate a policy of continuous assessment within an agreed and published framework. Athletes achieving satisfactory results at National events can be considered for selection to GBR teams (See Note on page C20 - Additional Notes and table)

2 Eligibility for Selection

Any athlete wishing to be considered for selection must be a member of the BCU. They must complete the BCU Sprint Racing availability form and sign the appropriate athletes' Agreement. Athletes hoping to be considered for Olympic Qualifying competitions and the Olympic Games must hold a GB passport. These forms are available from the BCU Performance Office.

3 International Panel (Selection Committee)

The SRC will be responsible for making recommendations to the BCU Board for the appointment of suitably qualified members to work on the international panel for Sprint Racing. The final authority for appointing international panels rests with the BCU Board. However for the purpose of management control the panel will report to the Sprint Racing Committee. The international panel will be responsible for proposing and agreeing the selection policy on an annual basis and for selecting international teams.

Members of the international panel will be selected on the basis of experience and competency. They will have first hand experience of the sport at national and international level. There is no requirement for international teams to be ratified by the discipline committee but they will be informed of nominations for major internationals and given the opportunity to discuss any concerns prior to the team being published.

There will be 4 core members of the international Panel, for the 2007 season the nominations are:

- John Anderson: BCU Performance Director
- Roland Lawler: SRC Committee Appointee
- Alan Williams: BCU Performance Manager (Chairman)
- Shaun Caven: BCU National Coach
- Peter Moule: SRC Chairman (Observer role for 2007)

Additional Panel Members:

National coaches: a maximum of 4 coaches may be nominated to assist with the selection of senior and junior teams. These members will have voting rights related to the class or age group they work with.

4 Competition Programme

The National Performance Manager for Sprint Racing in conjunction with the National Coaches will prepare a draft training and competition programme for Senior and Junior teams. These programmes will be submitted for approval by the BCU Performance Director and the Sprint Racing Committee. This Programme will be published in the Flatwater Racing Handbook.

5 Teams for Major Internationals

Teams for all major international events, World Cups, World and European Championships must comply with the rules of the International Canoe Federation and the European Canoe Association. Entry to these events is restricted to National Governing bodies affiliated to the ICF and the ECA. Restrictions apply to the number of entries each country may place.

SPRINT RACING SELECTION POLICY

6 Improvement

The international Panel will take account of improvement through the season, but this does not mean that the winner of the last competition is automatically selected.

7 Teams for Minor Internationals

The International Panel may nominate a panel of up to four coaches to select teams for minor internationals or development events. Minor teams selected by nominated coaches will be ratified by the chairman of the international panel.

8 Special Rules for Olympic Games

Entry to the Olympic Games is subject to qualification rules as agreed between the International Canoe Federation and the IOC. The International Panel as defined at 3 will select a G.B. Olympic Canoe and Kayak Sprint Racing Team. This team will be submitted to the British Olympic Association for approval. (See Additional Notes on Olympic Qualification)

9 Funding

Team selections are subject to available finance which means that funding can influence the size and number of athletes selected for international teams. Athletes who are not on World Class Programmes may be asked to contribute an amount determined by the National Performance Manager and approved by the BCU Sprint Racing Committee. These contributions will only be used to support the International Competition Programme. The BCU Sprint Racing Committee may, subject to available funding, support athletes who are not yet funded through World Class Programmes.

10 World Class Programmes

These Programmes can only support athletes who have been nominated and accepted as part of the World Class Programmes. The criteria for recommending and approving athletes for World Class Programmes will be published in the Racing Handbook.

11. The aims of the Selection Policy are

- To select the best possible teams for major competitions.
- Notwithstanding the above, the panel will also give careful consideration to developing all athletes within the B.C.U World Class Programme. The panel may restrict the number of events that crews can compete in if this is considered to be in the best interest of the overall GB Team.
- To employ an open and fair selection process that allows athletes to challenge for selection.
- To ensure that this process does not unduly affect the preparation of established athletes preparing for major competitions.

12. Crew Boats

The national coaches are responsible for the formation of crew boats. They will work throughout the year to form the best possible crews. When forming crew boats the coaches will give consideration to the following: compatibility, availability, commitment, and individual performance.

Additional Notes

Continuous assessment process: (Note from point 1. Satisfactory Results)

Senior Teams will be selected on proven ability. We will send teams of an appropriate level to international events. Appropriate level means athletes should be able to race competitively.

SPRINT RACING SELECTION POLICY

The times below were achieved at the 2005 World Championships. The guide adds 3 seconds for 200m events, 5 seconds for 500 metre events and 8 seconds for 1000 metre events. Senior athletes achieving these times could expect to reach semi finals at major international competitions and would normally be considered for selection. (*Note: World Championships times from 2006 were not consistent*)

The international panel recognise that some U23 athletes may not be able to achieve these times. U23 athletes will generally be between 1% and 3% slower than the published guide time. The priority for U23 athletes with results below the guide time will be the U23 European Championship.

The international panel may vary selection dates if unforeseen circumstances disrupt the selection timetable. If this becomes necessary every effort will be made to inform athletes as soon as possible. Athletes and coaches should be aware that the ICF and the countries organising international competition may also make changes that could affect the competition programme.

Additional information concerning crew boats will be available from the senior national coaches. The following coaches are responsible for the formation of crews.

Development Competitions

The B.C.U Performance Programme will nominate some events as development competitions. For these internationals the Panel would consider other factors such as age and geographical location etc before selecting these teams. Entries may be based on future potential rather than actual results.

Any athlete wishing to be considered for selection to an international team should read the selection policy in detail. This policy will be published in the Flat Water Racing Handbook and be accompanied with a timetable of assessments events and supplementary information concerning the development of crew boats.

Appeals:

At present the only grounds for appeal are that the International panel did not adhere to the agreed format and timetable for selecting teams. The B.C.U Appeals Policy was approved by the B.C.U Board in 2005. Copies of this policy can be obtained from the B.C.U Performance Office.

SPRINT RACING SELECTION POLICY

Supplementary information: Olympic Qualification.

Olympic Selection:

In addition to the points made in 8, there are additional rules concerning the qualification of places at the Olympic Games. These are covered under three main headings:

1 Olympic Qualification:

This is a process proposed by the International Governing body (I.C.F) and agreed by the IOC. Qualification of an athlete place does not mean that an athlete is selected for the Olympic Games. This is subject to the results of nominated competitions (shown on the following page) and the agreement of the International panel. The Olympic qualification system is complex! Interested parties are advised to check the I.C.F Web site for more information.

2 Eligibility:

To be eligible for selection the athlete must hold a full GB passport at the time of the Olympic Qualifying competitions in 2007 & 2008. They can then be nominated by their National Governing body and if accepted by the National Olympic Committee (B.O.A) a Delegate Registration Form (D.R.M) will be sent to the Olympic Games Organising Committee. Only athletes who have been approved by the BOA can be nominated as athletes for Beijing. They must have no current or past doping offences (as recognised by the World Anti Doping Agency) that bar them from entry to the Olympic Games.

3 Selection and Deselection:

The selection process for the Olympic Games in Beijing will be based on international results in 2007 and 2008. The timetable and specific events will be published in the Racing Handbook.

The BCU reserves the right to deselect an athlete who has lost form, or is suffering from illness or injury. In this instance the Performance Director will call on the BCU medical officer or another appointee to conduct a fitness trial or test to determine the athlete's fitness to participate. In the case of loss of form this would be a water based test over race distance against other GBR athletes who are eligible for selection. The test will be appropriate to conditions and the Class.

Following the fitness test the person appointed to conduct the test will supply the International Panel with the results of the test. If the athlete has passed the test they will remain in the GBR Olympic Team. If the athlete fails the test the Panel may nominate another athlete from the Olympic long list as a replacement.

The BCU has the right to deselect an athlete who has been found guilty of a disciplinary offence under the BCU Rules. This obviously would include offences concerning doping control regulations.

Sprint Racing's Timetable for Assessment Competitions for the Beijing Olympic Games 2008:

The opening ceremony for the Olympic Games in Beijing starts on the 8th August 2008. The canoe racing competition takes place over a six day period with the first day of competition on the 18th August and the last day of competition on the 23rd August.

The ICF qualification system is divided into two rounds. The first round (which is a global competition) will be at the Senior World Championships in 2007. The second round (which is a continental round) takes place in 2008. The continental round is split into five continental groups; Great Britain is in the European pool. The European Championships will take place over the period 15th to the 18th May 2008 in Milan, Italy.

SPRINT RACING SELECTION POLICY

Assessment Competitions for the 2007 World Championships:

The Assessment competitions that will be used by the international Panel when they consider the GBR team for the 2007 World championships are shown on the schedule at the end of this paper.

Assessment Competitions for 2008 European Championships:

International results from 2007 and the results from our national regattas scheduled for April & May 2008 will be used as assessments for our 2008 European Championships team.

Any athlete qualifying a place at the World Championships in 2007 who then goes on to win the same events at the April & May 2008 assessments will be pre-selected for Beijing.

Assessment Competitions for 2008 Olympic Games:

Following the second round continental qualifying competition (Milan European Championships) the international Panel will consider the best GBR team for the Olympic Games. The results that will be considered are the 2007 World & European Championships, the April and May National Regattas 2008 and the 2008 European Championships.

In considering the assessment process the International Panel have taken account of the following:

- The number and time of events that can be used in the assessment process.
- The need for paddlers to train in order to have the best possible chance of qualifying.
- Provision for paddlers to challenge for selection without compromising other athletes' preparations.
- Pre-selection issues and the need for crew boat training
- The timing of events within the ICF, IOC rules.
- The timetable agreed by the BCU and the BOA.

Timetable for Selecting and Nominating the Team:

B.C.U to compile a long list of possible Olympic athletes for B.O.A by 1st April 2008.

On the 5th June 2008 the I.C.F will confirm the number of athlete and boat quota places allocated to National Olympic Committees.

Following the I.C.F allocation a provisional GBR Olympic team along with nominated reserves will be selected by the international Panel for the Olympic Games in Beijing. The date for this meeting will be set between the 5th & 18th June 2008. The team will be passed to the Sprint Racing Committee for comment and to the BCU Board for approval.

The National Olympic committees must confirm the number of athletes they will enter by the 18th June 2008.

Between the 20th June and the 1st July the ICF will announce any reallocation of places.

The BCU will nominate its team on the 10th June 2008. These nominations will include athletes who meet the Olympic Qualifying standards who are waiting for the International Canoe Federation to confirm their place. The final deadline for entries will be the 14th July. At which point the B.O.A must lodge GBR entries with BOCOG.

Note:

The ICF Sprint Racing calendar is a working document that could still be changed. If changes are made which render the chosen assessment competitions impractical the International Panel will confirm any changes to the assessment programme as soon as practical.

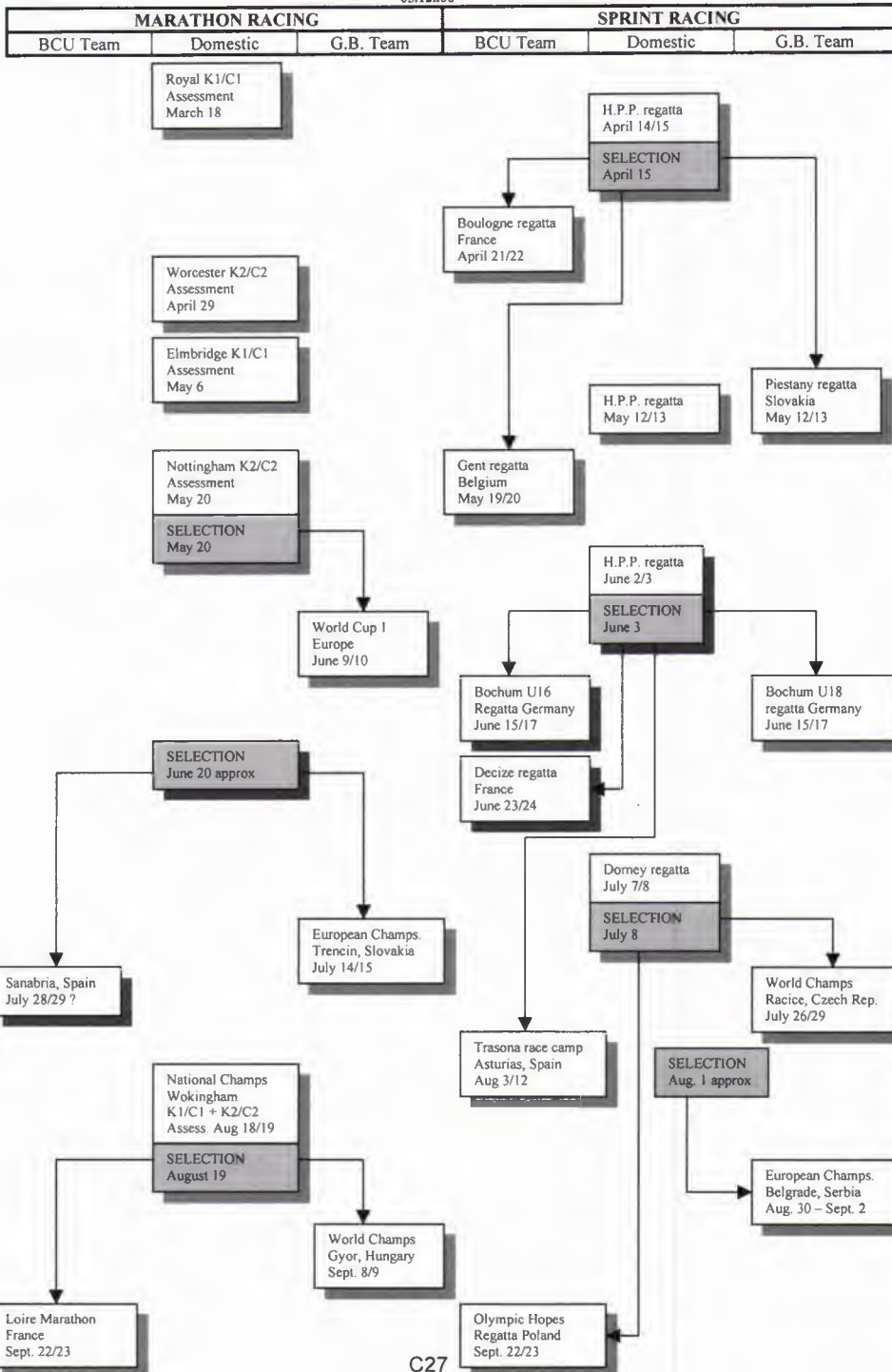

RACING STANDARDS AND COACHING

1. Introduction

The Placid Water Progression was set up as a coaching scheme to develop marathon racing, sprint racing and fast touring.

2. The Progression

Outlined below are the current **skill, racing and coaching awards** designed to support a progressive coaching & paddling scheme for clubs based on placid water using open cockpit canoes and kayaks.

2.1 Skill Development Awards for paddlers

The Star tests provide progressive levels of award for canoe and kayak. They can be used either as a basis to encourage skill development for paddlers or as an indicator of the appropriate level of skill for aspirant coaches in the instructional coaching awards.

Details of the syllabus are contained in free leaflets available from BCU Office.

2.2 Racing Awards for paddlers

The Racing Tests are designed to encourage paddlers to improve performance and recognise their progress in racing kayak and canoe. The Sprint Awards also provide a useful guide to indicate the class or division to which paddlers should enter into sprint and marathon racing.

The awards can be examined by any BCU Coach (Level 1-5) or Club Official and can be taken in any canoe or kayak

There are three types of Racing Award:

- **The Sprint (500m) Awards**

In each case the paddler must equal or beat the times below to achieve the standard.

2.3 Coaching Awards

Starting in 2007 the BCU is introducing a new coaching scheme and structure. This will be phased in over a period of time, commencing with level 1 in the spring of 2007

BCU UK Coaching Certificate Qualifications

Paddlesports cover a very wide range of environments and a wide range of crafts. These crafts and environments tend to be grouped into "Disciplines". The BCU Coaching Pathway is structured so that coaches can access training and become qualified in any of these disciplines. This range of awards helps us to ensure that coaching excellence is available to participants in whichever discipline they feel inspired to get involved in.

The BCU UKCC Coaching Pathway is made up of 5 levels. These levels reflect the experience and expertise of the coach.

The Coaching Awards are generic in nature for the first two levels with discipline specific modules available for the coach wishing to specialise. At level 3 the Awards are completely discipline specific with Racing Coaching being one of the options.

The awards are geared to support those coaches introducing instructing, leading and organising activities at Clubs or Centres. The syllabi do not require the coach to have personal paddling skills and there are opportunities for the paddling and non-paddling coach all they way through the scheme

The entry point into coaching for new coaches is as a Level 1 Coach (Assistant Coach) and / or Bell Boat Helm.

Level 1 is for those new to coaching and these coaches assist more qualified coaches to deliver their sessions. This is a generic award and covers all disciplines. Level 1 Coaches can work with paddlers at any stage of the LTPD pathway but will receive specific training in paddlesport start stage.

A **Level 2** coach is able to work alone, delivering sessions safely and effectively. Generally, these coaches still operate under the guidance of more experienced coaches. This is a generic award and covers all disciplines. Level 2 coaches will work with paddlers predominantly in the LTPD Foundation Paddlesport Phase.

RACING STANDARDS AND COACHING

A **Level 3** is a discipline specialist coach who is able to plan, implement and analyse long-term development programmes. This is an appropriate level of coach for a person to be in charge of Paddlesport activities in a club or centre or as a working professional. Level 3 coaches will be able to coach paddlers in the LTPD Foundation Paddlesport Phase and the Performance or Recreational Phase.

A **Level 4** coach is a very experienced discipline specialist coach with highly developed coaching skills and who can design, implement and evaluate the process and outcomes of long term or specialist coaching programmes in their chosen discipline and in all environments in which their discipline is practised. Level 4 coaches will be able to coach paddlers at all stages of the LTPD pathway.

A **Level 5** coach is an expert in their field, able to coach to an extremely high standard and offer expert advice about their chosen discipline. A coach who generates, directs and manages the implementation of cutting-edge coaching solutions and programmes.

From Level 3 onwards, coaches will specialise in one or more of the following disciplines or environments:

3. BCU Coach Update

The BCU has an update programme designed to help coaches develop their skills after they have gained a coaching award. This programme will assist existing coaches in transferring their current qualifications to the new scheme.

The update programme aims to provide:

- A system to enable long term training support for coaches
- A means to share good practice
- Improved BCU Coaching Service contact and communication with coaches

“**Coach Update**” involves all BCU coaches – competition and recreation and it requires coaches to put in a minimum of 6 hours of training in any 3-year period to stay up to date. There are various ways for coaches to become updated:

- Attend BCU Regional or Local Coach Update Forums
- Participate in a BCU Coaching Course
- Complete a “Continuous Coach Development Record” and send it in to BCU HQ

4. First Aid for Racing & Placid Water Coaches

All coaches are now required to hold a current First Aid Certificate to maintain their BCU Coaching Award. Details of the level of First Aid Training for the various awards can be obtained by contacting BCU HQ

RACING STANDARDS AND COACHING

For BCU Coaches to maintain the BCU insurance cover they must hold an up to date and certificated First Aid qualification (appropriate level of their award). Most First Aid awards have a 3-year lifespan. It is the responsibility of each coach to make sure the BCU Coaching Service is sent a photocopy of his or her new certificate when the qualification is renewed.

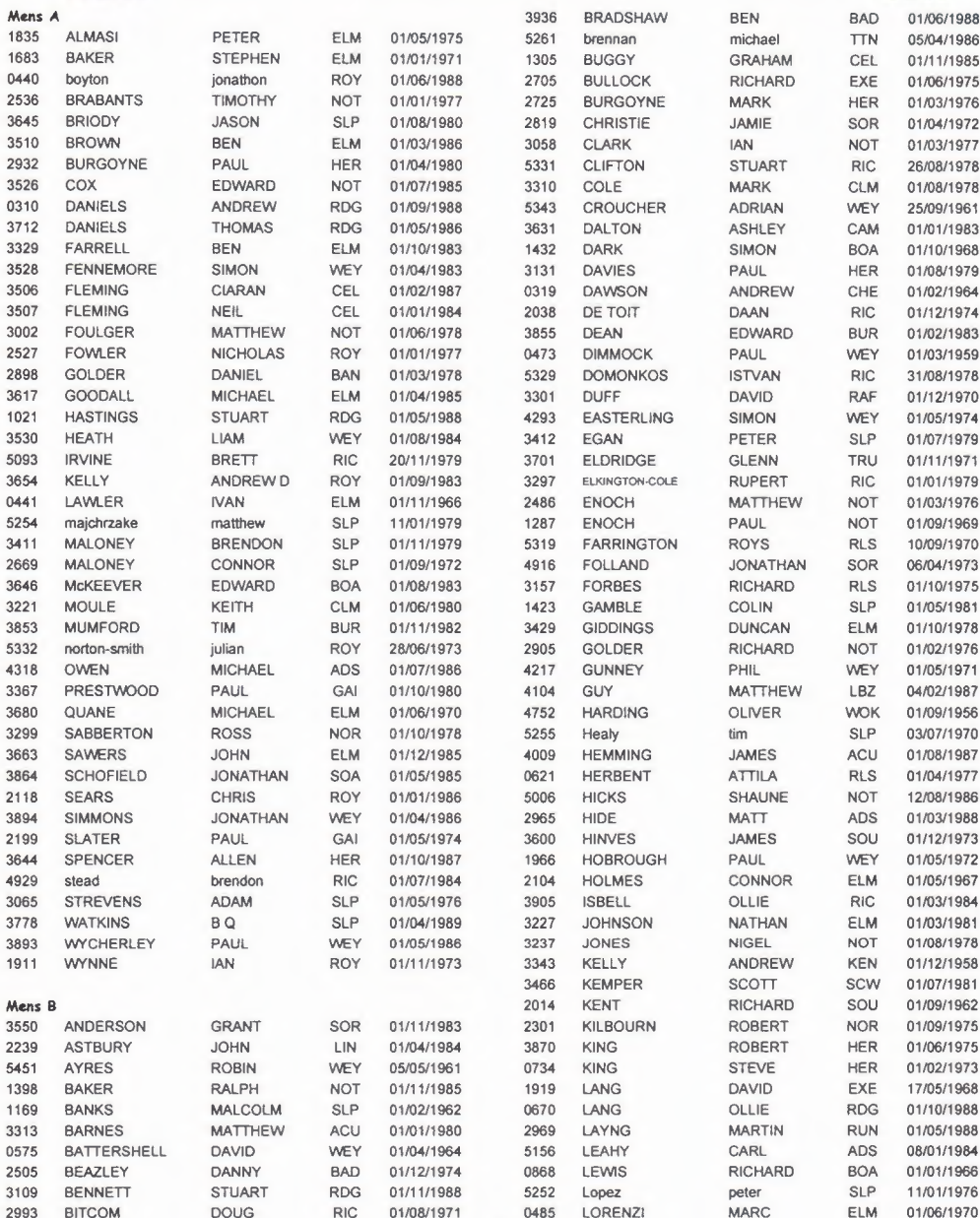

MARATHON RANKINGS SYSTEM

The new rules for Promotions and Demotions have now been running since the Spring of 2006. The use of the Hasler Race Management Programme automatically promotes and demotes paddlers and takes effect immediately on the publication of the race results. These are confirmed to Wiki Daniels to update the Programme hopefully in time for the next race. Team Leaders do need to be particularly aware if there are races in the same region on successive weekends to ensure that they enter their paddlers in the correct division. Written notification of promotions and demotions will only be made when the results have been altered due to errors or anomalies, or after such races as the National Championships and Hasler Finals or if an organiser has not used the programme.

However the information on the HRM programme, particularly as regards correct spellings of names and BCU and Club membership numbers is only as good as the information given to me by the club Marathon Team Leaders. The annual return of this information has been very disappointing this year with only 53 out of the 93 sent out returned by the deadline and some information in the following lists may be out of date or incorrect. If your information is incorrect check with your Team Leader and find out if they returned the form in time or at all. Has the club not informed me of a change, is the information getting through? Any one reading this please consider? Do you know who your club Marathon Team Leader is, do you see a copy of the Flat Water Newsletter? If the answer to any of these questions is 'no' please follow up and let me know if there have been changes in your club officials that I have not been told of.

Race Organisers - please make use of the Hasler Race Programme available to you, if you need help please ask. Email your results to your regional advisor, the divisions officer and myself in their basic form before you alter them to your own design for sending out to the clubs. Do not forget to send the race levy in the post to your Hasler Advisor or even direct to me.

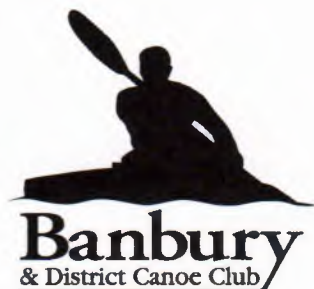

Chairman's Foreword

I started last year's report by saying that it was always pleasing to report international successes. I am more than pleased this year to repeat the message. We have seen superb performances from the GB paddlers, a great team spirit amongst all the athletes and invaluable support given to them by the team managers, coaches, and physios who have accompanied them.

We had successes at both World Cup competitions with Louisa Sawers winning gold in Zamora in June in the junior ladies K1 and Andy Daniels and Stuart Hastings also winning gold in the junior men's K2 event. Ed Rutherford gained a silver medal in the junior men's K1 beaten by just one second in the final sprint. Claire Spencer had an excellent race in Trecin a month later to win a silver medal in the junior women's K1. So we approached the World Championships in September with great hopes and we were not to be disappointed with some exciting racing. All of our paddlers did well. We had 14 boats in the eight kayak classes and achieved eleven top ten finishes. Matt Lawrence and James Train finished seventh in the C2 event. All in all a fine set of results and shared by many British supporters present in Tremolat.

Outstanding were the medal winners - two World Championship wins by Louisa Sawers, the junior ladies K1 and, together with Jessica Walker, the junior ladies K2; a fourth World Championship title won by Anna Hemmings in the ladies K1, and a silver medal for the second year running for Andy Daniels in the junior men's K2, this year accompanied by Stuart Hastings. But we cannot rest: it is all to do again next year. Some of our juniors show great promise as do our younger seniors. Louisa, Andy and Stuart move up to the senior ranks where, it has to be acknowledged, the pressures and incentives to both the athletes and their coaches to compete in sprint often win out over marathon. I hope that their performances in the last year or two enthruse them to continue on the marathon course alongside their sprint ambitions.

The development of paddlers on the rungs just below international standards is important to the committee and James Smythe, Dyson Pendle and Steve Harris have been running winter training courses to help with the development of these paddlers. A number of marathon races have been identified where it is hoped we can encourage many of those on the courses to come and race thereby ensuring some competitive racing to further assist in their development. We owe a great deal of thanks to James, Dyson and Steve for the time and commitment they have given to these paddlers.

On the domestic scene we have again had good support for races, particularly in the South. We still need to ensure that we tighten up on the preparation and procedures at races. An efficiently run race with prompt results is good for the paddlers, the organising club and our sport as a whole. Let's all work hard to achieve it. We have introduced a requirement for paddlers at the National Championships and the Hasler Finals to wear club colours. It is another way to enhance the image of our sport and, in time, I see this being extended to all races.

We are in the course of setting up a website for the Marathon Committee and by the time you read this I hope www.marathon-canoeing.co.uk is up and running. Our aim is to develop the site with information such as race results, news items and other articles so that the site becomes increasingly the place for marathon paddlers to go to for information. Now, there's a bold promise – we will work hard to deliver. If you have articles that you feel are newsworthy or details of your club race that you want publicising, please contact Tamsin Phipps, whose e-mail address is on page E3.

I started this report in the same way as last year and I end it in the same way. The Committee thanks everyone who has contributed to the sport of Marathon this past year; coaches, organisers and paddlers. We wish you success in 2007 but most of all that you enjoy your racing.

MARATHON RACING

PART A – REGULATIONS AND ADMINISTRATION

These regulations are bound to the Articles of Association of the British Canoe Union. ("BCU") and were approved by the Board of the BCU ("Board") in December 2004.

1. Title

- 1.1 The Committee shall be called the BCU Marathon Racing Committee.

2. Objectives

- 2.1 The Committee interests itself in all matters arising out of and in connection with canoe and kayak marathon racing in Great Britain.
- 2.2 The Committee's objectives are to encourage club, regional, national and international marathon events.
- 2.3 Its primary responsibilities are:
- a) To organise and conduct National Championships and other competitions on behalf of the BCU.
 - b) To set and publish competition rules and make recommendations for the conduct of national and regional marathons.
 - c) To give advice, guidance, and encouragement to sponsors of marathon racing in Great Britain.
 - d) To select, train and administer teams representing Great Britain in international events.
 - e) To select, train and administer teams representing England in international events.
 - f) To maintain disciplinary regulations.
 - g) To act as final authority in disputes, protests and appeals with regard to marathon racing rules and competitions.

3. Committee

- 3.1 The Committee shall comprise up to 12 persons, being Full Individual Members of the BCU. This total shall include the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer but does not include national delegates, co-opted members or the representative from the Regional Development Teams.
- 3.2 Members of the Committee shall serve for approximately two years and shall be eligible to stand for re-election at alternate Annual Consultative Meetings. One half of the elected members shall retire at each Annual Consultative Meeting.
- 3.3 The Chairman of the Committee shall be elected at the Annual Consultative Meeting and shall serve until the next Annual Consultative Meeting and be eligible to stand for re-election.
- 3.4 Persons who are employees of the BCU or National Associations may serve as members of the Committee with the consent of the Board.
- 3.5 The Committee shall appoint from within their membership (including co-opted members), a Secretary, a Treasurer and such other officers the Committee considers necessary for its administration and representation on other committees.
- 3.6 The Chairman has a seat on the World Class Management Group and the Committee shall appoint a representative to sit on the Sports Management Committee (SMC).
- 3.7 One representative of the marathon racing representatives on the English Regional Development Teams shall be entitled to attend meetings of the Committee as a non-voting member.

4. Co-Options

- 4.1 Committee may co-opt not more than three Full Individual Members to serve on the Committee until the next Annual Consultative Meeting. Co-opted members shall have the same voting rights as other Committee members.

5. Nominations

- 5.1 Nominations of candidates for election at the Annual Consultative Meeting shall be made to the Secretary of the Committee in writing supported by the signatures of two Full Individual Members of the BCU and must reach the Secretary not less than 30 days prior to the Annual Consultative Meeting.

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6. Proceedings of the Committee

- 6.1 The Committee shall meet at least twice in each calendar year and shall report to the SMC, which in turn shall report to the Board.
- 6.2 At least seven days notice of meetings shall be given in writing (by post, email or fax) to all members of the Committee.
- 6.3 The Secretary shall keep minutes of the proceedings of the Committee and of the Annual Consultative Meeting. Copies of the minutes shall be sent to the SMC. Copies of the agenda and minutes shall be sent to the regional marathon racing representatives.
- 6.4 Six of the members entitled to attend and vote at a meeting shall form a quorum of the Committee. Voting shall be by show of hands only and each member shall have one vote.
- 6.5 The Treasurer shall keep such books of account as the Board and the Committee may from time to time direct. The accounts of the Committee shall be submitted annually to the SMC, made up to 31 October. Approved costs of members attending meetings shall be paid.

7. General Meetings

- 7.1 An Annual Consultative Meeting shall be held in each calendar year at the National Marathon Championships.
- 7.2 At least 21 clear days' notice of the date, time and place of General Meetings shall be given to each affiliated club that has registered its interest in marathon racing with the Committee. The agenda for a General Meeting, details of the business to be discussed at the meeting and of the persons nominated for election shall accompany the notice of meeting.
- 7.3 The business of the Annual Consultative Meeting shall be:
 - (a) to receive the report of the Chairman;
 - (b) to receive a summary statement of accounts;
 - (c) to elect persons nominated to serve on the Committee, including the Chairman.
 - (d) to consider any items included in the notice of meeting. Any conclusions reached on such items shall stand as recommendations for further consideration by the Committee.
- 7.4 Only business notified in the notice of meeting shall be transacted.
- 7.5 Any item for the agenda at the Annual Consultative Meeting shall be submitted to the Secretary of the Committee in writing supported by the signatures of two Full Individual Members of the BCU and must reach the Secretary not less than 42 days prior to the Annual Consultative Meeting. Other items may be discussed at the discretion of the Chairman.
- 7.6 No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless a quorum of members is present at the time the meeting proceeds to do business. A quorum shall be eight Voting Members.
- 7.7 The Chairman of the Committee shall preside at General Meetings. If the Chairman is known to be unable to attend or if he remains absent 30 minutes after the schedule start time of the meeting, the voting members present may choose a voting member to take the chair.
- 7.8 "Voting Member" means any club or organisation affiliated to the BCU who participate in and have registered an interest in marathon racing. Each voting member represented at a General Meeting by a Full Individual Member shall be entitled to one vote.
- 7.9 The Chairman shall not be entitled to vote otherwise than when a casting vote is required.
- 7.10 Voting shall be by show of hands unless two or more voting members who are present or the Chairman request a poll.
- 7.11 A General Meeting may be called at any time at the discretion of the Committee or by notice in writing to the Secretary by not less than 10 voting members. Such notice must state in the form of a motion the business to be discussed and be signed on behalf of the voting members. The Committee shall convene a General Meeting within 60 days of receipt of such notice.

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8. Sub-committees

- 8.1 The Committee may, with the prior approval of the SMC, appoint a sub-committee, standing or otherwise, for a specific period and with a specific brief. The Committee shall appoint one of its number to chair the sub-committee and all members shall be Full Individual Members of the BCU. The Committee shall supervise and be responsible to SMC for the work of its sub-committees and shall fund its sub-committees from within its set approved budget.

9. Financial Budget

- 9.1 The Committee shall set a specific annual budget each year for approval by the SMC.

10. Trophies

- 10.1 The Committee shall approve the list of trophies which are the property of the committee and are awarded each year. The Committee will also determine and publish the basis for competition for these trophies.

11. National Championships

- 11.1 Each year the Committee shall organise or nominate a Championship Marathon event.
- h) The course must be typical of present courses.
 - i) The winners of the classes shall be considered the National Marathon Racing Champions in their respective classes.
 - j) Clubs wishing to stage the National Marathon Racing Championships should apply to the Committee (by the end of May two years preceding the Championships). The venue for the following year shall be announced at each National Championships.
 - k) The Committee shall appoint a Chief Official from outside the organising club to oversee the running of the National Championships. He/she will be the liaison between the Committee and the organising club, and will be empowered to approve such things as courses, entry fees, distance and the difficulty of courses, start times etc.
 - l) The organising club will provide a set of accounts of the event to the Committee by the end of December.
 - m) Sponsorship deals for the event shall be approved by the Committee.
 - n) The event shall be called the British National Open Marathon Racing Individual and Team Championship.

PART B - RULES FOR COMPETITION

General Rules Applying to All Races

1. DEFINITION

A marathon race can be raced over any distance: usually between 3km and 200km.

2. BEHAVIOUR

- a. Canoeing is a non contact sport and competitors shall race in a fair manner.
- b. When a canoe or kayak is overtaking another canoe or kayak it is the duty of the overtaking craft to keep clear of other competitors at all times.
- c. When a canoe or kayak is racing in a group of competitors it is the duty of all the competitors in the group to keep clear of other competitors at all times. This rule applies to any manoeuvring within the group.
- d. All paddlers will wear appropriate clothing when racing. This is a minimum of singlet and shorts. These should preferably be in club racing colours.

3. THE RACING STRUCTURE

The marathon racing system has been designed to encourage all levels of competitor from the raw beginner to top class internationals. There are five categories of race: -

GROUP A

These races will appear in the Racing Handbook calendar. For these races the race levy must be paid and competitors need to be BCU, WCA, SCA or CANI comprehensive members (see Rule 13).

- a) Divisional races approved by the Marathon Committee.

Promotions between divisions will take place based on the results of these races.

- b) Races and time trials approved by the Marathon Committee but not in the divisional system such as stage marathons, descents, Royal K1, Richmond K2, Thameside etc.

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- c) The National Championships.

GROUP B

- d) Those races in the regions and at clubs that do not appear in the calendar. These will include handicap and fun marathons and junior *Lightning* races [see Rules 49-57]. No promotions will take place at these races.

Clubs are encouraged to hold handicap races throughout the year as an introduction to competing in the divisional system. These should be over a 3-10km course with handicaps based on age, experience and type of boat.

GROUP C

- e) Races approved by the Marathon Committee but organised by outside bodies such as the D.W. Committee.

4. CLUB MEMBERSHIP

The racing year shall be from 1st September of any year to 31st August of the following year. When a competitor is a member of more than one club, he shall declare before 1st September to the Race Records Officer of the Marathon Committee the name of the club for whom he will race the following racing year. When a competitor changes his club in mid season, he is permitted to compete for his new club, instead of his old, provided that prior consent of the old club is obtained. This consent shall not be withheld unreasonably, particularly in the case of a change of residence from one area to another. The agreed change must be advised to the Race Records Officer in writing before points can be allocated to the new club in club competitions.

5. SAFETY

Competitor responsibility

- a) Competitors must render their boats sufficiently buoyant to remain afloat and to support the crew in rough water in the event of capsizing.
- b) Competitors must be able to swim adequately in the waters on which the race is being held.
- c) On open water adequate spray covers must be worn.
- d) All paddlers are required to render assistance to other competitors in distress.
- e) The wearing of life jackets or buoyancy aids is compulsory for all paddlers ranked in divisions 7, 8 and 9 irrespective of the race they are entered in. This applies to singles and doubles races.
- f) Life jackets and buoyancy aids will conform to BCU/BCMA STANDARD BA83.

Team Leader responsibility

- g) Team Leaders should decide if paddlers under 16 years of age in the higher divisions should wear life jackets or buoyancy aids.

Race Organiser responsibility

- h) Race organisers may require life jackets or buoyancy aids and spray covers to be worn and will have the FINAL say as to who should wear them (except where this is covered by rule 5e) depending on weather and water conditions. Such equipment must be provided by the competitors.

- i) The penalty for infringing any safety rule is disqualification from the race.

6. DISCIPLINE

Marathon racing is subject to the BCU Disciplinary Code and to the Disciplinary Regulations, clauses 1–12.4 inclusive, [see D21-D23]. These apply to all marathon races.

For the avoidance of doubt, any complaint that an individual member of the Union (competitor or non-competitor) has behaved in a manner described in clause 1.1 of the Disciplinary Regulations shall be lodged with the race Protest Committee in the manner described in Marathon Racing Rule 17(h) (i) and (ii). The Protest Committee shall determine what action, if any, shall be taken. If the Protest Committee decides that the complaint should be referred to the Marathon Committee, the race organiser shall report the matter to the Secretary within three working days. The Marathon Committee will consider the matter in accordance with the Disciplinary Regulations.

7. DRUGS

Marathon racing is subject to the BCU Doping Control Rules [see Pages 12 & 13 at front of Handbook].

8. BROKEN PADDLES / BOAT

A competitor must not change boats during a race, but may change paddles in the case of breakage.

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9. WASH HANGING

Competitors must not hang on the washes of powered craft.

10. ASSISTANCE TO COMPETITORS

A competitor may receive food and drink during a race. Competitors with a disability may receive assistance at portages, but no other assistance unless permitted before the race by the organiser.

11. BOAT DESIGNS

Any type of canoe or kayak can be used.

Kayaks shall be propelled solely by means of double bladed paddles.

Canoes shall be propelled solely by means of single bladed paddles.

The paddles must not be attached to the boat in any way, being supported only by the hands.

For GROUP A races boats must comply with the ICF regulations as detailed below:-

single kayak	max length 520cm
double kayak	max length 650cm
single canoe	max length 520cm
double canoe	max length 650cm
double touring canoe	max length 550cm

Boats over 460cm in length must not have concave sections unless classified as Wild Water Racing boats and falling within the ICF regulations for such boats.

12. BCU MEMBERSHIP

All competitors in GROUP A and Lightning races must be COMPREHENSIVE BCU, WCA, SCA or CANI members. Membership numbers must be quoted on entries and results and a valid membership card or photocopy **must** be produced at race check in. Those unable to prove membership will be required to pay an extra Event Fee of a minimum of £2.50 and a maximum of £5.00. This covers the organisers for insurance purposes. The exceptions are juniors ranked in divisions 7, 8 & 9 and Lightning competitors who are members of clubs with registered junior sections who should produce their registered junior section card instead.

Upon promotion to Division 6 there is a period of grace of 4 weeks during which a junior, racing with a registered junior section card, must become an individual comprehensive member of the BCU/WCA/SCA/CANI.

13. RACE LEVY SCHEME

At all GROUP A races, published in the Racing Handbook, there will be a race levy of £1.00 for each senior and veteran paddler by age, as recognised by their BCU, WCA, SCA or CANI membership, and 50p for each junior paddler by age, as recognised by their membership. The levy to be charged on all paddlers booked in irrespective of whether they start or finish the race. The race levy for all categories of races is to be remitted by the Race Organiser together with the race results to the Race Records Officer. **All levies to be sent within 7 days of the race.** Cheques should be made payable to the BCU Marathon Racing Committee. Race results may be e-mailed to the Race Records Officer but **if so please do not forget to send a cheque for the race levy by post.**

14. RACE REGISTRATION

The organiser of a GROUP A race must apply for that race to be registered. This must be done by the autumn of the year preceding the event. The event must be organised and run under the Marathon Racing Rules. Registered races may advertise through the Union and may appeal through the Marathon Committee in cases of dispute or difficulty. [See also BCU Disciplinary Code].

The registration fee will be the race levy described in rule 13.

15. BOAT NUMBERING

At all GROUP A races competitors shall number their boat for a race in the following manner. Paddlers racing in singles divisions 1-8 and all K2 divisions must display vertical number plates. The number plate must be yellow or white and displayed vertically in a slot placed on the middle of the back deck about 15cm behind the cockpit in the case of kayaks and on the front deck in the case of canoes. The slot will be fitted with a locking pin. The dimensions of the plate will be 200mm long x 150mm high with the top corners rounded to a 10mm radius.

Paddlers ranked in Division 9, Lightning, club and fun race paddlers may alternatively use 225mm diameter white discs which should be displayed on fore and aft decks or as directed by the organiser. The

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characters on the vertical number plate will be the same standard as a car number plate and **MUST** be **CLEARLY LEGIBLE** from 25 metres. This applies to both sides of vertical number plates.

Any paddler not displaying a number plate at the start of any race, or whose number is not clearly legible will not score club points.

16. ASSESSMENT RACES

Assessment races will be picked by the Marathon Committee as the most suitable races for determining the members of British teams and the race organisers will be advised by March 1st each year via the Canoe Racing Handbook. At these races, assessment classes may be separated from other race classes and may be run over the same or different courses.

17. ORGANISATION OF GROUP A RACES

- a) Race Organisers **must** be affiliated to the British Canoe Union.
- b) The race shall be open to amateur canoeists who are members of an ICF affiliated federation.
- b) The race shall be properly advertised and the organisers shall issue adequate instructions on request, up to one month before the event, to prospective competitors or interested group leaders.
- c) After the race the Race Organiser shall issue complete results sheets to all competitors who provide stamped, addressed envelopes.
- d) In the event of circumstances which render it impossible or unsafe to run the race as planned, the Race Organiser shall take all reasonable steps to inform the competitors and supporters at the earliest possible moment.
- e) Race Organisers shall charge an entry fee for each competitor to include the levy cost. This fee may be reduced for juniors or augmented for late entries.
- f) **Within 7 days of the race** the Race Organiser must remit the race levy together with the race results in accordance with rule 13.
- g) Changes of class/division and late entries shall be permitted if the organiser so wishes. Information regarding late entries and class/division changes should be available to competitors at least 30 minutes before the start time of the class/division concerned.
- h) The Race Organiser shall provide a Protest Committee consisting of four officials or members of the organising body to hear and settle all protests by any competitor in that event. The following rules will be observed:-
 - i) The protests must be received within 30 minutes of completion of the relevant race and before the announcement of the final results. Failure to observe this will invalidate the protest.
 - ii) The protest must be in writing to the Race Organiser and must give full details of the alleged infringement of the rules.
 - iii) The Protest Committee must meet immediately to hear all the evidence and to consider the protest's validity in accordance with the BCU and Marathon Racing Rules.
- i) A protest against an organising body may only be dealt with by the Marathon Committee. Any such protest must be made within 3 working days in writing to the Secretary of the Marathon Committee and give full details of the alleged infringement of the rules. The person making the protest must also inform the secretary of the club or body concerned within 3 working days. Failure to comply with these conditions will invalidate the protest.
- j) Appeals against the decision of the Protest Committee are permitted and these will be heard by the Marathon Committee.

18. ORGANISATION OF GROUP B RACES

- a) For these races competitors do not have to be BCU, WCA, SCA or CANI members, there is no levy and no requirement to submit results to the race records officer. Race advertising, entry fees and classes are at the discretion of the organiser. The formal requirements to register club membership and for protest procedures are not necessary.
- b) Rules 1, 2, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11 shall apply to all GROUP B races.

Rules Applying to Regional Divisional Races

19. Regional divisional races are GROUP A races and all of rules 1 -17 above shall apply.

20. THE DIVISIONAL SYSTEM

- a) At a divisional event there are separate singles races for each of divisions 1 - 9 and separate doubles races for divisions 1/2, 3/4, 5/6, 7/8 and 9.
- b) It is recommended that entry into the divisional system should be based on the standards detailed in the Sprint Section "Standards for Racing".

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- c) Each year a divisional list will be published in the Racing Handbook for divisions 1-8. These lists are checked and any paddler not having competed for two successive seasons is removed from the lists. Each autumn clubs are asked to submit a list of the paddlers who will not be active for the coming season and where appropriate, to amend a draft of the proposed divisional lists.

21. TYPES OF COURSE

Whilst there will be some variations due to local conditions and types of course available, the normal distances will be:-

Div.1, 2 & 3 Singles, 1/2 & 3/4 Doubles

Full senior course of about 20km with any degree of severity.

Div.4, 5 & 6 Singles, 5/6 Doubles

Course of about 13km which may include portages and/or weir shoots.

Div.7, 8 & 9 Singles, 7/8 & 9 Doubles

Course of about 6.5km with the minimum practical hazards.

22. SPECIAL PRIZES

Race organisers are encouraged to give prizes for special groups of paddlers e.g. first under 16, first C1. In particular they are strongly recommended to give a prize for the first woman in each division and for the highest placed TC2. This kind of encouragement is particularly important in the divisional system.

23. SEPARATE STARTS

Each class of six or more starters must start separately.

24. HANDICAP SYSTEM FOR LOW ENTRIES

If there are less than three entries in a division then the organiser will transfer those entries to another division. Where possible they should be transferred to a race of the same distance so that paddlers are not required to race further than they originally entered. Where there is a choice, transfer to a lower division is preferable to transfer to a higher division. A handicap (if moved down) or an allowance (if moved up) will be used to calculate the results. Transferred paddlers racing in a different division will count for prizes but will be ignored in calculating promotions and 'D' notices. The handicap or allowance, per division moved, to be:-

20km course	3 minutes for singles ; 6 minutes for doubles
13km course	2 minutes for singles ; 4 minutes for doubles
6.5km course	1 minute for singles ; 2 minutes for doubles

25. COMPETING IN A CREW BOAT

A paddler is normally ranked on singles performances. However when competing in doubles events the competition ranking shall be the average of the paddlers individual rankings (all halves rounded down). All paddlers competing in crew boats must show their singles ranking on the entry form and these rankings **must** be shown on the results.

eg. Paddler A = Div.5 and Paddler B = Div.8. $5 + 8 = 13$, average = $6\frac{1}{2}$ so the competition ranking = 6 and the entry would be div.5/6

26. PROMOTIONS

- a) Promotions between the divisions throughout the season will be based on the table "Standards for Racing" set out on page {B1} ("the Table"). Column HC of the Table assumes a World Champion takes 60 seconds to paddle a given course and ranks paddlers in singles divisions from 1 to 9 based on the number of additional seconds it would take for competitors to cover that same course. P/D Factor expresses these same times as factors. For example, a top ranking paddler in division 7 would be expected to take 90 seconds giving a P/D Factor of 1.5.

- b) Promotions will be calculated on the following principles on the basis of singles results subject to the other provisions of this rule 26;

Divs.1, 2

Promotions to divisions 1 and 2 will be calculated by taking the times at each race of the mid-placed paddler in divisions 1, 2 and 3 divided by the Mean Factor for each of these three divisions. The average of these calculations will be multiplied by the Promotion Factor for divisions 1 and 2 to give the times for promotion to divisions 1 and 2.

Divs 3, 4 and 5

Promotions to divisions 3, 4 and 5 and above will be calculated by taking the times at each race of the mid-placed paddler in divisions 4, 5 and 6 divided by the Mean Factor for each of these three divisions. The average of these calculations will be multiplied by the Promotion Factor for divisions 3, 4, and 5 to give the times for promotion to divisions 5 and above.

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Divs 6, 7 and 8

Promotions to divisions 6, 7, and 8 will be calculated by taking the times of the mid-placed paddler in divisions 7 and 8 divided by the Mean Factor for each of these two divisions. The average of these calculations will be multiplied by the Promotion Factor for divisions 6, 7 and 8 to give the times for promotion to divisions 8 and above.

[The above is an outline description of the promotion process. The detailed bases for calculations are available by post or email from the Secretary, Marathon Racing Committee.]

- c) Promotions may take place on either singles or doubles performances. Performances in doubles divisions will be monitored by the Ranking Officer and promotions made under Rule 26(k) where considered appropriate.
- d) Status in canoe will not affect status in kayak and vice versa.
- e) Generally no woman or canoe paddler will be promoted higher than division 3; no male junior kayak paddler higher than division 2 and no female junior paddler higher than division 4.
- f) No promotions will be made under Rule 26 (b) where there are fewer than 5 starters in any race. However, the Ranking Officer in consultation with the Regional Hasler Adviser may amend or dispense with this limit if persistently low numbers in a division are clearly preventing the promotion system from operating as intended.
- g) Promotions are not limited to one division. For example, a division 9 paddler with a time faster than that required for promotion to division 7, would be promoted straight to division 7.
- h) Where the HRM computer results system is used at a race, promotions will be immediate from the day of the race. Where the HRM system is not used at a race, a promoted paddler is deemed to be promoted when his club receives written notification from the Race Records Officer. All promotions, including those at races where the HRM is not used, will be advised to Team Leaders by the Race Records Officer as soon as practicable.
- i) Once promoted, paddlers **must** race in their correct division, or higher division, except under the provisions of rules 24 or 25. Any competitor found racing in a lower division, singles or doubles, except under the provisions of rules 24 and 25, may be disqualified from the event and be banned from the next three Hasler races in the competitor's region. The exception is for promotions awarded at races held at the beginning of a new racing season and before the Hasler Final held in that year. These promotions will not apply at the Hasler Final of the current season but will apply to all other races. (E.g. A div. 6 paddler promoted to div. 5 in September 2007 at a race designated as H2008 can still race in div. 6 at the 2007 Hasler Final but must race in div. 5 at all other races.)
- j) All paddlers, both from within the region and from other regions are eligible for promotions. The only exceptions are paddlers transferred from another division under rule 24 (handicap system for low entries).
- k) The Marathon Committee has discretion to promote or to withhold promotion at any time it is found to be necessary. This discretion is delegated to the Ranking Officer

27. DEMOTIONS

- a) Demotions between the divisions throughout the season will be based on the table "Standards for Racing" set out on page {B1} ("the Table").
- b) Demotions will be calculated on the following principles on the basis of singles results subject to the other provisions of this rule 27:

Divs. 2, 3 and 4

Demotions to divisions 2, 3 and 4 will be calculated by taking the times at each race of the mid-placed paddler in divisions 1, 2 and 3 divided by the Mean Factor for each of these three divisions. The average of these calculations will be multiplied by the Demotion Factor for divisions 2, 3 and 4 to give the times for demotion to divisions 2, 3 and 4.

Divs 5, 6 and 7

Demotions to divisions 5, 6 and 7 will be calculated by taking the times at each race of the mid-placed paddler in divisions 4, 5 and 6 divided by the Mean Factor for each of these three divisions. The average of these calculations will be multiplied by the Demotion Factor for divisions 5, 6, and 7 to give the times for demotion to divisions 5, 6 and 7.

Divs 8 and 9

Demotions to divisions 8 and 9 will be calculated by taking the times of the mid-placed paddler in divisions 7 and 8 divided by the Mean Factor for each of these two divisions. The average of these calculations will be multiplied by the Demotion Factor for divisions 8 and 9 to give the times for demotion to divisions 8 and 9.

[The above is an outline description of the demotion process. The detailed bases for calculations are available by post or email from the Secretary, Marathon Racing Committee.]

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- c) Demotions may take place on either singles or doubles performances. Performances in doubles divisions will be monitored by the Ranking Officer and demotions made under Rule 27(j) where considered appropriate.
- d) Status in canoe will not affect status in kayak and vice versa.
- e) No demotions will be made under Rule 27(b) where there are fewer than 5 starters in any race. However, the Ranking Officer in consultation with the Regional Hasler Adviser may amend or dispense with this limit if persistently low numbers in a division are clearly preventing the demotion system from operating as intended.
- f) Demotions arising from the result of any one race will be limited to one division.
- g) Where the HRM computer results system is used at a race, demotions will be immediate from the day of the race. Where the HRM system is not used at a race, a demoted paddler is deemed to be demoted when his club receives written notification from the Race Records Officer. All demotions, including those at races where the HRM is not used, will be advised to Team Leaders by the Race Records Officer as soon as practicable.
- h) Once demoted, paddlers **may** race in that lower division, or choose to race in a higher division, except under the provisions of rules 24 or 25. The exception is for demotions awarded at races held at the beginning of a new racing season and before the Hasler Final held in that year. These demotions will not apply at the Hasler Final of the current season but will apply to all other races. (E.g. A div. 6 paddler demoted to div. 7 in September 2007 at a race designated as H2008 must race in div. 6 at the 2007 Hasler Final but may race in div. 7 at all other races.)
- i) All paddlers, both from within the region and from other regions are eligible for demotions. The only exceptions are paddlers transferred from another division under rule 24 (handicap system for low entries).
- j) The Marathon Committee has discretion to demote or to withhold demotion at any time it is found to be necessary. This discretion is delegated to the Ranking Officer.

Rules Applying to Regional Hasler Races

28. Regional Hasler races are GROUP A Divisional races and all of rules 1-17 and 19-27 above shall apply.

29. THE HASLER TROPHY

The Hasler Trophy is the National Team League Championships and is competed for throughout the season on a regional basis. The Hasler season is defined by the races designated 'H' in the Racing Calendar of this Handbook. Races relating to the following season are designated 'H2008'.

30. REGIONS

The regions are defined as the BCU regions for England plus Scotland East, Scotland West, and Wales. Each region will run its own league championships throughout the year and will decide how many results are to be counted by clubs. It is hoped that eventually there will be enough races in each region for clubs to count their best 8 or 9 results from the total number of races.

31. DIVISIONS

Race Organisers must offer races for either division 1 singles or division 1/2 doubles and for singles divisions 2-9 and doubles divisions 3/4, 5/6, 7/8 and 9 at all events except where varied as agreed with the Regional Hasler Adviser.

32. COMPETITORS

- a) Each club will be allowed as many competitors as it wishes.
- b) A paddler can only compete in one race in a qualifying event.

33. POINTS

- a) In regional races only those clubs within the region will score points. Paddlers from other regions will not be taken into account when calculating points except that their time will be used for the 110% or 115% calculations if they are the fastest boats not promoted.
- b) To be included for points, clubs must be affiliated to the British Canoe Union.
- c) All competitors in both singles and doubles **must** show their singles ranking at race check-in. Competitors not doing so will not score points in the regional competition and may not count the race as eligibility to compete in the final.
- d) The points system will be as follows.
 - i) Divisions 1-9 singles and 1/2, 3/4, 5/6, 7/8 & 9 doubles will count for points.
 - ii) Points will be awarded per paddler in both singles and doubles - 20 for 1st, 19 for 2nd, 18 for 3rd and so on down to 2 points for all paddlers who finish a singles race within 110% of the time of the fastest boat not promoted or who finish a doubles race within 115% of the time of the fastest boat not promoted. One point only for paddlers who finish outside the 110% or the 115% limit irrespective of

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their position. This to apply to all races except division 9 singles and doubles which will receive 20 for 1st, 19 for 2nd, 18 for 3rd and so on down to 2 points for all paddlers who finish.

- iii) Transferred paddlers racing in a different division under the provisions of rule 24 will count for Hasler points.
- iv) Paddlers in a separate assessment race at a Regional Hasler event will not score Hasler points.
- v) Each club will count its six best scoring singles boats from any divisions and its three best scoring doubles boats from any divisions. Only the scores from three doubles boats can be counted even if some of these boats contain just one paddler who is eligible for Hasler points for a particular club.
- vi) At each event the club with the highest score will get 10 regional points in the regional competition, 9 for 2nd and so on.

Rules Applying to the Hasler Final

34. The Hasler Final is a GROUP A Divisional race and all of rules 1-17 and 19-27 above shall apply except rule 25 (crew boats) that is replaced by rule 38.

35. CLUB ELIGIBILITY

- a) The top 4 scoring clubs from each region (8 clubs from the combined Midlands region) as determined by the regional Hasler competitions, plus a team from the Combined Services and from the Isle of Wight, may compete in the Hasler Final at the end of the season. Additionally a team from the host club (or from each host club if there are two organising clubs) may compete if they have not qualified from the regional competition.
- b) Each eligible club will be allowed as many competitors in the final as it wishes.

36. PADDLER ELIGIBILITY

- a) A paddler must compete in 3 qualifying events at his or her current ranking, during the season to be eligible for the final. The exceptions are Div.1 senior kayaks, Div.2 junior kayaks, Div.3 women kayaks and Div.3 canoes who must compete in 2 qualifying events.
- b) Qualifying events are regional Hasler races and all assessment races for that season. This does not include races designated for the following Hasler season. Also a paddler may count competing in the National Championships on one or both days as one qualifying race. The previous Hasler Final does **not** count as a qualifying race.
- c) The qualification must be in the same type of boat (i.e. canoe or kayak).
- d) Paddlers are only eligible to paddle in a singles race at the Hasler Final if they have competed in 3 qualifying events in singles. The exceptions are paddlers already ranked in their highest division (Div.1 senior kayaks, Div.2 junior kayaks, Div.3 women kayaks and Div.3 canoes) although they must still comply with rule 36a.
- e) Regional Champions are eligible to compete in the final, provided they have complied with rules 36a-d, even if their club has not qualified for the final. Regional Champions are eligible for medals and trophies but will not score Hasler Final points. They will be ignored in calculating the Hasler Trophy clubs competition results.
- f) A paddler can only compete in one race at the final.
- g) The Regional Hasler Adviser will check the eligibility of paddlers from his region for the final. The Race Records Officer will be able to produce listings on request to help clubs and Hasler Advisers carry out this task.

37. CLASSES

There will be races for singles divisions 1-9 and doubles divisions 1/2, 3/4, 5/6, 7/8 & 9.

38. COMPETING IN CREW BOATS

At the Hasler Final where crew members in doubles races are ranked in separate divisions they must race in the classification of the higher ranked paddler.

39. POINTS

- a) All competitors in singles and doubles **must** show their singles ranking on the entry form. Competitors not doing so will not score points.
- b) Only competitors racing in their club colours will score points.
- c) Point scoring at the final will be as described in rule 33d (i), (ii), (iii) & (v).

40. TROPHIES

- a) The *Hasler Trophy* will be awarded to the club scoring the most points at the final
- b) The *Regional Trophy* will be awarded to the region with the highest aggregate score at the final from their three highest scoring clubs.

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- c) The *Adam Thomasson Trophy* will be awarded to the winner of the Div.2 race at the final.
- d) The *Ross Warland Memorial Trophy* will be awarded to the highest placed junior in the Division 4 race at the final.
- e) The *Committee Cup* will be awarded to the highest placed junior woman K1 in the highest division at the final.
- f) The *Ken Pereira Cup* will be awarded to the highest placed junior C1 in the highest division at the final.
- g) Individual Senior, Woman and Junior Regional Champions will be identified from the regional Hasler competitions. These will be the individuals scoring the highest number of points, in the appropriate division for the final trophy award, in their own regional races. These Regional Champions are eligible for the following trophies at the final:-
 - i) The *Rhodes White Trophy* will be awarded to the Senior Regional Champion who gains the most points in Div.1 at the final.
 - ii) The *David Shankland Trophy* will be awarded to the Woman Regional Champion who gains the most points in Div.3 at the final.
 - iii) The *Barber Trophy* will be awarded to the Junior Regional Champion who gains the most points in Div.2 at the final.
- h) The *Bill Sparks Trophy* will be awarded to the highest placed Veteran K2 at the final.

Rules Applying to the National Championships

41. The National Championships is a GROUP A race and all of rules 1-17 above shall apply.

42. DEFINITION

- a) The National Championships shall be called *The British National Open Marathon Racing Individual and Team Championships* and will identify the various National Champions.
- b) There must be at least 3 entries for a National Championship or Divisional Championship race to take place.

43. PADDLER ELIGIBILITY

- a) Paddlers may compete in races specified for those of a higher ranking but will not be allowed to compete in races specified for those of a lower ranking. (E.g. an U18 may race as an U23 or Senior but not as an U16 or O34.)
- b) Senior and Veteran Women paddlers may compete in a doubles crew in Senior and Veteran Mens kayak races of the same or higher ranking.
- c) All ages are calculated at 1st January of the year of the Championships.

44. NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP CATEGORIES

- a) There will be separate races for men's kayak, women's kayak and men's canoe in all age categories in both singles and doubles except the U12 and U10 categories where there are only kayak singles classes.
- b) **Senior paddlers** will race over a course of approximately 26km. The winners of these races shall be deemed the :-
 - Senior Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.*
 - Senior Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.*
 - Senior Men's National Canoe Marathon Champion of Great Britain.*
- c) **Paddlers aged under 23** will race over a course of approximately 26km. The winners of these races shall be deemed the :-
 - Under 23 Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.*
 - Under 23 Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.*
 - Under 23 Men's National Canoe Champion of Great Britain.*
- d) **Paddlers aged under 18** will race over a course of approximately 20km. The winners of these races shall be deemed the :-
 - Under 18 Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.*
 - Under 18 Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.*
 - Under 18 Men's National Canoe Marathon Champion of Great Britain.*
- e) **Paddlers aged under 16** will race over a course of approximately 13km. The winners of these races shall be deemed the :-
 - Under 16 Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.*
 - Under 16 Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.*
 - Under 16 Men's National Canoe Champion of Great Britain.*
- f) **Paddlers aged under 14** will race over a course of approximately 6.5km. The winners of these races shall be deemed the :-
 - Under 14 Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.*

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Under 14 Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.

Under 14 Men's National Canoe Champion of Great Britain.

- g) **Paddlers aged under 12** will race over a course of approximately 3.5 km. The only competitors eligible for this event are paddlers in Lightnings ranked below Division 8. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:-

Under 12 Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain

Under 12 Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.

- h) **Paddlers aged under 10** will race over a course of approximately 3.5 km. The only competitors eligible for this event are paddlers in Lightnings ranked below Division 8. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:-

Under 10 Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.

Under 10 Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.

- i) **Paddlers aged 34 or over** will race over a course of approximately 20km. The winners of these races shall be deemed the :-

Veteran Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.

Veteran Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.

Veteran Men's National Canoe Marathon Champion of Great Britain.

- j) **Paddlers aged 44 or over** will race over a course of approximately 13km. The winners of these races shall be deemed the :-

Over 44 Veteran Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.

Over 44 Veteran Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.

Over 44 Veteran Men's National Canoe Marathon Champion of Great Britain.

- k) **Paddlers aged 54 or over** will race over a course of approximately 6.5km. The winners of these races shall be deemed the :-

Over 54 Veteran Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.

Over 54 Veteran Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.

Over 54 Veteran Men's National Canoe Marathon Champion of Great Britain.

- l) Where crew members in doubles races are in different categories they must race in a category for which they are both eligible.

45. DIVISIONAL CATEGORIES

- There will be separate races in singles for each of divisions 1-9 and in doubles for divisions 1&2, 3&4, 5&6, 7&8 and 9.
- Paddlers will race in their ranked division irrespective of age, sex or boat type.
- Paddlers in singles divisions 1, 2 & 3 and in doubles divisions 1&2 and 3&4 shall race over a course of approximately 20km.
- Paddlers in singles divisions 4, 5 & 6 and in doubles divisions 5&6 shall race over a course of approximately 13km.
- Paddlers in singles divisions 7, 8 & 9 and doubles divisions 7&8 and 9 shall race over a course of approximately 6.5km.
- The winners of these races shall be deemed *Divisional Champions*.
- Where crew members in a doubles race are ranked in different divisions the competition ranking shall be determined in accordance with rule 25.
- Where a race is inquorate [see rule 42b] the paddlers may transfer to another division as allowed by rule 24 but they will not be eligible for the Divisional Champion title or medals.

46. TEAM COMPETITION

- Points will be awarded per paddler both in singles and doubles races - 20 points for the winner then 19, 18, 17 etc. down to one point for each finisher.
- All competitors in singles and doubles **must** show their singles ranking to be eligible for team points.
- Only competitors racing in their club colours will score points,
- A trophy, *The Spanish House*, will be awarded to the club scoring the most points at the National Championships counting all categories in Rules 44 and 45.
- A trophy, *The Spanish Galleon*, will be awarded to the club scoring the most points in the under 12 and under 10 age categories (Rules 44 (g) and (h)).

47. PROMOTIONS & DEMOTIONS

Although no automatic promotions will take place at the championships, the Marathon Committee may exercise their right under rules 26 and 27 to promote or demote on the basis of the results.

48. HASLER QUALIFICATION

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The event will not count as a Regional Hasler event nor be used to allocate points for Regional Hasler competitions. However it may be counted by a paddler as a qualifying race for the Hasler Final.

Rules applying to the Marathon Lightning Series

49 THE SERIES

- a) Race Organisers of Regional Hasler Trophy events are encouraged to include Lightning races that qualify for the Marathon Lightning Series in which teams compete for the Geoff Sanders Memorial Trophy.
- b) The series will run from 1 September each year for 12 months.
- c) Lightning races will not be used in determining the outcome of Hasler races.
- d) Lightning races will be included at the Hasler Final but will not be used to determine the outcome of the Hasler Trophy competition.

50 QUALIFICATION

- a) To qualify, paddlers must compete in a Pyranha Lightning Junior K1.
- b) Paddlers may compete in craft other than Lightnings but will not be eligible for race points. Race organisers should ensure they are entered in a 'Fun Race' included in the HRM, to avoid confusion.
- c) No individual or club qualification is required for Lightning paddlers competing in the Lightning races held at the Hasler Final.
- d) All ages are calculated as at 1st January preceding the date of each race.
- e) Paddlers with a marathon ranking of Division 8 or higher shall not be eligible to compete in Lightnings.

51 COURSE

The course shall be 2 - 4 Km. with no hazards.

52 CLASSES

- a) There will be four classes: boys under 10; girls under 10; boys under 12; girls under 12.
- b) Race organisers are encouraged to award medals to the first three places in each class.

53 POINTS

- a) Points shall be awarded in each class at each event with 10 points for the winner, 9 points for second place and so on down to 1 point for each paddler who finishes.
- b) Points shall be awarded in each class at the Hasler Final event with 20 points for the winner, 19 points for second place down to 2 points for each paddler who finishes.
- c) Points shall be awarded to all paddlers at a Lightning race irrespective of whether the paddler is paddling out of region.
- d) At the end of August in each year each paddler's best two scores will be included to form their club's total points score for that year. The points won in the Lightning classes held with the Hasler Final in September of that year will be added to that total.
- e) The winner of the Geoff Sanders Memorial Trophy will be the club with the highest number of points determined in d) above.

54 RESULTS

Results of all Lightning races should be forwarded to the Lightning Coordinator, to compile the Geoff Sanders Memorial Trophy results.

55 SAFETY

- a) The wearing of life jackets or buoyancy aids is compulsory for all paddlers
- b) The requirements of Rule 5 above must be observed in all respects.
- c) Race organisers must conduct a specific risk assessment for Lightning class races and, taking into account their age and experience, provide adequate safety cover over the whole course (e.g. rescue boats) where considered necessary.

56 PROMOTIONS

The Lightning programme aims to introduce young paddlers into marathon racing and it is important that paddlers do not remain too long in the class. Paddlers in the under 12 age group will therefore be monitored and, having scored more than 40 points in a season, be recommended by the Lightning Marathon Coordinator to transfer to Division 9 K1. As part of their long term development young paddlers are encouraged to compete in Division 9 races without affecting their eligibility to race in Lightnings. For this reason the Marathon Committee declined to recommend separate junior Hody K2 races.

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57 RACE LEVY/EVENT TICKET

- a) Lightning races are classed as Group B races and thus no race levy will be charged.
- b) Paddlers who are not BCU members or not members of a BCU affiliated club with a registered youth section shall purchase an Event Ticket to provide insurance cover. To promote racing at this introductory level, the MRC recommends a standard entry fee of £2.50, to include where necessary the Event Ticket charge.

PART C - THE STARTING OF ASSESSMENT RACES, NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS RACES AND HASLER FINALS RACES

There is a necessity to maintain the standard of starting at assessment races and major championships. The following will apply to all assessment races, to all races at the National Championships and to all races at the Hasler Finals.

1. REQUIREMENTS

- a) The start line should be clearly defined on both banks.
- b) A clearly defined marshalling line must be established behind the start line.
- c) The race must be started by a person drawn from the approved starters list, who will have an experienced assistant.
- d) The marshalling line should be controlled by at least two experienced officials.
- e) The above should all be equipped with PA equipment or loud hailer that it is the responsibility of the race organiser to provide.

2. STARTING PROCEDURE

- a) An audible warning will be given 5 minutes before the first start. From that time on, no paddler is to pass in front of the marshalling line. All paddlers who are already in front of the marshalling line have 3 minutes to get behind it.
- b) A second audible warning will be given 2 minutes before the first start. Any paddler in front of the marshalling line will be penalised. No paddler is to go in front of the marshalling line until instructed by the marshal.
- c) Once released by the marshal, the paddlers will be under the starter's control. Any paddler going in front of the start line before the 'GO' will be penalised.
- d) For each contravention of the above rules, a 2 minute penalty will be imposed.
- e) Note that the Marathon Team selectors have been instructed by the Executive Committee that they should use the results INCLUDING any penalty, as the basis for selection.

PART D - RECOMMENDATIONS

These recommendations are intended to guide organisers and others in the provision of acceptable races.

1. ADVANCE INFORMATION

Do not attempt to run a race without visiting a few to find out how things work. Advance information sent out to competitors and clubs should at least set out the following details.

- a) Name, date and status of the race.
- b) Name of the organising body.
- c) Closing date for entries and whether or not late entries will be accepted.
- d) Address to which entries and enquiries should be sent, and if possible a corresponding telephone number.
- e) Entry fees and to whom these should be payable.
- f) Locations of start and finish, and directions for getting to these places.
- g) Time of start and closure of checking in.
- h) Brief description of the course, sufficient to give a newcomer the general picture of the type of course and warning of any details of the course that they should inspect in advance.
- i) Any special regulations that competitors should be aware of before they arrive.

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- j) Any major changes since last year.
- k) An entry form asking for full details of competitors.

2. SAFETY

Safety measures are largely at the discretion of the organiser, since adequate measures vary considerably with course and conditions. Unnecessary precautions are wasteful and irksome, but inadequate precautions can lead to disaster. It is a stipulation that all paddlers ranked in Divisions 7, 8 and 9 or competing in Lightning and fun races wear a buoyancy aid [Rules 5 (e) and 55 (a)]. On the open sea it is probably wise to insist on buoyancy aids for all. On open water, rescue boats are very important. It does not take long to paddle half a mile out to sea, but it takes a long time to swim back, especially in cold water. A weir may be trivial to a fresh paddler but a different story to one who has just raced 15 miles. It is sometimes a good idea to position frogmen below a weir to pull people and equipment out as they drift past, but make sure that all rescuers are competent. An incompetent rescuer can be more of a hindrance than a help.

An important precaution is to make sure that no-one is stranded or lost halfway round the course. On open water races it is important to account for everyone. On calm water it is usually sufficient to have a back marker paddle over the course at the tail of the race.

3. BRIEFING AND CONTROL

- a) There may be a wide range of ambitions present at the race - some people go for a pleasant paddle, some with Olympic hopes. Try not to let them stumble over each other. Both parties are aggravated when a fast crew is confronted by a slow crew blocking a critical portage. Let the fast classes start first. Local conditions and variations in the course for different classes should be taken into consideration when arranging the start order.
- b) Every boat should be inspected at check-in to ensure it is numbered clearly, correctly and durably. Although it is the competitor's responsibility to number their boat, it is human nature that some will fail in this responsibility. Have with you the wherewithal to number boats and use it when the occasion demands.
- c) It is customary to deliver a briefing shortly before the race. This is the time to explain the starting procedure and order, to describe any special features of the race course and to emphasise any special regulations.
- d) Ensure that the course is clearly marked at all points where there could be doubt. Marshals should be positioned at turning points, and should tick off numbers on a check list. It is desirable to position marshals at portages and shoots. The marshals should keep the passage clear for competitors, keep spectators and competitors off forbidden land and report any misdemeanors to race control. A marshal's directions should override any prior instructions. A marshal should be clearly identifiable.

4. STARTING ORDER

- a. The order in which the various classes or divisions are started can have a significant effect on the race results. The general principle is to start the fastest classes first and the slowest classes last. This minimises the chance of fast boats paddling through slower classes, picking up stragglers on the wash and dragging them back to the class leaders. In practice, a perfect start order is not possible because of the wide variety of speeds within any one class and sometimes the complicating factor of multi lap courses.
- b. The following is the recommended start order. Not all of these classes will necessarily run at any one race.

1. Senior Men K2 Assessment race
2. Division 1/2 K2
3. Junior Men K2 Assessment race
4. Senior Men K1 Assessment race
5. Division 1 K1
6. Division 3/4 Doubles
7. Division 2 K1
8. Junior Men K1 Assessment race
9. Senior Women K2 Assessment race
10. Senior Men C2 Assessment race
11. Junior Women K2 Assessment race
12. Division 5/6 Doubles
13. Senior Women K1 Assessment race

14. Division 3 Singles
15. Division 4 Singles
16. Senior Men C1 Assessment race
17. Junior Men C1 Assessment race
18. Junior Women K1 Assessment race
19. Division 5 Singles
20. Division 7/8 Doubles
21. Division 6 Singles
22. Division 7 Singles
23. Division 9 Doubles
24. Division 8 Singles
25. Division 9 Singles

5. STARTING

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- a. A clean start is important and difficult to achieve. Most people can start the lower ranks of competitors in order but a strong personality is needed to keep those in higher divisions in good order. The starter must never lose control of the start, either through physical inability to make himself heard or through weakness of will. Preferably get an experienced racer to start your race and supply him with a megaphone. Do not be bullied by the competitors. They often try out the strength of the starter while waiting on the line. In the very last resort you can disqualify on the spot. On the other hand do not keep the competitors hanging around unnecessarily. They are often nervous before a race, may be getting cold or just plain bored. In fast water or wind it is often difficult for them to hold their positions. If you have got them into a fair line then start without delay. Say 'READY GO'.
 - b. Massed starts are good value for bullfighting addicts but can be bad for competitors. Do not start classes together if it means overcrowding the start line. In Regional Divisional races each class of six or more boats must start separately (Rule 23).
 - c. Record the start time of each class. Do not use a system which relies on a set start time. You cannot guarantee starting on the exact second.
- 6. TURNS**
- a. All turns should be clearly marked. It is usual to use a buoy or buoys around which the competitors must turn, but these should be clearly distinguishable from other existing buoys which are nothing to do with the race. A clear description and location of the turn buoys must be given at the briefing
 - b. It is important that all turns are properly marshaled. Each turn marshal should be provided with a list of the race numbers which started and is responsible for checking that each boat properly completes the turn. A list of boats which did not complete the turn and a written report of the incidents at the turn must be provided promptly to the race control.
- 7. FINISHING & RESULTS**
- a. Mark the finishing line clearly and signify a crossing of the line audibly by bell, whistle or some such device. It is not always obvious to the paddler exactly where the finishing line is, particularly as they may be exhausted.
 - b. Have a reliable clock which is readable and have a back up in case of malfunction. Make a record of the finishing order of every boat as it passes the finishing line. Have one person make an independent list of boat numbers. Another should make a list of boat numbers and finishing times - this person should have a pad of paper with each sheet numbered in advance so that you will know later if any sheet has been mislaid. On each sheet mark say ten lines. When a boat finishes, record its number and finishing time alongside. Never mind computation at this stage, your hands will be full recording the finishing order correctly. When a page is full pass it to someone else to analyse.
 - c. It is useful to have a portable cassette recorder running constantly at the finish line. You can record everything that happens at the finish and the tape can be used to check the finish order and timing if for any reason the finishing team becomes overwhelmed by mass finishes. Give the recorder to one of the finish team and tell them to 'talk' every boat over the line, giving number and time.
 - d. You are strongly requested to use the Hasler Race Management computer programme (HRM) to produce your results. This will automatically calculate all promotions and demotions which will apply from the day of your race, together with your Hasler points. The results will be produced in the format required by the Race Records Officer. The HRM has been specially designed for Hasler races and is distributed free on CD to all race organisers. If you require a further updated copy or any help with using the system please contact any member of the committee. If you would like to use the HRM at your race but are nervous about using it for the first time, the committee can arrange for an experienced operator to attend your race and guide you through the process.
 - e. Whether using the HRM or a manual system, have someone out of the wind and rain and away from possible distraction from paddlers to analyse your finishing results. Arrange a system for displaying the results as soon as you know them. If there are any errors the paddlers will usually spot them and they can be queried before prize giving. Have a results display system that is not dependant on good weather. The thing that competitors want to see quickly is a list of finishing orders with overall times. Other details such as start and finish times are essentially irrelevant and only clutter the display. Have the prize giving as soon as possible and announce any divisional promotions at this stage.
- 8. AFTER THE EVENT**
- a. After the event is over, buckle to and get the final result sheet sorted out. If you put it off your memory will dim, pieces of paper will get lost, your enthusiasm will wane and competitors will get very cross.
 - b. If you are using the HRM your results will automatically be produced in the correct format. If using a manual system the result sheets should be arranged by divisions in finishing order and should show position, name, division ranking, club, BCU number, points and promotions to higher divisions. Totals of points scored by clubs should also be shown although these will be verified by the Hasler Adviser. The

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race organiser should record at the top of the result sheet the number of paddlers who have entered the race.

- c. Where possible, please send results by e-mail. For regional Hasler races send your results to the Regional Hasler Adviser and Rankings Officer as soon as possible after your race. If sending hard copies by post, please send three copies of the results to the Regional Hasler Adviser and one copy direct to the Rankings Officer. The race levy should be sent directly to the Race Records Officer. For other races please send a copy of the results and the levy to the Race Records Officer. Results and levy in either case to be sent within the 7 days stipulated [Rule 13].

Please remember that if you have e-mailed the results you still need to send the levy by post.

- d. Send Event Ticket money to the BCU HQ, Nottingham together with a schedule of names, post code etc or BCU number of those who have paid for an event ticket, on the form provided by the BCU.

PART E - VENUE AND ORGANISATIONAL CRITERIA FOR THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS AND THE HASLER FINALS

The Marathon Committee will look to the following ideal criteria when considering applications for the hosting of the National Championships and the Hasler Finals. Any club wishing to host the National Championships or the Hasler Finals will be expected to make a short presentation to the Annual Consultative Meeting or to the Marathon Committee outlining their proposals for the course and organisation to meet these criteria.

1. THE COURSE

- a) The course should be wide enough at the start to provide a fair start for all paddlers. It should also be wide enough throughout its length for competitors to overtake and pass each other in opposite directions.
- b) The course should be capable of being paddled in an understern rudder boat.
- c) Portages should allow a minimum of 12 metres at the 'get out' and 'get in' points. Portages should not be of excessive number or length.
- d) Access to portage areas for spectators should be good with adequate parking, or pool transport should be provided.
- e) The course should be reasonably accessible for spectator viewing.
- f) There should not be too many other conflicting water users.

2. ORGANISATION

- a) The organising club(s) should have a proven track record in organising normal Divisional marathons.
- b) The venue should have good access by road and not be too far for the majority of paddlers to travel.
- c) There should be adequate camping facilities nearby, particularly for the two day National Championships.
- d) There should be adequate parking at the start and finish.
- e) There should be adequate covered checking-in and refreshment areas at the start and finish and a results display area.
- f) There should be adequate toilet facilities at the start and finish areas.
- g) There should be an adequate PA system at the start, briefing and prize giving areas.
- h) There should be adequate First Aid cover in appropriate areas.
- i) The starting of all races is to be as the procedure set out in PART C.
- j) There should be a computerised results facility capable of showing class results and team scores immediately after the races.
- k) Prizes at the National Championships will be the official BCU National Marathon Championship medals and Divisional medals.
- l) Prizes at the Hasler Finals will be the official BCU Hasler Finals medals.

BCU MEMBERSHIP AND EVENT TICKETS

All seniors and veterans must be full members of the BCU if they wish to race in a Marathon event that has been advertised in the Calendar. Juniors who are ranked in division 6 or above must also hold full youth membership.

A junior club member need not be a full member of the BCU in order to race in the lower divisions (7,8 & 9) of the Marathon racing system or in the other 2 categories of marathon races. He must, however, be a member of a club with a registered junior section and the number used for his or her identification will be the club's affiliation number followed by his own individual club number. This method of recording the juniors' numbers on the result sheet has proved cumbersome so it is advised that the club abbreviation followed by the paddler's club number

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is easier and preferred by the Records Officer, both for identification and ease of recording. i.e. LIN/005, CHE/017. Note that event tickets are also required for Lightning paddlers who are neither BCU members nor a member of a club with a registered junior section.

Should the junior be promoted into a higher division (6 & upwards) he must then become a full member of the BCU in his own right.

Race Organisers MUST still check that a competitor's membership is current either by photocopy of the membership card with the entry or by seeing the card on the day of the race.

If the card is unavailable or forgotten the paddler must purchase an "Event Ticket" as a "stop gap" but only once per season. The records officer carries out a check on event ticket issue for all race results and those paddlers abusing this system will be penalised.

The system is as follows:

1. The tickets are for use by non-members at the entry level only of National Competitions requiring membership e.g. Divisional Racing.
2. For use at a BCU event when the organiser believes a participant may be a member but the member cannot provide proof by way of a membership card.
3. The current fee for an Event Ticket and the amount payable by each participant is £2.50. Fees collected for Event Tickets must be sent promptly after each race to BCU HQ, Nottingham.
4. Event Ticket fees are not refundable.
5. The overall consideration is to encourage, in the best possible way, membership of the Country's Governing Body for Canoesport.

THE HASLER TROPHY



The story behind the Hasler Trophy

One of the most daring raids of World War Two took place on the night of 11 December 1942 in the enemy-occupied port of Bordeaux in France. Operation Frankton involved 12 men in six canoes being taken by submarine to a position 10 miles south of the Gironde estuary on 7th December. One of the canoes was ripped passing through the hatch of the submarine, but the other five then had an 85 mile paddle ahead of them. Two boats were lost in the tidal race and the remaining three carried on for three days, paddling in darkness and lying up during the day. One more boat hit a submerged rock and sank and the final two boats went on to Bordeaux harbour, where they attached their limpet mines and, assisted by the ebb tide, paddled silently back down the river. The mines detonated and severely damaged four vessels and sunk one. The four remaining men beached before reaching the sea, scuttled their canoes and travelled

overland to try to reach safety. Two were captured, but Major 'Blondie' Hasler and Marine Bill Sparks made their way to Spain – the only two of the original ten who survived. Hasler was awarded the DSO and Sparks the DSM.

After the war, Hasler went on to found the Single Handed Transatlantic Yacht race after a bet with his friend Francis Chichester. The Hasler Trophy was presented by Lloyds Underwriters to commemorate the raid of the so-called 'Cockleshell Heroes' and has been competed for since 1957. Major Hasler died in 1987 and Bill Sparks died on 30th November 2002, only ten days short of the sixtieth anniversary of the raid. In 2003 the Marathon Committee decided to inaugurate a new trophy named in honour of Bill Sparks, which goes to the highest placed veteran K2 in the highest division at the Hasler Final.

INTERNATIONAL MARATHONS

SELECTION POLICY FOR GREAT BRITAIN REPRESENTATIVE TEAMS

Objectives

- 1 To win medals at World, European Championships and World Cup events.
- 2 To maintain a position as a top nation in international competition.
- 3 To ensure the long-term athlete development required for international success.

This policy may be amended or supplemented by the BCU Marathon Racing Committee at its discretion in order to achieve the above objectives to cover exceptional circumstances. Every effort will be made to ensure as much notice as possible is given to all persons affected by any change.

Process of Selection

- 1 Each year, the ICF publish an International Calendar from which a programme of International Events to be attended is selected. Due regard being given to the Objectives and to budgets. Some events may be designated "Development". The programme is specified in the Racing Handbook.
- 2 The basic team composition for each event will be detailed in the Racing Handbook. Changes may be necessary to suit all the factors affecting team size and budgets.
- 3 The selection of teams for **all** internationals will be made on a **continuous assessment, open – to – all basis**. The composition of the team for each event will depend entirely on paddlers being and proving that they are of sufficiently high standard.

(The system of **continuous assessment** as opposed to system of 'first past the post' at a nominated selection event has been in operation for several years and has operated very well. It allows the selectors to consider an athlete who has under performed in any one race. This could be due to illness or equipment failure. It also means that consideration can be given to improving athletes who may not be winning but show potential for the future.)

- 4 Teams will be selected from results at the Assessment races, as detailed in the Racing Handbook, while accepting that there can be many variations of circumstances to affect performance. In marginal cases, previous competition results may be taken into consideration.
- 5 All Senior and Junior Kayak Men should race in the Assessment classes, and Senior and Junior Women, and Canoes, in Division 3 unless otherwise instructed.
- 6 Athletes wishing to be considered for International Events must comply with the following conditions.
 - 6.1 They must be Comprehensive BCU members, throughout the year.
 - 6.2 Having due regard to their availability for selection and their preferred

programme, they should apply to the Team Manager, by completing the Application Form and returning it by the dates specified in the Racing Handbook.

- 6.3 They should be prepared to meet all assembly costs and pay a contribution towards food, as detailed in the Racing Handbook.
- 6.4 They should be prepared to travel and be accommodated in the best interest of the team.
- 6.5 They must be prepared to accept the Team Coach's direction with regard to training and racing while abroad.
- 6.6 They must be prepared to dress and conduct themselves in a manner befitting a British Team representative, and promote the good name of British canoeing both at home and abroad.
- 6.7 They should be prepared to give support to the Sport UK, Sport England and the Lottery in promotional aspects, in return for the Grant Aid received.
- 6.8 They should wear the GB tracksuit and team clothing provided, on all suitable occasions.
- 6.9 They should compete in the appropriate Assessment events.

7 The principles guiding the Selection Committee will be as follows.

The best team available to represent Great Britain will be selected having regard to the following.

- A Winning medals at World, & European Championships, and World Cup events.
- B Gaining National Team points.
- C Experience enhancement and development potential consummate with the level of the Competition.
- D Available budget for an event that supports the overall Marathon programme.

8 The Selection Committee shall consist of the following:

The BCU Marathon Racing Committee selectors comprising the Chairman of the BCU Marathon Racing Committee who will Chair all selection meetings.
The Marathon Team Manager.
Up to 4 additional members nominated by the BCU MRC.
The BCU Performance Director.
The BCU Flat Water National Performance Manager.

Selectors are required to make every effort to attend all Domestic Assessment events, to ensure that a true and accurate assessment of current abilities can be made.

2007 INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMME

The Committee will provide as full a programme as possible in 2007, but this is subject to the funding we receive. At the time of going to press the funding we are to receive from the Lottery and the BCU exchequer fund is not known. The intended programme for the year is set out below, but it must be understood that the events supported and the sizes of the teams may change depending upon funding.

The main events for the year, for both Seniors and Juniors, are therefore: -

World Cup 1	In Europe, venue to be agreed	June 9/10
European Championships	Trencin, Slovakia	July 14/15
World Championships (WC2)	Gyor, Hungary	September 8/9

The World Cup Trophy will be awarded for the best total results from the two events. Each country can enter 3 crews, (2 at World Championships) in each class, with only the first finisher to count. In the Junior World Cup there are classes for Men K2, K1, C1 and Women K1& K2.

In addition to the 3 main events, we plan to send small teams to the Vallalolid K4 Series and the Pontrevedra K4 Series together with development teams to a training camp in Spain, and the Loire marathon in France, all depending on the assistance we receive from the Organisers. We will also support other events, where the Organisers provide total finance.

MARATHON COMMITTEE SUPPORT

The Marathon Committee will assist all potential team members in seeking personal sponsorship.

The applicant will be liable for any costs incurred, e.g. entry fees (even if he/she does not subsequently compete). It is regretted that the Marathon Committee can make no private travel or accommodation arrangements.

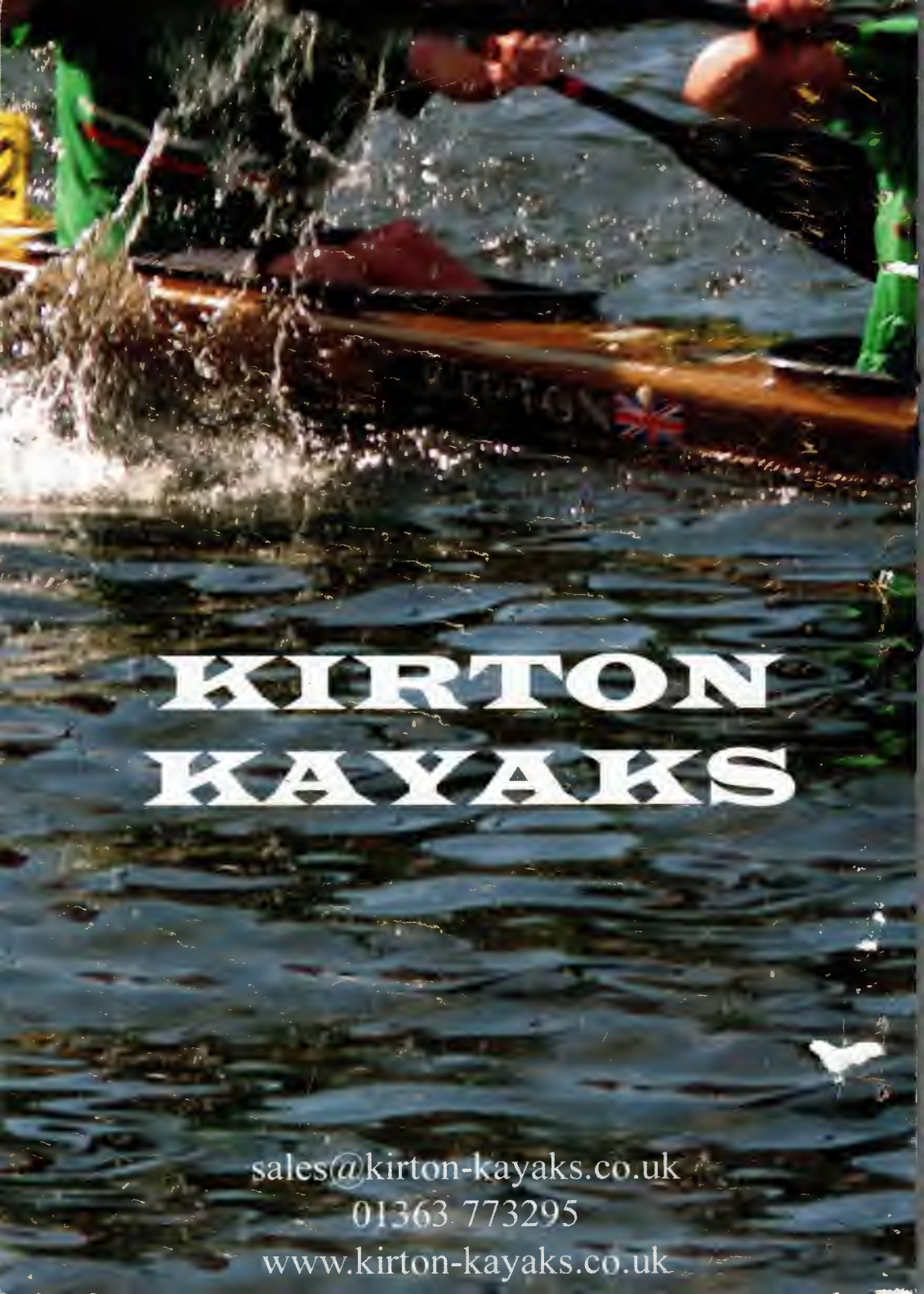
